△ The first building was constructed in 1880 by Mr. Neal Morris. This building was torn down in 1902 to make room for a new sanctuary which was built at a cost of \$222.23.

△ Members gave timber and did much of the labor. Mr. Alph Johnson was foreman of the construction.

△ The vestibule and belfry were added when the East Wing was built in 1919. Mr. Cary B. Jones gave the bell which yet today resides in the belfry.

△ In March, 1965, the present sanctuary and fifteen Sunday School classrooms, three nursery rooms, study, kitchen, three bathrooms, a baptistry and a choir loft were completed

△ at a contract price of \$66,629.00 by Davidson and Jones Construction Company. Mr. Roy

□ Womble was chairman of the Building Committee which consisted of Thelma Bartley,

△ △ △ △ △ Gernon Holland, A. M. (Harry) Jones, Joe Jones, Charles Livengood, Neal Moore, and

□ Doris Weatherspoon Vaughn.

△ In 1976, the Church purchased 1.74 Acres of land adjoining the Church on the north and east from Mr. Herbert Atkins for the sum of \$15,000.00.

△ Two committees were involved in planning and constructing this new building. The Building Planning Committee was composed of Wilton

△ △ □ △ Grimes, Curtis Jones, Sharon J. Lawrence, Charles Livengood (chair), and Jimmy Rogers.

□ △ Mr. Wilton Grimes was chairman of the Construction Committee which consisted of Dick

△ △ △ △ □ Britt, John Dill, Margine Eagles (now Daniels), Curtis Jones, Sharon Lawrence, Charles

△ △ △ Livengood, Bryan Perry, Jimmy Rogers, and Roy Womble.

△ In 1986, it was recognized that the Church Sanctuary was becoming outdated and needed renovation. A Remodeling/Redecorating Committee consisting of Jeannette Cox,

△ △ △ △ △ Sue Gates, LaRue J. Holmes, Rosie Jetter (chair), Robert (Bobby) Mills, Brantley Murray,

△ and Susan Temple was appointed to plan and carry out this long-term project.

△ □ In 1950, Theo L. Jones and wife, Hettie A. Jones, gave one acre of land and framing material for a parsonage. The parsonage was located near the second location of the

△ □ Burns School on Penny Road across the road from the Jones home (currently the

△ □ residence of Steve and Jeannette Cox). H. H. Holland was the contractor for the parsonage.

△ △ Pews used in the sanctuary from 1919 to 1965 were built by L. B. Woodall, J. E.

△ □ Massey, Furman J. Jones, and A. M. (Harry) Jones.

△ The first organ was purchased in 1894. A second organ was purchased in 1918.

△ The first piano was purchased in 1928. Ursula Atkins was the first pianist. An electric organ was given the Church in 1964 by Carlisle and Ernestine Jones Abbott.

△ Dr. R. W. Stephens of Apex gave the Church a silver communion set in 1919. It consisted of two cups and a pitcher. The present set of four plates and four trays with

△ places for individual cups was given about 1938 by Mr. and Mrs. T. Braxton Jones and Mr.

△ △ and Mrs. Paul Hendricks. Later, another plate and tray for cups were given by Mrs. Ara

△ Lee Jones in memory of her husband, Delno Jones.

□ In 1916, Ursula Atkins presented the Church with pine needle collection plates

□ which are on display in the Church Antiquities cabinet. The T. Braxton Jones Family and

△ Mr. and Mrs. Paul Hendricks presented the present collection plates.

□ In 1965, the audio system for the Church was given by Mr. Harry Jones and Mr.

△ □ Bruce Weatherspoon. Ironically, the system was used the first time at Mr. Jones' funeral.

△ In 2003, a silver cross for the Communion Table was given the Church as a

△ memorial by friends in remembrance of Mrs. Hazel Kirkpatrick.

