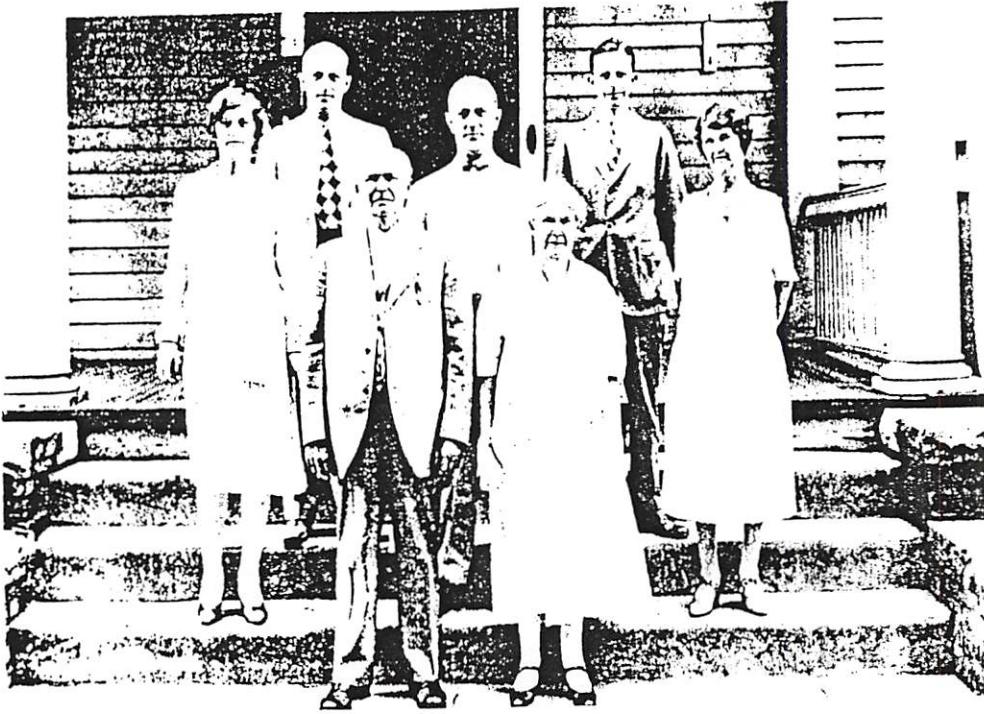

## ALBERT HENRY AND ELLIE (HARRISON) MOONEYHAM

557

Albert and Ellie Mooneyham were both born in Wake County near Falls of the Neuse. Albert Henry was born November 27, 1861, the son of Nancy (Williams), and Gaston Haywood Mooneyham. Ellie Louise was born May 19, 1861, the youngest daughter of Lauthy Ann (Lassiter) and Almira (Almy) Harrison. Albert moved to Raleigh as a young man, and for a number of years was associated with the firm of Dobbin and Ferrall. In 1918, while Raleigh was under the commission form of government, Albert was appointed Commissioner of Public Safety, filling an unexpired term. He then was elected to two successive terms.

After his retirement from the City Commission, Albert acquired an interest in the Mitchell Funeral Home, and served as its secretary until declining health curtailed his business activities. During his active years, he was a charter member of the Raleigh Civitan Club a member of the Travelers Aid Society, and President of the Associated Charities, until it merged with the Community Chest, and an active member of the Junior Order.

A major part of Albert's life was spent in the work of the Tabernacle Baptist Church, in Raleigh. He was on the board of deacons, and for 33 years he taught the Meredith College girl's Sunday School class.

An injury at the N.C. State Fairgrounds caused Ellie to be inactive for the rest of her life. This happened November 17, 1910. At this time, the State Fairgrounds were located in the area near what is now the Raleigh Little Theatre. It was aeroplane day, and thousands of persons watched the Glenn Curtis planes. The crowds were thrilled as the flights made by the two biplanes rose from the ground and made graceful flights of several minutes each, around the area. It was said that the machines attained a speed of close to 75 miles per hour. A car driven by a Mrs. Woolcott swerved, and ploughed into a crowd waiting to watch the aeroplane flights, resulting in injuries to five persons. The most seriously injured was Ellie.

