Julian thought his name was on a stone marker but later Mark & I looked & found the stone marker but it was for Ramsgate. [△]Peter Williams later lived in the Ransom Hinton Home

[△] Julian says my father's good friend had a he Kennedy Raynor Myatt who ran a Dairy on the east side of 401 at the Airport. The Cotton Gin was on the west side of the road. The land westward was [△]MYATT Land south of here was [△]WILLIAMS land

Re NCSU [△]McCullers Station. It originally belonged to Dr McCullers. Julian sold NCSU the 7 1/2 Acres next to Ten Ten & 401. Julian knew [△]Bill Allbrook the Supr. & [△]Joe Rand who worked under him as foreman.

There is a [△]Cemetery near the Runtan Bld.

Cotton was the main crop in the area until Bell weevil became serious then tobacco came in.

There was a school at [△]McCullers

III. Article 3 - History

- △△ Catawba Springs was organized and first pastored by Abel Olive in the year 1802 under the name of Pleasant Springs Church. The members were to be known as 'Christians and were to acknowledge Christ as the head of the church.
- △ Alexander Myatt was the first deacon and served until 1827.
- △ In 1871 the church decided to move two miles west of its original location to a more central meeting place. Dr. Allen

Adams donated a lot and small house to the church and the name was changed to Catawba Springs Christian Church. After renovation and use for nearly 30 years, the house was sold to the county and moved for use as a school house, at which time the church constructed a new building. This frame structure was expanded over the years with the addition of right and left Sunday School wings. Following the frame church's destruction by fire in 1946, the present brick auditorium and classroom building was completed in 1948, with a new wing being added in 1979.

- △ From the year 1802 to 1911, 23 men served as pastor of Catawba. J. Lee Johnson served the church from 1911 until 1949. It was under his leadership that Catawba Springs voted in May of 1937 to withdraw from membership in the Congregational Christian Church Conference of North Carolina, due to the growing apostasy of the newly merged denomination. Franklin Pierce pastored from 1950 until 1980.
- △ Lacy Frye was called as pastor the next year and served until 1986. In 1986 Pastor Bud Steadman began his ministry at Catawba Springs. HE PASTORED THE CHURCH
- △ UNTIL 1995. IN 1997 CHUCK WOODRUFF BECAME PASTOR AND IS THERE TODAY.

The earliest settlers had no religious opportunities. [△] Catawba Springs is, so far as we know, the oldest church in the vicinity. In 1700, a few miles out from Raleigh, the patriot army was collecting; perhaps the point was Hunter's Lodge, recently the residence of Mr. [△] Benson Hinton. Among the soldiers was a young man from Virginia, [△] the Rev. Jesse Lee, a Methodist minister, who, like a Quaker, objected to fighting. His strenuous objections led him first into trouble, getting in the guard house. [△] Then [△] Lee to preach and his sermon to the soldiers is thought to have been the first Methodist sermon delivered in Wake County. Later that year the famous Bishop Asbury passed through Wake on the way to Orange.

CATAWBA SPRINGS CHURCH:

For nearly seventy years the name was [△] Pleasant Springs; and was located some two miles east of the present church in what, for a long time was a Union Church house. The present site and name were agreed on about 1870. In this connection it may be of interest to note that at the close of the Civil War there were forty-four colored members who were then dismissed.

Charter male members in 1802 were [△] Alexander Myatt, [△] Anthony Franks, Sr., [△] John Utley, [△] Lewis Franks, [△] Nimrod Myatt, and [△] Jacob Utley. Charter lady members in 1802 were [△] Patsy Myatt, [△] Nancy Myatt, [△] Mary Utley, [△] Tilitha Utley, [△] Mariah Utley, [△] Ann Franks, [△] Ferebe Pinkston, [△] Rebecca Seagroves, [△] Patsy Seagroves, [△] Eliza Perry, [△] Mary Utley of John, [△] Mary Utley, [△] Polly Ann Utley, [△] Margaret Woodward, [△] Elizabeth Brown, [△] Winnsfred Austin, and [△] Sarah Edwards. Additions in 1803 were [△] Little John Utley, [△] Anderson Taylor, [△] Jonathan Utley, [△] Green Austin, [△] James Woodward, [△] Alfred Hamilton, [△] T. Honeycutt, [△] Peter Pinkston, [△] Isaac Penny, [△] Lewis Franks, Jr., [△] Henderson Perry, [△] Grey Utley, [△] Eldridge Austin, [△] T. Woodward, and [△] Anthony Franks, Jr.

