James Clovis Adams, who was called Clovis, was for more than 50 years a sawmill operator and lumber manufacturer in the Carolinas. He was associated in this business with his brothers, and from 1930 until his death in 1944 he and his brother C. V. Adams were engaged in the lumber business in Warren County, NC. △

The following obituary was published March 24, 1944 (probably in The Raleigh News & Observer) and there was also an obituary published the same day in the Warrenton Record.:

Vaughan.—James Clovis Adams, 71, sawmill operator and lumber manufacturer in the Carolinas for more than 50 years, last surviving son of the late Lt.-Col. James T. Adams of Holly Springs, died here Wednesday morning at 8:30 o'clock after a critical illness of four months. He and all of his four brothers and his father were well known as lumbermen in the Carolinas for many years.

Surviving are his wife, Mrs. Nannie Gibson Adams of Vaughan; three children, Leary W. Adams, Charlotte newspaperman, Mrs. Robert H. Williams of Cayce, S.C., and Mary Elizabeth Adams of Vaughan; three sisters, Mrs. Joe Massey of Apex, Mrs. Maggie Oldham of Holly Springs, and Mrs. Maude Holleman of Raleigh. △

Mr. Adams numbered his cousins and nephews by the hundreds, all among the Adams, Beckwith, Hunter, Olive, Burt, Holland, Horne, Norris, Holleman, Massey and Oldham families of Wake County and Central North Carolina.

Mr. Adams was the fourth of the nine children of the late Col. Adams, commander of the North Carolina Twenty-Sixth at Appomattox, and the late Lucy Ann Beckwith Adams, daughter of Green Beckwith, who before the Civil War had a 5,000-acre plantation between Holly Springs and New Hill.

Mr. Adams suffered a severe fall near his mill early last November and received internal injuries from which he never recovered. He had been in bed most of the time since mid-November and his condition became grave several weeks ago.

Funeral services will be held at the Holly Springs Baptist Church Friday afternoon at 2 o'clock.

