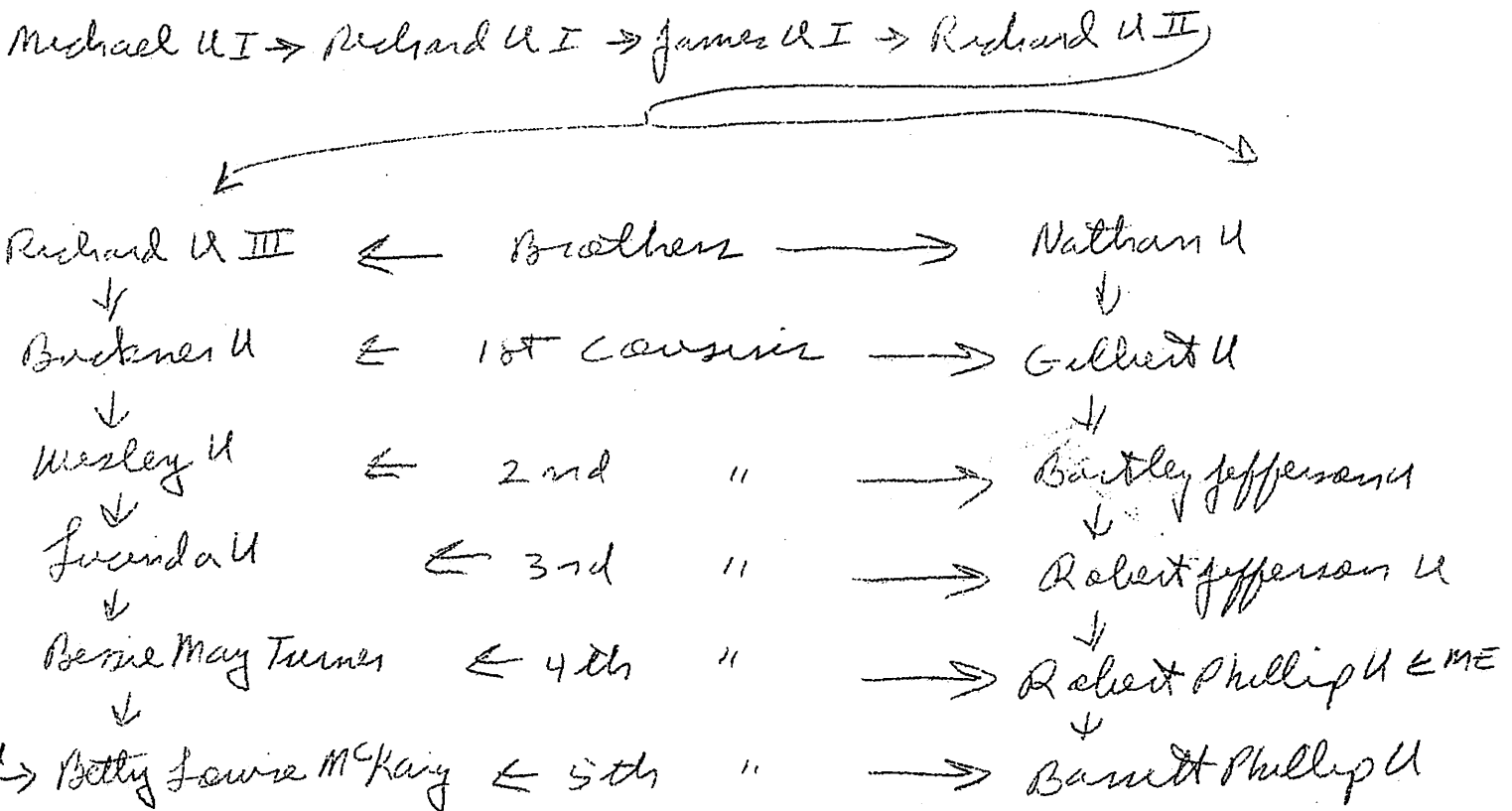

In an open field, about thirty-five feet south of Morgan street and near Boylan avenue on the east, under what was once a stalwart mulberry tree, but now decayed and tottering with time, and without a stone or slab to mark the spot, is the last resting place of Joel Lane.

This place, in the early part of the century, was owned by Peter Browne, one of the first lawyers to settle in Raleigh. Subsequently, in 1818, it was sold by him to Wm. Boylan. At present it is occupied by Mr. R. L. Potts and his cultured and interesting family.