Let me call attention to two of the Utleys who joined in 1803. Jonathan Utley was a first cousin to Little John. Jonathan Utley died in 1862, having been clerk of the church for more than twenty years. He was succeeded as clerk by his son [△] Alexander Utley, father-in-law of Mr. Tom Council.

No children were listed in the 1860 census but Lutetia was listed as being 33 yrs of age so she may have been born as late as 1827.

- Δ 1. WILLIAM K¹ GOODWIN was born in 1739. He married Winnifred Threadfill in 1763 at Wake County, North Carolina. [Source: Goodwin Family Lineage; <http://home.cfl.rr.com/tjgood/Goodwin.htm>]. He died in 1837 at Wake County, North Carolina, [Wake County death].

William was a Regulator and a private in the Revolutionary War fighting in the Walker (Wake) County of the North Carolina Battalion enlisting in 1777 and later reenlisting (according to membership application for the Daughters of the American Revolution by Virginia Helie Cobb in 1946). He lived in Chatham County, North Carolina. On 1 June 1783 William sold for "18 pounds specie" 30 acres "lying on both sides of Swift Creek" to John Myatt, Sr. The land was adjacent to land Myatt already owned. [Wake County Deed Book F pg. 277, found in the abstracts on pg. 19]. On 17 February 1808 William received a warrant and certificate for "125 acres of vacant land in Wake County on the waters of Big Beaver Creek, Joining the lands of Howell Olives, Joseph Taylor Esquire, his own, and the county line between Wake and Chatham. E. Holding, E.T." [pg. 498 Wake County, North Carolina deeds found on pg. 159 in the abstracts of Wake County deeds]. On 13 November 1810 the state of North Carolina gave [grant #866] William a tract of 68 3/4 acres on the waters of Big Beaver Creek adjoining the Chatham County line, said Goodwin, Howell Olive and Taylor. This was entered in the Wake County Deed Book K 17 February 1808 on page 299. [Found in abstracts of Wake County Deeds, pg. 123]. In 1830 a person named William Goodwin is shown living in St. Matthews township in Wake County. He owns no land or slaves but did pay a poll tax with his total taxes being 70 cents. [Wake County, North Carolina Census and Tax List Abstracts 1830 and 1840 compiled by Frances Holloway Wynne 1985 available in the Olivia Raney Library, 4016 Cara Drive, Raleigh, NC 27610].

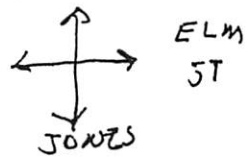

This article refers to colonial era ancestors of the family as shown below. However, the exact linkage of these venerable ancestors to the later generations is not made clear.

The maternal grandfather of their mother was ^ΔMark Myatt^Δ, a brave officer, prominent citizen, and Justice in the Inferior Court of Wake County. ^ΔHe^Δ marched with the Company of Ebenezer Folsom, as a sergeant, engaging in the battle of Moore's Creek Bridge. Later ^Δhe^Δ was made Lieutenant in Captain Wood's Company, Troop of Horsemen, Colonel Malmedy's Regiment, and served with distinction.

^ΔAnother great grandfather was Shadrack Barker, a staunch patriot, who took up arms in defense of American independence.

^ΔGeneral Joseph Lane I of Edgecomb County, N.C., was a famous soldier of colonial times and a third great grandfather.

Other kinsmen were noted in military and state history as generals, governor of state (Governor Swain), U.S. senators, and court justices.