### OLDEST MEMBERS OF THE CHURCH

Mrs. Thelma Bartley joined Swift Creek Baptist Church in 1958. She has been a faithful, active member and attended services as long as her health permitted. (She co-authored the 100<sup>th</sup> Anniversary history.) She is now a resident of Heartsfields Assisted Living in Cary. She celebrated her 91st birthday February 17, 2004. She vividly remembers her long association with the Church and will readily discuss it with anyone interested. We salute you, Mrs. Bartley, as the oldest member of Swift Creek Baptist Church.

△ Mrs. Doris Weatherspoon Vaughn joined Swift Creek Baptist Church at the age of twelve. (She recalls being baptized in the old baptismal that still exists in the spring-fed branch behind the Church near Holly Springs Road. She remembers the water being very cold.) Her attendance at Swift Creek started much earlier as she was carried to church as an infant by her parents who were active members. (Of the 30 pastors who have served Swift Creek, she remembers seventeen of them.) She celebrated her 84<sup>th</sup> birthday on September 17, 2004. She is a faithful, active member who attends all services regularly. Currently, she is an invaluable member of the 125<sup>th</sup> Anniversary Committee. We salute you, Mrs. Vaughn, for your 72 years of service to Swift Creek Baptist Church.

### CEMETERY

△ □ □ The first person to be buried in the Swift Creek Baptist Church Cemetery was eight month old W.H. Horton who died October 18, 1887. (Mrs. Bartley and Mrs. Jones reported in their 1979 history that the first person buried was the infant daughter of Mr. and Mrs. J. P. Wood in 1887. It is not clear what was their source.) The second burial was in 1890 and the third in 1891. There are 21 infants and 39 veterans buried here. (The first veteran, buried in 1895, was Mr. Aldridge Jones who served in the Confederate Army.)

△ The first Vacation Bible School was held in 1948 under the direction of Mrs. Dorothy Goodwin of the Apex Baptist Church. In 1979, Vacation Bible School was held during August when for the first time classes were held in the evening for adults. Enrollment in 2004 was 28 children and youth under the direction of Mrs. Lynne Cullins.

△ Swift Creek Baptist Church was organized in 1879 in the Burns School House which stood at that time opposite the Henry Atkins home on Penny Road. (This site is across the road from Penny Road Elementary School today.) The old school house was moved several times with its final location being on the south-east corner of the current Church property. It was torn away in 1977 during site preparation for the current education building.

From the minutes of the Raleigh Baptist Association held October 23 to 25, 1879, references to the organization of Swift Creek Baptist Church are found. The Church organization took place after a series of meetings were conducted by Rev. W. R. Gwaltney, pastor of the Tabernacle Baptist Church in Raleigh. He was a member of the Cooperative State Board and held a ten-day revival meeting in the Burns School House eleven miles southwest of Raleigh. The Swift Creek Baptist Church was organized on Friday, November 1, 1879. The Raleigh Baptist Association appropriated \$100 toward organizational and financial needs of the new church. Swift Creek Baptist Church applied for membership in the Raleigh Baptist Association in the fall session of 1880.\*

□ The presbytery that constituted the church was composed of Rev. W. R. Gwaltney, Rev. George J. Dowell, Rev. J. M. Holleman, and Rev. Harvey Hatcher.\*

The first church conference was held on October 31, 1879. At a conference in 1880, the constitution of the Pleasant Grove Baptist Church was adopted.\* (Copy attached.)

△△ The first deacons of the Church were W. H. Strain and J. C. Burns. The first female deacons, elected in 1986, were Mary Livengood and Betty Finch. Until the 1950's, deacons served for life. Since then, they are elected to three-year terms on the Board of Deacons but of course as ordained deacons, they retain the title of deacon for life. Many have served repeated terms on the active board assisting the pastor in ministering to the spiritual and physical needs of the members. The current Board of Deacons is composed of Jack Bryson, Frances Christmas, Steve Cox, Jerry Dayberry, Margine Daniels, Joe Jones, Charles Livengood (Chair), Bobby Mills, and Robert Smith. △△△△△

WEATHERSPOON, James O., Private

Born in Wake County where he resided as a farmer prior to enlisting in Wake County at age 20, 28 May 1861, for the war. Transferred to Company G, 7th Regiment N.C. State Troops, 1 June 1861.

