Ruffin Upchurch

Commentary:

Ruffin Upchurch was born 1787 in Dunn Township in Franklin County, North Carolina. He was the son of Moses Upchurch, head of Clan 1. Ruffin would move with his father to the border of Wake and Chatham counties in North Carolina. He would die there in 1866.

Ruffin was notable for having served in the War of 1812 and for having 22 children by possibly three women. By the time of his death his children had scattered. The published efforts of his executor help to document his children.



The parentage of JOHN SCOTT [d 1819 - MLU] of Wake County, N. C., who was the ancestor of the line of SCOTTS in which this writer is interested, has not been proven. However, in 1762 one JOHN SCOTT of Wake Co., N.C., was buying and selling land on Crabtree and Walnut Creeks. He left a will, recorded on the first of November, 1819 (WAKE CO., N. C. WILL BK. 15/347), naming his wife, Hannah and children, without naming his children. Presumably JOHN SCOTT [b 1768 - MLU] who was later active in land deals in this same section was one of those unnamed children.



Haywood as collateral for the Note. Henry defaulted (Alsey did not reclaim the property from Henry as allow in Deed Book AA page 88) on the Note and the property was sold at Public Auction and purchased by Parker Rand for \$550.00 from Henry Goodwin on November 8, 1826. The Lot in the City of Raleigh was apparently sold in a private sale. Description:

Goodwin and wife Betsey, Richard Ausley and wife Julia Ann, Elbert Ausley and wife Sarah, Elizabeth Ann, and Margaret Goodwin "Humbly complaining your petitioner, Lucy Goodwin would respectively show unto your Worships, that beginning in May last, her husband Henry Goodwin, late of the County of Chatham, departed this life without leaving your Petitioner unprovided for. That the Relicturem, Sarah Ann, is a minor and appearing in this suit by her next friend Richard Ausley. Your petitioner would show the said husband died seized and possessed of a tract of land in Chatham County containing 70 acres more or less adjoining the lands of Lomey (Lorenzo) Goodwin, Michael Thrailkill {nothing} out of which your petitioner Lucy Goodwin would show that she is by law entitled to her dower and {Mends}."

(Continued)

Lucy was living in the household of Robert and Caroline Goodwin in the 1860 Census. She married a second time to Alexander Kobby on October 28, 1860 in Chatham County.

I have not been able to positively identify all the children of this family. Bennet G. Goodwin, James K. Goodwin, William K. Goodwin, Margaret and Elizabeth Ann Goodwin were identified by name in a petition by Lucy for Dower rights to Kenry's estate. Acrel was named in the account book of the Upchurch Store, as being Kenry's son. Other children named in the estate papers as buying property sold in settling Kenry's Estate were Lorenza Goodwin, Margaret Goodwin, Kinton Goodwin, Patsy Goodwin, and Robert J. Goodwin. All of Kenry's children were born at Chatham County.

(1) Bennet G. Goodwin was born about 1804. He married Betsy Jones. (2) James H. Goodwin was born about 1807. He died before 1850 in Chatham County. He married Sydney (Siddy) Holland. (3) Acrel Goodwin (untraced) was born about 1809. He was recorded in Upchurch's Store account book in 1829 as being son of Henry. I have not found any other data on Acrel. (4) Martha Patsy Goodwin was born about 1811. She married Ruffin Upchurch (5) Mary (Polly) Goodwin was born about 1813. She married Thomas Lawrence on July 1, 1839. (6) Lorenzo S. Goodwin was born about 1815. He died October 6, 1894 at Chatham County. He married Lucretia Mooring. (7) William H. Goodwin was born on June 3rd 1817. He died about 1849 at Chatham County. He married Mary Ann Cotten. (8) Margaret (Peggy) Goodwin was born about 1820. (9) J. Hinton Goodwin was born about 1823. He married Willebeth (Willep) Hicks. (10) Robert J. Goodwin was born in 1827. He died before 1900 at Chatham County. He married Caroline Bynum. (11) Elizabeth Ann Goodwin (untraced) was born in 1830. She was still living in Henry's household in the 1850 Census for Chatham County.

