Gallatin County is just to the east of Johnson and Union Counties. Unfortunately, examination of Censuses and other available records did not uncover any other information about either Edith Byrd or William Newbols. However, the date and location for this marriage made it possible that it involved the William Newbold who was age 14 on the 1860 Census.

An interesting record was found on the 1860 Federal Census in Jackson County Arkansas: "Wm Newbold", age 28 and born in Tennessee was listed with a "Mary", age 25, and 6 children ranging in age from 10 to 1, all listed born in Arkansas. There were also a couple of "early marriage records" from Jackson County Arkansas that appeared to be for this William Newbold:

Notes for Elizabeth Upchurch:

An Elizabeth "NEWBOWLS" was found listed in Union County Illinois on the 1865 State Census as a head of household. Also enumerated on this Census are a male under age 10; two males age 10 to 20; a male age 20 to 30; a female under age 10; 2 females between 10 and 20; and a female between ages 40 and 50 [presumably Elizabeth].

These demographics almost perfectly correlated to the household of William Newboles listed on the 1860 Federal Census in Union County:

Elisha age 16 would be 21 in 1865 1 male 20 to 30 William age 14 would be 19 in 1865 2 males 10 to 20 John age 10 would be 15 in 1865 Anthony age 6 would be 11 in 1865 Francis age 3 would be 8 in 1865 1 male under 10 Nancy age 12 would be 17 in 1865 2 females 10 to 20 Elsy age 8 would be 13 in 1865 Louisa age 4 would be 9 in 1865 1 female under 10

Based on the 1865 Census, William was deceased, and Elizabeth Upchurch Newbold was born between 1815 and 1825. The record of her being age 20 on the 1860 Census was flat wrong. For one thing, it would have meant she was 2 years old when married to William Newbold in 1842! For another, it was completely inconsistent with the ages of all of the listed children. Her sister Mary Upchurch, who married William's brother George just a month earlier in Aug of 1842, was listed as 35 on the 1860 Census.

Although the 1860 Census, which listed Elizabeth as 20 years old, also listed her born in Kentucky. However, her presumed sister Mary Upchuch Newbold was listed on the 1860 Census as born circa 1825 in Tennessee. Elizabeth may also have been born in Tennessee vice Kentucky.

Gallatin County is just to the east of Johnson and Union Counties. Unfortunately, examination of Censuses and other available records did not uncover any other information about either Edith Byrd or William Newbols. However, the date and location for this marriage made it possible that it involved the William Newbold who was age 14 on the 1860 Census.

Notes for Louisa NEWBOLD: The Illinois online Statewide Marriage Index had an entry for "Louiza A. Newboles" getting married to



one Lewis Brumley in Johnson County Illinois on August 8, 1872. If this person, she would have been about 16 years old.

Unfortunately, no evidence of Lewis Brumley was found prior to or after this marriage record. Nor was any evidence of Louisa Newbold Brumley found anywhere.

On the 1870 Federal Census for Union County Illinois was a household headed by Edward Newbold with the following individuals in it:

Although in 1870 Louisa should have been 14 if her age in 1860 was correct, it is possible that this was her in 1870. One reason that this might be the case is that there is no other known teenage female named Louisa that has been documented.

 Elisha⁷ NEWBOLD (William⁶. William⁵. Levi/Levy⁴, John³, Thomas², Thomas¹) was born Abt. 1844 in Johnson County Illinois⁴, and died Bef. 1900 in Illinois⁵. He married Emma Wood 24 May 1874 in Union County Illinois⁶. She was born Jul 1854 in Tennessee⁷, and died Bef. 1900.

Notes for Elisha NEWBOLD:

It is likely that William NEWBOLD, son of William NEWBOLD, had a son prior to Ottaway [who was born to his second wife Mary Phillips] by his first wife Elizabeth Upchurch. There is a Census record in Union County Illinois in 1880 for an "Elisha NEWBOLES". age 36, born in Illinois, who lists his father as born in NC and mother in IL. Listed with him is his wife Emma, age 27, and a son Oliver, age 2.

Also listed with him is "Ottawa" NEWBOLES, age given as 24, and listed as his brother. This age is about right for Ottaway NEWBOLD, born circa 1854 to William NEWBOLD. And Union County Illinois is the county just west of Johnson County, where William NEWBOLD and his family resided. It would certainly appear that this Elisha NEWBOLES is an older brother of Ottaway, and thus an eldest son to William NEWBOLD. Because of the age of Elisha NEWBOLES, 36, he would have to be a son by William's first wife, Elizabeth Upchurch.