WEATHERSPOON, Simpson, Private

Born in Wake County where he resided as a blacksmith prior to enlisting in Wake County at age 28, 28 May 1861, for the war. Appointed 3rd Lieutenant to rank from 16 May 1861, and transferred to Company G, 7th Regiment N.C. State Troops on 17 June 1861.

WEATHERSPOON, William H., Private

Born in Wake County where he resided as a farmer prior to enlisting at age 22, 28 May 1861, for the war. Transferred to Company G, 7th Regiment N.C. State Troops, 1 June 1861.

The company, known as "Cedar Forks Rifles," was from Wake and Chatham Counties and enlisted in Wake County on 28 May 1861. It went into the camp of instruction near Company Shops (Burlington), Alamance County, 1 June 1861, and was assigned to this regiment [Sixth Regiment] as Company I. After joining the regiment, the company functioned as a part of the regiment, and its history for the war period is recorded as a part of the regimental history.

The information contained in the following roster of the company was compiled principally from company muster rolls for 20 June 1861, through February 1864, and 15 September through December 1864. No company muster rolls were found for the period prior to 20 June 1861; for March through 14 September 1864; or for the period after December 1864. In addition to the company muster rolls, Roll of Honor records, receipt rolls, hospital records, prisoner of war records, and other primary records, supplemented by state pension applications, United Daughters of the Confederacy records, and postwar rosters and histories, all provided useful information.

ORGANIZATION: ORGANIZATION

Swift Creek Baptist Church was organized in 1879 in the Burns School House which stood at that time opposite the Henry Atkins home on Penny Road. (This site is across the road from Penny Road Elementary School today.) The old school house was moved several times with its final location being on the south-east corner of the current Church property. It was torn away in 1977 during site preparation for the current education building.

From the minutes of the Raleigh Baptist Association held October 23 to 25, 1879, references to the organization of Swift Creek Baptist Church are found. The Church organization took place after a series of meetings were conducted by Rev. W. R. Gwaltney, pastor of the Tabernacle Baptist Church in Raleigh. He was a member of the Cooperative State Board and held a ten-day revival meeting in the Burns School House eleven miles southwest of Raleigh. The Swift Creek Baptist Church was organized on Friday, November 1, 1879. The Raleigh Baptist Association appropriated \$100 toward organizational and financial needs of the new church. Swift Creek Baptist Church applied for membership in the Raleigh Baptist Association in the fall session of 1880.\*

The presbytery that constituted the church was composed of Rev. W. R. Gwaltney, Rev. George J. Dowell, Rev. J. M. Holleman, and Rev. Harvey Hatcher.\*

The first church conference was held on October 31, 1879. At a conference in 1880, the constitution of the Pleasant Grove Baptist Church was adopted.\* (Copy attached.)

\*From "One Hundred Years of Swift Creek Baptist Church, Wake County, Raleigh, North Carolina 1879-1979."

The first deacons of the Church were W. H. Strain and J. C. Burns. The first female deacons, elected in 1986, were Mary Livengood and Betty Finch. Until the 1950's, deacons served for life. Since then, they are elected to three-year terms on the Board of Deacons but of course as ordained deacons, they retain the title of deacon for life. Many have served repeated terms on the active board assisting the pastor in ministering to the spiritual and physical needs of the members. The current Board of Deacons is composed of Jack Bryson, Frances Christmas, Steve Cox, Jerry Dayberry, Margine Daniels, Joe Jones, Charles Livengood (Chair), Bobby Mills, and Robert Smith.