Kenzy Goodwin died on May 17, 1857, in Chatham County, North Carolina.

THE LIFE OF RUFFIN UPCHURCH, VETERAN OF THE WAR OF 1812

By Robert Phillip Upchurch

In 2012 it is reasonable to reach back two hundred years to see what we can learn of our heritage growing out of the records of our countrymen who served in the War of 1812. One report holds that six Upchurches served from North Carolina. Here we tell the story of Ruffin Upchurch, 1787 – 1866, who spent his adult life near the Wake/Chatham County line. As with most veterans of the War of 1812, the life story Ruffin Upchurch is of greater interest to us than what he actually did in the War.

Ruffin was actually living just across the line in Chatham County, NC when he was drafted into the service on September 1, 1814 for six months, of which he served five. He was a Private in the Company of Capt. John Green in the 1st N. C. Regiment, Col. McDonnal commanding. He was discharged in Portsmouth, VA on February 8, 1815. Ruffin died at home on March 14, 1866 in western Wake County, leaving his last wife, nee: Martha Goodwin a widow. On May 20, 1878 she began her plea for a pension based on the war service of her late husband. It would appear that Ruffin engaged in no battles and it is likely he experienced the "hurry up and wait" and other mundane daily activities that seem senseless to the men in the ranks but which, supposedly, meld the troops into cohesive fighting units.

So, we are led to make a few observations about Ruffin, his family, and his times and to reflect on what we learn about our heritage in the process.

In her application Martha stated that she and Ruffin lived first in Chatham County for 15 years and then in Wake County for 25 years. Here lies a hint about one aspect of a heritage in Wake. It is a fact that western Wake and eastern Chatham formed a community. If one has a heritage in western Wake it is most likely some of the heritage will also be found in eastern Chatham. Certainly this is true with the Upchurch family. About 1802 the Upchurch brothers Moses (Ruffin's father) and Nathan (my ancestor) arrived in the area with Moses settling just across the line in Chatham and Nathan just inside Wake at Green Level.

It is of passing interest that just as Ruffin served in the War of 1812, his father Moses was a veteran of the Revolution, and, not surprisingly, at least two sons of Ruffin, Thomas Upchurch, 1834 – 1863, and James Wesley Upchurch, 1839 – ?, served the Confederate States of America.

The lore of our family on the Wake/Chatham border, in an effort to shock, often brings forth the claim that Ruffin had 22 children by his several wives. The full story of his wives and of his many children is beyond this telling. We can report that many of the 22 children have been identified. We (Continued)

have been aided in this search by census and other records and by his will and by a court directed search for all his legal heirs. Suffice it to say that his descendants have been much in evidence on the Wake/Chatham border and nearby communities over the last two centuries.

Dilly Kelly, nee: Adelia Jane Upchurch, 1893 – 1985, of western Wake was the most fascinating person a family historian could ever hope to meet. Her grandfather, Isham Sims Upchurch, was a nephew of Ruffin. She had a superb memory in which there resided huge amounts of family information. She was the epitome of southern charm as she entertained at the table. She took me under her wing on my several visits to the area. On one field trip she pointed out that Ruffin lived just south of Olive Chapel Church and that his oldest son John Upchurch was buried just south of the church on the east side of the road. We believe that it was this selfsame John who, after the Civil War, operated a store in the historic and sometimes notorious building called New Ruin Tavern. This area was indeed Ruffin's "briar patch" as we southerners are wont to say. Many of his descendants are buried in the Olive Chapel Church Cemetery.

One of the unfinished stories about Ruffin concerns the prospect that early in his married life he may have produced a son Henderson Upchurch who migrated to Texas in the 1880's while Texas was an independent Republic.