As many descendants of Col. Joel Lane are still living among us, a brief sketch of the Lane family may prove not uninteresting:

There were five of the Lane brothers—Joel, Joseph, Jesse, James and Barnabas. The three first mentioned settled in the vicinity of Raleigh in 1741. Col. Joel Lane's first wife was Martha Hinton, his second Mary Hinton, daughters of Col. John Hinton, of Wake. Joseph Lane married Ferebee Hunter. He died in 1798. The maiden name of the wife of James Lane was Lydia Speight. Jesse Lane had a son, John, who married Betsy Street, of Buncombe, and these two were the father and mother of General Joseph Lane, of Oregon, who was the candidate for Vice-President in 1860, on the ticket with Breckenridge. Jesse Lane married Winifred Aycock, and these were grandparents of ex-Governor Swain.

Joel Lane had six sons and an equal number of daughters. The sons were: Henry, James, William, John, Thomas and Joel; the daughters were, Nancy, Martha, Elizabeth, Mary, Dorothy and Grizzelle. The eldest son, Henry, was the grandfather of the late

Henry Mordecai, and second cousin to General Joseph Lane. This relationship between the latter and Mr. Mordecai occasioned, in 1860, when the Vice-Presidential candidate came to Raleigh, the most distinguished social gathering which had ever been observed here.

This was at the residence of Mr. Mordecai, on the northern limits of the city, to which were invited every one of consequence hereabouts and all the kinspeople of the Lanes and Mordecais far and near. It is said to have been the most brilliant and elaborate affair ever known in the history of the capital. Among others present, and who were descendants of Joel Lane, were members of the following families: Devereuxs, McCullers (John Joseph Lane McCullers, father of Mr. Chas. E. and Dr. Joseph McCullers), the late Col. L. D. Stephenson, Matthew Stephenson, Austin Jones, and a great many others whose names are not now recalled.

The living descendants, now in this vicinity, of Henry Lane, are Mrs. Margaret L. Little and five sons; Miss Martha Mordecai, Mrs. Mary W. Turk and two children; Mrs. Ellen Mordecai, her son S. F. Mordecai and his eight children; Mrs. Margaret Devereux and daughters—Mrs. J. J. Mackay and five children, Mrs. J. W. Hinsdale and five children, and Misses Annie and Laura Devereux.

Capt. J. J. Thomas, Dr. D. E. Everett, Joseph G. and Jno. W. Brown are also descendants of Col. Lane. The late W. H. Holleman was Col. Lane's great-grandson. Mrs. Margaret E. Rowland, of Middle Creek Township, and mother of J. T. and Rev. Chas. H. Rowland, is also lineally descended from Col. Lane, whose son James was Mrs. Rowland's great-grandfather.

Mrs. Lydia Brown, mother of Messrs. Jno. W. and Joseph G. Brown, was a granddaughter of James Lane.

Mrs. Phil. Thiem, her sons and daughters—one of the latter being Mrs. Walter Woolcott; Mrs. John Redford; Miss Janie Brown; Mrs. Richard Young, her sons and daughter; the children of the late Nat. L. Brown, and Mrs. W. M. Brown, her sons and daughters—are also descendants (through their mother and grandmother, the late Mrs. Lydia Brown), of James Lane.

Other descendants of the historic Lanes are Messrs. Thomas J. Stephenson and his brothers, David, James M., Lonnie D., Jr., Nathaniel R., Ralph Lane, and sisters, Sallie E. and Julia V. Stephenson—sons and daughters of the late Col. L. D. Stephenson—all of Middle Creek Township, this county.

Mr. Chas. E. McCullers, of Raleigh, has in his possession a powder-horn and mahogany walking-cane, with the name of "Joseph Lane" carved on each, the lettering being still quite distinct.

Descendants of these 12, if any/ if known, are shown in continuation sections. Descendants of only one of the 12 (Moses Monroe Upchurch) are known at this time. They are covered in continuation Section 24, copy enclosed. Of the descendants the only one with whom I have had contact is Rose Bell Upchurch of Bedias, TX. We exchanged several letters in 1989 but she did not respond to my last letter of 9 APR 1989. Given her birth date it is quite likely she is deceased, but I do not know that for sure.

In the family Moses Upchurch (KID-2030) and his brother Burrell Miles Upchurch migrated from GA to Grimes Co, TX in the decade before the Civil War. Shortly after the war a party of relatives also made the trek from GA to Grimes Co, TX. This party included the widowed sister of Moses & Miles - Harriet (Upchurch) Loftin and her 11 year old daughter Celestia Annis Loftin. W. D. Chambers, the third Mayor of Waco, was elected and served from August 20, 1860, to August 14, 1861. He was born in Meridian, Mississippi, in 1833 and came to Waco in 1853. He died in Waco November 21, 1881. He was a lawyer and served in the Confederate army with distinction. He has some distant relatives living here today but they know little about him.