Albert and Ellie had five children. Nancy Elizabeth (1885-1974), my mother, married William Edward Ellington, who was with the Internal Revenue Service, and the U.S. Customs Office for many years. Herbert Allen (1888-1953) married first to Willie Foster, who died in 1923, and later to Lil Utter. Herbert was President of Raleigh Tractor and Truck Company in Raleigh. James Albert (1890-1953) married Pattye Yearby. He was district manager of Southern Bell Telephone Company in Orlando, Florida. Peyton Harrison (1898-1950) married Emma Campbell and was associated with the Seaboard Railroad. Ellie Louise (1901-1935) married Edward H. Foley, a banker.

Ellie died January 3, 1938 and Albert died May 2, 1953. They are buried in Montlawn Cemetery, Raleigh.

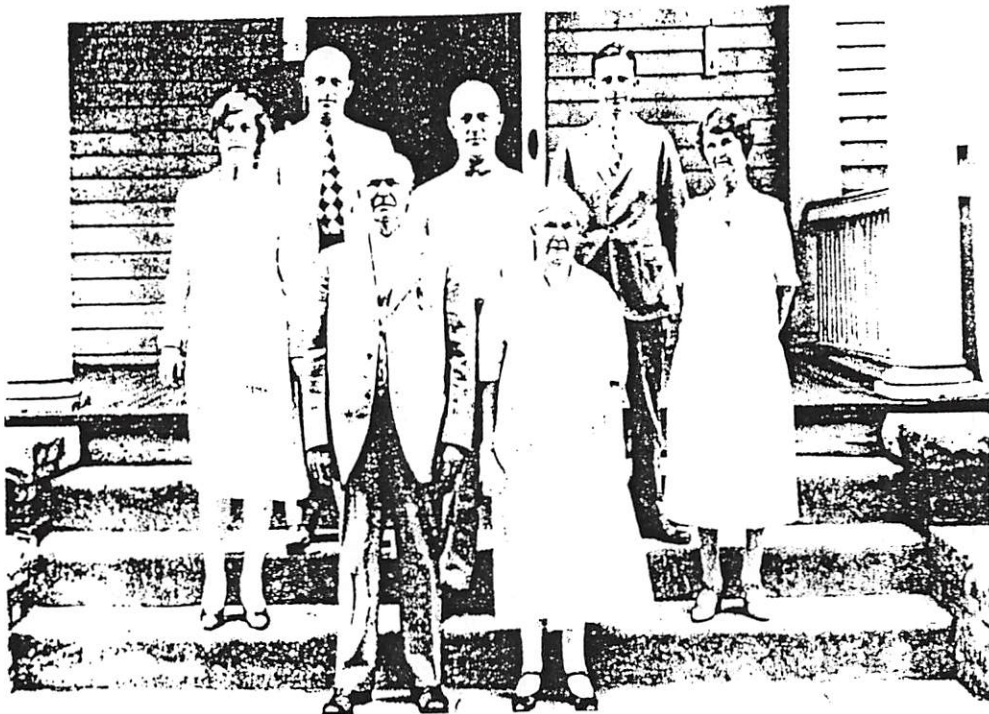

Albert and Ellie Mooneyham were both born in Wake County near Falls of the Neuse. Albert Henry was born November 27, 1861, the son of Nancy (Williams), and Gaston Haywood Mooneyham. Ellie Louise was born May 19, 1861, the youngest daughter of Lauthy Ann (Lassiter) and Almira (Almy) Harrison. Albert moved to Raleigh as a young man, and for a number of years was associated with the firm of Dobbin and Ferrall. In 1918, while Raleigh was under the commission form of government, Albert was appointed Commissioner of Public Safety, filling an unexpired term. He then was elected to two successive terms.

After his retirement from the City Commission, Albert acquired an interest in the Mitchell Funeral Home, and served as its secretary until declining health curtailed his business activities. During his active years, he was a charter member of the Raleigh Civitan Club a member of the Travelers Aid Society, and President of the Associated Charities, until it merged with the Community Chest, and an active member of the Junior Order.

A major part of Albert's life was spent in the work of the Tabernacle Baptist Church, in Raleigh. He was on the board of deacons, and for 33 years he taught the Meredith College girl's Sunday School class.