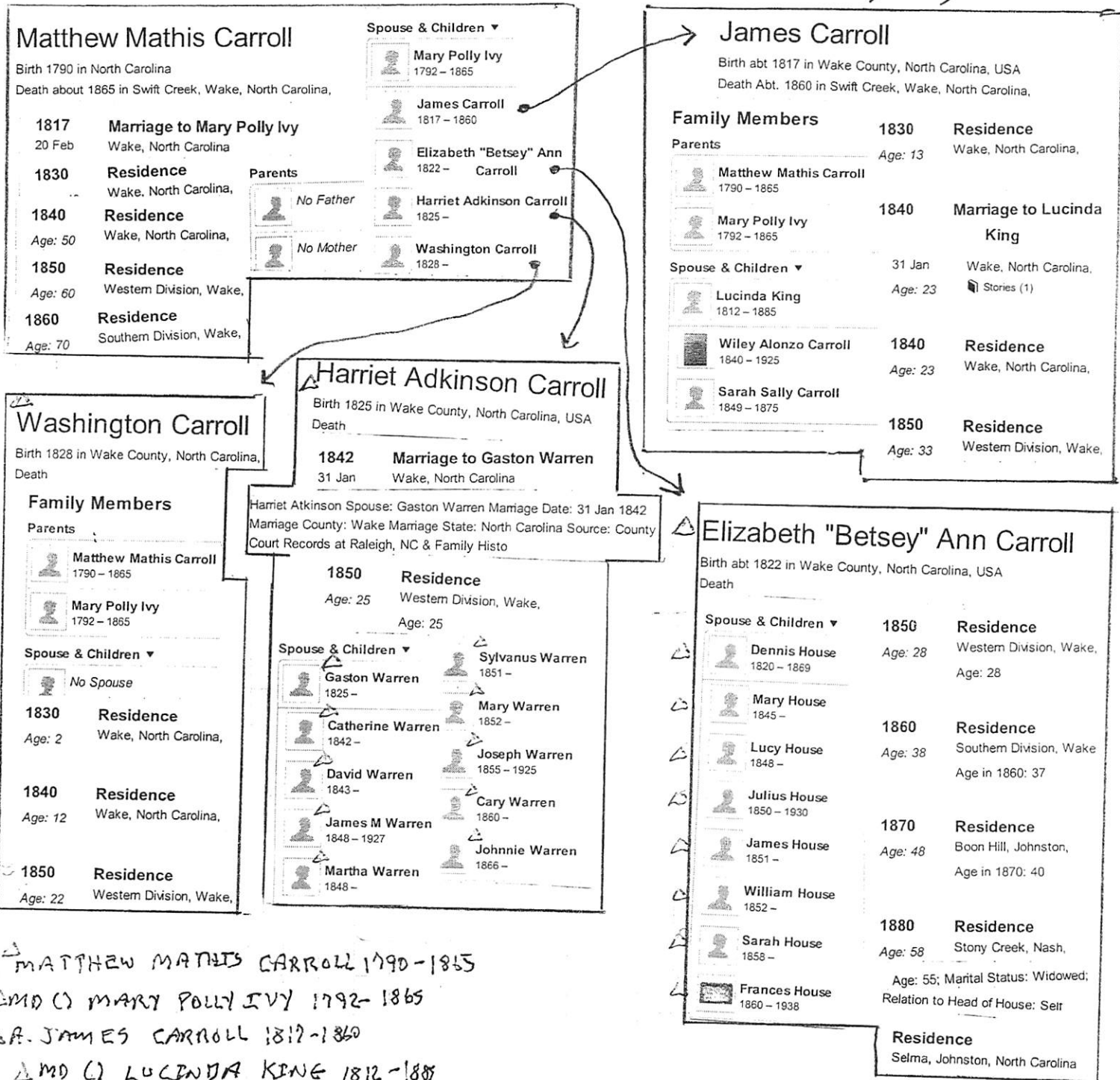

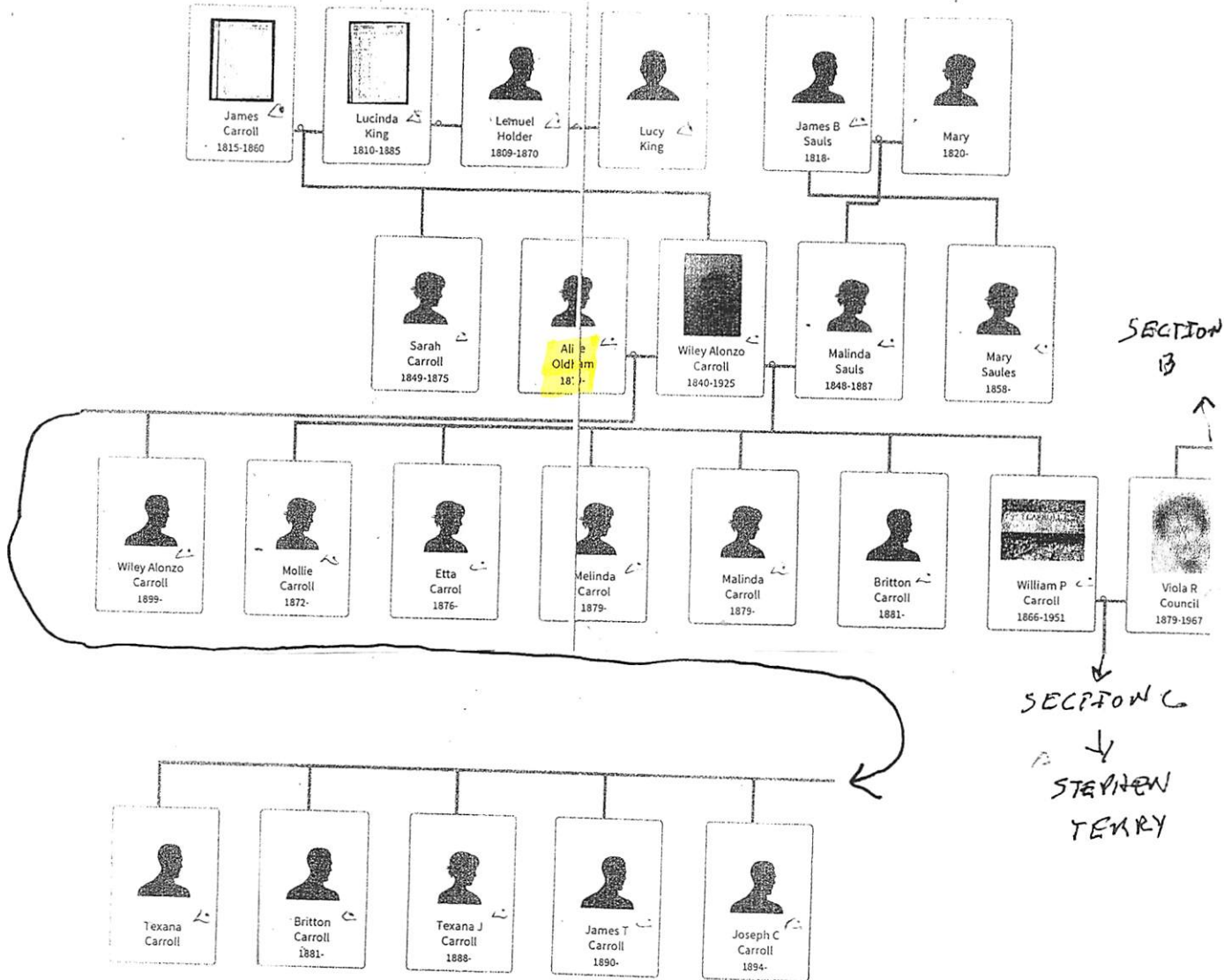

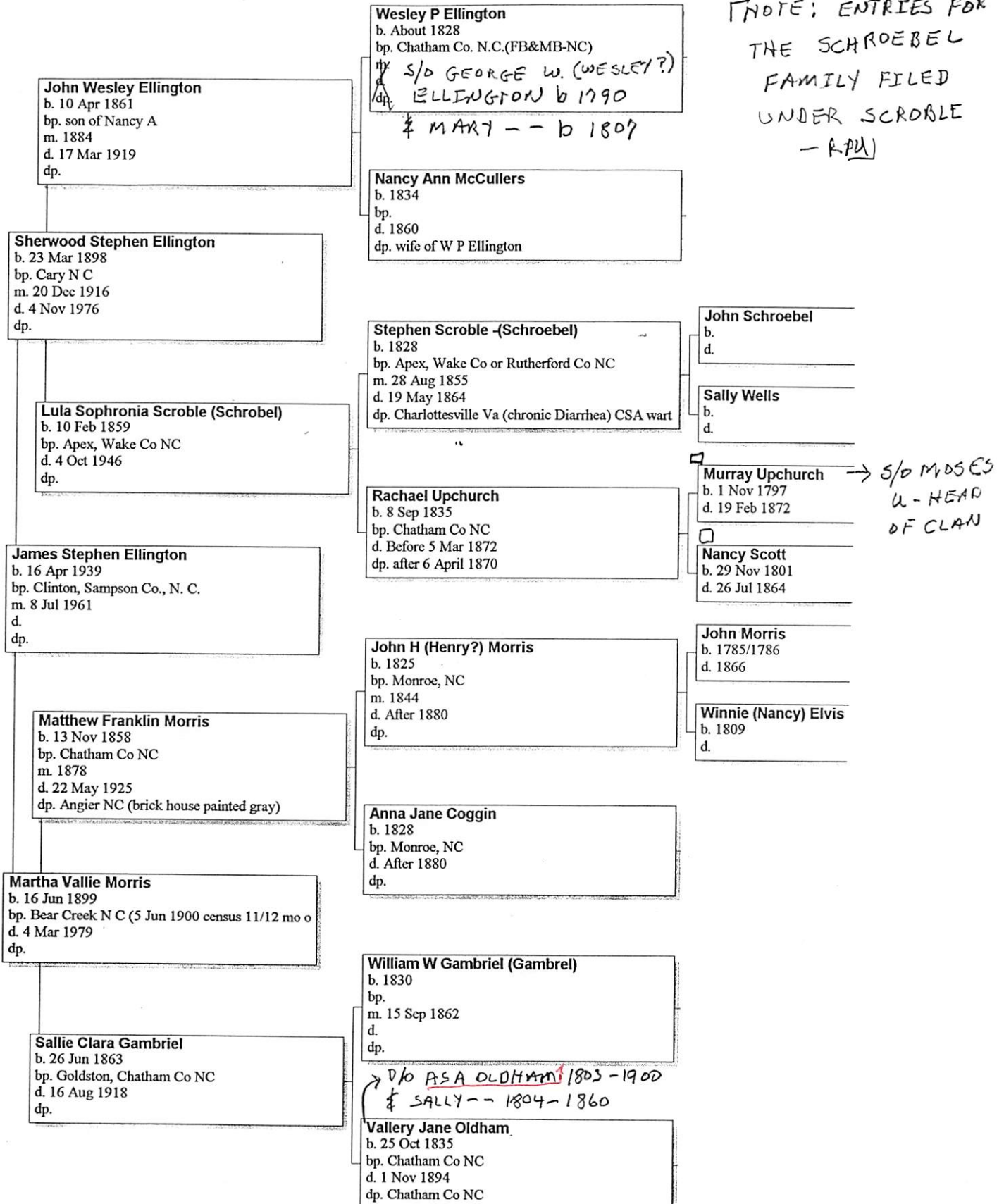

James Theophilus Adams served in Company D, North Carolina 26th Regiment, Confederate States of America, rising from the rank of lieutenant to lieutenant colonel. His picture and an account of his service appear in Chief Justice Walter Clark's History of North Carolina Regiments, Vol. II; in George C. Underwood's History of the Twenty-Sixth Regiment of the North Carolina Troops in the Great War 1861-65; and in Richard B. McCaslin's Portraits of Conflict, a Photographic History of North Carolina in the Civil War. He was in command of the regiment when General Robert E. Lee surrendered at Appomatox, VA; and he signed the paroles of the men. For a period he also commanded General James Johnston Pettigrew's Brigade, during its retreat from Petersburg, VA. His name appears on the Confederate monument in Holly Springs, NC; and a picture of him is on display in the Holly Springs Masonic Lodge.

In September, 1897, the church elected J. C. Owens to serve as pastor for the remainder of the year, and in October they elected him pastor for 1898. Re-elected for 1899, he served only half of that year, resigning in May because he had been appointed a missionary to China.