There seems to be a skip from W. D. Chamber's term which ended in August, 1861, until the election of Judge R. N. Goode June 2, 1862. During this period of ten months apparently Waco had no mayor. The records are blank for the period.

Judge R. N. Goode was elected fourth Mayor of the Town of Waco and served from June 2, 1862, to May 9, 1865. He was a lawyer, enjoyed a good practice, and was an unusually good and kind man. His home was a large brick, two story house on the corner of Jefferson and Second streets. He had several children, who grew to manhood and womanhood in Waco. None of them are living in Waco at this time, however. His grandson, Mr. E. E. Thompson, recalls little about his grandfather. He has a daughter living in Houston, Texas, Mrs. L. Blanche Goode Besbee, who gives the following information about her father. Judge R. N. Goode was born in 1812 in Canebreaks, Tenn. He came to Waco in 1859 and lived here until his death in 1873. During the Civil War of 1861-'65 he believed in the Union, and because of this belief he had much trouble with the people. He had courage to withstand all oppression and threats. Mrs. Besbee is the last child living.

Judge E. A. McKinney, the fifth Mayor, was elected and served from October 29, 1865, to July 3, 1866. I. N. Mullen served as Protem from July 30, 1866, to August 20, 1866.) He was a lawyer of much ability, and lived a long and useful life in Waco. Judge McKinney was born in Temperanceville, Canada, June 9, 1833, and came to Waco in 1859. He died in Waco September 4, 1915. In 1862 he joined the Confederate cause, and enlisted in the Sixth Texas Cavalry, where he was given the rank of captain. He served with General J. W. Speight, Governor Richard Coke, and Governor L. S. Ross. After the war he returned to Waco and became mayor of the town. He married Miss Florence Speight on January 5, 1868, and by this union had three children, Miss Blanca S. McKinney, Ernest S. and E. B. McKinney.

C. B. Way was elected or appointed the sixth Mayor of the Town of Waco and served from December 10, 1866,

to April 5, 1869. B. F. Harris was Mayor Protem from September 3, 1868, to December 18, 1868. I can find little about this man as mayor. Mrs. Joe W. Taylor of North Fifth Street, Waco, sent me a paper with this interesting sidelight on C. B. Way as a man. He was recording secretary of a Temperance organization in Waco May 11, 1860. The members of the organization were Miss Mollie Burney, Miss Sallie Smith, Mrs. R. A. Stone, Mrs. W. H. Crump, Mrs. Pigg, Mrs. John McLennan, Mrs. J. H. Sears, C. B. Way, W. H. Crump, James Robinson, R. A. Stone, E. H. Harrington, Joseph Cobb, Sallie Bryan, Rev. G. O'Bryan, Angi Sears, J. H. Sears, Mrs. Hubby, A. I. Conrow. He writes these two lines at the bottom of his records of date May 11, 1860.

"Without the smile from partial beauty won
O what were man—A world without a sun."

The population of Waco in 1870 was 3,618.

B. F. Harris, the seventh Mayor, was appointed under the military rule and served from April 30, 1869, to December 30, 1872. He was postmaster of the City of Waco for years.

John C. West was elected the ninth Mayor of Waco and served from December 23, 1874 to November 22, 1875 Wiley Jones served as Mayor Protem from November 22, 1875, to January 1, 1876, after Judge West resigned. Judge John C. West was a lawyer and a true and faithful counselor in all matters placed in his hands. He was born April 12, 1834, in Camden, South Carolina, and came to Waco in 1859. He died in Waco on July 12, 1927. Waco never had a finer citizen than Judge John C. West. He had a family of several fine and interesting children. His wife was a very fine woman, and was a great worker in all things of interest to Waco such as church, neighborhood, community, and state organizations. I knew them both well and valued their friendship very much. Judge West was a Special District Judge, and served as President of the Waco Public School Board for thirteen years. His home, Minglewood, is located at 624 Dutton Avenue.

