## **Isham Sims Upchurch**

**Commentary:** See number two below. This biofile is chock full of information regarding the life of Isham.

(1) Letter 13 Nov 1981 – Mayfred Upchurch to RPU CSA – Isam Upchurch – G Co, 16 NC Infantry Pvt/ Pvt [Note: This is Isham Sims Upchurch – RPU]

(1) Isham Sims Upchurch married Adelia Beavers and they resided in Chatham Co, NC. A daughter was Ora Aurelia Upchurch 2 Mar 1866 – 25 Jul 1962).

(2) Isham Sims Upchurch (31 Dec 1824 – 5 Apr 1916) was the 1<sup>st</sup> son and 3<sup>rd</sup> child of Murry and Nancy (Scott) Upchurch and the grandson of Moses Upchurch. At the time of ------ Isham Simms birth Murry Upchurch was living on a farm on the old Fayetteville Road near White Oak Creek which Murry had bought from his father Moses. Today this is Road 751. On 25 Dec 1850 Isham Sims bought 300 acres of land for \$600 from Uncle Sims Upchurch. (See (28) for description of land). This was part of the original tract bought by Moses when he moved to Chatham Co from Franklin Co, NC – Married 23 Dec 1851 Adelia Beavers (8 Mar 1832 – 24 Sep 1893) daughter of George and Mary (Baucom) Beavers of Chatham Co, (Chatham Co, NC Marriage Records, Pittsboro, NC).

Isham and Adelia build a log house and their first 7 children were born here before Isham was called into Civil War service. He served in Co G, 16<sup>th</sup> NC Regiment CSA and was released as a POW at Point Pleasant MD 21 Jun 1866. He signed at that time an Oath of Allegiance.

In ref (28) are details associated with land purchases of Isham Sims Upchurch on 7 Nov 1879, 17 Dec 1889, 18 Feb 1897 to build his farm up to 450 acres. He built a larger house circa 1872 and used the old house for kitchen and dining room. Isham and Adelia were first members of Mt Pisgah Church and later of Green Level Baptist Church. After Adelia's death the household was carried on by a number of unmarried daughters. A woodworking shop was run on the farm. All of living children were married before 1900 and Isham married 2ndly 3 Feb 1903, Mrs R A Taylor who died on 10 Dec 1911. Isham, Adelia, Mary and Sidney are buried in the family graveyard at the old home place near Chatham and Wake Co line, NC. See ref (20) for details for Isham Sims Will dated 16 Oct 1893. # Part Four

#### ISHAM SIMS UPCHURCH

#### and his

#### DESCENDANTS

in North Carolina and Elsewhere 1824-1972

ISHAM SIMS UPCHURCH, first son and third child of MURRY and Nancy (Scott) UPCHURCH, was born 31 Dec. 1824, in Chatham County, N.C. At the time of ISHAM SIMS' birth, his father was living on a farm on the Old Fayetteville Road, near White Oak Creek, which MURRY had bought from his father, MOSES UPCHURCH. This road is numbered 751 today.

On 25 Dec. 1850, before his marriage about a year later, ISHAM SIMS bought 300 acres of land from his uncle SIMS UPCHURCH, for \$600... "lying on waters of Pitts Creek, beginning at a stake on the Raleigh Road, N 207 poles to a white oak and persimmon tree on a branch, thence down said branch to SIMS UPCHURCH'S corner, thence west 116½ poles to stake in the old field, thence 237 poles to post oak on Yeats line, thence east with George and B.W. Yeats lines, 105½ poles to the head of a small branch, thence south 42 degrees 35 poles to stake and pointers on the Raleigh Road." This land was part of the original tract bought by MOSES UPCHURCH, his grandfather when he came to Chatham County from Franklin County, N. C.

On 23 Dec. 1851 ISHAM SIMS UPCHURCH married Adelia Beavers, born 8 March, 1832, daughter of George and Mary (Baucom) Beavers of Chatham County. (CHATHAM CO., N. C. MARRIAGE RECORDS, PITTSBORO, N. C.)

ISHAM and Adelia built their first house of logs, cut and hewn from their own land. Their first seven children were born here before ISHAM was called into service during the Civil War, when their oldest child was twelve years of age. ISHAM spent a very unhappy time during the war on account of having to be away from his wife who had to bear the burden of livelihood for the family. He served in Co. G, 16th North Carolina Reg. CSA, as proven by a Certificate of Release of Prisoner of War, issued at Headquarters, Point Pleasant, Md., 21 June 1866. He, like all members of the Army of the South was considered as a "prisoner of war" and had to sign an Oath of Allegiance to the Union, after the war was over, before he was released.

