Nash man killed in family feud

The stabbing death of a Nash County man left three of his relatives behind bars last week following a domestic quarrel near Lucama.

Charles "Chuck" E. Narron, 30, of Route 3, Middlesex, was pronounced dead Jan. 14 at Wilson Memorial Hospital with multiple cuts and one stab wound to the chest, reported Capt. Danny Jordan of the Wilson County Sheriff's Department. The murder apparently resulted from a fight that broke out after four family members had been drinking.

Narron's ex-wife, Brenda Narron; her son, Timmy Carter; and Narron's brother, Steve Narron; all of Lucama, were each charged with murder. Jordan said on Friday, Carter stepped forward and admitted to delivering the fatal stab wound.

Carter, 21, is being held without bond in the Wilson County Detention Center. Steve Narron, 25, and Ms. Narron, 40, were both released on bond Friday but still face murder charges. Ms. Narron was also charged with DWI.

Witnesses told authorities that the four began drinking about 3 p.m., Jan. 14, at a mobile home at the corner of Springfield School Road and Teal Road in Wilson County. Ms. Narron's 17-year-old daughter reported that the four argued and fought throughout the afternoon and into the night.

At around 10 p.m., Chuck Narron went out to his car to get a knife. The other three got knives from inside the mobile home. A fight then ensued in the yard with Narron's brother, ex-wife and her son ganging up on Narron. He was cut several times during the altercation.

Ms. Narron later tried to drive her ex-husband to the hospital, but wrecked the car on the way. When the rescue squad arrived at the accident scene, they attempted CPR but were unable to revive Narron.

Ms. Narron's daughter, who was the only one at the mobile home who was not drinking, told authorities that the four often fought among themselves.

"They had been fighting off and on all night," said Jordan, "and it just led to a bigger fight."