A. J. Byrd was elected the tenth Mayor of the City of Waco and served from January 1, 1876 to May 16, 1878, when he resigned. (J. W. Speight served as Mayor Protem from May 17, 1877, to July 28, 1877. D. C. Kinnard served as Mayor Protem from May 16, 1878, to June 6, 1878. Byron McKeen served as Mayor Protem from June 20, 1878, to July 20, 1878.) A. J. Byrd was a popular

WAKE COUNTY CIVIL ACTION PAPERS CONCERNING LAND - PART I

Few early deed records survive for Wake County. When combined with the cessation of land grants from 1763-1778, we find a dearth of early Wake County land records. One interesting set of records that do survive (though not in their entirety) are Civil Action Papers (CAPs) Concerning Land. These are a subset of the CAPs series at the North Carolina State Archives in Raleigh. These are extant court papers where there was an issue concerning land. The originals can be found in C.R.099.325.93 (1773-1793). The surviving paperwork up to the year 1800 will eventually be abstracted and included in Wake Treasures.

You will note that the timing of many of these is in 1778. This would have been the first time that one could file for a land grant in about fifteen years. During those years, many moved to Wake County, made improvements on land, bought and sold land, and yet no land grants were issued. So, as soon as the land grant process was re-instituted by the State of NC, there were a lot of land grant entries made, and this caused a lot of caveats to also be filed.

WAKE COUNTY CIVIL ACTION PAPERS CONCERNING LAND - PART I

Abstracted by Diane L. Richard pg 8

Few early deed records survive for Wake County. When combined with the cessation of land grants from 1763-1778, we find a dearth of early Wake County land records. One interesting set of records that do survive (though not in their entirety) are Civil Action Papers (CAPs) Concerning Land. These are a subset of the CAPs series at the North Carolina State Archives in Raleigh. These are extant court papers where there was an issue concerning land. The originals can be found in C.R.099.325.93 (1773-1793). The surviving paperwork up to the year 1800 will eventually be abstracted and included in Wake Treasures.

You will note that the timing of many of these is in 1778. This would have been the first time that one could file for a land grant in about fifteen years. During those years, many moved to Wake County, made improvements on land, bought and sold land, and yet no land grants were issued. So, as soon as the land grant process was re-instituted by the State of NC, there were a lot of land grant entries made, and this caused a lot of caveats to also be filed.

On September 2, 1778, Shadrack Medlin was a witness to the sale of land by Willis Tant to William Fish in Bute County on the north side of Crooked Creek, adjoining Fish on the Mill Branch and to head of William Pace's Spring Branch.

In 1778, in Captain Ferrell's District in Bute County, Henry Tyler Medlin, Shadrach Medlin, Bradley Medlin, and Ryal Medlin took oaths of allegiance to the State of North Carolina to defend the independent government against King George III. This oath of allegiance qualified these Medlin (Medlen) patriots from Bute County to vote in elections.

The Earl of Bute had become very unpopular in the colony and his name created dishonor. In 1779, the North Carolina Legislature abolished Bute County and the area formerly known as Bute County was divided into Franklin and Warren Counties.

On January 29, 1779, Franklin County came into existence as the southern half of previous Bute County. This new county was named in honor of Benjamin Franklin, the very popular patriot statesman of Pennsylvania.

Henry Tyler Medlin, Shadrach Medlin, and Bradley Medlin were three Patriot soldiers from Franklin (formerly Bute/Granville) County, North Carolina that served in the Revolutionary War against Great Britain. After enlisting at Granville Court House, Henry and Shadrach Medlin served together in Captain Edward Yarborough's Company in the Revolutionary War.

Henry Tyler Medlin died in July 1781 from disease after marching to Charlotte. His son, John Medlin, was issued a military land grant in Montgomery County in 1820 for his father's military service.

In the pension application for Shadrach Medlin, aged 70, in Wake County Court on October 4, 1820, his wife Cloah is listed as age 67 and his granddaughter Rebecca is listed as being age 12 or 13.

Bradley Medlin was drafted in 1780 in Franklin County, North Carolina and served two tours as an American Revolutionary War soldier from 1780 to 1782 enlisting under Captain William Ferrell. Bradley Medlin and his descendants moved to Tennessee in 1793 where he received land grants for his service. He lived in Wilson County in 1832 when he applied for a pension and he moved to Madison County, Tennessee in 1839 where he died on August 18, 1843.

Bryant Medlin (Sr.) enlisted in Kinston, in Dobbs County (later Lenoir County), as a Volunteer in the N.C. Militia for three different periods totaling 15 months between 1775 and 1781 in the American Revolutionary War. Beginning with Captain John Garland's Company, Bryant Medlin drew musician's pay as both drummer and piper. This Medlin Patriot soldier fought in the Battle of Moore's Creek Bridge, North Carolina and the Battle of Stono at Charleston, South Carolina.

