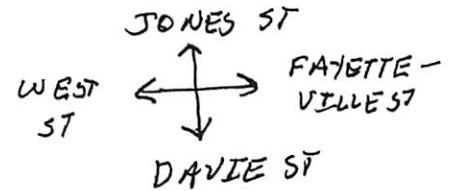

WILLIAMS, Lelia A. v. J. H. WILLIAMS

The marriage was dissolved the April Term of Superior Court, 1909. The Pl married the Def 7 October 1894 in Wake County. The Pl was a resident of North Carolina more than two years before filing the action. The Pl alleges the Def committed adultery with Blonnie **WILLIAMSTON** and others. Summons dated January 1909 called **J. H. WILLIAMS**. Summons dated April 1909 called C. E. **UPCHURCH**. Summons dated April 1909 called R. L. **ROGERS**, John **GREEN**, David (Daniel ?) **JEFFREYS**, Leonidas **ROGERS**, and Roland **YOUNG**. Pl recovers cost.

DETAILS RE CO "I"

WILLIAMS, C. L., 1st Sergeant

Enlisted in Wake County at age 23, 28 May 1861, for the war. Appointed Sergeant the same date. Promoted to 1st Sergeant on 28 January 1862. Present or accounted for until wounded in the right cheek at Cedar Creek, Virginia, 19 October 1864. Paroled at Appomattox Court House, Virginia, 9 April 1865.

WILLIAMS, G. S., Private

Resided in Chatham County where he enlisted at age 23, 18 July 1862, for the war. Wounded in the right knee at Gettysburg, Pennsylvania, 1-2 July 1863. Present or accounted for until paroled at Appomattox Court House, Virginia, 9 April 1865. North Carolina pension records indicate he was wounded in the right arm at Petersburg, Virginia, at an unspecified date.

WILLIAMS, J. H., Private

Enlisted in Chatham County at age 20, 25 February 1862, for the war. Wounded in the left side at Rappahannock Station, Virginia, 7 November 1863. Paroled at Appomattox Court House, Virginia, 9 April 1865.

WILLIAMS, Jackson L., Private

Born in Wake County where he enlisted at age 23, 28 May 1861, for the war. Died at Camp Jones, Virginia, 13 September 1861, of disease.

WILLIAMS, James M., Private

Enlisted in Chatham County at age 20, 25 February 1862, for the war. Killed at Gettysburg, Pennsylvania, 2 July 1863.

WILLIAMS, John F., Private

Enlisted in Wake County at age 30, 28 May 1861, for the war. Detailed as a driver in the Ambulance Corps from 1 September 1862, through September 1864. Paroled at Appomattox Court House, Virginia, 9 April 1865.

WILLIAMS, Sandy, Private

Previously served in Company D, 35th Regiment N.C. Troops. Transferred to this company on 27 December 1862. Present or accounted for until paroled at Appomattox Court House, Virginia, 9 April 1865.

The company, known as "Cedar Forks Rifles," was from Wake and Chatham Counties and enlisted in Wake County on 28 May 1861. It went into the camp of instruction near Company Shops (Burlington), Alamance County, 1 June 1861, and was assigned to this regiment [Sixth Regiment] as Company I. After joining the regiment, the company functioned as a part of the regiment, and its history for the war period is recorded as a part of the regimental history.

The information contained in the following roster of the company was compiled principally from company muster rolls for 20 June 1861, through February 1864, and 15 September through December 1864. No company muster rolls were found for the period prior to 20 June 1861; for March through 14 September 1864; or for the period after December 1864. In addition to the company muster rolls, Roll of Honor records, receipt rolls, hospital records, prisoner of war records, and other primary records, supplemented by state pension applications, United Daughters of the Confederacy records, and postwar rosters and histories, all provided useful information.

