He was 90.
The son of the late James and Lula (Belschner) Harvey was born in Thistle, Md., and grew up in Catonsville.
After graduating from Catonsville High School, he attended Johns Hopkins University before $\Delta \quad$ completing Lincoln Chiropractic College in Indianapolis.

Harvey served with the Army in the European Theater during World War II.
In 1949, he moved to Greenville to establish a chiropractic practice. He retired at age 82.
Mary Ragsdale Harvey survives her husband of 66 years, as do their sons, George Harvey, with wife Ann, of Raleigh, N.C., and Philip Harvey, with Susan, of Kill Devil Hills, N.C., as well as eight grandchildren.
Also, Rebecca Christian, of Catonsville, his sister, plus numerous nieces and nephews.
A service was held in St. James United Methodist Church, where Dr. Harvey was a charter member.

Notes for Dr.-Alonzo-j Buffaloe:
Bio notes: ALONZO J. BUFFALOE, M. D., established in the successful practice of his profession in the attractive little city of Alexandria, Hanson county, is a native of the fine old state of North Carolina, having been born in Raleigh, Wake county, and being the son of B. B. and Cornelia Buffaloe, representatives of old and honored southern families. The father is devoting his life to agriculture and is a man of prominence and influence in his community. Dr. Buffaloe was accorded excellent educational advantages in his youthful days, having secured his preliminary discipline in the common schools of his native state and having entered Wake Forest College, where he received his literary training. In the meanwhile he had determined to prepare himself for the noble profession to which he is now giving his attention, and was matriculated in that celebrated technical institution of the national metropolis, Bellevue Hospital Medical College, in New York city, being there graduated in 1886 and receiving his coveted degree of Doctor of Medicine. After his graduation, wishing to be more thoroughly equipped for the arduous duties of his chosen profession, he took special courses in chemistry, physical diagnosis, surgery and army and navy dressings in Belleview and Mount Sinai Hospitals. He then located in the city of Raleigh, North Carolina, determined to win his professional spurs in his native state, and there he initiated the active practice of medicine and surgery, being for some time connected with the city hospital, where he gained still further clinical experience of the most valuable order. He continued to be there engaged in practice until 19OI. In 1895 he availed himself for a while of the advantages of the post-graduate course at the Johns Hopkins Hospital, Baltimore, Maryland. Dr. Buffaloe came to South Dakota in April, 1901, and finally became impressed with the attractions of Alexandria and decided to establish himself here. He has no reason to regret his choice, for he has met a most favorable reception, both professionally and socially, and has built up a gratifying practice.

Bio notes: *** NOTED ARCHITECT \& BUILDER ****
William Jackson Hicks was born 1827 in Spotsylvania County, Virginia, one of 8 known children (only 2 surviving) born to farmers Martin Hicks \& Nancy Pendleton.

He was the paternal grandson of Brig. General Peter \& Sally Hicks of Spotsylvania, whose father,

Peter Hicks Sr., had come to Virginia from England ca. 1750 and was one of the early settlers of Spotsylvania county. He was the maternal grandson of John Pendleton \& Sarah Alsop of Spotsylvania County, VA.

William was just 3 years old when his mother died in 1830 and and since his father, by ill luck and other means, had lost his fortune, he helped manage the family farm from an early age. As a youth, he was recalled as being frail, weak and delicate, but he seemed to have some inner drive and was determined to develop his body and his life, and in later years he was described as having developed into a stately figure of a man - tall, large-framed and well proportioned.

In 1849, his father died, and the 22-year old, realizing his future was not in farming, went to work as a quarryman and stonecutter in Louisa County, VA. Always attracted to mechanical work, Hicks then turned to the carpenter's and millwright's trades. Although he had only a few years of formal education, he pursued a rigorous course of self-education in the mechanical arts and engineering.

In 1852 Hicks was hired by Smith, Colby, and Company of New York to install machinery in the McCulloch Gold Mill near Greensboro, North Carolina. After two years in the Greensboro area he moved to Raleigh where, according to his contemporary, Samuel Ashe, Hicks was involved in constructing and equipping the Neuse Manufacturing Company's paper mill, the large stone factory still standing at Falls of the Neuse. Hicks liked Raleigh and evidently made connections with substantial local citizens.