John Medlin, private from Moore County, enlisted in Moore County and served under the company commanded by Captain John McRae, according to his widow's application for pension. Nancy McKenzie Medlin, living in Scotts Hill, Tennessee, last filed for a pension on August 18, 1853 in Henderson County, Tennessee. She stated that she was married prior to 1794 to John Medlin in Moore County by Thomas Medlin, justice of the peace. Her several applications were all denied for lack of existence of proof of a service record in North Carolina.

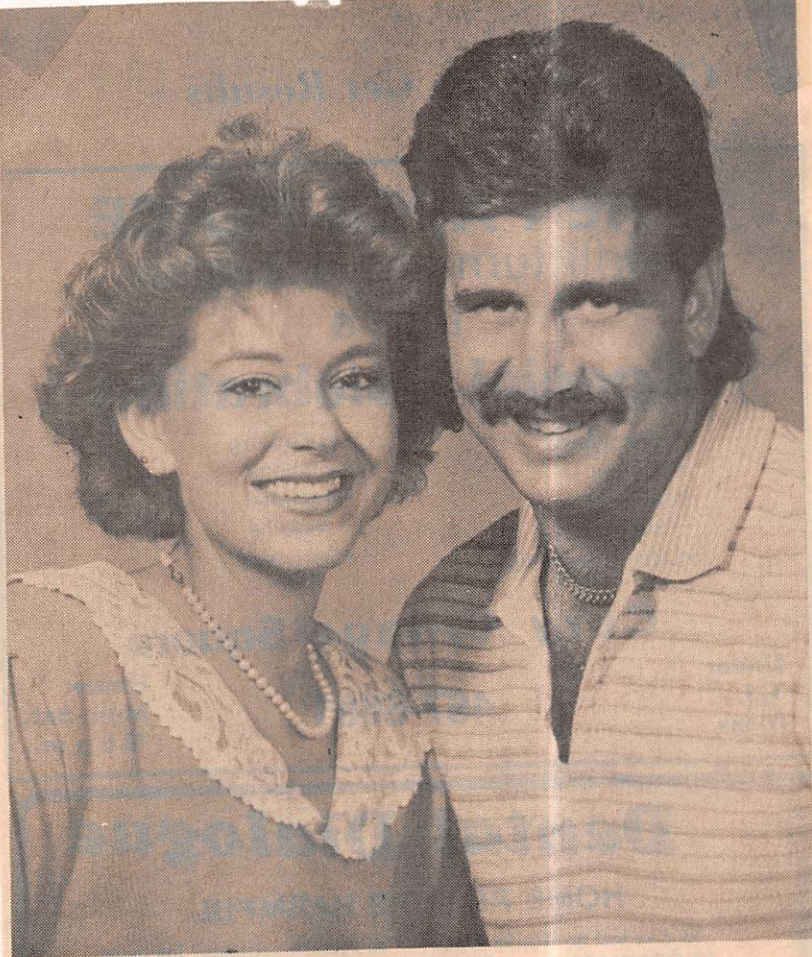

MRS. CORNELIA NORRIS

In the death of Mrs. Norris, the William Utley Memorial Association sustains a distinct loss. Three years ago at its organization, Mrs. Norris was present and was unanimously elected the genealogist of the Association. Many years of genealogical investigation amply qualified her for the difficult task. And the information she had gathered and distributed had enriched the minds of many relative to their ancestors, the places they came from and the family connections.

We deeply appreciate her services and the contributions she so unselfishly made in the most altruistic manner. And we the members of the William Utley Memorial Association hereby place on record, for permanent preservation, our high esteem of Mrs. Norris as a lady of culture and high character whose long and useful life was unselfishly devoted to her family, friends, and all who sought her services which she rendered gracefully and graciously and whose memory we will cherish always as one worthy of our fondest recollections.

Mrs. Norris was the daughter of the late Jessie Norris of Apex; and was born August 3, 1857. She therefore lacked only a few weeks of having reached her 78th birthday. For many years she had been a resident of Raleigh and an active member of the First Baptist Church. Her husband, the late M. T. Norris, preceded her in death by more than 25 years. She leaves three children (daughters), all of Raleigh, Mrs. J. K. Marshall, Mrs. James McKimmon and Mrs. J. L. Primrose.

Mrs. Norris was for many years a member of the Caswell-Nash Chapter of the Daughters of the American Revolution, had done much work along genealogical lines for the Chapter, and represented it frequently in Washington City. Her funeral was conducted by Dr. E. McNeil Poteat, pastor of the Pullen Memorial Baptist Church of Raleigh.

Home Work

One woman so inspired hundreds of others across the state that they gladly came together to donate hard-earned butter-and-egg money to build the Jane S. McKimmon Center.

