14. HILLIARD JACKSON MILLS, son of Shadrack Mills and Patsy Wilson, was born 1 Jul 1845 in Wake Co., NC, and died 25 May 1920. He married 29 Jun 1873 Mary Hellen Yates (b 14 Sep 1839, d 6 Nov 1909), daughter of Anderson Yates and Julie Hellen Smith. They were married by JP A.C. Council, in Green Level, NC. They are buried at Rock Springs Church Cem., Apex, NC.

Hilliard served in the Confederate Army during the Civil War. For more info see ch GRANDSONS OF NAAMAN MILLS: SOLDIERS IN THE CIVIL WAR.

Hilliard was a farmer. He resided in Chatham Co., NC (Grove P.O.) with his father on FC/1860; and Wake Co., NC (White Oak Twp.) with his cousin, Elijah L. Mills and family on FC/1870. Hilliard and his family resided in Wake Co., NC (White Oak Twp.) on FC/1880-1920. The FC/1880 contained the following info on the Agricultural Schedule regarding Hilliard's farm:

1880 - 40 acres of tilled land. 12 acres of woodland and forest. Value of farm, including land, fences and buildings - \$400. Value of farming implements and machinery - \$50. Value of livestock - \$150. Cost of fertilizers purchased in 1879 - \$22. Amount paid for wages for farm labor in 1879, including value of board - \$55. 18 weeks of white hired labor in 1879 upon farm. Estimated value of all farm productions sold, consumed, or on hand for 1879 - \$400. 1 mules and asses of all ages on hand 1 Jun 1880.

In Hilliard's compiled military service record from the Civil War, he is described as being 5 feet, 6 inches tall. On 10 May 1902, he applied for a soldier's pension from the State of NC, for wounds that he received during the Civil War. His application was approved.

After Mary Hellen's death, Hilliard m 2ndly 10 Nov 1910 Kiddie Holt (b ca 1838, d 19__). Hilliard left a will. He lived to age 74.

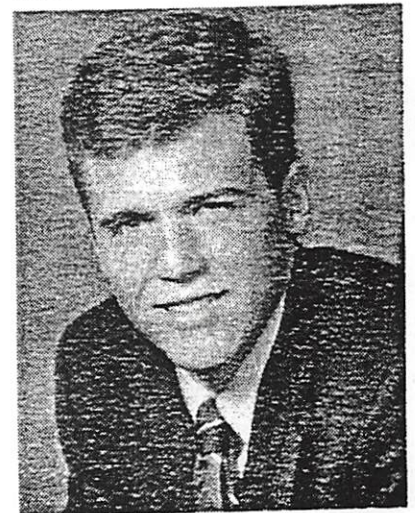

 Co, NC

△ BROYLEY, W. M., Private

Enlisted in Wake County on July 15, 1862, for the war. Present or accounted for until wounded at Winchester, Virginia, on June 15, 1863. Reported as absent wounded from that date through December, 1864.

△ CREEL, J. J., Private

Resided in Onslow County and enlisted in Wake County at age 32, July 15, 1862, for the war. Reported as absent sick from September 25, 1862, through December, 1862. Present or accounted for until captured on May 12, 1864, at Spotsylvania Court House, Virginia. Confined at Point Lookout, Maryland, until transferred to Elmira, New York, on August 10, 1864. Released at Elmira after taking the Oath of Allegiance on June 23, 1865.

△ CUMMINGS, JOHN, Private

Born in Pitt County where he resided prior to enlisting in Wake County at age 31, July 15, 1862, for the war. Died September 15, 1862, in hospital at Richmond, Virginia, of "febris remittens."

△ DEAL, JOHN, Private

Resided in Onslow County where he enlisted at age 18, March 25, 1863, for the war. Wounded May 3, 1863, at Chancellorsville, Virginia. Absent wounded through December, 1863. Captured May 12, 1864, at Spotsylvania Court House, Virginia, and confined at Point Lookout, Maryland. Transferred from Point Lookout to Elmira, New York, on August 10, 1864. Released at Elmira after taking the Oath of Allegiance on June 27, 1865.