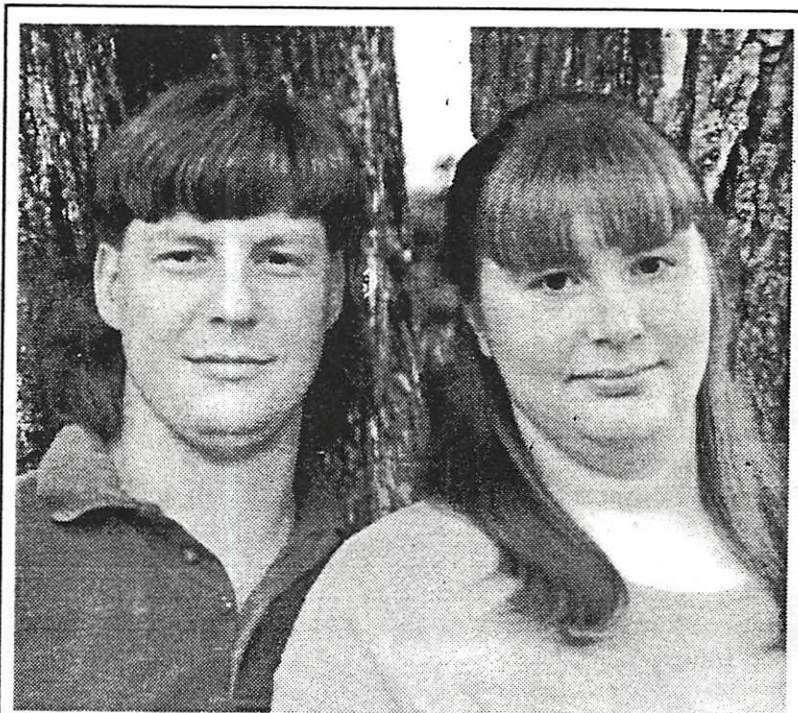

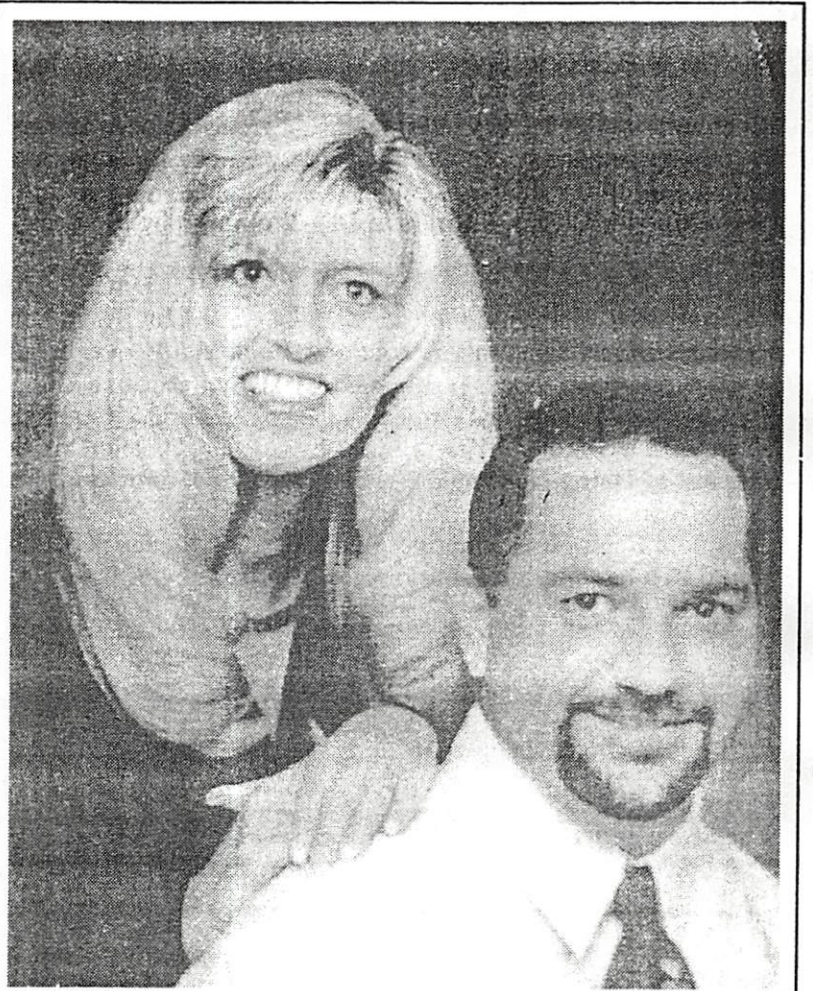

Emit major-leaguer dies

Baseball lost one of its biggest boosters, and many in and around the community of Emit lost a friend last week when Sam Narron passed away.

Narron, 83, died Dec. 31, 1996, of heart failure. For nearly 31 years, he'd made his living in professional baseball, as a player and then as a coach. He was a part of four World Series and won two championship rings.

More recently, he was best known as a fan and an ambassador for the game he loved, becoming a fixture at Five County Stadium. As a former coach with the Pittsburgh Pirates, he was especially fond of their local affiliate, the Carolina Mudcats.

Narron got serious about baseball after former Wakelon High coach Red Johnson talked him into joining the school team in Zebulon. In 1934, Johnson helped get the third baseman into a baseball camp in Arkansas. There, Narron played with Hall-of-Famers Rogers Hornsby and Dizzie Dean, and was soon signed by the St. Louis Cardinals.

In the minor leagues, he switched to catching and led the Georgia-Florida League with a .350 batting average in 1936. That led to his first promotion to

the majors.

"I was in the bullpen when (Manager) Leo Durocher said he wanted me to hit for Dean," Narron recalled in a 1991 interview. "Carl Hubbel was pitching, and Dean yelled from the dugout, 'Hey Sam, you're up for a good man, so you better get a hit.'" It took a diving catch to get Narron out, and he returned to the minors.

He was back with the Cardinals by '42 when they defeated the Yankees in the World Series. New York won a rematch in '43, and Narron retired five seasons later. He became a coach with the Brooklyn Dodgers and returned to the World Series in '49, where the Yankees prevailed again.

From 1951-64, Narron coached with Pittsburgh and worked two all-star games. He earned his second World Series ring in 1960 when the Roberto Clemente-led Pirates upset Mickey Mantle, Roger Maris and the Yankees.