An injury at the N.C. State Fairgrounds caused Ellie to be inactive for the rest of her life. This happened November 17, 1910. At this time, the State Fairgrounds were located in the area near what is now the Raleigh Little Theatre. It was aeroplane day, and thousands of persons watched the Glenn Curtis planes. The crowds were thrilled as the flights made by the two biplanes rose from the ground and made graceful flights of several minutes each, around the area. It was said that the machines attained a speed of close to 75 miles per hour. A car driven by a Mrs. Woolcott swerved, and ploughed into a crowd waiting to watch the aeroplane flights, resulting in injuries to five persons. The most seriously injured was Ellie.

Albert and Ellie had five children. Nancy Elizabeth (1885-1974), my mother, married William Edward Ellington, who was with the Internal Revenue Service, and the U.S. Customs Office for many years. Herbert Allen (1888-1953) married first to Willie Foster, who died in 1923, and later to Lil Utter. Herbert was President of Raleigh Tractor and Truck Company in Raleigh. James Albert (1890-1953) married Pattye Yearby. He was district manager of Southern Bell Telephone Company in Orlando, Florida. Peyton Harrison (1898-1950) married Emma Campbell and was associated with the Seaboard Railroad. Ellie Louise (1901-1935) married Edward H. Foley, a banker.

Ellie died January 3, 1938 and Albert died May 2, 1953. They are buried in Montlawn Cemetery, Raleigh.

Forty-Seventh Regiment, Company C—Wake County—The first Captain of Company C was Edward HALL, who died 1 September, 1862, when Cameron T. IREDELL became Captain, was killed 3 July, 1863, and George M. WHITING became Captain, taken prisoner at Gettysburg and died after the war of disease contracted in prison. The Lieutenants of this company were Nathaniel L. BROWN, David M. WHITAKER, Marmaduke W. NORFLEET and A. H. HARRIS.

Forty-Seventh Regiment, Company E—Wake County—John H. NORWOOD was the first and only Captain of Company E. Its Lieutenants were Erastus H. RAY, Benj. W. JUSTICE, promoted A. C. S. of the regiment; Leonidas W. ROBERTSON and William A. DUNN.

Forty-Seventh Regiment, Company H—Wake County—Charles T. HAUGHTON, first Captain of Company H, died in June, 1863, when Lieutenant Sydney W. MITCHELL became Captain and was, to the close of the war. Its Lieutenants were T. L. LASSITER, Sydney A. HINTON, J. D. NEWSOM and John T. WOMBLE.

Forty-Seventh Regiment, Company I—Wake County—I. W. BROWN was the first Captain of Company I, and killed at Reams Station. Its Lieutenants were Charles C. LOVEJOY, transferred to another regiment; William Henry HARRISON, J. Wiley JONES and J. Rowan ROGERS, a brother of the first Colonel of the regiment.

### Pages 111-112

2 April, 1865. ...I wish it was so that I could meet some of those of the Forty-seventh who were at the final scene when General LEE surrendered, but I have met only two, Lieutenant J. Willie JONES, of Company I, and Corporal Rufus SANDERS of Company C, who are now living in Wake county. After 2 April the Forty-seventh had very few men but its organization was kept up till General LEE surrendered. On the 2<sup>d</sup> the Forty-seventh was bringing up the rear of General LEE's shattered heroes and here it was that with the larger portion of the remaining members of the Forty-seventh I was captured. I had orders when placed in charge of the skirmishers of the Forty-seventh Regiment on that day to hold our position at all hazards. The enemy was never able to break through my skirmish line, but it was completely surrounded and we were captured by the enemy coming from our rear. Gaston H. MOONEYHAM, a private of Company E, Forty-seventh Regiment, who is now living in Barton's Creek Township, this county, was with me when I was captured and stood manfully by me in this fight, the last fight we made for the Confederacy.

The Moneyhams were early settlers of Wake

County. Thomas acquired 136 acres of land on the East side of Reedy Branch, off Marks Creek in 1779. He died a few years later, leaving three children. By 1784, his estate had been settled. Robert Traywick was granted custody of William, then 10 years old, to be taught to be a blacksmith-planter; and James, then eight years old, to be taught to be a sadler; and Nancy, six years old, was apprenticed to George Traywick until she reached the age of 18. Jacob Mooneyham acquired 150 acres of land on the South side of Indian Branch (Marks Creek) in 1778.

The 1850 census of Wake County, St. Matthews District, lists Matthew, farmer, and his wife Martha. Their children are Gaston, Paschal, Catherine, John and Addison.