Margot, I looked up the name Isaac Beckwith in Watson's Wake Co deed abstract book. I didn't find him. However, I did find that an "Isaac Beckworth" purchased land in Wake Co [Wake DB Q:67]. The abstract reads "William Barker Sr of Wake Co to Isaac Beckworth of same, June 30, 1798, for 15 pounds, a tract of 100 acres lying on the waters of Little White Oak Cr adjoining James Holland, Bolin Beckworth, Arthur Wood, Sampson Holland, and Etheldred Jones. Wit: William Bridges, Britain Utley". Note the adjacent property names. This tract is in the same general area as the Enoch Booker grant previously discussed. I suspect that "Isaac Beckworth" may actually be "Isaac Beckwith" with a spelling or transcription change.

△

The tract of land mentioned in the deed is also very close to the Green Family holdings. I would note the following. If Green Beckwith owned land in 1846, he had to have been at least 21 years old, and be b. before 1826. The Revolutionary War soldier you mentioned is most probably General Nathaniel Greene. He was b. 1742 and d. 1786. FYI, Green's Path passes through western Johnston Co and is shown on the 1770 John Collet map. It is believed to have been named for a preacher in the early part of the 18th century. Any of these could have been a source for the first name of Green Beckwith. Of course, it may also have been something entirely different.

△

In the 18th c. Granville grants were limited to 700 A. Grants from the State of NC, were limited to 640 A. There are only a few exceptions, e.g., prominent citizens and officials. Some larger grants were issued for Revolutionary War service in the NC military preserve, located in several parts of present day Tennessee. All that said, an individual could obtain multiple grants and could make other purchases from neighbors. This allowed him to accumulate large holdings. For example, the Etheldred Jones mentioned in the above grant accumulated some 12,000 A in southern Wake Co from some 20+ grants. Also, I've just finished a piece of work on the Mark Myatt holdings, also in southern Wake Co. Some 20+ smaller grants were aggregated into a single 7,000+ A tract, which was then divided amongst his six children.

Consider not the spelling: Where there are recorded land grants, deeds,
and wills, there is various spelling on the same page - Johnstone, Jon-
son, Johnson - and our forefather Tapley Johnson's name is spelled every
way it could be spelled, including Tarpley - Taply, Tapply, Taple, Tapley,
and Tappley. And the spelling Johnston was used more frequently until
about 1800; the spelling without the "T" was more often used after that
date.

Tapley Johnston's name appears first in Johnston County in 1786, "on the
20th of October...Joseph Irby for the sum of 80 £...sold unto the said
Taple Johnson a certain tract or parcel of land lying in the County of
Johnston on both sides of Black Creek containing 800 acres. Witness:
Mark Myatt".

County on Cooper's Branch...issued in 1789 by Governor Samuel Johnston.
The Grant had been entered in 1780. And subsequently there are five
other Grants to him totaling 1265 acres - on Hughes Creek, Hectors Creek,
Buies Creek, Neils' Creek, Thornton's Creek, Mill Creek (now Avents
Creek), Little Creek and Black River, - through the year 1807. During
that period of twenty years, it is recorded that he acquired by Grant
and deed 3653 acres of land near the waters of the Cape Fear, in the vi-
cinity that is now Averasboro, Erwin, Buies Creek, Lillington, Cokesbury
and Kipling. *

There appears no sale, but in the years 1814 and 1818 he deeds land to
his four children - William, Tapley, Jr., Sarah, and Betsy.

He like other men of ability in his day was appointed to select and build
ferry crossing on the Cape Fear, to lay out and overseer roads, to prove
deeds or wills; serve as Superior Court Juror at Wilmington, as bonds-
man and other like services that were common in his day.

We do not know when or where he married Lydia Matthews, but the story
is told of his proposal. Lydia was putting down a hoe cake on the

griddle over some coals on the hearth. The inspiration for a practical
helpful wife overtook him and he patted her shoulder and said, "Lydia,
will you have me?" Lydia patted the bread and replied, "Hush Tapley,
hush!" And the patting pursued with, "O, Lydia, won't you have me?"
and "Hush, Tapley, hush!" until the bread was all patted into the fire...
when they faced their embarrassment, they laughed and decided to stop
fencing with each other and face life together.