There is also listed on the 1870 Mortality Census Index for Union Precinct of Union County Illinois an entry for a "Thomas NEWBOLE, age 1 – May -- chills". While this might be a child of Elisha and Emma, it could also be that of either Edward NEWBOLD or Benjamin NEWBOLD. Both are listed on the 1870 Census for Union Precinct in Union County. Elisha NEWBOLD was not found on this Census in that precinct.

After 1880, there is no further record of Elisha Newbold.



Notes for Emma Wood:

After the 1880 Federal Census, there is no further record of Emma or husband Elisha. Their son Oliver is found married for 5 years living in Macon County Tennessee in a family headed by one Mr. King and his wife Nancy J. He is called a "nephew" on this Census.

Notes for Ottaway T. NEWBOLD:

There is a Census record in Union County IL in 1880 for an "Elisha NEWBOLES", age 36, born in Illinois, who lists his father as born in NC and mother in IL. Listed with him is his wife Emma, age 27, and a son Oliver, age 2. Also listed with him is "Ottawa" NEWBOLES, age given as 24, and listed as his brother. This fits very well to be Ottaway NEWBOLD, who is listed born in 1856 on the 1900 Census for Johnson County Illinois. Union county Illinois is the county just west of Johnson County, where William NEWBOLD and his family resided. Elisha NEWBOLES is likely then an older brother of Ottaway, and thus an elder son to William NEWBOLD.

On the 1900 Census, Ottaway is living just two households away from his Uncle, James Oliver NEWBOLD. Another brother to James Oliver NEWBOLD and Ottoway's father William was Ottaway NEWBOLD, for whom this Ottaway was obviously named. His Uncle Ottaway died in 1853.

According to the 1900 Census, Ottaway is a farmer who owns his land.

On the 1910 Census in Burnside Township in Johnson County Illinois, "Otto T. NEWBOLES" is living with his wife "Manda" and 8 of their 10 children. All of their children are indicated alive by the Census. Ottoway is listed as a farmer living in a "frame house". [The two children not living with them are oldest son "Gus", and daughter "Lisha".]

More About Ottaway T. NEWBOLD: Burial: 1914, Newbold Cemetery New Burnside Johnson County Illinois

Notes for Amanda Katherine Wise:

On the 1920 Federal Census in Williamson County Illinois. "Manda" NEWBOLD, widow, is found living with 5 of her children: 22 year old twins "Dewey" and "Hugh", Charles, age 19; Earl, age 16; and daughter Velva, age 13. The sons all appear to be listed for occupation as "coal miners".

On the 1930 Federal Census in Williamson County, Amanda NEWBOLD once again is listed, this time with her son Earl, her daughter Velva, and her son Guy, although Guy is also listed in his own household in Johnson County Illinois with his wife Myrtle. There is also listed a female "Lillian" NEWBOLD, listed as a daughter in law, and who is age 22. As her son Earl is listed as "married", it could be posited that this is his wife.

It should be noted that her parents are listed as born in North Carolina and Tennessee, respectively.

On his 1918 WW I draft registration card, Dewey Adam NEWBOLD is shown to be working for the CW&F Coal Company. A description of him said he was of medium build and height, with brown eyes and dark hair.

Brad Crawford, a researcher of Ottaway NEWBOLD and descendants, made an interesting comment:

"As a sideline point of interest, some of Ottaway's sons were very active in the Ku Klux Klan. And one of them (either Hewey or Dewey) was killed in a gunfight in Williamson, Illinois. The story is written about in a book called "In Bloody Williamson - KKK & bootlegging, 1920s" by Geo. Galligan."

Like his twin, he is a miner for the CW&F Coal Company. The card went on to describe him as of "medium" height and build, with blue eyes and dark hair.

Notes for Velva NEWBOLD:

On the 1930 Federal Census a 23 year old Velva Evan is listed as the wife of one William Evans, a coal miner who lives in Williamson County Illinois. The age of this Velva is correct to be Velva NEWBOLD, as is her location in Williamson County, where NEWBOLDs lived about on the border between Williamson and Johnson County Illinois. It is possible that this entry is for this person due to the associated circumstances.