Following Owens' departure there was a period of instability in pastoral leadership and an absence of unity in the congregation. On June 25, 1899, T. H. Leavitt was called to serve the rest of the year, but seven weeks later, on August 13, he resigned. On August 26 a committee was appointed "to secure a pastor." On September 23 they offered two names, C. R. Taylor and former pastor A. D. Hunter. On October 21 the church voted unanimously to call Hunter but he declined the call. A new committee was appointed, with two of the three members of the first committee serving on it. That committee reported on November 25 with the names of "Brethren Lewis and Pippins" who would accept a call. The committee was discharged, Pippins and C. R. Taylor were nominated, but Lewis was not. C. R. Taylor was elected by a vote of 20 to 11. The motion to make the vote unanimous "was rejected by a vote of two." Taylor began his work as pastor on February 24, 1900 and conducted services regularly through September 22, 1900. At the service on that Sunday, however, "Bro. Yates reported that the church was behind on missions and that as it was our pastor's last time, his salary should be collected." And Taylor stated "that he would furnish a supply until the end of the year or until the church should call a pastor."

At the next church conference, held on October 29, 1900, the names of three candidates were placed before the church. On the third ballot S. W. Oldham was elected to serve for one year, and then the vote was made unanimous. At the conference on Saturday, November 24, which was presided over by one of the defeated candidates for the pastorate, it was announced that Oldham had accepted the call and would begin his work as pastor in January, 1901. At the end of that year the lack of unity was still apparent. At the regular church conference on the last Saturday in October, 1901, when the church was choosing a pastor for 1902, two men were considered—S. W. Oldham, the incumbent, and J. L. Martin. After two ballots the church had failed to elect either man and it was decided to postpone the next ballot until Sunday morning. On Sunday, Oldham took his name off the ballot and "Bro. J. L. Martin received a majority of the votes." His call was then made unanimous, and, in spite of the division at the time, his pastorate proved to be a turning point in the life of the church.