James Theophilus Adams served in Company D, North Carolina 26th Regiment, Confederate States of America, rising from the rank of lieutenant to lieutenant colonel. His picture and an account of his service appear in Chief Justice Walter Clark's History of North Carolina Regiments, Vol. II; in George C. Underwood's History of the Twenty-Sixth Regiment of the North Carolina Troops in the Great War 1861-65; and in Richard B. McCaslin's Portraits of Conflict, a Photographic History of North Carolina in the Civil War. He was in command of the regiment when General Robert E. Lee surrendered at Appomatox, VA; and he signed the paroles of the men. For a period he also commanded General James Johnston Pettigrew's Brigade, during its retreat from Petersburg, VA. His name appears on the Confederate monument in Holly Springs, NC; and a picture of him is on display in the Holly Springs Masonic Lodge.

Following the war he returned to his home in Wake County to farm and become engaged in the lumber business. He and other members of the Adams family bought the timber rights to tracts of land, then set up sawmills to cut and dress the lumber. His home, located near Holly Springs, is still (August 2000) standing. It is pictured on page 364 of Kelly A. Lally's book, The Historic Architecture of Wake County, North Carolina, and is incorrectly identified as the home of "Col. David Adams" (his brother). His birth, marriage and death dates are given in a family Bible, and photostats of those pages are included in these papers. He was named as Lucy Ann Beckwith's husband in Green Beckwith's will, Wake County, NC, Record of Wills, Book A, 1878-1884.

Vintage structures reflect town's history

When Kelly Lally set out to record the architectural history of Wake County, she did not limit her focus to such impressive structures as the J. R. Cunningham house on South Hughes Street or the Hunter Schaub house on North Salem Street.

The book she compiled, entitled "The History of Architecture of Wake County, North Carolina," also includes what most passersby

would view as more mundane structures--the Seaboard Railroad overpass over Williams Street, for example.

And, branching out into rural White Oak Township, she included picture and story of the New Ruin Tavern, located on State Road 1141 in the New Hill vicinity, a sagging frame building with a tin roof and a colorful history.

Throughout Wake County, in all 18 townships, she followed the same practice. "Our goal was to show the development of Wake

County over time," Ms. Lally said in a recent interview.

She said she attempted to select buildings representative of the various periods of Wake County history. Some are notable, not only for their age, but for the beauty of their construction; others are significant because they represent the architecture of a particular period.

The New Ruin Tavern is included for its age, its construction and especially its history.

On page 345 of her book, in the section on White Oak Township, Ms. Lally has written:

"Local tradition holds that this frame farm building originally housed a tavern in the community known as New Ruin, famous as the site of mid-nineteenth-century dances and gambling events such as cockfights and horse races.

"Constructed with a mortise-and-tenon frame and elevated on a stone-pier foundation, the building displays the 'coastal cottage' form--with engaged sheds to the

front and rear--associated with traditional early nineteenth center architecture, but oddly shows no evidence of a chimney. The interior is divided into two main rooms; the front shed is thought to have been the location of a bar.

"The mile-long stretch of road from Cotton's Crossroads in Chatham County to the tavern is said to have served as a track for horse races.

"In more recent decades the old tavern was used as a general store by the Upchurch family, but it is now used as a storage building."

In an interview Ms. Lally said she has heard that concern about the questionable activities at the New Ruin Tavern may have provided the impetus for formation of the Olive Chapel Baptist Church.

Ms. Lally's book was published by Wake County Government. It grew from a decision made by county commissioners several years ago that a survey should be made county-wide to identify all properties with historic significance in the hope that at least some of them might be preserved.

Ms. Lally said when she was employed to do the survey, no one was certain just how the information would be stored or published. The idea for the book evolved as the survey progressed.

The 448-page hardcover volume was released in the fall and is available for purchase through the Wake County Planning Department.

In commenting on historic landmarks in the Apex area and White Oak Township, she said the depot, designed in 1914 by the staff of the Seaboard Railway home office in Norfolk, is one of five depots still standing in Wake County and the

only one built of brick.

The depot is presently home to the Apex branch of the Wake County Library system.

Among the oldest in-town Apex homes included in the book are the Atkinson-Wagner House on Templeton Street built around 1870 and the Thompson-Utley-Tunstall House on North Elm Street, also built in the 1870's.

The Hunter Schaub house on North Salem Street is also notable for its "rare original picket fence."