To this union we have a record of four children - two boys and two girls.
William who married Goodin Carter; Elizabeth married Jesse Branch, but
lived only a short time. Sarah married Joel Prince, and the youngest
child, Tapley Ormond Johnson, Jr., married Mary (Polly) Atkins.

The earliest settlers had no religious opportunities. Catawba Springs is, so far as we know, the oldest church in the vicinity. In 1790, a few miles out from Raleigh, the patriot army was collecting; perhaps the point was Hunter's Lodge, recently the residence of Mr. Hanson Hinton. Among the soldiers was a young man from Virginia, the Rev. Jesse Lee, a Methodist minister, who, like a Quaker, objected to fighting. His strenuous objections led him first into trouble, getting in the guard house. Then Lee to preach and his sermon to the soldiers is thought to have been the first Methodist sermon delivered in Wake County. Later that year the famous Bishop Asbury passed through Wake on the way to Orange.

CATAWBA SPRINGS CHURCH:

For nearly seventy years the name was Pleasant Springs; and was located some two miles east of the present church in what, for a long time was a Union Church house. The present site and name were agreed on about 1870. In this connection it may be of interest to note that at the close of the Civil War there were forty-four colored members who were then dismissed.

Charter male members in 1802 were Alexander Myatt, Anthony Franks, Sr., John Utley, Lewis Franks, Nimrod Myatt, and Jacob Utley. Charter lady members in 1802 were Patsy Myatt, Nancy Myatt, Mary Utley, Tilitha Utley, Mariah Utley, Anny Franks, Ferebe Pinkston, Rebecca Seagroves, Patsy Seagroves, Eliza Perry, Mary Utley of John, Mary Utley, Polly Ann Utley, Margaret Woodward, Elizabeth Brown, Winnifred Austin, and Sarah Edwards. Additions in 1803 were Little John Utley, Anderson Taylor, Jonathan Utley, Green Austin, James Woodward, Alfred Hamilton, T. Honeycutt, Peter Pinkston, Isaac Penny, Lewis Franks, Jr., Henderson Perry, Grey Utley, Eldridge Austin, T. Woodward, and Anthony Franks, Jr.

Let me call attention to two of the Utleys who joined in 1803. Jonathan Utley was a first cousin to Little John. Jonathan Utley died in 1862, having been clerk of the church for more than twenty years. He was succeeded as clerk by his son Alexander Utley, father-in-law of Mr. Tom Council.

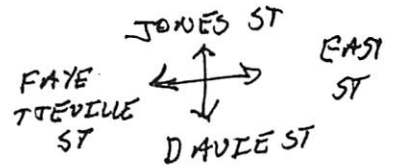

MYRES, W. A. Private

Enlisted in Lenoir County on 10 February 1864, for
 the war. Deserted at Winchester, Virginia, 1
 September 1864.

The company, known as "Cedar Forks Rifles," was
 from Wake and Chatham Counties and enlisted in
 Wake County on 28 May 1861. It went into the camp
 of instruction near Company Shops (Burlington),
 Alamance County, 1 June 1861, and was assigned to
 this regiment [Sixth Regiment] as Company I.
 After joining the regiment, the company functioned as
 a part of the regiment, and its history for the war
 period is recorded as a part of the regimental history.

The information contained in the following roster of
 the company was compiled principally from company
 muster rolls for 20 June 1861, through February 1864,
 and 15 September through December 1864. No
 company muster rolls were found for the period prior
 to 20 June 1861; for March through 14 September
 1864; or for the period after December 1864. In
 addition to the company muster rolls, Roll of Honor
 records, receipt rolls, hospital records, prisoner of war
 records, and other primary records, supplemented by
 state pension applications, United Daughters of the
 Confederacy records, and postwar rosters and
 histories, all provided useful information.