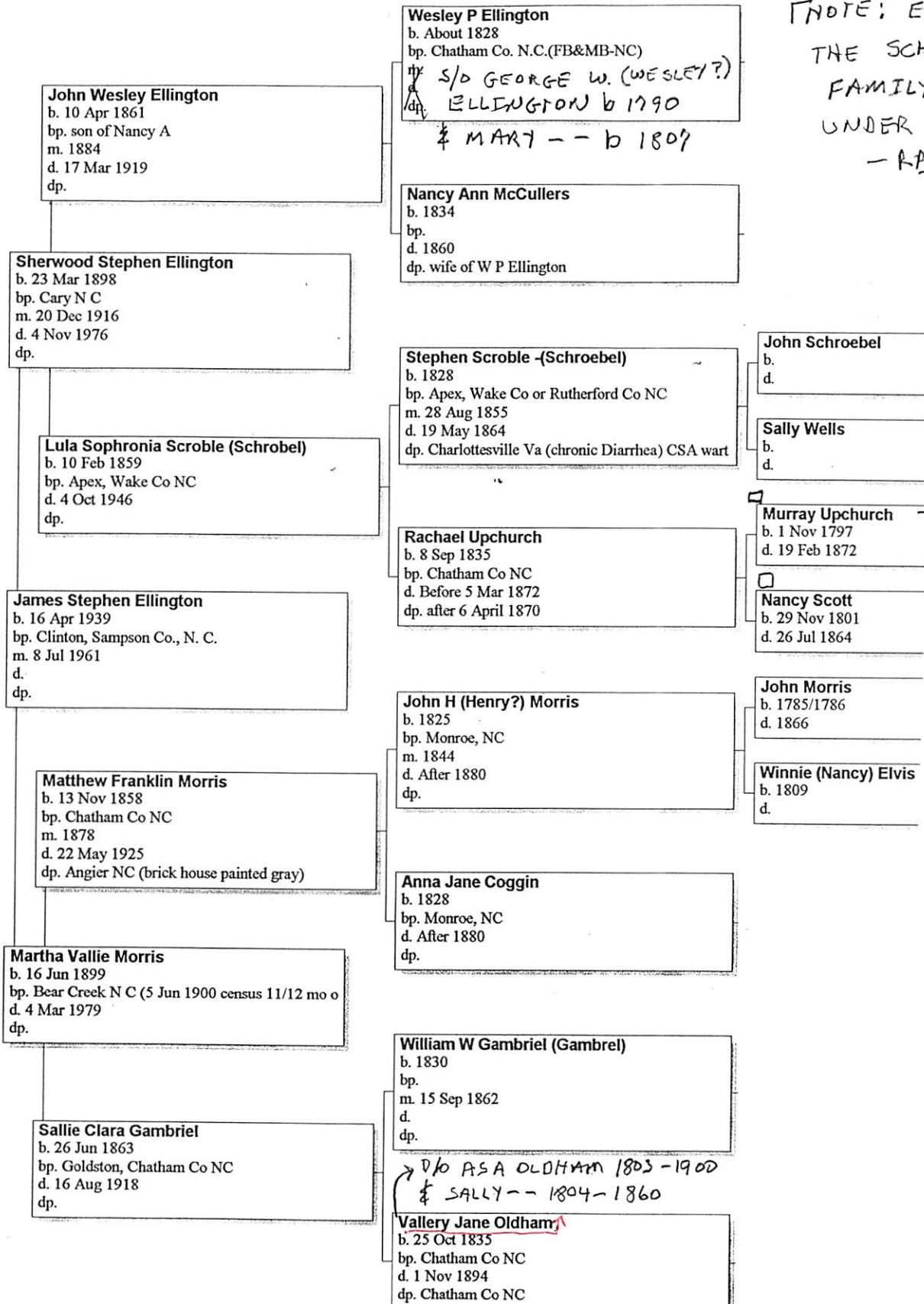

7. WILEY JOSEPH MILLS, son of Matthew Mills and Piety Wade, was born 26 Aug 1834 in NC, and died 17 Mar 1897. He married 3 Jul 1856 Charity Elizabeth Wilborn (b 5 Jul 1842, d 24 Jan 1936). They were married by JP A.W. Betts, in Wake Co., NC - bondsman was John Wilborn.

Wiley served in the Confederate Army during the Civil War. For more info see ch. GRANDSONS OF NAAMAN MILLS: SOLDIERS IN THE CIVIL WAR.

