Zebulon Woman's Club notes 75 years of service

For 75 years, the Zebulon Woman's Club has been "serving, learning, and enjoying." This month, the club is enjoying its 75th birthday.

The Zebulon Woman's Club was born April 7, 1924, but its roots go back to 1923 when a group of civic-minded Zebulon ladies organized the Civic League to improve what they saw as deplorable conditions in town.

The women met in the home of Mrs. S.W. Harris on Gannon Avenue where they, according to the notes of first club President Mrs. J.D. Davis, "worked together for the common good of all to make Zebulon the 'Biggest and Best Little Town on Earth.'"

In her annual report at the end of the Civic League's first year, Davis stated:

"Now let's just see what we have done during 1923. We were instrumental in having 100 oak trees set. We put on a special cleanup campaign and had 85 loads of rubbish and garbage hauled out of town. We established a playground which kept many children off the streets. We secured for the summer months a traveling library which was fairly devoured by the children and some grown people.

"We nagged at the school board until they provided firefighting equipment for the school, but yet we have no fire escape. Bulbs and vines have been planted around the light plant and the depot.

"In recognition of our petition, the railroad company painted our depot. With the help of our county farm and home demonstration agents, we put on a community fair which our community felt proud of. We petitioned the commissioners to put hogs out of town. We petitioned the highway commission to put a hard surface road through our town and we were the means of establishing a headquarters for our night police."

Club member and former President (1989-91) Cleo Perry said the women were so concerned about continuing their good work that they contacted Palmar Jarman of the Raleigh Woman's Club to speak to them about the advantages of being a federated club. After hearing Jarman, the group met in the Town Hall and organized the Wakelon Woman's Club.

The Civic League was disbanded and its funds were turned over to the new club. Eighteen women formed this group 75 years ago with Mrs. E.H. Moser as the first president.

Earl H. Moser Jr., 79, of Camarillo, Calif., formerly of Zebulon, died Wednesday, Oct. 20.

Moser was a 1930 graduate of Wakelon High School. He received a bachelor's degree in civil engineering from North Carolina State University. He was retired from the U.S. Naval Civil Engineering Laboratory in Port Hueneme, Calif., where he had been director of the Polar Division and later the Navy Environmental Protection Division for the Pacific.

He directed experimental work on the Greenland ice cap and later on Antarctica. During the course of his work, he was one of the few persons to visit both the north and south magnetic poles. In 1960, he was chosen to prepare the roads and parking lots in the Sierra Mountains for the Winter Olympics in Squaw Valley, Calif.

Surviving: brother, Rom Moser of Zebulon; nephews, Bill Moser of Zebulon, Steve Moser of Winston-Salem.

Moser announces candidacy

Commissioner Rom Moser announced Monday that he intended to seek another four-year term on the Zebulon Town Board.

"It has been an honor for me to serve the people of Zebulon as a commissioner for the past four years," he said in a prepared statement. "I am proud to have helped start work on some of our long neglected problems — the brown water engineering study which promises to ... improve the quality of our water ... improvements to our cemetery after years of neglect and moving to build a much larger wastewater treatment plant that

will open new doors for expansion of Zebulon. ...

"We are starting on a new Public Works Building in a way that will save thousands of dollars ... (and) the new recreational park that we are building will greatly increase the enjoyment of recreation in Zebulon," he continued.

Although Moser has yet to formally file as a candidate, he said he wanted to announce his intentions to seek re-election.

"Most important, all of these improvements and many others, like the money we have set aside to improve our streets after the water study is completed, have been accomplished without any increase in our town tax rates," Moser said. "This comes at a time when other towns in Wake County raised taxes last year and again this year. I am proud that Zebulon now has the lowest rates in Wake County in spite of all of our many programs and improvements."

Moser added that he wanted to be able to continue the work that the present administration has initiated.

Commissioner Grace Kilkelly,

whose term also expires this year, said Monday that she planned to announce her intentions in another week or so. She did not have a prepared statement at the present time and had not yet made a decision on her candidacy.

Zebulon Mayor Frank Wall announced two weeks ago that he would not be seeking re-election to a third term as mayor.

The filing period ends at noon on Friday, Aug. 4. Elections are slated for Nov. 7.