From organizing tomato clubs to being the force behind a continuing education center at North Carolina State University, the women of the North Carolina Home Demonstration Clubs have had no problem getting the job done. Their energy and inspiration came from Jane S. McKimmon, the group's first director and North Carolina's first home demonstration agent.

Through this group's determination and McKimmon's foresight, thousands of women and men are educated each year in a learning center named in honor of McKimmon — one she never saw but dreamed of for decades.

Butter-and-egg money

Hundreds of women across the state were so strongly influenced by McKimmon that in 1951, members of the Home Demonstration Clubs pledged to raise money for a home demonstration building on or near the State College (now NCSU) campus. "Early on in their decision to raise money, they were looking for a building with several classrooms and a kitchen," explains John Cudd, retired senior associate vice-provost for the Division of Continuing Studies. "It became bigger than their dreams, which was good."

The members made a commitment to donate a portion of their "butter-and-egg" money toward the cost of the

building. The pledge amounted to \$2.50 per person — \$1 the first year and 50 cents a year for the next three years. "They were using the money they made using skills they had learned through the Home Demonstration Clubs," says Cudd.

Before McKimmon could see the goal reached, she died in 1957 at the age of 90. Nine years later, when the women donated \$100,000 of their "butter-and-egg" money to Chancellor John T. Caldwell, McKimmon's dream of having a large education facility dedicated to home demonstration came closer to reality.

When Bob Scott was elected governor in 1968, the women received added



“It’s fitting that this building is the place where North Carolinians from across the state come to continue to learn skills to advance their careers and enhance their lives,” says Dr. Denis Jackson, assistant vice chancellor and director of the center. “All those years McKimmon spent traveling the state to teach, she would appreciate that this is a facility where all North Carolinians can be taught.”

Rural roots

Born in Raleigh in 1867, McKimmon became the director of the women’s division of the Farmer’s Institute — a predecessor to the North Carolina Home Demonstration Agency — around 1909. Her job took her to very rural parts of the state where life was often hard for families. Her goal was to help rural women and girls learn how to improve their homes and their lives.

Journeys to teach rural women took McKimmon from coastal areas like Roanoke Island to western mountain communities like Franklin. On one such trip, she took on the challenge of teaching young farm girls how to make rolls. Once the dough was made, the young ladies took it home to cook for the evening meal. In her 1945 book, *When We’re Green We Grow*, McKimmon recalls that day: “I could not see the home ovens or note their temperature, but before the bread makers left, each had an opportunity to test the temperature by placing a piece of white paper in the oven. ... If the paper browned or burned in a minute, the oven was too hot. If it browned lightly in that time it was about right, but if the paper remained white the oven was not hot enough. Not at all an accurate method, but it was surprising how well those girls made use of the information and how well it served in baking.”

As she prepared to return to Raleigh, McKimmon asked the girls to mail her samples of their bread as they continued to practice. She writes, “The postman who delivered them to me said, ‘There surely have been a lot of little boxes in your mail, Mrs. McKimmon, and every one of them smells good.’”

McKimmon’s next-door neighbor also may have gotten a whiff of those rolls. Dr. I.O. Schaub, head of the Agricultural Extension Service at NCSU, saw the

support. The governor’s aunt had been one of the first agents McKimmon had hired when she became a home demonstration agent, so he understood the importance of this facility. Governor Scott helped move legislation through to fund the building. At the same time, the continuing education program at the college was in need of a central location for classes. In 1971, the General Assembly appropriated funds to build a center covering both needs, and five years later, the Jane S. McKimmon Center opened its doors.

“Three million people have attended an educational event at the McKimmon Center since it opened,” says Cudd. The first class held was “Utilizing Tax Laws to Your Advantage,” presented by Raleigh businessman Ted Pemberton. Over the years, the center became home to those improving education in plumbing, teaching, and computer programming. What originated as a place for women to gather to advance their home economics skills now has classrooms wired for Internet and international learning.

passion McKimmon had for her pupils and asked her to become the first North Carolina home demonstration agent (one of five in the nation).

McKimmon knew the first order of business would be to place county home demonstration agents throughout the state. She went to county commissioners and asked each to appoint an agent in their county. Fourteen counties stepped forward, and McKimmon started with those women and 416 white farm girls.

Knowing there were many more young ladies who could benefit from learning new skills in home economics, McKimmon sought ways to reach them. For several years, young boys had grown their own corn and sold it through the Farmer's Institute. She wrote, "Indeed, what farm boys did with an acre of corn revolutionized methods of production in the South, and both the self-confidence

and the pocketbooks of the boys benefited by the crops they produced." Seeing no reason why girls could not profit in the same manner by growing and canning tomatoes, she began the Tomato Clubs. Girls across the state would plant tomatoes, practice cultivation techniques, harvest their crop, and be taught how to can and sell their products. The goal for the girls was not just to learn how to can, but also to generate income for families.