And, so, we close this epistle having barely scratched the surface in reporting on Ruffin Upchurch, erstwhile soldier of the War of 1812, and his life experiences. A study of Ruffin tells us much about our heritage in Wake County, NC.

In the name of God Amen,

I, <u>Ruffin Upchurch</u>, of the County of Wake and State of North Carolina being of sound mind and memory and considering the uncertainty of their frail and transitory life do therefore make publish and declare this to be my last will and testament.

That is to say:

First after all my just and lawful debts are paid and discharged, that is to say, the residue of my estate, both real and personal I give and bequeath and dispose of as follows:

ITEM 1. I do give my beloved wife <u>Martha</u> the tract of land whereon I now live known as the land of New River during her natural lifetime or widowhood.

ITEM 2. I give also the residue containing all the balance of my property to my wife her natural lifetime or widowhood.

ITEM 3. It is my desire that after the decease of my wife <u>Martha</u>, that is to say, if she dies before the youngest child <u>Eliza Jane</u> shall come of age, the following from Wesley down, namely to <u>Gas.</u> children <u>Wesley</u>, <u>Gaston</u>, <u>Margaret</u>, <u>Amy</u>, <u>Franklin</u>, <u>Aby</u>, <u>Eliza Jane</u>.

ITEM the 4. It is my desire that the above named children remain on my lands with the privilege of all my property until my youngest child becomes of age or marry's.

ITEM the 5. If any of the above named children should marry they should seek another house.

ITEM the 6. Tis my will and desire that my executor to this my will shall have full power and control of all my above named property at his disposal to sell and divide all the named property equally amongst all my children share by share or their lawful heirs. Likewise I make constitute and appoint my said son <u>A. Upchurch</u> to be executor of this my last will and testament hereby revoking all former wills by me made. In witness I have hereunto subscribed my name and affixed my seal the thirty first day of May in the year of Our Lord One Thousand Eight Hundred and Fifty-Eight.

Upchurch, administrator of <u>Ruffin Upchurch</u> with the will annexed Against Kelly Upchurch, Sally Upchurch, Polly Upchurch, Clement Upchurch, Betsy Lawrence, Mariah Rollins, John Upchurch, Rufus Upchurch, Tom Upchurch children to wit, Martha and Nelly infants, Katy Lawrence and Alfred Lawrence, Margaret Scott, Wesley Upchurch, Frank Upchurch, Augusta A. Upchurch, Aby Upchurch, Eliza Jane Upchurch.

Respectfully showeth unto your Worships that he qualified as administrator of the said <u>Ruffin Upchurch</u> with the will annexed at August Term, 1866, of this Worshipful Court:— That from the best information and knowledge which he has been able to obtain, the debts due from his said intestate, amount to about 400 dollars [looks like \$400 but could be \$600 – MLU 18 Jul 2015], and he is of the opinion, that the charges of the administration will amount to *Fifty* dollars;— and further, that the personal estate of the said intestate, according to the best of his opinion and judgment is worth about *Sixty* dollars. Your Petitioner further showeth, that the said intestate at the time of his death, was seized and possessed in *fee simple* of a tract of land situated in said county of *Wake*, adjoining the lands of **John Goodwin, John Upchurch and others** and containing about 120 acres, of the value of \$ 3 per acre, or thereabouts, that he owned no other real estate, and that said land descended, upon his death to his children and grandchildren as stated above and your petitioner –

subject however, to the dower of *Martha Upchurch*, the widow of the intestate, which has been already allotted to her. Your Petitioner further showeth, that a sale of the whole of said tract of land (except the widow's dower) is necessary to enable him to pay the debts of his intestate, and the charges of his administration.

To THE END, therefore, that the said tract of land, (the said widow's dower excepted,) may be sold by your Petitioner under a decree of this Court, upon such terms as your Worships may direct, and that the proceeds of the sale may constitute assets in his hands for the payments of debts and charges of administration.


