The only item John and Amanda Norton were able to salvage from the ruins of their Piney Plains Road home in the Macedonia community after it was destroyed by fire Wednesday was their daughter Laura's christening gown.

Outside, her bright red tricycle sat undisturbed under a tree in the front yard. A wagon and her swing set - both in the back yard - also escaped the hot flames that engulfed the mobile home where the Norton's had lived for the last year and a half.
"It's terrible," said Mrs. Norton after she and her husband had sifted through the charred, wet ruins of family photographs, clothing and household furnishings they have collected over the past 10 years. "I don't know how we'll ever replace it all."

Since the fire, which Swift Creek Volunteer Fire Departmont chief L.D. Warner said apparently started around a couch in the living room, the Nortons have been aided by
family members, the American Red Cross and neighbors who have offered clothing and other essentials.
Their concern has changed Mrs. Norton's entire view of the world.
"Ind always thought this was a take-me world, too fast-paced," she said. "But, I've found there are a lot of good people out there. I've met neighbors I didn't know we had.
"I just hate it takes something like this to make you believe it," she said. "I just can't put it into words."

The fire was spotted about 11 a.m. by a nearby construction worker who saw smoke coming from the home.
"He broke through a window because he thought we were in there asleep," she said. "We would have been if my husband's truck hadn't broken down and I hadn't left to go get him.

When Mrs. Norton returned home, all she could do was watch it burn.
"It looked like a towering inferno," she said. "It scared
me to death."
They haven't taken Laura back to the scene since that morning.
"She had nightmares Wednesday night," said her mother.

This is the third fire in recent months the Nortons have had, although the other two - which Mrs. Norton said were caused by faulty wiring - were relalively minor.
"They told me the hot spot was in the front at the window," she said of Wednesday's blaze, noting an electrical socket is located in the wall behind the couch which was under the window.

One of the earlier fires was in a plug in the living room; the other in the wiring for the family's clothes dryer in the bathroom.

If they had known some of the wiring was faulty, they could have done something about it, Mrs. Norton said.

But, the owners of the trailer have told the Norton's another home will be moved onto the property as soon as possible.
"They had just told us Satur-
day that we could stay for five years," Mrs. Norton said. "We were real excited because we love it there."
The Red Cross' Single Family Fire Disaster Plan has given them enough money to stay somewhere for the weekend and to purchase some clothing and personal items.
But, after Sunday, they will need temporary housing.
"There's just not room at my sister-in-law's or at my grandmother's," she said of the family they have in this area.
"We'll need beds to sleep in, something to sit on and a table and chairs to eat at," she said.

Her husband is employed by White's Tire Service; she was to start a new job this week.

Hi Very Distant Cousin Lee---
From your April 21 response I gather that to make an Upchurch connection you have to go back to Joan Upchurch in England. You gave no dates but I assume she lived and died there in the !800's or earlier and that one of her descendants moved to America and it is from this latter person from whom you descend.

It is convenient say my family history work is divided into two parts-- A and B. My primary effort has been "A" and concerns tracing all of the descendants of Michael Upchurch, I who came to America in 1638 as a fourteen year old indentured servant from Huntingdonshire, England. Essentially all white American Upchurches descend from this Michael. There could be as many as a million of them many no longer with the name Upchurch as they descend from Unchurch females. I see no way that you are a descendant of Michael. Part A is documented by our website www. upchurchstory, com password 2013upchurch\#. It is continued with our newer website www,alledfamies, com password 2014allied\#.

Part "B"concerns our research to find ancestors and relatives of Michael in England. I have made several trips there. More importantly starting in 1990 and for several decades we contracted with Professor David Ransome, an Englishman, to work on this for us. We published about 25 reports of his which may be found from postings of our publications Upchurch Bulletin and Englandia on our first website. Professor Ransome created several charts for groups of related Upchurches in England. Your ancestors may be in them. His work was fantastic. However, he was never able to link all the Upchurch groups into one big related family. We first thought that Michael lived at Little Gilding but learned he lived nearby at Brington. I think you would find Professor Ransome's reports Interesting but I leave it to you to decide whether to spend time on them. At some point I would like to gather all of his reports together along with commentaries so they could be more easily accessed an studied.

Phil Unchurch this Sunday morning has forwarded to me your correspondence with him, and I wonder if I can be of any help to you. I am off to England for six months on Thursday and am intrigued by your mention of Joan Upchurch, born c.1520. I wonder if you know where she was born or where she lived. And was Unchurch her maiden or her married name? How did you find out that she was born in 1520? Does her name occur in an Inquisition Post Mortem? Parish records were not required until1538, so her name in an IPM might suggest that she came from a significant landholding family.
When I was hunting for Upchurches I found that in the late 15 th and early 16 th centuries them confined to a relatively small area in easter England around Huntingdon whereas the Holyokes I now note are to be found west and north of Stratford-on-Avon in the Midlands. As always, there are interesting uncertainties.
I look forward to hearing from you.