As one of seven members of his family to play pro ball, Narron was never far from the game even after retirement. In 1994, he was cast as a base coach in Disney's "Angels In The Outfield."

But Narron would rather use his baseball legacy to help local charities than land acting roles. The farmer and volunteer fireman

often donated World Series souvenirs or autographed bats to be used in fund-raising events.

He was also willing to donate his colorful memories of his playing days.

"Burleigh Grimes was a raw-meat eater," Narron once said of Brooklyn's fastball pitcher. "He never wasted a pitch — he'd throw it at you."

Just as Narron never wasted a moment — he'd share it with you.

Pro Baseball Will Always Be Part of Sam Narron

"You learn something every game you play," said Sam Narron of Zebulon.

If that is the case, Narron has earned a master's degree in baseball. The diamond, after all, has been this man's best friend for some 60 years.

Narron cleated up for the local Wakelon High School team in 1934. From there, a ball and bat took him all around the country.

Class D professional ball was followed by a stint in the Georgia-Florida league, where he led the circuit in hitting with a .350 average.

A short excursion into the major leagues put Narron on the St. Louis Cardinals' roster. That was 1936, the year the Chicago Cubs edged the Cardinals in the pennant race by winning an incredible 21 straight games near the end of the season.

The next year, Narron returned

to the minors, playing with a club in Asheville.

The early 1940s ran Narron through a Texas league and back into a Cardinals' uniform. Five other North Carolina residents combined with him on that club, called by experts one of the best ever. They must have been.

The 1942 Cardinals beat the New York Yankees to win the World Series. Narron's first of four appearances in baseball's championship, all of which squared him against the "Bronx Bombers," snared him a world championship.

The Yankees, featuring such legends as Joe DiMaggio and Bill Dickey, gained revenge the following year with a 1943 World Series victory.

Narron went to the plate as a pinch hitter that year. The result: a hard line drive to the shortstop. "I can't make excuses," Narron laughed in remembrance of the out. "Of course, the ball had eyes."

Two years later, he landed a coaching job with the Pittsburgh Pirates that occupied him for some 13 seasons. Another split with the Yankees in a pair of World Series meetings gave Narron another ring of glory.

In 1964, he came home, a boy of summer no more. But, the game followed him.

Twenty-five years later, professional baseball may be moving in practically next door to him. The Columbus, Ga., Mudcats, a Class AA team proposed for relocation to Zebulon, are a "can't miss" club to the veteran player because they are in a "great town" with a "great location" where "all roads lead to the ballpark."

Count Sam Narron as a season ticket holder. "I'll be going to nearly all of them," he assured.

He will, too. If only to see how

some of the new players compare with the old legends. Narron saw Babe Ruth play in 1932; Pete Rose when Rose was just a "young boy"; as well as Stan Musial and Roberto Clemente. He once played alongside Lou Gehrig, the "Iron Horse," in an exhibition game.

According to Narron, the old-timers were sportsmen as well as players. He calls them "nice guys," not corrupted by outside forces like money. When Narron played major league ball, the average salary was between \$6,000 and \$8,000. An exclusive handful of great ones earned as high as \$20,000.

Winners' bonuses in his World Series appearances were \$6,200. Losers' pay in championship action was \$3,100.

"Things have changed a lot," Narron said. But, he insisted, the money was never the important part of it all. "I've got my World Series rings. I'll treasure them," he pointed out.

In a career where he "saw a lot

of baseballs flying around," Sam Narron has visited towns all over America. He has not been more satisfied with one than he is with Zebulon.

Maybe it is because home is where the start is, when he used "tobacco sticks to hit rocks" in order to perfect a powerful swing. He prefers the explanation that the people of his community are the best anywhere. So, he is content.

