Resided in Wake County where he enlisted at age 32, July 15, 1862, for the war. Present or accounted for until wounded and captured at Gettysburg, Pennsylvania, July 1-3, 1863. Confined at U.S.A. hospitals at Gettysburg until transferred to U.S.A. General Hospital, West's Buildings, Baltimore, Maryland, on October 14, 1863. Paroled at that hospital and sent to City Point, Virginia, for exchange, on November 12, 1863. Reported as absent on parole, or absent on furlough, until retired to the Invalid Corps on December 1, 1864.
- △ PARISH, BENJAMIN J., Private
Resided in Wake County where he enlisted at age 26, July 15, 1862, for the war. Died September 15, 1862, at Raleigh.
- △ PARISH, NATHAN, Private
Resided in Wake County where he enlisted at age 28, July 15, 1862, for the war. Captured and paroled at Headquarters, Army of the Potomac, on May 4, 1863. Forwarded to Washington, D.C., the same day. Sent from Washington to City Point, Virginia, for exchange on May 10, 1863. Reported on company muster rolls as absent without leave from June 1, 1863, until reported as captured at Mine Run, Virginia, on December 3, 1863. Confined at Old Capitol Prison, Washington, until transferred to Point Lookout, Maryland, on February 3, 1864. Released at Point Lookout after taking the Oath of Allegiance on June 3, 1865.

- △ YOUNG, WILLIAM FRANKLIN, Private
Resided in Wake County and enlisted in Randolph County at age 23, July 17, 1862, for the war. Captured at Frederick, Maryland, September 12, 1862, and paroled and exchanged at Aiken's Landing, James River, Virginia, November 10, 1862. Present or accounted for until captured at Spotsylvania Court House, Virginia, May 12, 1864. Confined at Point Lookout, Maryland, until transferred to Elmira, New York, August 10, 1864. Died at Elmira on April 24, 1865, of "chronic diarrhoea."
- △ ★ YOUNG, WILLIAM H., Private
Resided in Wake County and enlisted in Randolph County at age 24, July 17, 1862, for the war. Captured at Frederick, Maryland, September 12, 1862, and paroled and exchanged at Aiken's Landing, James River, Virginia, November 10, 1862. Wounded at Gettysburg, Pennsylvania, July 2-3, 1863, and captured at Gettysburg July 4-5, 1863. Confined at DeCamp General Hospital, Davids Island, New York Harbor, until paroled and exchanged at City Point, Virginia, September 8, 1863. Captured at Spotsylvania Court House, Virginia, May 12, 1864, and confined at Point Lookout, Maryland. Paroled at Point Lookout on March 15, 1865, and exchanged at Boulware's Wharf, James River, Virginia, March 18, 1865. Admitted to hospital at Richmond, Virginia, March 18, 1865, and transferred to Camp Lee, near Richmond, the next day.