On 16 March 1869, ISHAM SIMS bought 35½ acres of land for \$200., from Brittain & Penny G. Mills, his wife, "beginning at pointers on Pitts Creek to a stake at Mary Luter's corner . . . & ISHAM UPCHURCH line, N to stake on Pitts Creek . . ." (CHAT. CO., N. C. DEED BK. A-0/51) Signed: Brittain Mills Penny G. (X) Mills

On 7 Nov. 1870, ISHAM SIMS bought 50 3/4 acres of land from Matthew T. Yates for \$125... "land beginning I. S. Stone corner... to Pitts Creek... to I. S. UPCHURCH corner... to M. K. Herndon corner."

On 17 Dec. 1889, ISHAM SIMS bought 15 9/10 acres for \$74.10 from W. M. Waller . . . "land beginning at Bartlett B. Yates, I. S. UPCH. corner . . . W. M. Waller's corner on Pitts Creek . . . N to stake Tom Lewter's line." Signed: W. M. Waller (CHAT. CO., N. C. DEED BK. C-B/339) (Reg. 30 Oct. 1893)



On 18 Feb. 1897, I. S. UPCHURCH bought, at auction, 50 acres for \$28.... "land beginning Burwin Holland's corner... D. H. Herndon's line... N. Stake J. J. Jenkins's line." (Land belonging to Alex and Emeline Yates). Signed: Emeline (X) Yates. Wit; B. R. Hargrove

(CHAT. CO., N. C. DEED BK. C-Z/210) (Reg. 4 May 1897)

On these 450 acres of land ISHAM SIMS built up a profitable farm, with the help of his sons. Sometime around 1872 he built a larger house to take care of his larger family. The old house was used for kitchen and dining room. He maintained a wood working shop on the premises and made ax handles, churns, spinning-wheels, and many other items needed for the operation of the home and farm of that day.

ISHAM SIMS and ADELIA were members of the Mt. Pisgah Church for a number of years and then moved their membership to Green Level Baptist Church. Six children were born after the Civil War. Of their thirteen children, MARY and SIDNEY died as small children. ADELIA died 24 Sept. 1893, after a number of their children were married. The household chores were then carried on by the unmarried daughters.

Before 1900 all of the children of ISHAM SIMS were married, and he married second, 3 Feb. 1903, Mrs. R. A. Taylor. She died on 10 Dec. 1911. ISHAM SIMS lived five years longer and died 5 April 1916. He and ADELIA, MARY and SIDNEY are buried in the family graveyard at the Old Home Place near the Chatham and Wake County line, N. C.

In ISHAM SIMS UPCHURCH'S will, dated 16 Oct. 1893, his desires as to the disposition of his earthly goods are so simply ex-

pressed there could be no mistake as to his wishes:

"In the name of God Amen.

- I, I. S. UPCHURCH of the County of Chatham and State of North Carolina, being of sound mind and memory, so make and declare this to be my last will and testament in manner and form following:
- Item 1: I give and bequeath unto my children all my real estate equally divided in value.
- Item 2: I give to my boys that are living when I die all my tools, both farming and carpenter's to be divided according to value.
- Item 3: I desire that my kitchen furniture shall be so divided that my girls shall receive two thirds and my boys one third, divided according to value.
- Item 4: I have given unto each of the following children, Josephine Broadwell, G. W. Upchurch, M. R. Upchurch, M. G. Upchurch, T. I. Upchurch, I. P. Upchurch, V. F. Goodwin and F. P. Upchurch, twenty-eight dollars and forty cents in cash. I desire that my other children, Laura and Cora Upchurch shall receive the same sum that they may be equal to the others. upon condition, if Laura and Cora shall receive this amount of money at the age of twenty one then they shall loose a discount of three per cent for five years, twenty-six being the age at which the other children received the amount with which they are charged.
- Item 5: I desire that my children that I have given bed and bedclothes give them in on schedule and those that have not had shall have the same amount then the balance to be equally divided.



- Item 6: I desire that my daughter, Marceline, shall have fifty dollars for extra services rendered me and that my daughter, Ora, shall have thirty-five dollars for extra services rendered me, this above the equal share with the other children those amounts to Marceline and Ora shall be paid out of the proceeds of the sale of personal property.
- Item 7: I desire that all my personal property not herein mentioned shall be sold and the money equally divided among all my children.
- Item 8: I appoint M. R. Upchurch of Chatham County and J. M. Broadwell of Wake County my executors of this will, provided they give the necessary bond.

Adelia was the daughter of George & Mary (Baucom) Beavers, also of Chatham County. <u>I S Upchurch</u> was the son of Murry and Nancy (Scott) Upchurch, Nancy being the daughter of John and Rachel (Baucom) Scott of Wake Co, NC.