Going outside Apex Ms. Lally



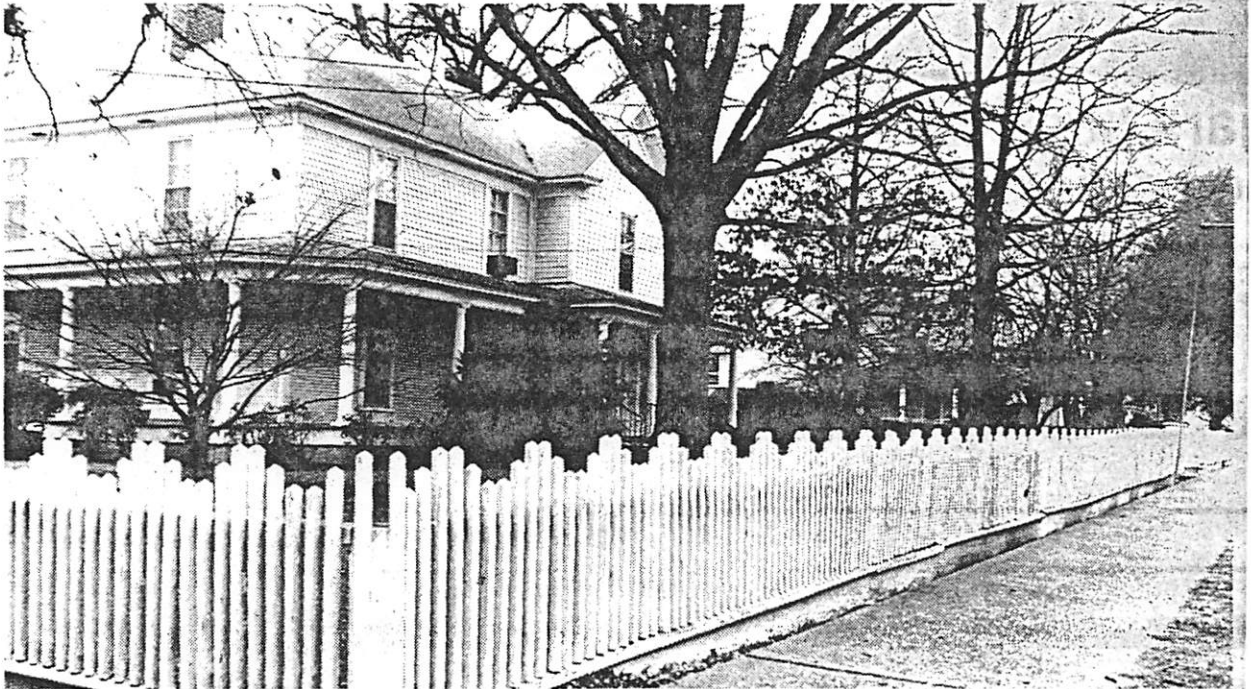
The Betts-Beasley house on Elm Street, believed to have been built around 1889, was a boarding house in the early 20th century.

pointed to the J. M. Williams house in Green Level as "a locally rare example of Queen Anne architecture," built about 1900 by a tobacco farmer.

Many other homes in Apex and the surrounding countryside are featured as well as some commercial buildings, among them the old L.R. Jackson tobacco warehouse and the W. A. Hinton and Son hardware store, both on Main Street.

A photo of the Seaboard Railroad overpass across Williams

Street is also in the book with the following description:

"Erected around 1930 by the Seaboard Air Line Railway, this concrete Art Deco railroad over-

pass features two narrow piers on each side of Williams Street, which support three slightly arched openings over the road and adjacent sidewalks.

"The piers rise above the openings to support iron railings that flank three sets of railroad tracks. The railings are made up of both linear and curved elements, which, with the verticality of the piers and angular designs molded into the concrete, give the structure its Art Deco appearance."

Ms. Lally said one aim of the book is to educate people, to let them know that these buildings and structures have interest in the hope that some will be preserved.

It is the goal of the Wake County Historic Preservation Commission to find ways to preserve some of them, she said.

Ms. Lally said the book does not contain all of the Wake County buildings which have historic interest. She said the process of deciding what to include was very difficult. She said she hopes those whose favorites were not chosen will understand.