 James H.⁷ NEWBOLD (William⁶, William⁵, Levi/Levy⁴, John³, Thomas², Thomas¹) was born Abt. 1860 in Union County Illinois, and died Bet. 1895 - Dec 1899 in Union County Illinois. He married Sarah Elizabeth Batson 29 Sep 1880 in Union County Illinois²⁸. She was born Abt. 1858 in Cannon County Tennessee, and died Aft. 1910.

Notes for James H. NEWBOLD:

From "Union County Marriages 1877-1885 Marriage Books 5, 6 and 7", by Darrel Dexter, found on the llinois Trails History and Genealogy web site [http://www.iltrails.org] is this item which may help to unravel the children mystery a bit:

"James H. Newbold Mrs. Elizabeth Say 29 Sep 1880 5-156

(The groom was 21, a farmer from Willard's Landing, born in Union County, son of William and Elizabeth (Upchurch) Newbold. This was his first marriage. The bride was 22, from Willard's Landing, born in Cannon Co., Tenn., daughter of Jacob and Irene (Rother) Batson. This was her second marriage.)"

A 10 year old James Newbold is also found in the household of one Edward Newbold on the 1870 Federal Census for Union County Illinois. Edward, however, was listed as only 24 years old, making it difficult to ascertain the relationship to James.

Based upon the children Alice, Earnest, and Lula appearing with his wife Elizabeth on the 1900 Federal Census in Union County shortly after her marriage to one David J. Miller in Dec of 1899, it was assumed that these were his



children. It was also deduced that he had died sometime between the birth of his last daughter Lula in 1895, and his wife's remarriage in December of 1899.

His wife Sarah Elizabeth Batson was married at least twice before him, to one Fountain Hughes in 1873, and then Amos Say in 1876. A total of 4 children appeared to be the product of his marriage to Ms. Batson.

Notes for Sarah Elizabeth Batson:

12 year old Elizabeth Batson is found living in the household of Jane F. Batson, age 52, in Union County Illinois on the 1870 Federal Census, exactly two households before that of 10 year old James Newbold living in the household of Edward Newbold. So despite the fact she married a Mr. Say first, she certainly knew James Newbold for many years prior to their getting married in 1880.

It is recorded in the Illinois Index of Marriges that one S E Batson Nowbold [Mrs] married one David J. Miller on December 3, 1899. This almost certainly must be the ex-wife of James Newbold.

Sarah Elizabeth Batson had plenty of marital experience prior to her marriage to David Miller. To wit:

Sarah E. Batson married one Fountain Hughes on January 5, 1873 in Union County.
Sarah Hughes married on Amos Say on April 13, 1876 in Union County.
Elizabeth Say married James H. Newbold on Sep 29 1880 in Union County.
And then of course, one S E Batson Nowbold married David Miller in Union County December 1899. [All taken from the Ilinois Statewide Marriage Index, 1763–1900].

On the 1900 Federal Census, she is found as the wife of David Miller in Union County Illinois. Also living with them are 2 sons of his by a previous marriage, and 3 Newbolds: Alice F. NEWBOLD, born October 1881; Earnest NEWBOLD, born December 1883; and Lula, born June 1895. Each of these children have listed their father born in Illinois, and mother born in Tennessee. These children were called "stepdaughter or stepson" of David Miller. The 1900 Census also showed them married 0 years, reinforcing the record of marriage from December 1899. This data strongly indicates that the only children she ever had were by husband James Newbold.

David Miller, his wife Sarah E., and Lula NEWBOLD are found on the 1910 Federal Census living in Jackson County Oklahoma. Lula is 15 years old. Living adjacent to them are David Miller and wife Alice F. NEWBOLD. Sarah Elizabeth's daughter by previous husband James Newbold, and their two children.

Notes for Oliver Newton NEWBOLD:

There is a Census record in Union County Illinois in 1880 for an "Elisha NEWBOLES", age 36, born in Illinois, who lists his father as born in NC and mother in IL. Listed with him is his wife Emma, age 27, and a son Oliver. age 2.

Oliver NEWBOLDS is found in Macon County, Tennessee on the 1900 Federal Census, age 22, and with parents born in Illinois and Tennesse, respectively. He is listed as the head of household's "nephew". Head of household appears to be William D. King [almost illegible] and wife Nancy J. The clear assumption is that he is related to Nancy, who may have been his mother's sister.