The first canning classes for agents began in 1912, when the 14 agents came to Raleigh. McKimmon writes, "It was a three-day school: As I recall, after much hard work every woman went away convinced that she could blanch and peel a tomato, pack it in a sterilized tin can, and seal the can with skill."

What started as rural canning on farms across the state turned into an enterprising business for many women. Soon communities wanted to help local female entrepreneurs and began selling the canned goods in local stores. In Anson County, one sign read, "Why buy from Maryland when we can tomatoes here in Anson?" Under McKimmon's direction, North Carolina clubs were the first in the country to guarantee quality standards in this market.

Where to meet?

While McKimmon was director, the home demonstration clubs grew to 75,000 members (both black and white) representing all 100 counties. Once a year, McKimmon would gather all the agents at State College for two weeks of education on the most up-to-date home economics information. As the years went by, attendance expanded to include mothers and their daughters. Soon there were so many participants that the event moved to Reynolds Coliseum. It was evident by this time that the home demonstration program needed its own place to conduct meetings.


Ada Dalla-Pozza recalls those days as a young girl participating in her local 4-H club in Anson County learning how to decorate and landscape. "Not only would Mrs. McKimmon have all the home demonstration members come to State College, but she would have the 4-H'ers come, too. She was someone a young girl wanted to be like," she says.

Dalla-Pozza was so inspired by

McKimmon and her county home demonstration agent, Rosalind Redfern, that she studied home economics at the University of North Carolina at Greensboro and, after teaching for one year, became a 4-H agent with the Agricultural Extension Service. Later, she became the assistant director of Home Economics Extension after serving as a home economics agent in three districts. "Mrs. McKimmon was not only a part of my life when I was a young girl, but also when I was an adult," she says.

McKimmon continued to serve as the state home demonstration director until her retirement in 1937. During her tenure, she continued her own education by earning her bachelor's degree from State College in 1926 and her master's degree in 1929. After retiring, she continued to work as assistant director of the North Carolina Agricultural and Extension Service (1924-1946) and as head of the state's 4-H Clubs. She also received an honorary L.L.D (doctor of laws) degree from UNC.

At the Jane S. McKimmon Center, signs of the home demonstration clubs still exist. "Room 6 is the North Carolina Extension Homemakers Room," says Jackson. "Room 4, by the way, is named in honor of Ada Dalla-Pozza." And each summer, for one week, the center's atmosphere changes when the state 4-H Congress meets. "There is definitely a different kind of energy here then," he adds.

McKimmon would have been delighted to see so much energy being put to good use for learning. The woman who started with tomato clubs would love the idea that all North Carolinians have a place to come where learning never ends. "She was such a visionary," says Cudd, as he looks at her portrait at the end of the entrance hall. "She would be glad to know her vision continues to grow."

The Heartts made extensive changes in the appearance of the house, eliminating Italianate features and replacing them with columns across the front. The place is now owned by the State.