Gaston Haywood Mooneyham married Nancy Campbell Williams June 22, 1858. Their children were Albert Henry, who married Ellie Louise Harrison; Fannie, who married Tom Brown; Annie, who married Sam Daniels; Martha, who married Vee Winfree; Jennie, who married Rosis Winfree, and Millie, who married John Carter.

On February 27, 1862, Gaston enlisted in Company E. 47th Regiment, Wake County, of the Confederate Army. He fought at Gettysburg in July 1863. The forty-seventh was captured on April 2, 1865 about five miles west of Petersburg, Virginia. J. Rowan Rogers wrote on April 9, 1901, "The enemy was never able to break through my skirmish line, but it was completely surrounded and we were captured by the enemy coming from the rear. Gaston H. Mooneyham, who is now living in Barton's Creek Township, this county, was with me when I was captured and stood manfully by me in this fight, the last fight we made for the Confederacy." This was copied from page 112, "Histories of the Several Regiments and Battalions from North Carolina in the Great War 1861-1865, Vol. III. These men were imprisoned in New York before returning home.

My brother Bill tells how Great-grandfather Gaston let him touch and move a bullet, that lodged in his shoulder during a Civil War battle. The bullet was never removed, but it apparently caused no problem.

Nancy Williams Mooneyham died May 30, 1915, and she is buried in the Millbrook United Methodist Church Cemetery, Wake County. Gaston lived his last years with his son Albert in Raleigh, and he died October 25, 1920. He is buried in the cemetery of the old Mt. Vernon Baptist Church.

# Generations of confederate veterans work

## to keep memories from fading

Gen. Douglas MacArthur's most memorable remark is "Old soldiers never die, they just fade away."

The Sons of Confederate Veterans (SCV) are working to make sure that doesn't happen to their ancestors' memory. To be a member, candidates must show lineage from a Confederate soldier or political leader.

Carl Eason, commander of the Apex camp, had at least four relatives who saw some of the heaviest action in the war, two on his mother's side of the family, and two on his father's side.

William Terry and Henry Mooneyham came from the Swift Creek area in Wake County. Apex wasn't even a town, then.

Each served in the infantry and saw action at Fredricksburg, Chancellorsville, the Wilderness campaign and Gettysburg.

"They dug trenches and did the walking," Eason said.

They served in the 6th N.C. regiment, Company I. The "bloody 6th," who fought in the First Battle of Bull Run, Eason said.

The SCV named their camp the 6th, in honor of those who served.

At Gettysburg Eason's ancestors took part in Pickett's charge, where they fought an uphill battle against deadly Union muskets and canons.

A small group of Confederates actually took a portion of the wall defending the hill, but most were cut down or captured, despite capturing a Union canon.

"They didn't have enough men to hold the position," Eason said.

"They went the farthest of any group of men at Gettysburg, and were among the last to surrender at Appomattox," Eason said.

All of his ancestors survived to return to Wake and Johnston Counties after the war, despite rampant dysentery that killed more soldiers than gunfire.

Eason said the area has much more history that is becoming forgotten, and it is his group's mission to make sure folks remember.

Gen. William T. Sherman's men occupied the Morrisville/Holly Springs area, Eason said.

North Carolina was spared much of the destruction that Sherman inflicted on South Carolina and Georgia during his march to the sea, Eason added.

Because of that, North Carolina's state records are surprisingly accurate. Sherman burned most capitol buildings in Georgia and South Carolina, destroying the records inside.

During the march to the sea Sherman and his men destroyed a 60-mile swathe of land, burning fields and mills, and killing livestock and wildlife.

"Sherman called total war total hell, but he made war against innocent women and children," Eason said.

In this area, Sherman's men tried to burn Yates Mill Pond, on Lake Willow Road, Eason said. The men threw torches into the mill, then left. Citizens took quick action to put out the fire.

"You can still see the burn marks," Eason said.

