### **MURRAY UPCHURCH** $\underline{Pg-1}$ XID - 14

COMMENTARY: This biofile for Murray Upchurch, one of the sons of Moses Upchurch, head of Clan 1, provides critical information on this stalwart citizen of Chatham County, North Carolina. He was born in 1797 in Dunn Township in Franklin County, NC some five years before his father moved his entire family to Chatham in 1803. It was here that Murray would live out the remainder of his days. We are especially well informed about Murray Upchurch as Belle West, in her 1972 book, *The Upchurch Family*, took great care in dealing with her ancestor, Murray. This biofile should be considered in context with the aforementioned book.

[poss a daughter of <u>Murray U.</u> - RPU] Entries for <u>Murray</u> were 16 Apr 1827, Jun, Aug 1827 and Feb, Mar, Apr 1828.

<u>MURRY UPCHURCH</u>, son of MOSES and Mary (Simms) UPCHURCH, was born 01 Nov 1797, in Franklin County, N. C.. While still young, sometime before 1810, he moved with his family to Chatham County, N. C., where his father had bought a rather large acreage. No facts of his youth are known, but he presumably grew up engaged in the growing of tobacco, along with his many brothers and sisters.

On 23 Aug 1820 <u>MURRY</u> married Nancy Scott, (b 29 Nov 1801 d 26 July 1864) daughter of John and Rachel (Baucom) Scott of Wake County, N. C.

On 10 Jan 1826 <u>MURRY</u> bought 160 acres of land from his father, MOSES UPCHURCH, for \$250., "on Clifton's Spring Branch . . . RUFFIN UPCHURCH'S corner . . . . Hugh McLane's corner." (CHATHAM COUNTY DEED BK. A - A/60) In Feb 1849, <u>Murry</u> bought 100 acres from his brother, SIMS UPCHURCH, (CHATHAM CO. DEED BK. A - A/60)

The 1850 U. S. census of Chatham County, N. C. listed <u>MURRY'S</u> age as 52 and Nancy's as 48, with four children still living at home.

The 1860 census gave <u>MURRY'S</u> age as 63 and Nancy's as 59. In their household, according to the census, still lived their daughters, Mary, aged 23 and Clara, aged 19. This same census showed, also, Nancy Carson, widow, aged 25, who was probably a helper in the household. Nancy (Scott) Upchurch died 06 July 1864, and <u>MURRY</u> married Nancy Carson.

The date of Nancy (Carson) UPCHURCH'S death is not known, but she left a will dated 22 Nov 1869, leaving the property she had inherited from her first husband to her Carson children. (CHATHAM CO., N. C. WILL BK. E/45).

<u>MURRY UPCHURCH</u> married as his third wife, Sallie Temples, on 01 March 1870, in Chatham County, N. C.

<u>MURRY</u> died suddenly on the 19<sup>th</sup> of March 1872 in a neighborhood store. His will was dated 06 April 1870, and is abstracted below:

"To my beloved wife, Salie – 75 acres of land, including the homestead, adjoining the lands of SIMS UPCHURCH, Welthy, Elkins, and H. Melton, as long as she shall live, or her widowhood; bedstead, one wheel and cards, cooking utensils, one year provision to be set aside and given to her by my executor.

To my daughter, CLARY – one cow and calf, one walnut folding table, one side saddle.

I give and devise to my son PASCHALL'S children one note that I hold against the said Paschall.

I give and devise to my daughter ELIZABETH LAWRNCE'S children . . . one hundred dollars.

I give and devise to my son, ISHAM, the sum of one dollar.

It is my will that twenty-five dollars taken out of my daughter RACHEL'S children part and then for them to share equal with the rest.

It is my will that my executor rent my land until he, in his judgement shall see fit to sell it for cash or credit, and he shall sell all my personal property and divide equally, between my daughters; MARTHA ELIZABETH'S CHILDREN, EMALEY, PASCHALL'S CHILDREN, MARY and CLARY.