It is not known when his parents died, nor when Oliver moved to Tennesse. Also with him on the 1900 Census is his wife Susan, age 23 and born in Tennessee. They have been married for 5 years according to the Census entry. Whether married in Tennesse or Illinois has not been determined. However, for what it's worth, there is no record in the Illinois 1763-1900 Marriage Database of this Oliver Newbold getting married to anyone, much less a Susan [which would seem to suggest a marriage in Tennesse].

On the 1910 Federal Census for Macon County, Tennessee [ED 38 sheet 18] is found an entry for an Oliver NEWBOLES, age 32, born in Illinois, with parents born in Illinois and Tennessee, respectively. He is listed as a farmer. He is living with a wife named Susie, age 34 born in Tennesse. The Census lists them married for 14 years, and with no children.

On the 1920 Census in Allen County Kentucky, a 42 year old Oliver NEWBOLD listed the birth place of both of his parents as "unknown". His occupation was of a farmer. He was listed with a wife named Maggie, age 24. and 1 son. This appears to be a second wife. It is unknown whether first wife Susie is deceased or divorced.

He is again listed in Allen County Kentucky on the 1930 Census, still a farmer. This time he listed his parents as being born in Illinois and Tennessee, which is correct. He now also has 6 children listed, along with wife Magge [M. Butram].

Notes for Maggie Mae Butram:

Maggie M. Butram is found on the 1900 Federal Census in Allen County Kentucky, born July 1896, to parents James and Martha, both born in the 1860s [hard to read exact dates].

Notes for Eric Guy NEWBOLD:

An "Errick G. NEWBOLD" age 23, and wife "Myrtles", age 20, are found in Williamson County Illinois on the 1910 Census. His occupation is listed a "Tip laborer in a coal mine".

On a World War I draft registration card, Guy NEWBOLD lists his next of kin as "wife and 2 children". The card was dated June 5, 1917. From 1930 Census information, only 1 child born by 1917 is known. Either a child died, or perhaps a female not otherwise known got married by 1930. Unfortunately, Guy NEWBOLD cannot be found on the 1920 Federal Census.

Guy NEWBOLD is found on the 1930 Census in Johnson County Illinois with his wife Myrtle D. and four children. His occupation is "coal miner".

Interestingly, he and his wife are also listed living with his mother, Amanda on the same Census but in Williamson County. Looks like he got counted twice!

Notes for William Ira NEWBOLD:

William NEWBOLD is found on the 1920 Federal Census in Johnson County Illinois, age 31 and a farmer, with his wife Grace and several children: Hazel, Alice, Howard, Minnie, and Mayne.

William Newbold and family could not be located anywhere on the 1930 Federal Census.

The obituary for one of his sons born after the 1920 Census, Albert, provides a considerable amount of information regarding the rest of his family:

There was a railroad accident in 1922 in Johnson County that this individual may have been part of. According to the Vienna Times of 27 November 1922, several men working for the Illinois Central Railroad departed on a "speeder" between Parker and Ozark Illinois and unfortunately encounted a train coming the other way. Here is that account:

"Never was our community more wrought up than when the news spread that Section Foreman E. N. Vaughn and two of his men were killed instantly at the Robinson trestle, the first report saying it was the McCabe or Shadowen 40 foot trestle was an error. On this ill-fated morning, Foreman Vaughn and five of his men left Parker at 7:00 a. m., going toward Ozark and as they left, before the agent and operator opened up, they had no means of knowing there was an engine on the road. A few minutes later they were running at a rapid rate, Mr. Vaughn 21



having charge of the speeder, and just as they reached the Robinson trestle, the headlight and smoke of an engine was seen approaching. Three of the men jumped and saved their lives but the other three stuck to the car, and just before they reached the east end of the trestle, an awful impact came. The engineer had reversed the engine and it was almost stopped; but the speeder was still running at a high rate of speed and threw the men several feet in the air. E. N. Vaughn, the foreman, fell to the rocks below, his head striking a stone pillar and was killed instantly. Coleman Deason, it is said, raised to his feet just as the crash came, and he was thrown forward, head first, his head striking the front end of the engine boiler, crushing his skull. The body then fell to the ground below. Daniel Emery, the third man, somehow fell on the rails, and his head and arm were both cut off. The body then fell to the earth, some 20 or 30 feet below. The speeder was tore up some and was knocked back some distance, but remained on the track. The crash was heard quite a distance and soon people came from all points. Many wonder why the foreman did not stop the speeder, but the reason will never be known. Some think they aimed to make the east end of the trestle, others that they lost control of the car, so it is all surmise. The engine came around a sharp curve and there was some fog in the air that was against them. The engine was No. 489, an old work engine, and is said to be the same one that killed Bedford Emery at Parker many years ago, and also Bob Barnwell at Parker some years so it has anything but an enviable record. The engineer on this occasion is named Mitchell; the conductor,

