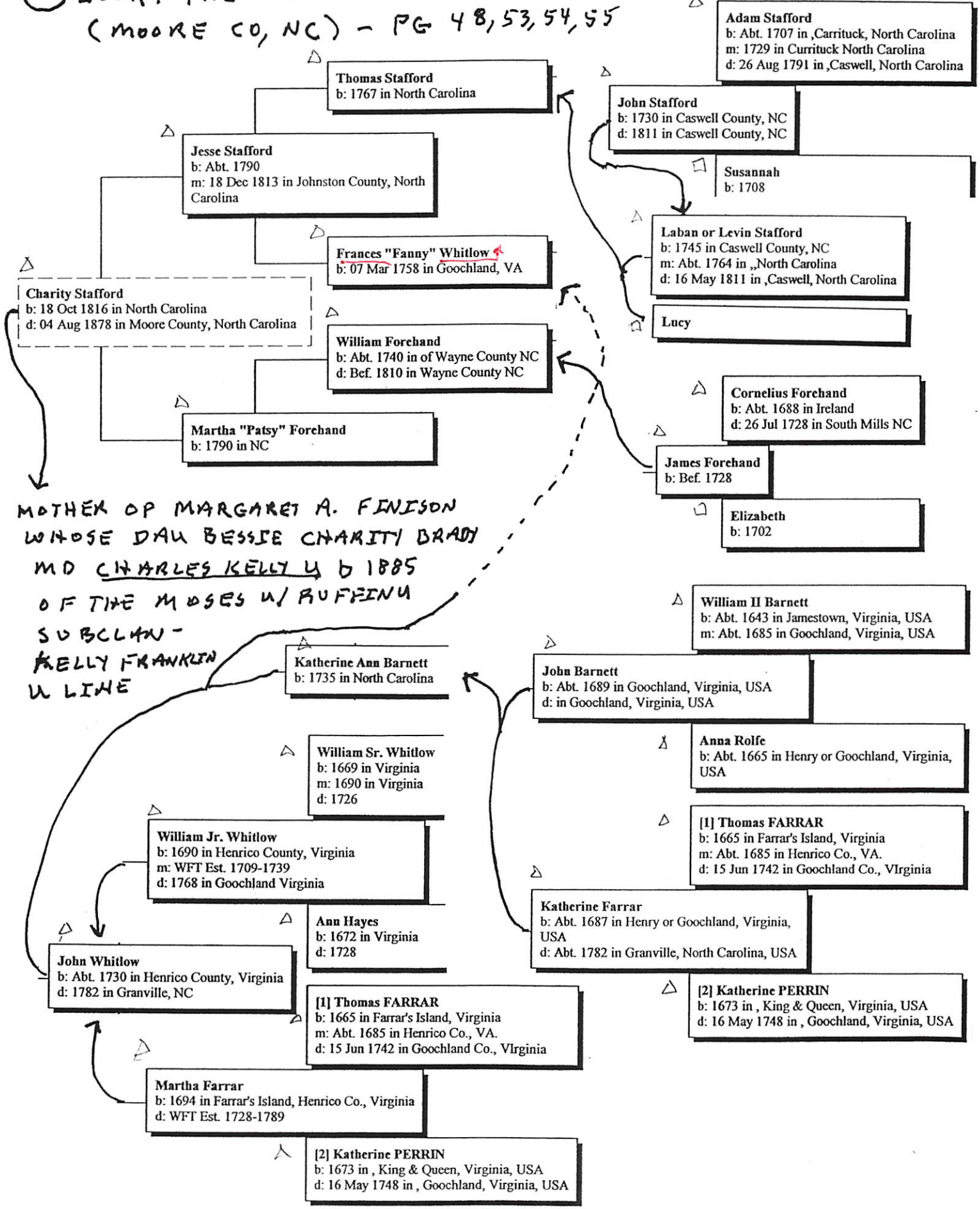

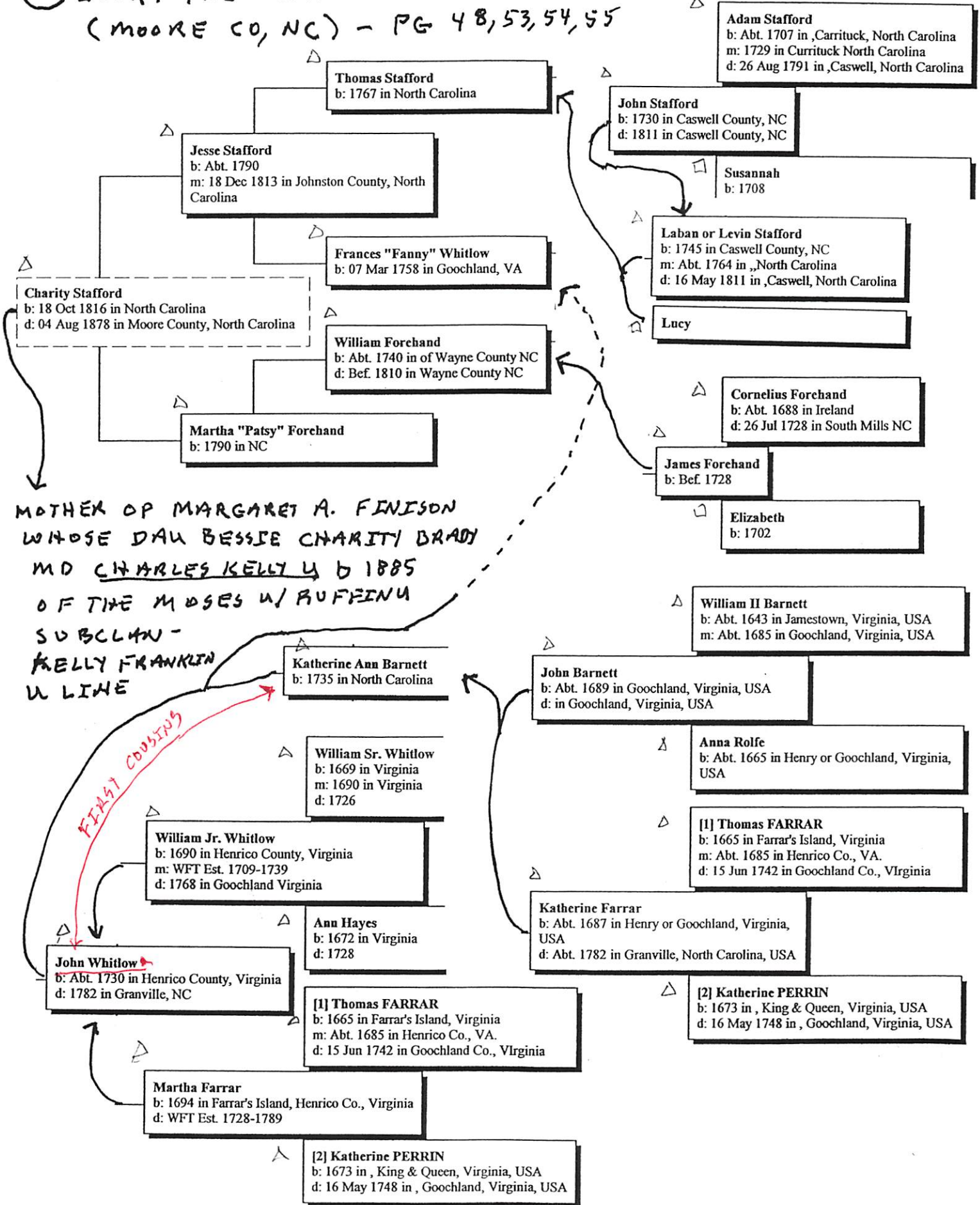

Northhampton Co, N.C. early JUNE 1861

1ST, 2ND, 3RD REGTS

COMPANY I "Beaufort Rifle & Beaufort Rifle" organized in
Cranen Co, N.C. & included 29 MAY 1861 New Bern, N.C.

△ BIVINS, WILLIAM, Private
Enlisted in Wake County on May 14, 1864, for the war. Died in hospital at Richmond, Virginia, July 26, 1864, of "phthisis pulmonalis."

△ SMITH, JOHN B., Private
Enlisted in Wake County on April 27, 1864, for the war. Deserted May 22, 1864, and reported as a deserter on muster rolls through October, 1864. Appears on a register of effects of deceased soldiers dated 1864.

△ BRASWELL, BAKER W., Private
Resided in Edgecombe County and enlisted in Wake County on July 8, 1863, for the war. Present or accounted for until captured at Kelly's Ford, Virginia, November 7, 1863. Confined at Point Lookout, Maryland, until paroled and sent to Venus Point, Savannah River, Georgia, November 1, 1864, for exchange. Paroled at Goldsboro on May 18, 1865. "Came in for parole."

△ STEWART, WILLIAM W., Private
Enlisted in Wake County on June 1, 1864, for the war. Captured at Winchester, Virginia, September 19, 1864, and confined at Point Lookout, Maryland. Paroled at Point Lookout and transferred for exchange to Aiken's Landing, Virginia, March 15, 1865. Declared exchanged on March 18, 1865.

△ ★ COLEY, G. D., Private
Enlisted in Wake County on May 23, 1864, for the war. Company muster rolls report him as absent wounded from July 18, 1864, through October, 1864. Paroled at Statesville on May 19, 1865.

△ WHIRLAN, A. B., Private
Captured and paroled at Raleigh on April 12, 1865.

△ GRAVES, A., Private
Enlisted in Wake County on February 3, 1864, for the war. Deserted on July 28, 1864.