On March 4, 1858 the 31-year old married 21-year old Julia Louise Harrison, only daughter of merchant John R. Harrison. The couple settled in Raleigh and William opened a contracting business.

William and Julia would become parents to 8 known children ( 4 boys /4 girls), 2 of whom died in infancy: John Martin Wilton Hicks (1859-1944), James Hicks (1860-1860), Mary L. Hicks (1861-1890), William Bowes Hicks (1864-1923), Julia F. Hicks (1867-1904), Charles Howard Hicks (1869-1869), Elizabeth "Lizzie" W. Hicks (1872-1944), Bertha M. Hicks (1873-1962) and Frances "Fanny" Hicks (1875-1900).

During the Civil War, Hicks turned his paper mill on the Neuse into a powder mill, which rendered the Confederacy invaluable services in furnishing the grey veterans with ammunition. It was one of the chief sources from which the Confederacy was supplied with gunpowder, and although he was not a fighter in the struggle, his services were even more important than that of many generals in the army.

After the war, he entered the rosin business, then returned to contracting in association with Thomas H. Briggs, Sr. and James Bod, leading Raleigh builders who had been active before the war. The firm constructed many buildings in the postwar boom.

In 1869, Hicks took on a newly established position as superintendent of construction and assistant architect of the Central Prison (State Penitentiary) in Raleigh, which had been authorized by the state legislature in 1868. The facility, completed in 1884, was a huge, brick edifice designed in castellated style by Ohio architect Levi T. Scofield. For a time the prisoners lived in $\log$ huts on the grounds of the prison, making bricks and laying the walls for their new quarters, which were nearing readiness for occupancy in 1882. Hicks managed the complex project effectively, and as the work proceeded he earned the approbation of various political leaders. In 1872, even after a change of political leadership, he was retained as "warden and architect" of the penitentiary and became de facto state architect. He was also accorded the title "Colonel."

Under Hicks's administration, the convict brick-making operation at the prison proved such an economic boon that several major state buildings of the 1880s were constructed with "penitentiary brick." Among these were the Executive Mansion, the Supreme Court Building, and Holladay Hall (main building of present North Carolina State University, see Charles L. Carson), all in Raleigh, and Memorial Hall (1883-1885, see Samuel Sloan) in Chapel Hill. All were designed by noted architects of the day including Samuel Sloan, A. G. Bauer, and Charles L. Carson.

In 1883, Philadelphia architect Samuel Sloan had provided designs for the elaborate Queen Anne style Executive Mansion in Raleigh, but Sloan died in 1884, leaving the project in the hands of his
young assistant A. G. Bauer. In order to save money, the state, as suggested by Governor Thomas Jarvis, contracted with Hicks as "Architect and Warden" of the prison. Hicks undertook to complete the building using prison labor and prison-made materials. Work on the prison and the mansion proceeded simultaneously. Hicks not only supplied convict bricks and labor but also, according to an 1887 account from Governor Thomas Jarvis, shaped the design. As early as 1883, Hicks and others had substantially amended Sloan's original design for reasons of economy, which "much provoked" architect Sloan. Other alterations followed. Hicks substituted "penitentiary machine made pressed brick" trimmed in sandstone for Sloan's extensive use of sandstone, and he altered the design toward symmetry and simplicity. Despite these economies, cost overruns and budget problems slowed the project. It was finally completed in 1891.

In the meantime, Hicks also supplied drawings to complete another Sloan project, the quickly built, impermanent complex for the 1884 State Exposition at the state fairgrounds. The following year, Hicks and Bauer shared the planning of the Supreme Court Building in a practical and subdued rendition of the Second Empire style.

In addition, Hicks supplied penitentiary brick to some private customers including the Duke family's tobacco warehouses in Durham. In October 1897, Hicks wrote a detailed letter to tobacconist Benjamin N. Duke estimating the quantity of brick needed for the Walker Tobacco Warehouse, the first of a series of large, brick warehouses in Durham and something of a prototype. Hicks may have taken a role in the design as well.