WILLIAMS, C. L., 1st Sergeant

Enlisted in Wake County at age 23, 28 May 1861, for the war. Appointed Sergeant the same date. Promoted to 1st Sergeant on 28 January 1862. Present or accounted for until wounded in the right cheek at Cedar Creek, Virginia, 19 October 1864. Paroled at Appomattox Court House, Virginia, 9 April 1865.

WILLIAMS, G. S., Private

Resided in Chatham County where he enlisted at age 23, 18 July 1862, for the war. Wounded in the right knee at Gettysburg, Pennsylvania, 1-2 July 1863.

Present or accounted for until paroled at Appomattox Court House, Virginia, 9 April 1865. North Carolina pension records indicate he was wounded in the right arm at Petersburg, Virginia, at an unspecified date.

WILLIAMS, J. H., Private

Enlisted in Chatham County at age 20, 25 February 1862, for the war. Wounded in the left side at Rappahannock Station, Virginia, 7 November 1863. Paroled at Appomattox Court House, Virginia, 9 April 1865.

WILLIAMS, Jackson L., Private

Born in Wake County where he enlisted at age 23, 28 May 1861, for the war. Died at Camp Jones, Virginia, 13 September 1861, of disease.

WILLIAMS, James M., Private

Enlisted in Chatham County at age 20, 25 February 1862, for the war. Killed at Gettysburg, Pennsylvania, 2 July 1863.

WILLIAMS, John F., Private

Enlisted in Wake County at age 30, 28 May 1861, for the war. Detailed as a driver in the Ambulance Corps from 1 September 1862, through September 1864. Paroled at Appomattox Court House, Virginia, 9 April 1865.

WILLIAMS, Sandy, Private

Previously served in Company D, 35th Regiment N.C. Troops. Transferred to this company on 27 December 1862. Present or accounted for until paroled at Appomattox Court House, Virginia, 9 April 1865.

The company, known as "Cedar Forks Rifles," was from Wake and Chatham Counties and enlisted in Wake County on 28 May 1861. It went into the camp of instruction near Company Shops (Burlington), Alamance County, 1 June 1861, and was assigned to this regiment [Sixth Regiment] as Company I. After joining the regiment, the company functioned as a part of the regiment, and its history for the war period is recorded as a part of the regimental history.

The information contained in the following roster of the company was compiled principally from company muster rolls for 20 June 1861, through February 1864, and 15 September through December 1864. No company muster rolls were found for the period prior to 20 June 1861; for March through 14 September 1864; or for the period after December 1864. In addition to the company muster rolls, Roll of Honor records, receipt rolls, hospital records, prisoner of war records, and other primary records, supplemented by state pension applications, United Daughters of the Confederacy records, and postwar rosters and histories, all provided useful information.

On March 1, 1796 in Johnston County Court, Bryant Medlin (Jr.) and John Medlin were each listed as delinquent for a poll tax in Johnston County.

On August 30, 1796 in Johnston County Court, William Medlin was included on a list of insolvents for 1795.

On August 30, 1797 in Johnston County Court, John Medlin was included on list of insolvents for the year 1796.

On October 12, 1797 in Franklin County, Matthew Medlin purchased land from John Strother, witnessed by Bradley Medlin. Bradley Medlin also purchased land in Franklin County in 1797 from Drury Perry.

In March 1798 in Wake County Court, Drury Medlin proved three deeds from Jacob Williams to Thomas Busby.

In 1798, in Franklin County, Bradley Medlin and James Medlin are listed as landowners in Captain Norris's District and Shadrach Medlin is listed as landowner in Captain Upchurch's District, with each of them owing one white poll tax.

On June 24, 1799, John Medlin of Wake County purchased from James Cone 200 acres on Turkey Creek in Nash County adjoining Jacob Brantley, Morgain and Mary Jones, witnessed by Jesse Hammons, Guilford Cone and William Perry.

On February 6, 1799 in Wake County, William Medlin was listed as owing a note to the estate of Robert Johnston. On April 15, 1799 in Wake County, Drury Medlin, Micajah Medlin, and Thomas Busby were listed as buyers at the estate sale of Robert Johnston.