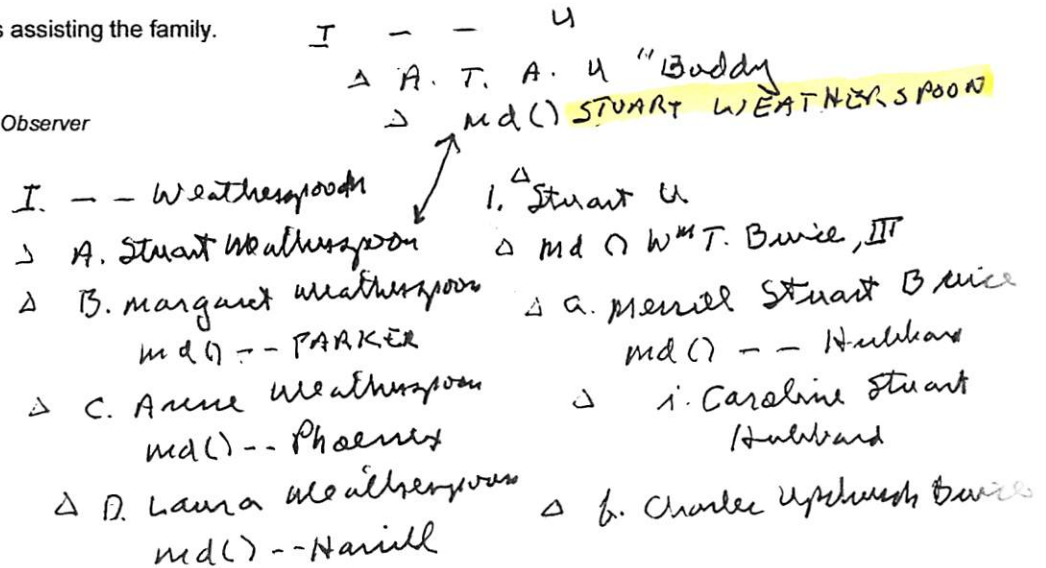

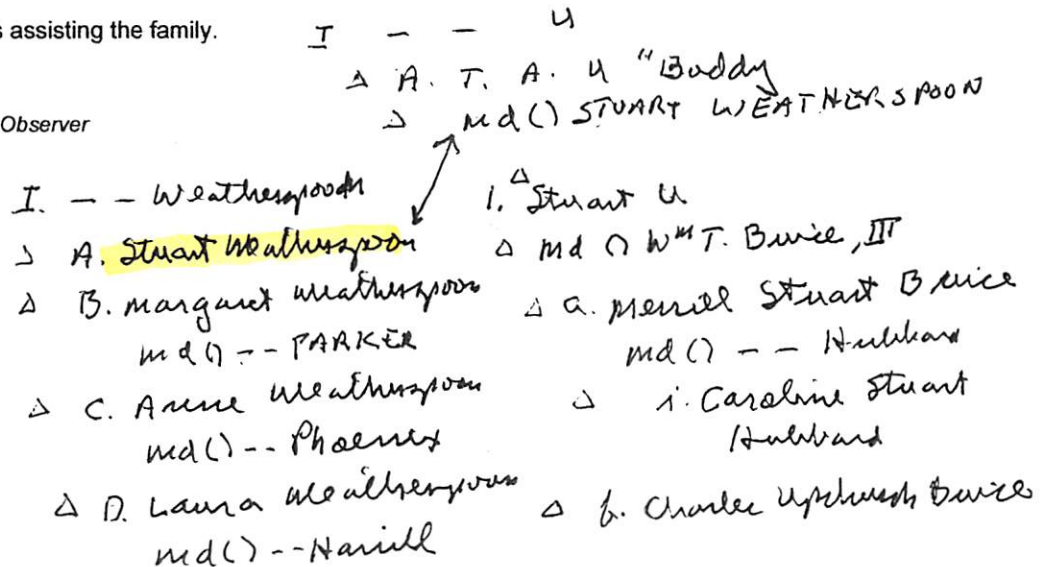
