The Political Graveyard - Find a Politician in Your Family Tree

o, this is not an article about the upcoming presidential campaign, although a few snide remarks do pop to mind. In fact, a web site called *The Political Graveyard* describes itself as "The Internet's Most Comprehensive Source of U.S. Political Biography," or "The Web Site That Tells Where the Dead Politicians are Buried." If you had an ancestor in politics, you might find this to be an interesting and useful site.

The Political Graveyard presently has tranrecords scribed 302,477 politicians, judges, and diplomats. The coverage of the site includes many federal officials, state officeholders and candidates in all 50 states, state and national political party officials, federal and state judges, and mayors (including candidates at election for mayor) of qualifying cities.

This web site is much more than a listing of cemeteries. It has extensive lists of political figures, many of them with minibiographies or else links to more detailed information about the individuals listed. Such information usually includes states and places of birth and sometimes includes the names of the politician's par-

I didn't recognize any of the names as being close relatives although I suspect that I share DNA with a few of them. Looking through the list, I found numerous state legislators, delegates to national political conventions, and one lieutenant governor.

If you are looking for more information about someone in your family tree. The Political Graveuard might be worth a visit. You never know whom you will find there.

The Political Graveyard is created and maintained by one person: Lawrence Kestenbaum, of Ann Arbor, Michigan. He must have spent tens of thousands of hours on this so that others can benefit from the information there.

<u>Upchurch, E. F.</u> – of Yanceyville, <u>Caswell County</u>, N.C. Democrat. Member of <u>North Carolina state senate</u> 18th District, 1915-16. <u>Burial location unknown</u>.

<u>Upchurch, Frank D.</u> – of St. Augustine, <u>St. Johns County</u>, Fla. Democrat. Delegate to Democratic National Convention from Florida, <u>1948</u>, <u>1952</u> (alternate). <u>Presumed deceased</u>. <u>Burial location unknown</u>.

<u>Upchurch, Hamilton D.</u> – Democrat. Member of <u>Florida state house of representatives</u> 28th District; elected 1978. Still living as of 1978.

<u>Upchurch, John David</u> — of Illinois. Democrat. Candidate for <u>Illinois state senate</u> 51st District, 1938; candidate for <u>U.S. Representative from Illinois</u> 24th District, 1948, 1950. <u>Presumed deceased. Burial location unknown.</u>

<u>Upchurch, Ruble</u> – of Jamestown, <u>Fentress County</u>, Tenn. Republican. Alternate delegate to Republican National Convention from Tennessee, <u>1960</u>. Still living as of 1960.

<u>Upchurch, W. B.</u> – of Albany, <u>Clinton</u> <u>County</u>, Ky. Democrat. Alternate delegate to Democratic National Convention from Kentucky, 1936. <u>Presumed deceased</u>. Several of our Upchurch Political families descend from Clan 3, Nathan Upchurch I, including Tracy Upchurch current Mayor of St. Augustine, Florida.

Mayor Upchurch, a native of St. Augustine, is Associate Professor of Law and History at Flagler College where he also serves as Director of the Frank D. Upchurch, Sr. Endowed Law Program.

Upchurch's previous experience as an elected official includes serving as a member of the St. Augustine City Commission from 1988 to 1992, as St. Augustine Mayor from 1990 to 1992, and a member of the Florida House of Representatives from 1992 to 1996.