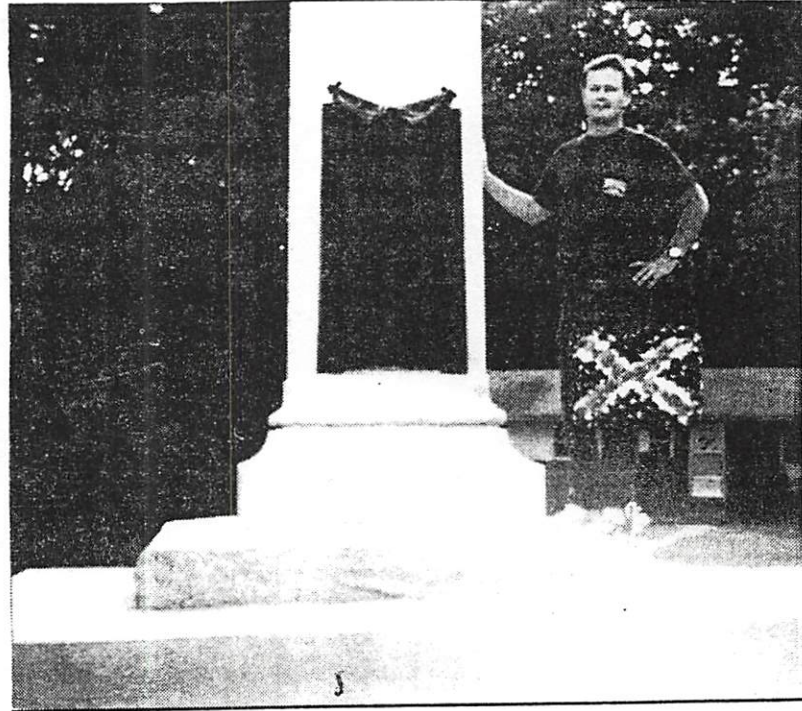
Sherman justified his actions by saying he was destroying the enemy's ability to make war.

But Sherman captured North Carolina's records and sent them to Washington D.C., Eason said. Therefore, many North Carolinians can trace their heritage, Eason added.

"North Carolina records are probably some of the best there is," Eason said. "North Carolina records are pretty accurate."

Eason also has another good source of information, his mother and father. Eason's father, who is 93, still remembers talking to Confederate veterans as a little boy. His mother, who is in her 70s, also remembers.

"There's a lot of stuff we're losing," Eason said.

Understandably, Sherman is not very popular with the SCV, which is why they protested and eventually stopped plans to erect a monument in his honor near Bentonville.

The SCV argued that public money and public lands should not be used if Confederate memorials are not given equal treatment.

Confederate memorials erected by the SCV are bought with private money and put on private land, Eason said.

Eason said he fights for Confederate monuments because no one else will.

"If the flag goes, the monuments will be next," he said.

Eason reveres the Confederate flag for its historical value, and disparages its use by racist organizations.

"We're not a hate group," he said. "In fact, in 1992, the SCV adopted a resolution condemning the flag's use by the Ku Klux Klan, neo-Nazi and other hate groups."