"Thanks for your nice letter of Feb 1988. After I read it I called Donald and he offered to drive me down to the Isham Upchurch homeplace to see if we could determine which county it was in. We went east on State Road 1605 from 751 and entered Wake Co a few hundred yards before we came to State Road 1759 which dead ends at the Isham Upchurch homeplace. There is no county sign on 1759, so we do not know where Chatham starts, but family tradition has it that the kitchen was in Chatham Co and the living room in Wake Co. George Winston Upchurch was born in the same county as the others.

Yesterday at church I spoke with Lisa Ruth Barbee Jones, fourth child of Laura Alice Upchurch Barbee and she confirmed the family tradition of the Isham homeplace being in Wake and Chatham Counties. It appears that the cemetery is in Wake Co and part of the homeplace in Wake County and the rest in Chatham Co. I do not know how this can be resolved except by survey. The house is still standing."

November 16, 1861 – Letter #7

This letter is from Isham Upchurch who writes back home to his wife telling her of his trip to see his brothers-in-law.

Richmond Va

Saturday night after supper

Nov 16th 1861

My Dear wife I seat myself to night to let you know where I am. I was a little unwell at dinner today and could not eat much dinner but I feel well now hoping these lines will find you and my dear Children well I can not tell when we shall get to Manassas on the account that we can not get our baggage a long on the cars it is the hardest matter in the world to get freight to gow on to its destination M.D. Williams H. Sears others & a Mr. Hannis from S.C. are gone down to the Depot to see if our things has come the freight traine came in at 5 P.M. and if has come we wile stant to the boys in the morning and if we stand then with no accident we will get to them Monday next so you see that we will not have long to stay with them as we want to get home by tonight weak but if we fail do not be uneasy about me for I feal safe where I am the people seams kind here but I have to pay a high price for the kindness. I receive only \$2.50 for day night and loging. You may gow out look all around and see buildings 2 or 3 miles every way Just over the river there is Manchester there is buildings here 10 storis high I am in the American hotel 5 story room No 8 I wroat John a little note before I left Raleigh. Tell John he would be surprised if he could see Richmond. If the men has com from the depot and our things has com I write to necttey Ill go down and seee. Mr. Williams has come up tells me our things has not come.

I will close by saying fare well for this time.



L.S. Upchurch Married For Fifty-Seven Years and Has 106 Relatives.

Durham, Jan. 3 - On the border line of Wake, Durham and Chatham counties the family of Mr. L.S. Upchurch lives and it has a remarkable record. The last day of the year is Mr. Upchurch's birthday. It is always celebrated by a family reunion, and the encroachment of years seldom finds one missing. Mr. Upchurch married Miss Dillie Beavers December 23d, 1851. To them were born thirteen children, and eleven survive. Ten of the eleven were present at the recent reunion and forty of the forty-nine grandchildren attended. Fourteen of the twenty-one great-grandchildren came, and with the ten children, their wives and husbands, the forty grandchildren, their wives and husbands, and the great-grandchildren, there were 106 relatives, 84 of whom were present.

The spread dinner was a feature of the old gentleman's natal day. It was made up of a basket from every family. The table which carried it was sawed fifty years ago and is made of planks seventeen inches wide. They are in perfect state of preservation.

Mr. Upchurch lived forty-three years with his first wife, who died fifteen years ago. In 1902 he married Mrs. Watson and they enjoy almost perfect health. In the fifty-seven years of married life, there have been but seven deaths in all of the families, a remarkable record.





#### A TRIPLE CELEBRATION

December 31, 1899 was a very special day to have this photograph taken. It was New Year's Eve, the last day of the 19th Century, and it was also the 75th birthday of Isham Sims Upchurch. Isham is pictured sitting in a chair, with his daughters and their husbands standing behind him. Isham's wife, Adelia Beavers Upchurch had passed away 24 Sep 1893 and is buried in the Upchurch Cemetery near the Chatham & Wake County line. Isham had fought for the Confederacy during the Civil War, in the 16th North Carolina, Company G. He was released from the prison at Point Lookout, MD on 21 June 1865. He and his wife, Adelia had 13 children. Sidney died at age 10, and Mary at age 8. On 3 Feb 1903, Isham married for a second time, at age 79 to Rosanna Taylor (age 53), who died 10 Dec 1911. Isham Upchurch died 5 Apr 1916 at age 91. Isham's daughter, Josephine Frances Upchurch lived to age 102, as did her son, Fred Broadwell. The Upchurch and Mills families had intermarried many times, from the early 1800s to the present day.