In 1800, in the Federal census of North Carolina, Bryant Medlin, Sr. and Bryant Medlin, Jr. were both listed as heads of families in Wayne County, which had been formed from Dobbs County in 1779.

Also listed as the head of a family in North Carolina in the 1800 census were William (Owen) Medlin (Sr.) in Johnston County; Joseph, Shadrach, Bradley, Britain, James, Jemima, Josiah, and Matthew Medlin in Franklin County; Cade, Drury, Francis, and William Medlin in Wake County; John Medlin in Halifax County; Nicholas Medlin in Robeson County; Joel, John, and Hugh Medlin in Moore County; John Medlin in Montgomery County; Michael Medlin in Chatham County; and Thomas Medlin in Lenoir County.

On October 15, 1801 in Franklin County, Bradley Medlin was listed as a buyer at the estate sale of William and Theodrick Ferrell, orphans sold by Jeremiah Perry, guardian.

On December 24, 1801 in Johnston County, Benjamin Medlin was listed as a buyer at the estate sale of Robert Horton.

In 1802, William Owen Medlin (Jr.) had moved to Anderson County, Tennessee in Medlin's Company where he was too old for a poll tax.

On November 22, 1803, a marriage bond was issued in Wake County for Royal Medlin and Judah Hicks, with Willis Hicks and Moses Bledsoe as bondsmen and Simon Turner as witness.

The words of eminent foreign Protestant Divines have been consulted, and every assistance called in, to defeat the purposes of the enemies of religion, and to render the triumph of Christians, in a pure revivion, complete.

If the present undertaking should be found serviceable to the cause of true piety; if it should be found to throw a light on those pages of Holy Writ which are less perspicuous, either from their style or their matter, to a common understanding; if the humble and pious reader shall have his doubts explained, his discouragements lessened, and his knowledge of the Sacred Oracles rendered more familiar, the Authors of this work will rejoice that they have been enabled to gratify their highest ambition, and contribute to the advancement of personal and domestic religion.

