Dear friends,

Perhaps you noticed, but there was no Christmas greeting from us this past year. We appreciated your cards and have thought of you often, as friends become more important in one's waning years.

Last year was not a good year for us in many ways. Our daughter Elaine died during an epileptic seizure in her apartment on December 2. She had had her first grand mal at age 20 and controlled her seizures quite well with medication. We knew this complication could occur, but it was still a shock. She had had a great year. Finally she had a job which she really liked as executive secretary to the head of dermatology at Washington Hospital Center in Washington, D.C. She had just selected a house to buy near her work. We spent a week in Washington, D.C., closing out her affairs. On our return we had a memorial service for her at our church.

Over a year ago in December 2000, Craig's wife filed for divorce, and she moved to Indianapolis with custody of their two boys. Our son Craig was devastated. Their house here in West Lafayette was sold in May 2001. To mentally and emotionally regroup he moved home to live with us. He has continued to commute to Indianapolis daily as he had been doing since January 2000. Then in July Craig changed jobs in Indianapolis. At the beginning of this year his boys moved back here with him (and us) while his ex-wife makes some decisions about her life.

Craig and his two boys presently occupy the upstairs of our house. Hence, there was a major reshuffle of furniture, closets, etc. Thankfully we are in good health as we have had the major care of the boys. As we write, they are 6 and 9 in kindergarten and third grade. They have adjusted well to all the turmoil in their young lives. The older one has been in a different school system every semester for the last two years. It has been a wonderful opportunity for us to get to know them.

In October a dog from the Humane Society, a two-year old Lhasa Apso, named Shi, came to live with us and to walk us daily.

Wyman has been in and out of his office at Purdue. He has enjoyed reading many things which he never had time to read when he was employed. He coauthored a 150-page manuscript with a colleague in Raleigh and reviewed a book manuscript on breeding for quantitative traits.

Ruth occasionally plays bridge and is busy with PEO. And she tries to keep the ship afloat here at home.