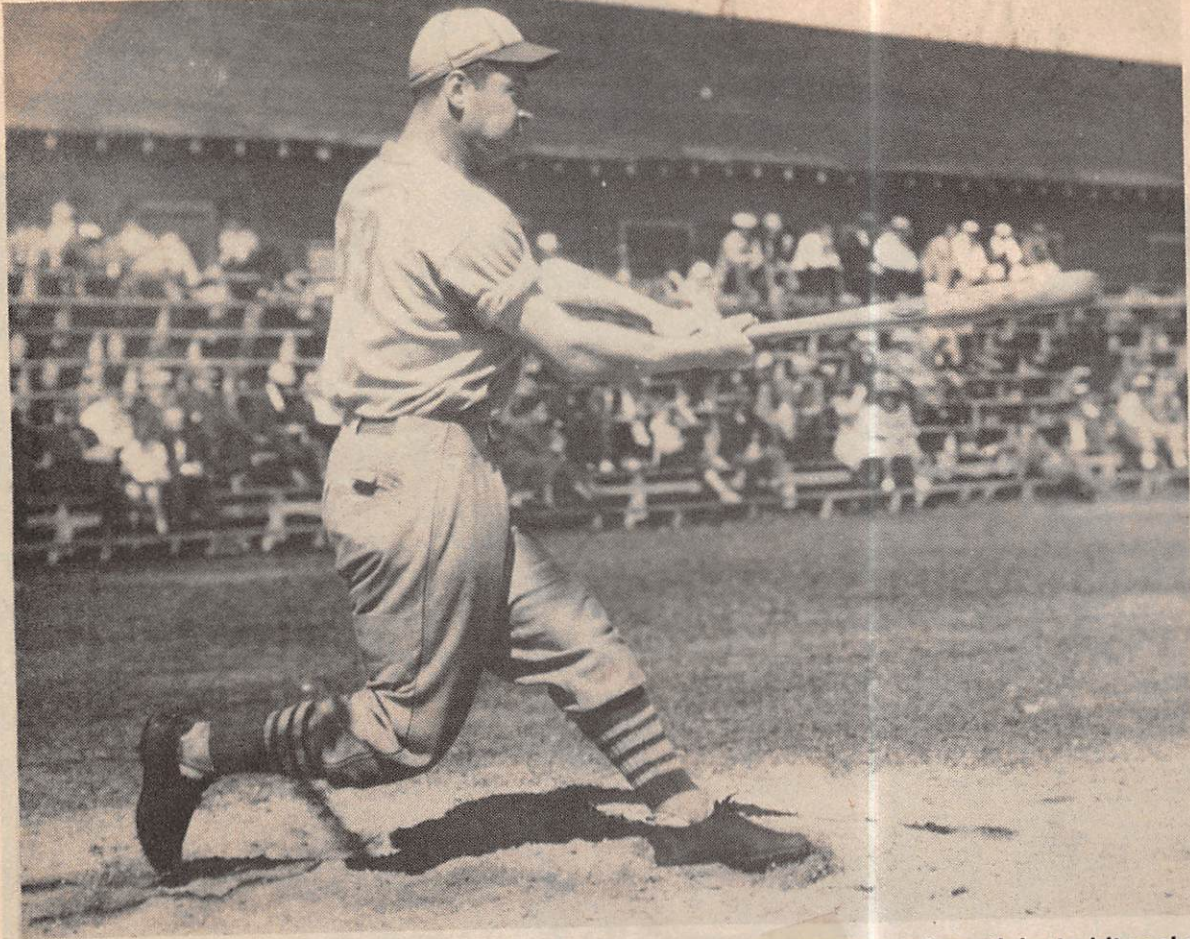

As one of seven members of his family to play pro ball, Narron was never far from the game even after retirement. In 1994, he was cast as a base coach in Disney's "Angels In The Outfield."

But Narron would rather use his baseball legacy to help local charities than land acting roles. The farmer and volunteer fireman often donated World Series souvenirs or autographed bats to be used in fund-raising events.

He was also willing to donate his colorful memories of his playing days.

"Burleigh Grimes was a raw-meat eater," Narron once said of Brooklyn's fastball pitcher. "He never wasted a pitch — he'd throw it at you."

Just as Narron never wasted a moment — he'd share it with you.