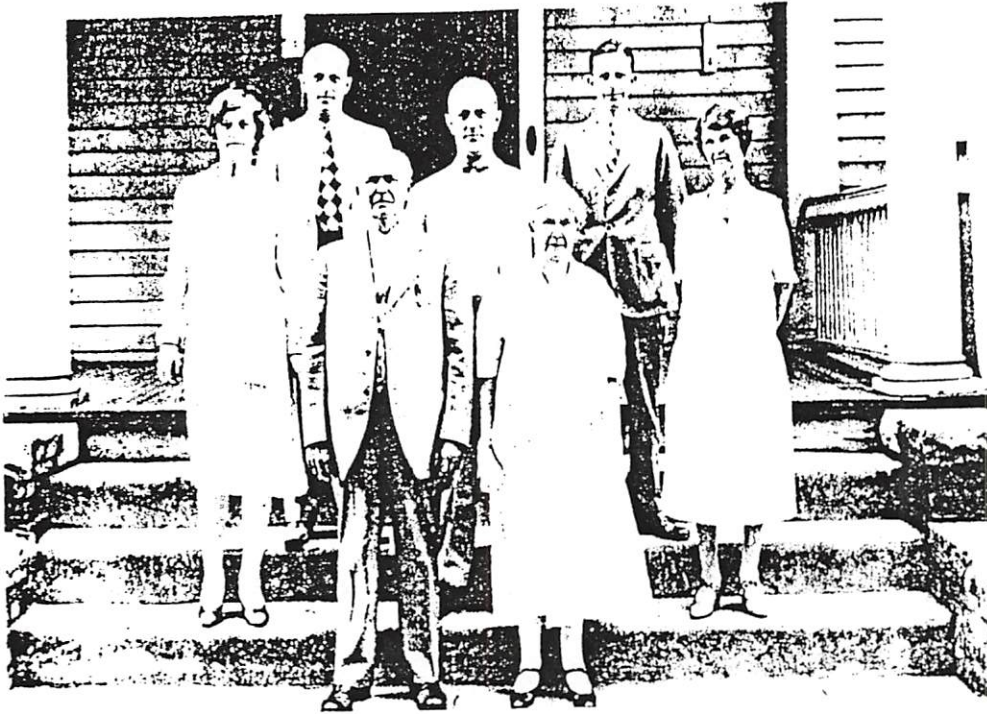

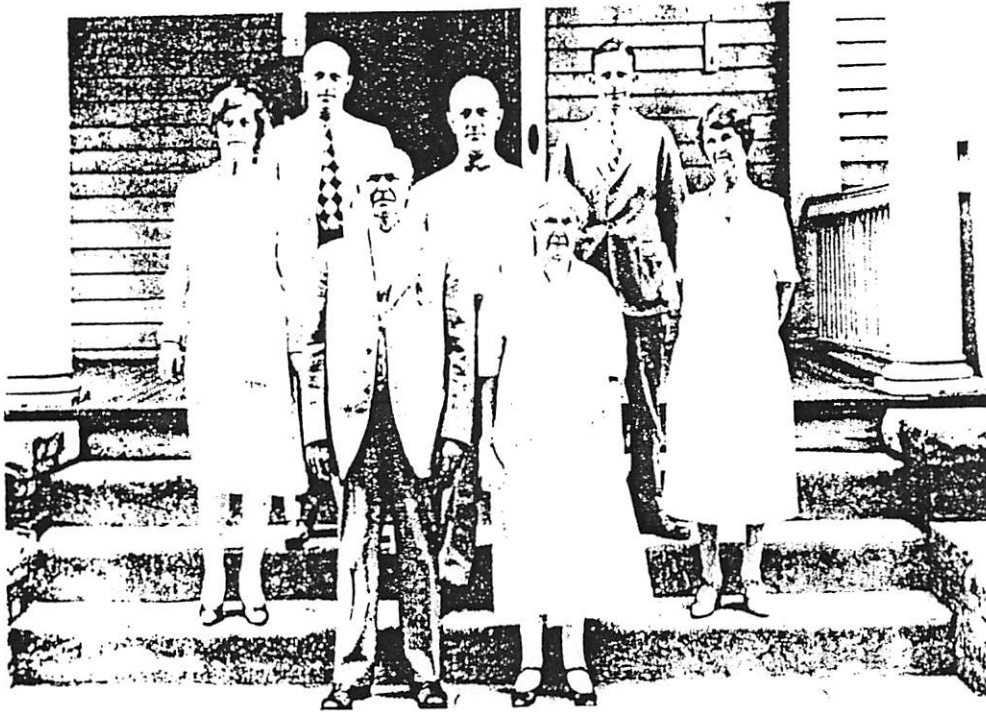

When Charlie Herndon Edwards was a small boy, the Civil War was in progress. According to his daughter, Evelyn Grant, there was a powder mill located on a branch — about where Glenwood Village is located today — and he helped carry water from the branch to the mill. One day there was an explosion at the mill, while Charlie had gone to get water, and several men were killed.

It appears that Elizabeth Reid Murray may have been referring to the same accident on page 469 in her book, *Wake: Capital County of North Carolina*. In discussing the effort to provide arms and ammunition in the Civil War, she referred to the North Carolina General Assembly offering assistance to those who would construct a powder factory. Accepting the challenge, George B. Waterhouse and Michael Bowes built a powder mill "on House Creek near its entry into Crabtree Creek", Mrs. Murray wrote. "The mill was partially destroyed in June 1862 by an accidental explosion that was 'easily heard in town' and that killed four employees. The victims were Matthew Moonham, Albert Warren, William H. Struce, and a young Mr. Riggs or Riggsbee", Mrs. Murray recorded.

If the incident which Charlie Edwards observed took place in June 1862, he would have been a mere lad not quite seven years old. Certainly, an explosion of this type, which killed several people, remained in his mind for a lifetime.