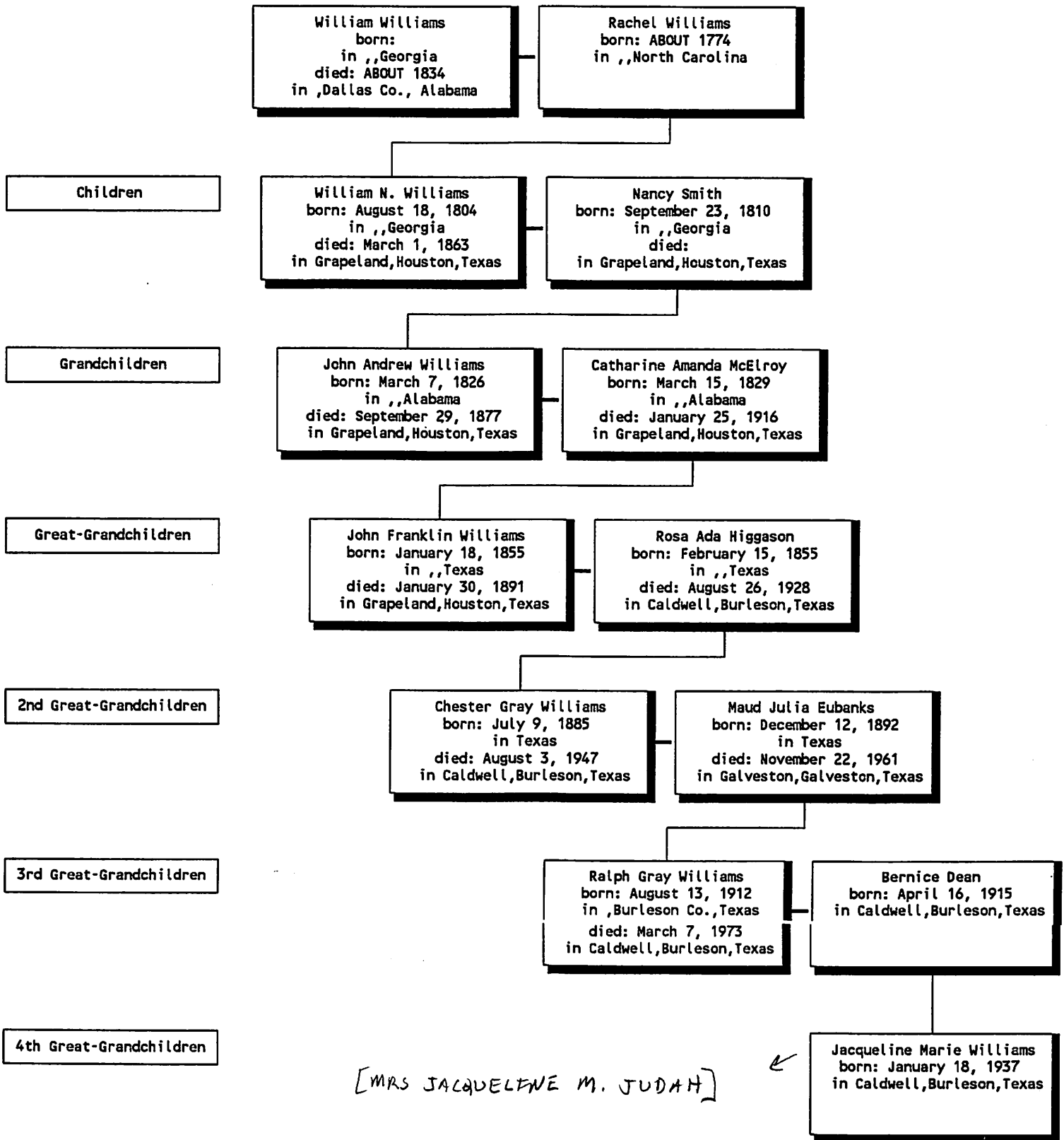

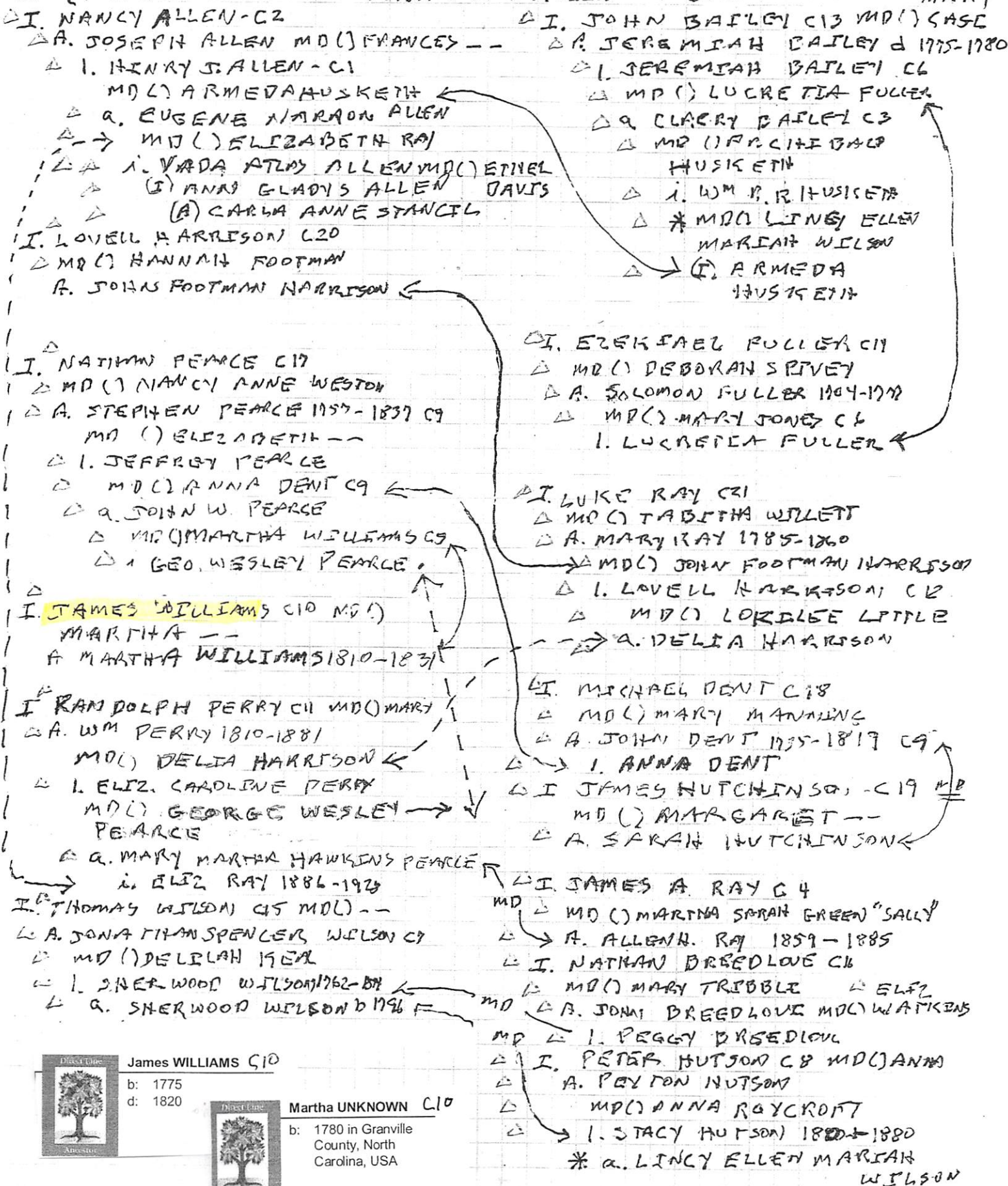

Present or accounted for until paroled at Appomattox Court House, Virginia, 9 April 1865. North Carolina pension records indicate he was wounded in the right arm at Petersburg, Virginia, at an unspecified date.

WILLIAMS, J. H., Private

Enlisted in Chatham County at age 20, 25 February 1862, for the war. Wounded in the left side at Rappahannock Station, Virginia, 7 November 1863. Paroled at Appomattox Court House, Virginia, 9 April 1865.

WILLIAMS, Jackson L., Private

Born in Wake County where he enlisted at age 23, 28 May 1861, for the war. Died at Camp Jones, Virginia, 13 September 1861, of disease.

WILLIAMS, James M., Private

Enlisted in Chatham County at age 20, 25 February 1862, for the war. Killed at Gettysburg, Pennsylvania, 2 July 1863.

WILLIAMS, John F., Private

Enlisted in Wake County at age 30, 28 May 1861, for the war. Detailed as a driver in the Ambulance Corps from 1 September 1862, through September 1864. Paroled at Appomattox Court House, Virginia, 9 April 1865.

WILLIAMS, Sandy, Private

Previously served in Company D, 35th Regiment N.C. Troops. Transferred to this company on 27 December 1862. Present or accounted for until paroled at Appomattox Court House, Virginia, 9 April 1865.

The company, known as "Cedar Forks Rifles," was from Wake and Chatham Counties and enlisted in Wake County on 28 May 1861. It went into the camp of instruction near Company Shops (Burlington), Alamance County, 1 June 1861, and was assigned to this regiment [Sixth Regiment] as Company I. After joining the regiment, the company functioned as a part of the regiment, and its history for the war period is recorded as a part of the regimental history.

The information contained in the following roster of the company was compiled principally from company muster rolls for 20 June 1861, through February 1864, and 15 September through December 1864. No company muster rolls were found for the period prior to 20 June 1861; for March through 14 September 1864; or for the period after December 1864. In addition to the company muster rolls, Roll of Honor records, receipt rolls, hospital records, prisoner of war records, and other primary records, supplemented by state pension applications, United Daughters of the Confederacy records, and postwar rosters and histories, all provided useful information.

A farm family who cares

Are you tired of hearing unhappy news about the environment? Here is good news about one local farm family that cares and is doing something.

The Wake Soil and Water Conservation District is proud that the James Macon Williams family was chosen as its Conservation Farm Family for 1994. Through their hard work and stewardship of the land, they have made dramatic improvements in how their farming operation affects the environment.