After severing his connection with the State he again entered private business in Raleigh in 1894 investing in the newly formed business of Separk, Hicks, and Company, a manufacturing concern, and in 1896 he was president of the North Carolina Building and Supply Company, which grew rapidly with a plant in Raleigh and a branch lumber mill at Troy by 1899. Among his associates in the firm who gained prominence were W. J. Ellington and C. P. Snuggs.

During this period Hicks engaged in several projects, including work on the new campus of Trinity College (later Duke University), which moved to Durham from Randolph County. There, the large Main Building designed by architect Samuel Linton Leary was under construction by contractor C. H. Norton when the central tower collapsed. Hicks was called in to evaluate the collapse and was given the contract to rebuild and complete the project. A sketch of his life, published in 1898 by Trinity College, stated that "Colonel Hicks. . . superintended the construction of every brick building of Trinity College and Trinity Park School. . . . For this reason his venerated portrait now graces the wall of the college library."

In 1898, the 71-year old retired from building and was elected superintendent of the Oxford Orphan Asylum in Granville Co, NC. Here his services met marked success. The orphanage was a well-intended organization founded by the Masons in 1872. By the time Hicks came to the home, it was tottering under the burden of debt, and almost prostrated for lack of means by which it could be steered. Buildings were insufficient to supply the demands of the children, and at times the staff did not know from one day to the next where food would come from to feed children. From this state of reeling uncertainty, William Hicks steered the institution clear of debt and stirred up the people of North Carolina concerning their duty for the cause, resulting in the creation of an annual income for the home's support. During his tenure at Oxford, the Hicks lived on the orphanage grounds. Hicks offered his resignation on September 1, 1909 but remained at Oxford until his death, when R. L. Brown took over, and the home remains in operation today (2009) and is now known as the Masonic Home for Children.

William J. Hicks died on January 14, 1911, just one month shy of his 84th birthday. The well-loved and respected octogenarian was widely eulogized for his excellent character as well as his many accomplishments. One contemporary noted, "He epitomized the practical, ambitious, and adaptable men who made their way in the unsettled times after the war." His funeral drew "an immense throng" to Raleigh's Oakwood Cemetery. His beloved wife of 53 years survived him a little more than year, passing in 1912 at age 75.

As for his children, son John M. W. Hicks never married and became treasurer of the American Tobacco Company and lived in New York City for many years. His only other surviving son, William Bowes Hicks, married three times and was father to 6 children, and was a lumber dealer for many years in Montgomery Co, NC. Daughter Mary married Raleigh grocer, Job Phalerus Wyatt, and
was mother to ${ }^{-} 4$ known children. Three of his other daughters married, but their husbands are unknown to this researcher. Julia married and divorced unknown Buffaloe, and was mother to a daughter, Ethel; Elizabeth married unknown Johnson; and Bertha married unknown Turner. Youngest daughter, Fanny, died unmarried in 1900 at age 24.

Notes for John-Martin-Wilton Hicks:
Bio notes: Eldest son of Raleigh architect/builder William Jackson Hicks and his wife, Julia Louisa Harrison. Long-time employee of American Tobacco Company, founded in 1890 by James Buchanan Duke (1856-1925). In 1907, anti trust action started against American Tobacco Company broke it into several major companies by 1911. Some of these companies are known today as R. J. Reynolds, Liggett \& Myers Tobacco Company, and Lorillard. John M. W. Hicks was a major stockholder and an executive with the corporation all his adult live, living for many years on West 79th Street in Manahattan. He never married and died in 1944 at age 85.
iii. Mary-Eliza Hicks, daughter of William-Jackson Hicks and Julia-Louisa-Harrison Harrison was born on 25 Dec 1861. She died on 15 Oct 1890 (Y).
iv. Elizabeth W Hicks, daughter of William-Jackson Hicks and Julia-Louisa-Harrison Harrison was born in 1872. She died on 29 Aug 1944 (Y). She married Job Phalerus Wyatt. He was born in 1858. He died (Y).

