466 THE CARPENTER FAMILY

The Carpenter family of North Carolina traces its family heritage back to the late 1700's to Nash County. On October 25, 1782, Thomas Carpenter was the first of his family to move to North Carolina. Research indicates that Thomas may have moved from Virginia and served as a Revolutionary soldier for North Carolina. After the war, Thomas purchased 314 acres of property on the waters of Moccasin Creek in Nash County. Thomas married Mary Lee Leigh. Thomas and Mary had a son named John Carpenter. John married Elizabeth Upchurch and had a son named Simeon Carpenter.

John and his family lived on Moccasin Creek in Franklin County, North Carolina. John later moved his family to Green Co., Alabama, where he died sometime around 1836 to 1838. Simeon continued to reside in Nash County and in 1840, Simeon married Martha Bunn (1st wife) and later married Cynthia Gay Brantley. Simeon and Cynthia had a son named Granberry (Berry) Carpenter. Berry married Eliza Ann Moss and they had a son named Granberry Jackson (Jack) Carpenter, who married Ida Pearl Poland. Granberry Jackson (Jack) and Pearl had two sons, which were Otis Lee Carpenter and Winslow Carpenter. They also had four daughters which were, Nina, Ida Clrene and Christine. Otis Lee married Dorothy Bessie Taylor Carpenter and had a son named Harry Lee Carpenter. Otis and Dorothy purchased property in the Sandy Cross area of Nash Co., where Dorothy continued to reside until her death in 2005. Harry Lee Carpenter married Ella Gwendell (Dell) Poland in 1962. Dell was the daughter of the late James Elmer Poland and Lessie Odell Winstead Poland. Harry and Dell purchased property from Dorothy and continued to reside in the Sandy Cross area. They had four children, which were Lynne Carpenter Spencer, Angie Carpenter Page, Harry Lee Carpenter, Jr. and Mark Carpenter. This branch of the Carpenter family continues to reside in Nash Co. At the present, Mr. & Mrs. Harry Lee Carpenter Sr. have a total of 10 grandchildren.

The Carpenter family were primarily farmers up to the point of Otis Lee Carpenter. Otis served in the U.S. Army. He was wounded in the line of duty in Austria on May 16, 1945 and died on May 17, 1945. Members of this family have entered into various fields of work such as business and professional employees, self-employment, healthcare services, teaching and blue collar workers.

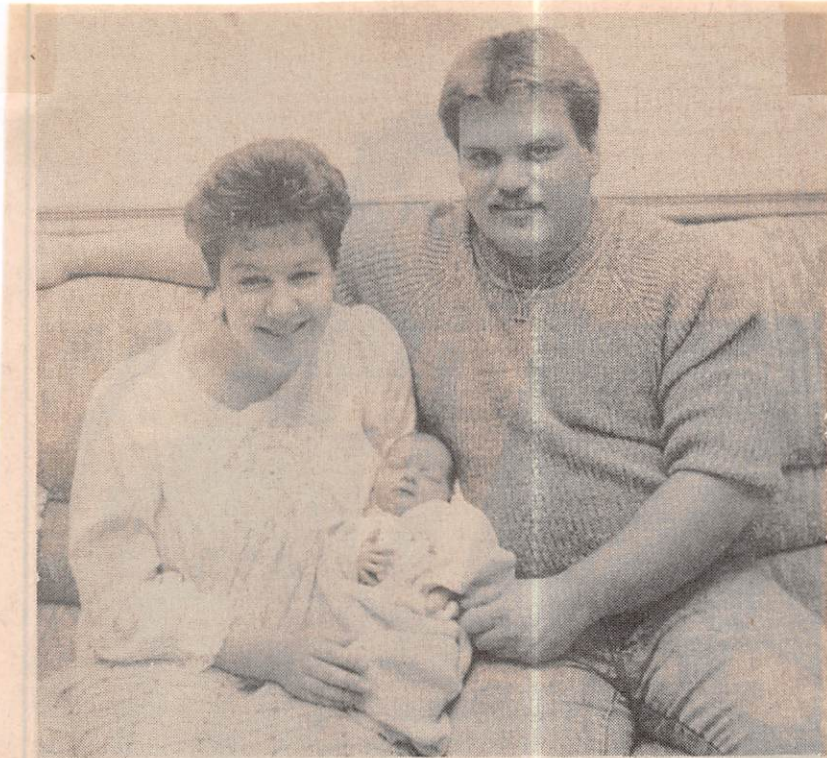

## 650 RANSOM EATON GILL

Ransom Eaton Gill, the son of Thomas Ezra and Alice Lee Davis Gill, was born May 28, 1845, and died January 20, 1890. He resided in Franklin County, near Franklinton. He served as a soldier in the Confederate Army Junior Reserves. Ransom Eaton Gill married Laura Richardson Taylor, daughter of Jesse Ford and Ann Eliza Taylor, on May 15, 1877. The wedding ceremony was performed at her home, Sonora Oaks, Raleigh, N. C. by Dr. Prichard. Laura Taylor was born May 12, 1854, and died August 10, 1932. She was voted the most beautiful girl in school by her classmates at Baptist Seminary.