Wiley was a millwright and carpenter. They resided in Wake Co., NC (White Oak Twp.) on FC/1860-1870; and (Middle Creek Twp.) on FC/1880. In 1860, Wiley owned an estate valued at \$220. In 1870, he owned real estate valued at \$350 and a personal estate valued at \$150. The FC/1880 contained the following info on the Agricultural Schedule regarding Wiley's farm:

1880 - 30 acres of tilled land. 70 acres of woodland and forest. Value of farm, including land, fences and building - \$900. Value of farming implements and machinery - \$40. Value of livestock - \$200. Cost of building and repairing fences in 1879 - \$10. Cost of fertilizers purchased in 1879 - \$50. 4 weeks of colored hired labor in 1879 upon farm. Estimated value of all farm productions sold, consumed, or on hand for 1879 - \$440. 1 horses of all ages on hand 1 Jun 1880.

Wiley's widow and family resided in Wake Co., NC (Holly Springs Twp.) on FC/1900. Wiley lived to age 62. Their children:

This information comes from two source documents, so to speak, neither of which are primary documents, a record Dan Olds found in the library in Macon, GA, the original Wake Co. page constructed from Mrs. Clark's book, records that I (FOC) had found, and a record in the Gill Gazette. *I emphasize again that none of these are primary records, and therefore they are prone to error in interpretation, until we get the original records from Wake Co., NC (which Dan and relatives are now getting and are on this link)*

Jesse Gill, documented in his will as a son of David Gill of Wake Co., NC. Jesse Gill b<1767, listed in 1788 will. Married Tabitha Pace. Jesse Gill of Wake Co. makes affidavit that Wm. Barler was a soldier in the Revolutionary War. 1800 Wake Co., NC census page 732, 00010-40010-04.

Fortunately much is known about the descendants of Jesse and Tabitha Pace Gill. Tabitha was the daughter of Buckner Pace. Little is known of this Buckner Pace, although some researchers think that he was the son of John and Ann Russell Pace of Brunswick County, Virginia. Jesse Gill and Tabitha Pace were married in Wake County on 26 October 1792. The reason that much is known about the descendants of Jesse and Tabitha is because Jesse left a rather large estate at his death and this estate was contested in the Wake County Courts for many years. The many papers in this file contains the names of Jesse's children, grandchildren, and great-grandchildren. These papers also list many death dates, first and second husbands and wives, and places of residence of the different descendants. Jesse and Tabitha had the following 11 children: Nancy Ann Gill married first Rose Wormley Ray on 24 December 1813 in Wake County. They had two sons: Buckner Ray and Henry C. Ray. Henry C. Ray married Cynthia G. Bailey in 1839 and they had Mary Eliza who married James A. Alien, Cynthia Paridadi, and Sarah Anderson who married William D. Ray. Nancy Ann Gill Ray married second Edward A. Hi Phil,

You have an interesting history, and have moved around the country as much as I have!

My daughter and son-in-law live in Niceville, near Eglin AFB where they first met and married, and then proceeded to transfer all over the USA until he retired from the air force.

My husband and I met in Biloxi, MS, both in the USAF, at Keesler Field, and have moved coast to coast, north and south, when he worked for IBM, when it was known as "I've Been Moved" to employees. I am not originally from NC, tho I have been in the Raleigh area nearly 30 years and have found a home here. Sorry to say the place is changing far too rapidly and is losing the grace and charm that it once held so lavishly. It seems like most of the places around the country that we cherish have been wrecked by hurricanes or over development.

When I retired I did our family genealogy and several other family's at their request. I had found a lot of information in cemeteries and decided to help other people find their families by recording and posting cemetery transcriptions. I think your activities on behalf of the Upchurch family are very impressive and commendable. When I was researching the Medlin family records with a Medlin descendant she remarked on a failed romance between a Medlin daughter and an Upchurch, a generation back, one of her aunt's I believe. It was one of many anecdotes she remarked on.

I believe that Ramkhatte is a corruption of Ramsgate, and I am never quite sure as to where this specifically refers. Never quite sure if Ramkhatte Road is Lake Wheeler Road, or Holly Springs Road, or Old Stage Road!

I doubt that I would be of any use or interest to you in your search for Swift Creek information, I live in the Middle Creek Township which is now in the process of being ruined by new construction and road improvements, just as the Green Level area is going the same way. The Swift Creek area has some protection and may survive more or less intact.

Re the Medlins—I will be pleased to have anything in the way of details you have that involve the Upchurches. The two families had associations in the 1800's in Franklin Co. N C. there was one marriage in Cumberland Co [now Harnett]. Let me know if we need to engage more on this.