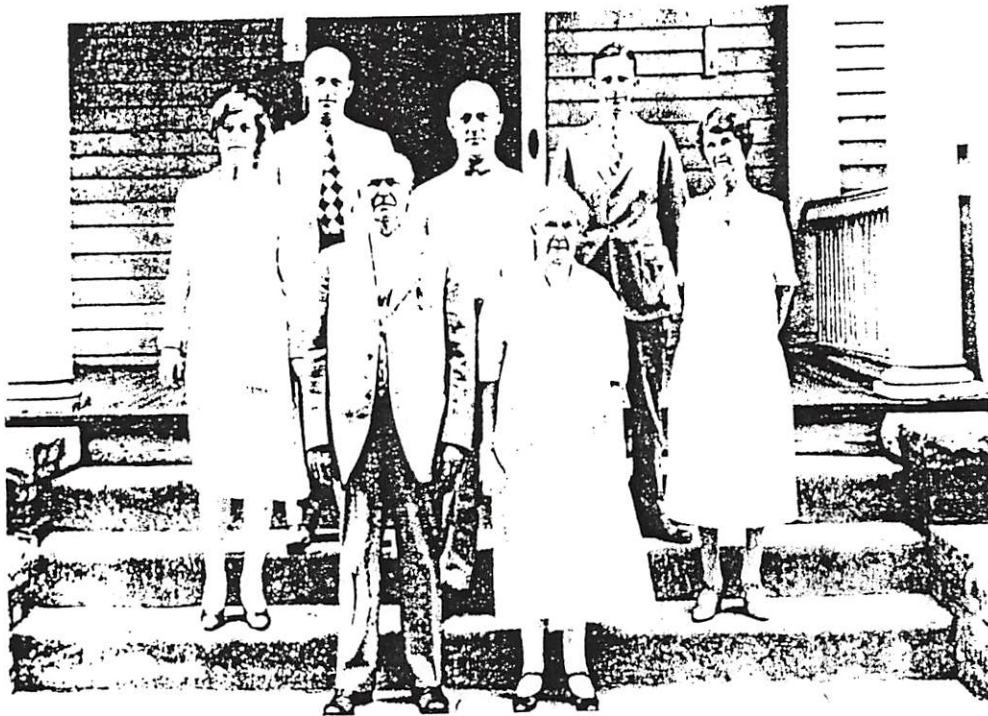

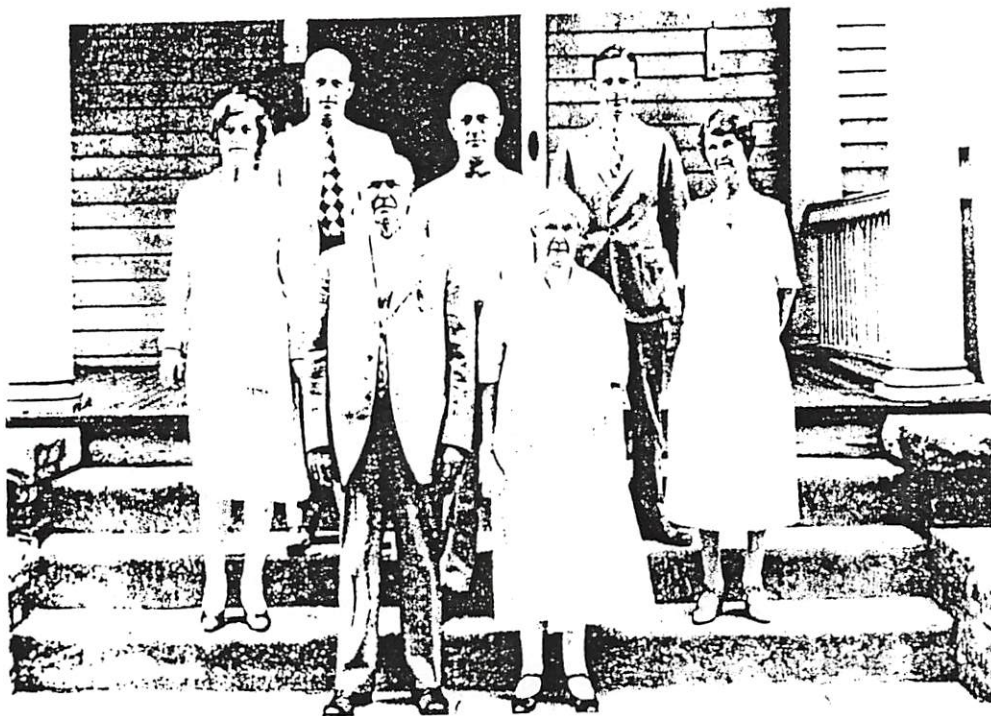