N. Y. Gulley, who later became dean of the Wake Forest College Law Department, served as Ransom Gill's attorney. In a letter written to

Annie Gill Harris, a daughter of Ransom Gill, he described Ransom as "a man of genuine worth," "energetic and diligent in business." He wrote that Ransom was successful and always willing to lend money to those in need. Ransom Eaton Gill and his family were members of Perry's Chapel Church.

Ransom and Laura Gill had five children. Jesse Weston Gill, born June 7, 1878, married **Loula Moss**. Hubert Seaton Gill, born May 26, 1880, married Dixie Taylor Dunn. Allie B. Gill, born June 15, 1882, married Claud D. Taylor. Royal Joseph Gill, born October 26, 1884,

never married. Annie Laura Gill, born October 16, 1886, married James A. Harris. Ransom Eaton Gill, Jr. born April 9, 1889, never married.

Ransom Gill was serving on jury duty in Louisburg in January, 1890. He started home with another juror, and then went by Clifton's Store for a few purchases. He did not return home that night from jury duty. His family did not worry because they thought he had been detained by jury duty. He was found murdered the next day near Ebenezer Church. He had been shot with a bullet through his head. His horse had been unhitched from the buggy and was found tied to a tree nearby. In Mr. Gulley's letter he indicated the position of the body, and the ground on which it lay, indicated that he had probably been moved to that spot from where he had been shot. His hat was lying on the ground, but since it had a bullet hole through it, it was probably on his head when he was shot. Since he had money in his pocket, robbery was not considered a motive. According to the *News and Observer*, there was "no clue to the murderer." After his death, Ransom's wife moved with her family to near Raleigh in Wake County where she lived until her death in 1932. Zollie was a farmer all his life. He had a country store on what is now Johnson Town Rd. near Pearces. This was a gathering place for the men to talk and play checkers or cards. There was a large mule-drawn cider mill located on the farm with a cider loft built over it. The loft had a big yellow apple painted on the barn-red structure. This was used to make cider and vinegar. Other families would bring their apples to be ground for cider and vinegar, also.

Zollie never learned to drive and until 1937 when he bought his first truck, his means of travel was by mule and wagon and his work was by mule and plow. The family raised their own food: hogs for meat; cows for meat, milk, and butter; chickens for meat and eggs; and all vegetables were canned. Wheat and corn was carried to a mill to trade for flour and corn meal.

Most of the family still lives in Franklin County. Many live in the Pearces and Bunn Community. Zollie died in 1963. Lillie lived with her son, Pete, until her death in 1985. Both Zollie and Lillie are buried in the Pearce Baptist Church Cemetery.

# Zebulon teen, two classmates mourned

Flowers and mementos adorning lockers bid farewell to three Southern Nash High School students killed last week in a car crash.

The teen-agers — driver Reagan Moss, 17, of Nashville; Mandy Baker, 17, of Zebulon; and Amanda Hamm, 15, of Sharpsburg — died Thursday after Moss' car ran off N.C. 97 and hit a bridge railing. The fatal wreck occurred at the narrow Turkey Creek bridge near Samaria.

Deborah Baker, 15, Mandy Baker's sister, survived the accident. Deborah Baker, who has regained consciousness and is talking, was listed in fair condition Monday at Duke University Medical Center's intensive care unit.

The students were on their way to school when the accident occurred at 7:20 a.m. The fatal wreck shocked students and faculty at the high school.

Nearly a week after the crash, according to Principal Tommy Finch, attendance is low due to the accident. For those coming to school, everything is on "slow motion."

## after crash

"We're here, but we're not doing what we're supposed to do," he said. Finch added that many students are gathering in the hallways to console each other and remember their friends. Counselors were brought in last week for teachers and students dealing with grief.

"It's been difficult for students and staff alike," Finch said.

Although the three students were not involved in many high school clubs, according to Finch, they

were "ordinary, good folks." All were popular with classmates.