Norton, and we failed to get the fireman's name. The three men who saved their lives by jumping were Hosea Emery, Vern Mount and James Newbold. All escaped with a few minor bruises and a good shaking up. "

A Census of the NEWBOLD Cemetery in New Burnside Township of Johnson County Illinois [where numerous NEWBOLDs are buried, including James D. NEWBOLD] had a listing for "Isabell NEWBOLD, daughter of James D. NEWBOLD -- dates illegible -- about 21 years of age". Whether this refers to Bernice NEWBOLD, his daughter listed on the 1930 Census, or yet another daughter is not known.

There is a Census record in Union County Illinois in 1880 for an "Elisha NEWBOLES". age 36, born in Illinois, who lists his father as born in NC and mother in IL. Listed with him is his wife Emma, age 27, and a son Oliver, age 2.

Also listed with him is "Ottawa" NEWBOLES, age given as 24, and listed as his brother. This age is about right for Ottaway NEWBOLD, born circa 1854 to William NEWBOLD. And Union County Illinois is the county just west of Johnson County, where William NEWBOLD and his family resided. It would certainly appear that this Elisha NEWBOLES is an older brother of Ottaway, and thus an eldest son to William NEWBOLD. Because of the age of Elisha NEWBOLES, 36, he would have to be a son by William's first wife, Elizabeth Upchurch.

There is also listed on the 1870 Mortality Census Index for Union Precinct of Union County Illinois an entry for a "Thomas NEWBOLE, age 1 -- May -- chills". While this might be a child of Elisha and Emma, it could also be that of either Edward NEWBOLD or Benjamin NEWBOLD. Both are listed on the 1870 Census for Union Precinct in Union County. Elisha NEWBOLD was not found on this Census in that precinct.

After 1880, there is no further record of Elisha Newbold.

Oliver NEWBOLDS is found in Macon County, Tennessee on the 1900 Federal Census, age 22, and with parents born in Illinois and Tennesse, respectively. He is listed as the head of household's "nephew". Head of household appears to be William D. King [almost illegible] and wife Nancy J. The clear assumption is that he is related to Nancy, who may have been his mother's sister.

It is not known when his parents died, nor when Oliver moved to Tennesse. Also with him on the 1900 Census is his wife Susan, age 23 and born in Tennessee. They have been married for 5 years according to the Census entry. Whether married in Tennesse or Illinois has not been determined. However, for what it's worth, there is no record in the Illinois 1763-1900 Marriage Database of this Oliver Newbold getting married to anyone, much less a Susan [which would seem to suggest a marriage in Tennesse].

On the 1910 Federal Census for Macon County, Tennessee [ED 38 sheet 18] is found an entry for an Oliver NEWBOLES, age 32, born in Illinois, with parents born in Illinois and Tennessee, respectively. He is listed as a farmer. He is living with a wife named Susie, age 34 born in Tennesse. The Census lists them married for 14 years, and with no children.

On the 1920 Census in Allen County Kentucky, a 42 year old Oliver NEWBOLD listed the birth place of both of his parents as "unknown". His occupation was of a farmer. He was listed with a wife named Maggie, age 24. and 1 son. This appears to be a second wife. It is unknown whether first wife Susie is deceased or divorced.

He is again listed in Allen County Kentucky on the 1930 Census, still a farmer. This time he listed his parents as being born in Illinois and Tennessee, which is correct. He now also has 6 children listed, along with wife Magge [M. Butram].

Notes for Maggie Mae Butram:

Maggie M. Butram is found on the 1900 Federal Census in Allen County Kentucky, born July 1896, to parents James and Martha, both born in the 1860s [hard to read exact dates].

Listed with him is his wife Emma, age 27, and a son Oliver, age 2. Also listed with him is "Ottawa" NEWBOLES, age given as 24, and listed as his brother. This fits very well to be Ottaway NEWBOLD, who is listed born in 1856 on the 1900 Census for Johnson County Illinois. Union county Illinois is the county just west of Johnson County, where William NEWBOLD and his family resided. Elisha NEWBOLES is likely then an older brother of Ottaway, and thus an elder son to William NEWBOLD.