Lastly, I hereby constitute and appoint Aderson Council by lawful Executor."

From the MURRY UPCHURCH Family Bible, which cannot be found at this date, comes the following information of the names and birth dates of the children of MURRY and Nancy (Scott) UPCHURCH. This was, fortunately, copied from the Bible, on 12 Feb 1888, by the late Philip Nelson Foushee (son-in-law of MURRY UPCHURCH), at the request of ISHAM SIMS UPCHURCH, a son of MURRY, and was found among the papers of ISHAM SIMS UPCHURCH after his death. The additional information of the names of the spouses was furnished by ORA (UPCHURCH) LEWTER, Deceased. MARTHA UPCHURCH (b 03 Aug 1821) m Simeon Yates. ELIZABETH UPCHURCH (b 17 Jan 1823) m Pat Lawrence. ISOM (ISHAM) UPCHURCH (b 31 Dec 1824 d 03 April 1916) m 23 Dec 1851 Adelia Beavers (b 08 March 1832 d 24 Sept 1893) (13 children – see full story this book). JOHN H. UPCHURCH (b 24 Oct 1826) never married. EMMALA UPCHURCH (b 07 Dec 1828) m Addison Council. We drove south on Hwy 751 from the H. O. Kelly Place (Adelia residence) and just south of the Nursery on the west side of the road, Adelia pointed out the Mulholland Place which Adelia says was the place where Moses U. and his son Sims U. were buried in now unmarked graves. Adelia calls this the Sims U. place – but at another place in the notes she indicates that <u>Murray U.</u>, another son of Moses U. was buried with Moses and Sims and as a conflict she refers to this as the <u>Murray U.</u> Place. Adelia says a distant relative of Moses U. authorized the plowing over of the graves. The Mulholland's are apparently sensitive to many visits.

## WILL OF MURRY UPCHURCH

I <u>Murry Upchurch</u> of the County of Chatham and State of North Carolina being of sound mind and memory, but considering the uncertainty of my earthly existence, do make and declare this my last will & testament in manner & form following that is to say:

First – That my executor (hereinafter named) shall provide for my body a decent burial, suitable to the wishes of my relations & friends, and pay all funeral expences, together with my just debts howsoever & to whomsoever owing, out of the moneys that may first come into his hands as a part or parcel of my estate.

Item. I give & devise to my beloved wife Salie – Seventy – five acres of land including the homestead joining the land of Sims, Upchurch; Welthy, Elkins; & H. Metton to have & to hold so long as she may live on it or her widowhood one beadsitd, bead & furniture (her choise) one wheel & cards, cooking utentials, one year provision to be set apart & given to her by my executor.

Item..- I give & devise to my daughter Clary, one cow and calf, one walnut folding table, one side saddle, this I want to give to my sid daughter Clary in order to make her up even with my other children, to have & to hold forever.

Item. - I give & devise to my son Paschal's children one note that I hold against my said son Paschal in full of there part of my estate.

Item. - I give & devise to my daughter Elizabeth, Laurence children first - that one hundred Dollars, be taken from there part & then for them to shear alike with my other children.

Item. - I give & devise to my son Isham, the sum of one Dollar as his full share of my estate to have & to hold forever.

Item. - It is my will that twenty-five dollars be taken out of my daughter Rashal children part & then for them to share equal with the rest.

Item. - It is my will that my executor rent my land until he in his Judgment shall see fit to sell it for cash or credit & that he shall sell all of my personal property and devide it equally between my daughters Martha, Elizabeth children, Emaley, Rachel children, Mary & Clary.

Item. - & Lastly - I do hereby constitute & appoint Aderson Council my lawful executor to all intents & purposes to execute this my last will & testament according to the true intent and meaning of the same & every part & clause thereof hereby revoking and declaring utterly void all other wills or testaments by me made heretofore. In witness whereof I the said Murry Upchurch, do set my hand & seal this the 6th Day of April 1870.