△ FIELDS, KINCHEN E., Private

Resided in Chatham County and enlisted in Wake County at age 50, July 15, 1862, for the war. Died in hospital at Richmond, Virginia, December 9, 1862, of "variola."

△ McCAULEY, S. H., Private

Born in Moore County where he resided prior to enlisting in Wake County at age 26, July 15, 1862, for the war. Died October 10, 1862, of wounds received in battle at Sharpsburg, Maryland, September 17, 1862.

△ McKETHAN, NEILL, Private

Resided in Moore County prior to enlisting in Wake County at age 20, July 15, 1862, for the war. Company muster rolls state that he was sent to the rear on September 17, 1862, while the company was in Maryland and was "supposed deserted." Appears on a parole of prisoners of war dated Office of the Provost Marshal General, Army of the Potomac, October 3, 1862. No further records.

△ McLEMORE, JOHN H., Private

Resided in Moore County prior to enlisting in Wake County at age 30, July 15, 1862, for the war. Wounded at Sharpsburg, Maryland, on September 17, 1862. Present or accounted for until reported as absent sick from April 6, 1863, through August, 1863. Captured at Spotsylvania Court House, Virginia, May 20, 1864, and confined at Point Lookout, Maryland. Transferred to Elmira, New York, on July 6, 1864. Released at Elmira after taking the Oath of Allegiance on July 11, 1865.

△ McLEOD, NEILL, Private

Enlisted in Wake County on July 15, 1862, for the war. Muster rolls state that he was "missing since September 17, 1862." Appears on a parole of prisoners of war dated Office of the Provost Marshal General, Army of the Potomac, September 27, 1862. Also appears on a roll of prisoners of war at Fort McHenry, Maryland, dated October 14, 1862, which states that he was paroled and sent to Aiken's Landing, James River, Virginia, for exchange. This roll states that he was captured on October 1, 1862, at Antietam, Maryland. Admitted to hospital at Richmond, Virginia, on October 24, 1862, with "wound of right hip" and was furloughed on December 20, 1862, for 50 days. Present or accounted for until captured near Spotsylvania Court House, Virginia, May 12, 1864. Confined at Point Lookout, Maryland, until transferred to Elmira, New York, on August 10, 1864. Died December 10, 1864, at Elmira of "pneumonia."

△ MANNING, A. A., Private

Resided in Pitt County and enlisted in Wake County at age 21, July 15, 1862, for the war. Died on September 23, 1862, in hospital at Warrenton, Virginia, of "rubeola."

△ MARSHALL, JOHN R., Private

Resided in Onslow County where he enlisted at age 24, May 13, 1861, for the war. Discharged on July 16, 1861. Reenlisted in Wake County on July 15, 1862, for the war. Wounded at Sharpsburg, Maryland, September 17, 1862. Admitted to hospital at Richmond, Virginia, on September 28, 1862, with "gun wound in shoulder." Absent wounded until detailed for hospital duty on March 1, 1863. Absent detailed until admitted to hospital at Richmond on April 7, 1863, with "hernia and debility." Returned to duty August 18, 1863. Reported as present on the August, 1863, muster roll. Absent sick from October 15, 1863, until detailed as a nurse at hospital at Lynchburg, Virginia, on December 10, 1864. Paroled in April, 1865, at Lynchburg.

△ ★ VANN, THOMAS N., Private

Resided in Moore County and enlisted in Wake County at age 34, July 15, 1862, for the war. Accidentally wounded at Fredericksburg, Virginia, December 10, 1862. Killed at Chancellorsville, Virginia, May 3, 1863.

△ WALKER, JOSEPH, Private

Resided in Chatham County and enlisted in Wake County at age 30, July 15, 1862, for the war. Left in hospital at Richmond, Virginia, August 17, 1862, and never returned to company.