On the 1900 Census, Ottaway is living just two households away from his Uncle, James Oliver NEWBOLD. Another brother to James Oliver NEWBOLD and Ottoway's father William was Ottaway NEWBOLD, for whom this Ottaway was obviously named. His Uncle Ottaway died in 1853.

According to the 1900 Census, Ottaway is a farmer who owns his land.

On the 1910 Census in Burnside Township in Johnson County Illinois, "Otto T. NEWBOLES" is living with his wife "Manda" and 8 of their 10 children. All of their children are indicated alive by the Census. Ottoway is listed as a farmer living in a "frame house". [The two children not living with them are oldest son "Gus", and daughter "Lisha".]

Notes for Amanda Katherine Wise:

On the 1920 Federal Census in Williamson County Illinois, "Manda" NEWBOLD, widow, is found living with 5 of her children: 22 year old twins "Dewey" and "Hugh", Charles, age 19; Earl, age 16; and daughter Velva, age 13. The sons all appear to be listed for occupation as "coal miners".

On the 1930 Federal Census in Williamson County, Amanda NEWBOLD once again is listed, this time with her son Earl, her daughter Velva, and her son Guy, although Guy is also listed in his own household in Johnson County Illinois with his wife Myrtle. There is also listed a female "Lillian" NEWBOLD, listed as a daughter in law, and who is age 22. As her son Earl is listed as "married", it could be posited that this is his wife.

It should be noted that her parents are listed as born in North Carolina and Tennessee, respectively.

There was a railroad accident in 1922 in Johnson County that this individual may have been part of. According to the Vienna Times of 27 November 1922, several men working for the Illinois Central Railroad departed on a "speeder" between Parker and Ozark Illinois and unfortunately encounted a train coming the other way. Here is that account:

"Never was our community more wrought up than when the news spread that Section Foreman E. N. Vaughn and two of his men were killed instantly at the Robinson trestle, the first report saying it was the McCabe or Shadowen 40 foot trestle was an error. On this ill-fated morning, Foreman Vaughn and five of his men left Parker at 7:00 a.m., going toward Ozark and as they left, before the agent and operator opened up, they had no means of knowing there was an engine on the road. A few minutes later they were running at a rapid rate, Mr. Vaughn having charge of the speeder, and just as they reached the Robinson trestle, the headlight and smoke of an engine was seen approaching. Three of the men jumped and saved their lives but the other three stuck to the car, and just before they reached the east end of the trestle, an awful impact came. The engineer had reversed the engine and it was almost stopped; but the speeder was still running at a high rate of speed and threw the men several feet in the air. E. N. Vaughn, the foreman, fell to the rocks below, his head striking a stone pillar and was killed instantly. Coleman Deason, it is said, raised to his feet just as the crash came, and he was thrown forward, head first, his head striking the front end of the engine boiler, crushing his skull. The body then fell to the

ground below. Daniel Emery, the third man, somehow fell on the rails, and his head and arm were both cut off. The body then fell to the earth, some 20 or 30 feet below. The speeder was tore up some and was knocked back some distance, but remained on the track. The crash was heard quite a distance and soon people came from all points. Many wonder why the foreman did not stop the speeder, but the reason will never be known. Some think they aimed to make the east end of the trestle, others that they lost control of the car, so it is all surmise. The engine came around a sharp curve and there was some fog in the air that was against them. The engine was No. 489, an old work engine, and is said to be the same one that killed Bedford Emery at Parker many years ago, and also Bob Barnwell at Parker some years so it has anything but an enviable record. The engineer on this occasion is named Mitchell; the conductor,

Norton, and we failed to get the fireman's name. The three men who saved their lives by jumping were Hosea Emery, Vern Mount and James Newbold. All escaped with a few minor bruises and a good shaking up." A Census of the NEWBOLD Cemetery in New Burnside Township of Johnson County Illinois [where numerous NEWBOLDs are buried, including James D. NEWBOLD] had a listing for "Isabell NEWBOLD, daughter of James D. NEWBOLD -- dates illegible -- about 21 years of age". Whether this refers to Bernice NEWBOLD, his daughter listed on the 1930 Census, or yet another daughter is not known.