Funerals for Moss and Mandy Baker, who was Moss' girlfriend, were held Saturday. Hamm was buried on Sunday.

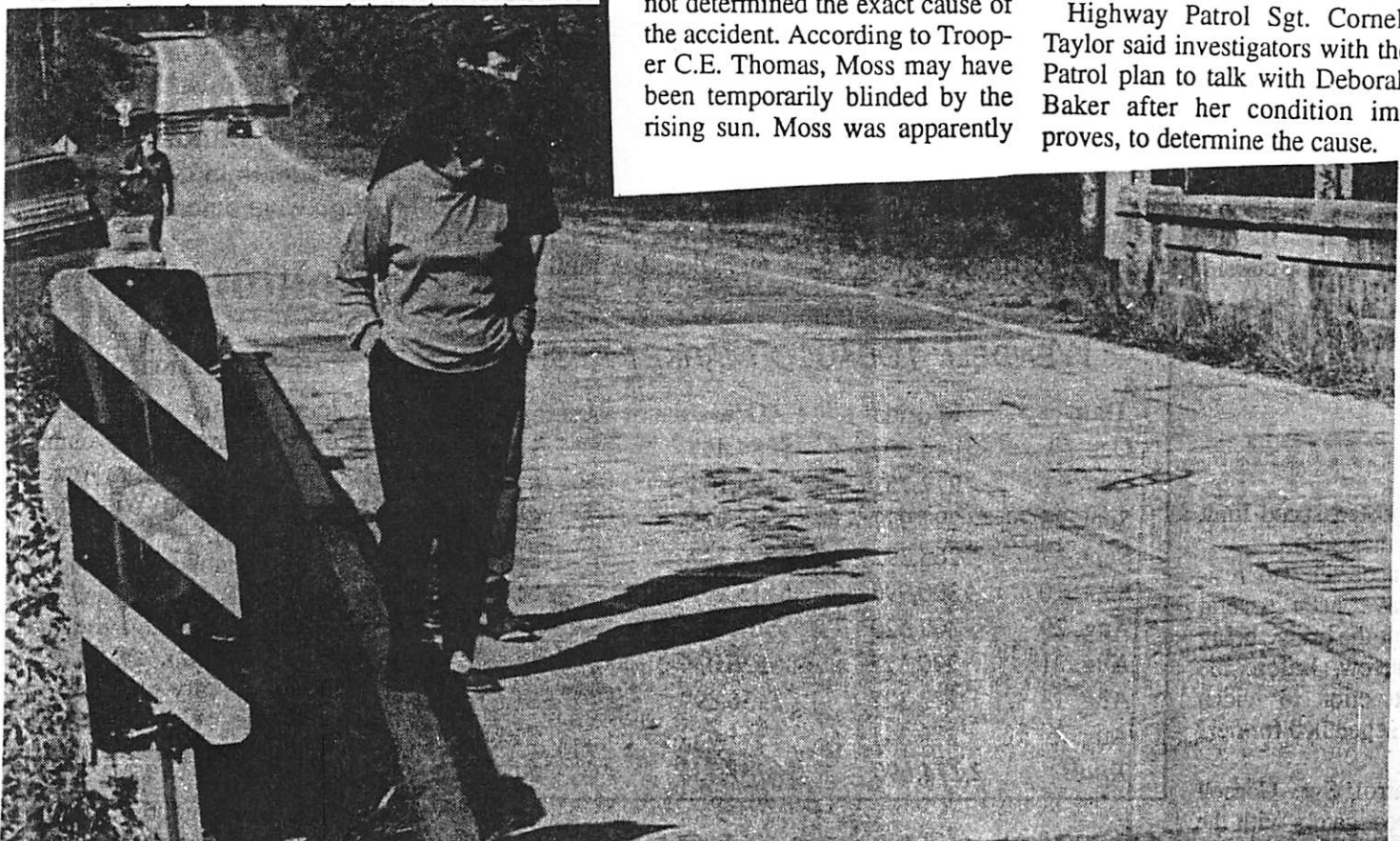
The state Highway Patrol has not determined the exact cause of the accident. According to Trooper C.E. Thomas, Moss may have been temporarily blinded by the rising sun. Moss was apparently

following the posted speed limit of 55 mph, Thomas added.

In the past, according to residents, there have been several complaints about the bridge being dangerously narrow. Before the accident, construction to widen the bridge was scheduled for next year.

Highway Patrol Sgt. Cornell Taylor said investigators with the Patrol plan to talk with Deborah Baker after her condition improves, to determine the cause.