I grew up steeped in Rhamkatte lore which is now being rapidly lost. I have expanded my quest to cover all of Swift Creek Township so the project will attract more participants. Fortunately the Inwood Church Area in which I grew up is maintaining some of it's pastoral aspects thanks to the establishment of the N C State Research Facility. Some of this is on Upchurch land.

Gordon (husband) has a good friend named Graham Penny who is descended from the family that operated the mill years ago, and for whom Penny Rd is named

I knew the Upchurch Family had large land holdings in Green Level. The Green Level families fought to keep development out of their neck of the woods but it is like fighting a rising tide, you just can't stop it. I don't think the Upchurch-Medlin failed romance I mentioned would be a good idea to pursue, as it was the Upchurch boy's mother who forbade the engagement and the Medlin girl never married. There is a private family issue involved.

I have been out transcribing cemeteries and am so pleased! I found a tiny cemetery with a Confederate marker and that is what I really love, finding obscure old cemeteries. Hopefully I can find some history relating to the old soldier. So many cemeteries, so little time!

Hi Phil,

Give us a call when you get to Cary, we will join you for lunch. Tel. # 772-1937, area code 919. We live south of Raleigh, and used to live in Cary, where Waverly Place shopping center now sits. Many changes since then!

Unfortunately updates need to be sent off by the original transcriber and can be a lot of work for the transcriber and for the web master so if you have a ton of updates it may not be greeted with open arms. This is all volunteer work and the web masters are all employed and do this cemetery work as a "gift", as I do, but I am a retiree so I have more time than they. If you have some cemeteries not already published you can submit them on your own, very easy to do.

Maintaining and preserving private cemeteries is the responsibility of the family or their descendants or "friends of the cemetery", there are no state or city funds available. The biggest headache here in Wake Co. is the excessive and explosive growth that is causing almost weekly removal of small cemeteries to make way for houses and commercial buildings. It is done with care but it makes me feel bad when it happens. From a historical point of view it is destruction at it's worst, but there is no stopping it unless a family member steps forward and objects but as a rule that does not happen. It is the families that sell the property, and they do not reserve the family cemeteries.. The commercial and church cemeteries are safe, it is the small family cemeteries that sit on a corner of the family farm that are going, going, gone and will soon be a dim memory.

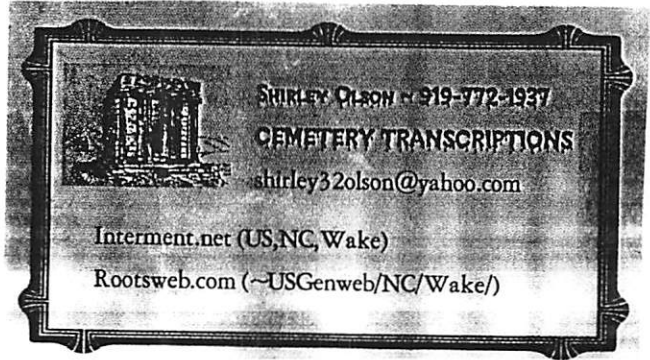

Hi Phil,

Thank you for your nice message. Happy to hear you are home safe and sound. We have just returned from a trip to Florida to visit our daughter and son-in-law. We had a really nice trip through the Georgia mountains, then down to Alabama to Scottsboro, where the unclaimed baggage warehouse is located and that was a lot of fun. We went to Huntsville and found it much changed from when we lived there. Our old neighborhood looked tired but not too bad. When we were in Niceville, Fla. we took a trip over to Biloxi, Miss. where Gordon and I were stationed at Keesler Fld., back in the 50's. We drove west to Gulfport where we were married and found it a sad sight. All the beautiful old homes are gone, including Jefferson Davis' home, the churches and businnesses are all gone. The good news is they have rec'd a grant to rebuild Beauvoir. It is never the same though, so many familiar places are gone for good. But the casinos are up and running so there are some jobs for the local folks and there were people on the beach so life goes on. Ocean Springs, where we lived after we were married is in surprisingly good shape but the bridge is still out going to Biloxi. On our way home we stopped at Warm Springs, Ga. at the Little White House and enjoyed that. The day we left Niceville, Fla. the smoke from the fire in Georgia had reached the area and caused a lot of consternation and sore throats. We are glad to be home. Travelling is fun but the best part is coming home.

Gordon and I attended the meeting about restoring the old Raleigh City Cemetery, Mt.