"James H. Newbold Mrs. Elizabeth Say 29 Sep 1880 5-156

(The groom was 21, a farmer from Willard's Landing, born in Union County, son of William and Elizabeth (Upchurch) Newbold. This was his first marriage. The bride was 22, from Willard's Landing, born in Cannon Co., Tenn., daughter of Jacob and Irene (Rother) Batson. This was her second marriage.)"

A 10 year old James Newbold is also found in the household of one Edward Newbold on the 1870 Federal Census for Union County Illinois. Edward, however, was listed as only 24 years old, making it difficult to ascertain the relationship to James.

Based upon the children Alice, Earnest, and Lula appearing with his wife Elizabeth on the 1900 Federal Census in Union County shortly after her marriage to one David J. Miller in Dec of 1899, it was assumed that these were his children. It was also deduced that he had died sometime between the birth of his last daughter Lula in 1895, and his wife's remarriage in December of 1899.

His wife Sarah Elizabeth Batson was married at least twice before him, to one Fountain Hughes in 1873, and then Amos Say in 1876. A total of 4 children appeared to be the product of his marriage to Ms. Batson.

Notes for Sarah Elizabeth Batson:

12 year old Elizabeth Batson is found living in the household of Jane F. Batson, age 52, in Union County Illinois on the 1870 Federal Census, exactly two households before that of 10 year old James Newbold living in the household of Edward Newbold. So despite the fact she married a Mr. Say first, she certainly knew James Newbold for many years prior to their getting married in 1880.

It is recorded in the Illinois Index of Marriges that one S E Batson Nowbold [Mrs] married one David J. Miller on December 3, 1899. This almost certainly must be the ex-wife of James Newbold.

Notes for Sarah Elizabeth Batson:

12 year old Elizabeth Batson is found living in the household of Jane F. Batson, age 52, in Union County Illinois on the 1870 Federal Census, exactly two households before that of 10 year old James Newbold living in the household of Edward Newbold. So despite the fact she married a Mr. Say first, she certainly knew James Newbold for many years prior to their getting married in 1880.

It is recorded in the Illinois Index of Marriges that one S E Batson Nowbold [Mrs] married one David J. Miller on December 3, 1899. This almost certainly must be the ex-wife of James Newbold.

Sarah Elizabeth Batson had plenty of marital experience prior to her marriage to David Miller. To wit:

Sarah E. Batson married one Fountain Hughes on January 5, 1873 in Union County.
Sarah Hughes married on Amos Say on April 13, 1876 in Union County.
Elizabeth Say married James H. Newbold on Sep 29 1880 in Union County.
And then of course, one S E Batson Nowbold married David Miller in Union County December 1899. [All taken from the Ilinois Statewide Marriage Index, 1763–1900].

On the 1900 Federal Census, she is found as the wife of David Miller in Union County Illinois. Also living with them are 2 sons of his by a previous marriage, and 3 Newbolds: Alice F. NEWBOLD, born October 1881; Earnest NEWBOLD, born December 1883; and Lula, born June 1895. Each of these children have listed their father born in Illinois, and mother born in Tennessee. These children were called "stepdaughter or stepson" of David Miller. The 1900 Census also showed them married 0 years, reinforcing the record of marriage from December 1899. This data strongly indicates that the only children she ever had were by husband James Newbold. David Miller, his wife Sarah E., and Lula NEWBOLD are found on the 1910 Federal Census living in Jackson County Oklahoma. Lula is 15 years old. Living adjacent to them are David Miller and wife Alice F. NEWBOLD. Sarah Elizabeth's daughter by previous husband James Newbold, and their two children.

Notes for Alice Frances NEWBOLD:

Alice F. NEWBOLD is found living with her mother, named Elizabeth but probably Emma [or possibly a second wife of Elisha NEWBOLD], and her 2 siblings, Earnest and Lula NEWBOLD, on the 1900 Federal Cenus in Union Precinct of Union County Illinois. Her mother had remarried to one David Miller within the previous 12 months, since the years married column for her and David Miller was filled out as "0".

What is very curious is that the Illinois Archives online marriage index records the marriage of Alice Frances NEWBOLD to one David L. Miller in December of 1900. As the 1910 Census for Jackson County Oklahoma reveals, this David Miller is a younger individual, only age 30 in 1910, and obviously related to the David Miller who married Elizabeth NEWBOLD. It would appear that mother and daughter may have married father and son, respectively.
