Nancy Upchurch XID-55845

Commentary: Nancy Upchurch was born in 1817 in Chatham County, NC and died there in 1885. She was the daughter of Whitney Upchurch and the granddaughter of Moses Upchurch, head of Upchurch Clan #1. She married William James Hobby/Hobbie and their daughter Araminta married David Burns, the son of Silas Burns.

This Biofile begs for amplification. It should lead to more details for the Moses/Whitney Upchurch Tree. For this we are thankful for cooperator Billie Rita Adams. More research is needed for the clarification of the Hobby/Hobbie surname.

There is a hint here of a broader story to tell concerning Silas Burns. He was the father-in-law of Araminta, the daughter of Nancy and William. This Silas was notable as the founder of Peden Steel in Raleigh, NC. He was also an absentee owner of 50 acre tract on Tryon Road in Rhamkatte which has a little known, yet important history, the telling of which is planned.

I really am fascinated with your census data! I've learned from this that my great great grandmother Nancy Upchurch Hobbie not only raised her own 5 children as a single parent, but also must have cared for her granddaughter W. Ethel Burns after the child's mother, Araminta Hobbie Burns died at age 25. Ethel's father David Burns remarried (Dora Boykin), but I have no info about them except the names of their 2 sons, Owen Parker Burns (b 23 Aug 1884 and died 1928 Charleston, SC) and Paul Burns. I'm curious who raised Ethel's older sister Nina Burns (who died of diphtheria while a student at Peace College). This Burns line has eluded me for years! David's parents, Silas and Lydia Dunn Burns, came to Raleigh, in 1834 from Massachusetts, for Silas to do iron work on the capitol that was under construction. They are both buried in the old City Cemetery, and the Iron fence that surrounds that cemetery is the one that once surrounded Union Square...Burns manufactured it in the foundry he established. I'll send you my profiles for these folks along with copies of photos of Araminta and David Burns.



This is the inscription on her tombstone in memory of our Mother **N. A. Hobbie**, daughter of the late Whitney Upchurch Died April 13, 1888. In the 71st year of her age. Blessed are the dead which die in the Lord.

Nancy Upchurch Hobbie is buried near several Upchurch graves including Adelaide Jenks Upchurch (2/20/1858 - 2/14/1936); Martha A. Upchurch (11/12/1832 - 1915); William A. Upchurch (5/4/1858 - 2/5/1889) and Carell Upchurch (9/30/1884 - 11/19/188-?)

(I had some correspondence in 1957 with the D.A.R. and with Etta Belle Lewter West in Detroit, Michigan concerning the Upchurch line. Several women had joined the D.A.R. on the Moses Upchurch record/line. His wife was Mary Simms. According to the D.A.R. records, Moses Upchurch had a son, Whitney Upchurch (his wife was Elizabeth Goodwin), born in 1793. The Wake County census for 1830 shows Whitney Upchurch and in his household there is one male between 30 and 40 years old; thus it is possible this is the Whitney who was born in 1793.)

 - 2. [A] Shows William and Nancy with 2 young children in 1850



- 3. [B] Shows Nancy as Head of Household in 1860 with 5 small children ages 5 12. The "N. D." is probably a misprint and should be "N.A.". "E.B." = Baxter; L.V.R. = Araminta; J.A = a new female of the family; A.M.= Antoinette; L.D = Jason Dexter.
- 4. William and Nancy presumably separated after the birth of Dexter in 1856. They eventually divorced See [G] re: "divorced"
- 5. I have been unable to locate William in the 1860 census
- 6. [E] Shows William has married "Leasy" his 3rd wife. Presumably the children 2-5 are of this 3rd marriage.
- 7. [D] Shows Nancy as head of household in 1870 with two of her 5 children present. Note that Dexter is in the home.
- 8. [F] Is a puzzle. Here we see Dexter listed for the 2nd time on the 1870 census (this sometimes happens). He is in school. The head of the household on the original census seems to be clearly Preston Parson and his wife is clearly Nancy not Haney. The fact that she was born almost makes her a fit to be Nancy A. [Upchurch] Hobby in a 2nd marriage but on balance I think not. In 1880 Nancy appears as Nancy Hobby See [G].
- 9. [C] I brought this 1870 census record forward thinking it might bear upon the family of William and Nancy if so it is indirect.
- 10. The records for [B] and [E] interestingly are right next door to Benjamin Upchurch. This Benjamin Upchurch descended from Calvin Upchurch of Franklin County, NC, son of Jubal Upchurch, I. Calvin and Nancy's father Whitney were 1st cousins. Thus Benjamin and Nancy were 2nd cousins but their ancestors had parted ways in 1802. If they knew they were 2nd cousins, it was not a big deal. A puzzle is how Nancy headed a household in 1860 next to Benjamin and William headed a household in 1870 next to Benjamin. It could have been the same home with Nancy leaving between 1860 and 1870 while William returned with his new wife and family.
