Perymon Willbanks Will. Recorded 5<sup>th</sup> April 1824

In the name of God Amen. I Perymon Willbanks of the County of Henry & State of Tennessee, do make and Ordain this instrument, to be my last will and testament, & working all others:

First. I lend to my wife Averila the benefit of my fifty acres of land which I bought of John Barnett during her natural life, likewise I give to my wife, my old mare and Saddle, my Stock of Hogs, and one Cow and calf, with my sheep and kitchen furniture, with my Bedchamber furniture and chest, likewise my will and desire is, my wife should have of the present Crop of Corn, sufficient to last her one year.

Item. My will and desire is, my son Henry should have my sorrel mare with the choice of one my Cows & Calves. My will further is, that my son Richard Willbanks, should have the Cow that I have bound him.

The residue of my Stock with my farming utensils my wish is, should be sold, and after debts is paid, divided between my two sons, to wit: Henry and Richard Willbanks, and after the death of my wife, my will is, the fifty acres of land, be divided, between my above named two sons Henry & Richard

Item. My will desire is, that David Upchurch & John Barnett should execute the above deed, to wit: My Land Seal this 19<sup>th</sup> of October 1823