John R. Harrison was a wagon \& buggy maker in Raleigh in the 1840's-1860's. Born in North Carolina in 1808, to John \& Delia Harrison, he was in his 40 's when he entered into a business partnership with Wiley W. Johnson in 1848 opening a shop at the corner of Morgan \& McDowell Streets in Raleigh. The partnership later dissolved when Harrison left to go into the business of manufacturing railroad cars for the North Carolina Railroad opening business on West Street in Raleigh.

John R. Harrison married Mary Lucas of North Carolina about 1834 and were parents to two known children: (CSA) Lt. John W. Harrison (1835-1883) and Julia Louisa Harrison (1837-1912) who married architect, William Jackson Hicks.

John Harrison died in 1874 at age 66. His wife of 40 years survived him another 21 years, spending her widowed years living with her married daughter. Mary Lucas Harrison died in 1895 at age 80 .

Mary Lucas and John-R Harrison had the following children:

Notes for Lt.-John-W Harrison: Bio notes: John W. Harrison was born 1835 in Raleigh, Wake County, NC the eldest of 2 known surviving children ( 1 boy/1 girl) born to buggy and railroad car manufacturer, John R. Harrison and his wife, Mary Luce.

John W. was 26 when Civil War broke out, and he served ast 1st Lieutenant with the NC 14th, Company E. "Oak City Guards". This regiment with more than 1,000 men, moved to Virginia where it was placed in the Department of Norfolk. Later it was assign ed to General Colston's, G. B. Anderson's, Ramseur's, and Cox's Brigade, Army of Northern Virginia. The 14th participated in the various campaigns of the army from Williamsburg to Cold Harbor, fought with Early in the Shenandoah Valley, and ended the war at Appomattox. It sustained 17 casualties at Williamsburg, 102 during the Seven Days' Battles, 139 in the Maryland Campaign, 4 at Fredericksburg, and 142 at Chancellorsville. Of the 306 engaged at Gettysburg, twenty percent were disabled, and there was 1 killed and 4 wounded at Bristoe. It surrendered 7 officers and 107 men at Appomattox.

Following the war, John returned to Raleigh and became a merchant. He married to a woman named Sadie (ca. 1872) and was father to one known child, Lucas (b. 1873).

John W. Harrison died in 1883 at age 48. It is not known what became of his wife and child. He his buried in Oakwood near his parents and sister.

John R. Harrison was a wagon \& buggy maker in Raleigh in the 1840's-1860's. Born in North Carolina in 1808, to John \& Delia Harrison, he was in his 40 's when he entered into a business partnership with Wiley W. Johnson in 1848 opening a shop at the corner of Morgan \& McDowell, Streets in Raleigh. The partnership later dissolved when Harrison left to go into the business of manufacturing railroad cars for the North Carolina Railroad opening business on West Street in Raleigh.

John R. Harrison married Mary Lucas of North Carolina about 1834 and were parents to two known $\Delta \Delta$ children: (CSA) Lt. John W. Harrison (1835-1883) and Julia Louisa Harrison (1837-1912) who married architect, William Jackson Hicks.

John W. was 26 when Civil War broke out, and he served ast 1st Lieutenant with the NC 14th, Company E. "Oak City Guards". This regiment with more than 1,000 men, moved to Virginia where it was placed in the Department of Norfolk. Later it was assign ed to General Colston's, G. B. Anderson's, Ramseur's, and Cox's Brigade, Army of Northern Virginia. The 14th participated in the various campaigns of the army from Williamsburg to Cold Harbor, fought with Early in the Shenandoah Valley, and ended the war at Appomattox. It sustained 17 casualties at Williamsburg, 102 during the Seven Days' Battles, 139 in the Maryland Campaign, 4 at Fredericksburg, and 142 at Chancellorsville. Of the 306 engaged at Gettysburg, twenty percent were disabled, and there was 1 killed and 4 wounded at Bristoe. It surrendered 7 officers and 107 men at Appomattox.

Following the war, John returned to Raleigh and became a merchant. He married to a woman named Sadie (ca. 1872) and was father to one known child, Lucas (b. 1873).

John W. Harrison died in 1883 at age 48. It is not known what became of his wife and child. He his buried in Oakwood near his parents and sister.