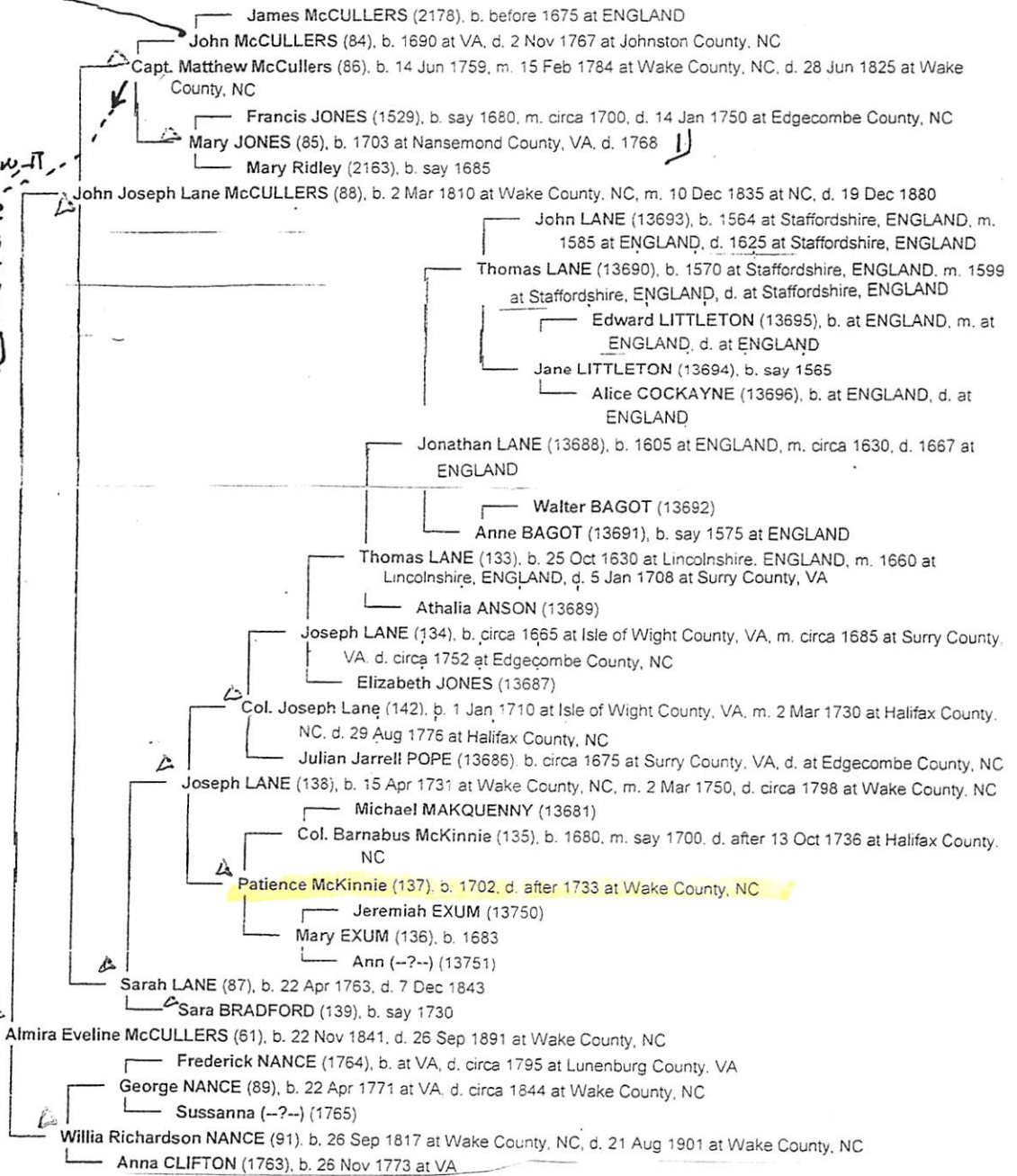

Dear Phil:

Marty and I are well. Our days have been full and fulfilling. Neither of us have engaged in any income producing activity, choosing instead to look after our families. We moved Marty's Dad and Mother into a house next door where we cared for both until Feb. of 91 when Mrs. Marshall died. Mr. Marshall continued to live next door for another year until his deteriorating mental health made it necessary to place him in a home. The home is close enough that we can closely monitor his care. We have decided not to sell the house next door until Mr. Marshall passes away or some other circumstance demands that we do so. That gives me two homes and two desert yards to maintain.

My mother lived alone in Montana until this summer. At the age of 95 her short term memory became so deficient that it was necessary to move her into a nursing home in Montana. I have been spending two or three weeks each spring fixing up her home and getting her settled in for the summer since I retired. This summer Mike and I went up and spent three weeks getting her situated in a home since she chose to stay in Billings among friends and other family. Here, there would have been only Marty, Mike and I.

Mike finished his 20 years in the Navy, retiring as a first class petty officer. He elected to go back to school to earn an electrical engineering degree. He lives at home and commutes to ASU. After 20 years in the service of his country, he was only eligible for one semester of GI Bill assistance as it was phased out. We are assisting him financially. We have also been funding his immediate costs for medical care since it takes up to six months for CHAMPUS and supplemental health insurance to reimburse those costs. We have, as needed, done the same for my mother and Marty's parents. It is unbelievable the bureaucracy of our 3100 health insurance companies, 15 of which I have personally had to deal with over the years. That has taken up a great amount of my time when about one in every three claims have required me to contact one or more times after filing to secure the payments we have been entitled to under the contracts. Surely a National Health Insurance could be no less efficient.

All of the above leave little time for volunteer work outside the family. Although we live comfortably, neither do we have the funds to support worthwhile causes that come to our attention and that is something I do regret; so you will understand why we have not been responsive to a number of opportunities the Arboretum and U of A have provided. As long as Marty and I pace ourselves, we get along pretty well physically and mentally. It was good to hear from you. We send our best to you and your family.
