Corinth Baptist packs pews for 125th anniversary celebration

There is a phrase known in Baptist churches: "pack-a-pew."

When used, it means that a normal church pew usually holding 10 to 12 people comfortably has suddenly fit in as many people as humanly possible — shoulder to shoulder with hardly any breathing room.

"Pack-a-pew" fit nicely, and tightly, Sept. 26 as Corinth Baptist celebrated its 125th anniversary.

"We're having a great day. This is as big of a crowd as I can remember," said E.J. Corbett, a 78-year congregation member.

In honor of the historic feat, Corinth Baptist celebrated via its homecoming service. Corinth native the Rev. Ricky Anderson preached the sermon.

During its existence, 20 different pastors have handled pulpit duties. Pastor A.A. Pippin holds the record for the longest term (23 years spanning 1898-1920).

Robert was probably born ca. 1738. His first land transaction was in 1759 in Bertie Co, Nc. Robert most likely married Esther Warren, daughter of Benjamin Warren, Sr.. of Bertie County, NC. There is one single reference to Robert and Hester (Esther) Chamblee together in court records. Esther Chamblee is listed as a member of the Poplar Springs Baptist Church in Franklin Co, NC. In 1744, Bertie Co, NC, Benjamin Warren proved his rights and listed his wife, Esther and others: James, Benjamin, Margaret, Mary Patience, William and Esther Warren.

Pippin Inducted Into Hall Of Fame

Harold Edmond Pippin of Zebulon has been chosen as the second inductee in the North Carolina Truck Driver Training School's newly created hall of fame.

Pippin, 67, is a part-time driver for GoodMark Foods of Garner. In 1988, he retired after more than 20 years as a road and field instructor at the N.C. Truck Driver Training School, located at Johnston Community College in Smithfield. The school, founded in 1949, is the oldest truck driver training institution in the United States, according to the N.C. Trucking Association.

Growing up on a farm, Pippin learned to drive trucks and operate farm machinery at an early age. Following World War II, while serving in the "Army of Occupation" in Europe, he was assigned to drive jeeps and three-axle trucks. He returned home to become a self-employed farmer and drove a tanker part time for a local oil company. His experience led him to attend the N.C. Truck Driver Training School to acquire the skills necessary to become a professional truck driver.

"One unique part of the training at the school was the field maneuvers, which presented a challenge to all students because they were a prerequisite for over-the-road driving," stated Pippin. He is a 1965 graduate of the school.

After training nearly 8,000 drivers during his career, Pippin believes trucking will continue to be the most important method of transportation for industries in North Carolina and the United States. Pippin said, "If you love to drive and can exercise the discipline and accept the responsibili-

ties required to become a professional truck driver — then go for it!"

Ron Nichols, coordinator of the school, attested to the impact of Pippin on the school's success. "Pippin was a safe driver, a good employee with a professional attitude for promoting driver safety. Skill and knowledge allowed his students the freedom to learn in a creative atmosphere. Pippin was very well liked by his students."

To be eligible for hall of fame selection, candidates must have graduated from the school at least 25 years prior to induction. They must also have contributed to the success of the school, made an impact on the trucking industry and have a clean driving record, Nich-

ols said. The school plans to select one graduate per year to join the hall of fame, along with a non-graduate, honorary member who will be chosen every five years.

Pippin, who was not aware of the award presentation, said, "I was stunned, excited and filled with a feeling of humility that I had been chosen for this honor."

When Pippin is not driving part time these days, you might find him at Five County Stadium in Zebulon where he is the head usher for the Carolina Mudcats baseball team.