△ WHITLOW, JOHN, Private
Resided in Randolph County and enlisted in Wake County at age 26, August 19, 1862, for the war. Roll of Honor carries the remark: "Sent to hospital November 15, 1862, and not heard from since."

△ HEATHCOCK, SAMUEL W., Private
Enlisted in Wake County on May 23, 1864, for the war. Company muster rolls state that he was left near Washington, D.C., July 12, 1864, sick. Federal Provost Marshal records do not indicate where and when he was captured, but his name appears on a roll of prisoners who took the Oath of Allegiance at Elmira, New York, July 7, 1865.

△ WOODRUFF, JOSHUA, Private
Enlisted in Wake County on June 25, 1863, for the war. Present or accounted for on company muster rolls through October, 1864, being reported as absent without leave from March 22, 1864, through October, 1864.

△ OWENS, JOHN, Private
Enlisted in Wake County on June 6, 1864, for the war. Deserted June 16, 1864.

△ RAY, JOHN D., Private
Enlisted in Wake County on April 29, 1864, for the war. Present or accounted for on company muster rolls through October, 1864. Admitted to hospital at Richmond, Virginia, January 5, 1865, and furloughed for 60 days on January 8, 1865.

△ REID, MALON, Private
Enlisted in Wake County on June 7, 1861, for the war. Reported on September-October, 1864, muster roll as "absent wounded and taken prisoner September 19, 1864."

△ RIDGE, WILLIAM, Private
Enlisted in Wake County for the war. First reported on company muster roll for May 1-August 31, 1864. Reported on that muster roll as "absent sick since August 17, 1864." Reported with same remark on September-October, 1864, muster roll. Issued clothing at General Hospital, Liberty, Virginia, October 21, 1864.