The Williams' have farmed in Green Level, N.C., for almost a century since Macon Williams' grandfather, James Madison Williams, bought the farm in 1903. His father, Jeter James Williams, farmed, cruised timber, and ran a sawmill in the area.

Macon didn't originally intend to be a farmer. With a business and economics degree from Atlantic Christian College in Wilson, he worked for one year at ITT. With his father's health declining, he came home to help on the farm. Since Jeter Williams' death in 1987, Macon has had the help of his sister, Mackie Lambert, and now his children, Dawn and Jimmy. Even with a full-time job, Eliza, Macon's wife, helps on weekends and when timing is critical.

When asked how he got started in conservation, Macon replied, "My father taught me about conservation practices that didn't cost much and could be done with the resources available on the farm -- rotations, grassed waterways, dikes, etc."

Macon Williams has a concern for all the natural resources. His farming operation provides wildlife cover and food, forest management and conservation of the soil and water resources. His chemical management program uses pesticides and fertilizers only when necessary, and only at recommended rates.

His conservation practices have a strong effect on water quality by keeping soil and chemicals from leaving the fields:

- Grassed waterways use permanent vegetation in low spots in the field to filter the sediment from water runoff.

- Field borders perform the same function on the field edges.

- Terraces are used to guide the farmer's planting direction across the slope rather than up and down to slow rainfall runoff and to increase water infiltration into the soil.

- Diversions are similar to terraces but may not be parallel to the row direction.

- Sod-based rotation increases water infiltration and reduces soil erosion by increasing the organic matter in the soil.

- Soil tests guide the fertilization program.

Farmers with a history of working the land are making a difference in the battle to save their natural resources for the future. Wake Soil and Water Conservation District is proud and happy to be helping farmers like Macon Williams protect the environment in this way.

Born February 24, 1903 in Sampson County, Rupert T. Jackson was the son of Hinton Miles Jackson and Jenett Eliza Tew Jackson. His daughter tells us that her father came to Angier in 1930 from Sampson County to work in his sister's (Malissa Jackson Denning) husband's grocery store. He worked for Mr. Webb Denning for six years then bought the store from him and changed the name to Jackson's Market. It was located on the northeast corner of North Broad Street East and Williams Street. He worked twelve to fourteen hours a day, six days a week but Sundays were his Lord's days. Most Saturday nights it would be midnight before he got home, but he was up in plenty of time to ring the bell at Angier Baptist Church where he also served as a Deacon. He was a member of Angier Kiwanis Club and served as Town commissioner.

His daughter Nancy stated that in his free time her daddy enjoyed fishing and baseball, especially since his son Kenneth played with a Tobacco State League team. She also said he was a man with little formal education but a man with a big heart; he was the *best* husband, father, and grandfather a person could be and he loved people. He fed many families when they had no money; he was Santa's helper when Santa was running short of goodies or when children needed shoes to wear to school. He commented once that he couldn't believe a man had gone to the moon,

but IF they did, the weather would never be the same. She agrees with her dad ... the weather hasn't been the same!

Finally, his daughter said, her father did not have many worldly goods but he must be very rich in heaven because he always wanted to give rather than receive. He was honest, truthful, dependable and he was much loved by his family.

Mr. Jackson was married to Eliza Jeanette Jackson for sixty-five years; she came to Angier in 1930 with her husband. Mrs. Jackson was born in Sampson County, October 25, 1903. Her parents were Everette Anson Jackson and Ada J. Jackson.

Her daughter described her in this manner: "She loved her family and stayed busy at home looking after her children and her mother-in-law who lived with them. In later years she started working in Jackson's Market with her husband. They were partners in work as well as in life. She was a great cook — as her family, many preachers, soldiers in World War II, and many young people of Angier can attest. She loved people and could find something good about everyone. She enjoyed her church and loved her Lord. She was a good woman. She, like her husband, enjoyed the game of baseball, probably because their son was involved in the game. Most of all she loved her family and devoted her life to caring for and helping them. Many people called her 'Mama Jack' even though they were not related. She was a person who was easy to love and her family really loved her."

They have five children: eleven grandchildren, eighteen great-grandchildren, and one great-great-grand child. They are listed by families.

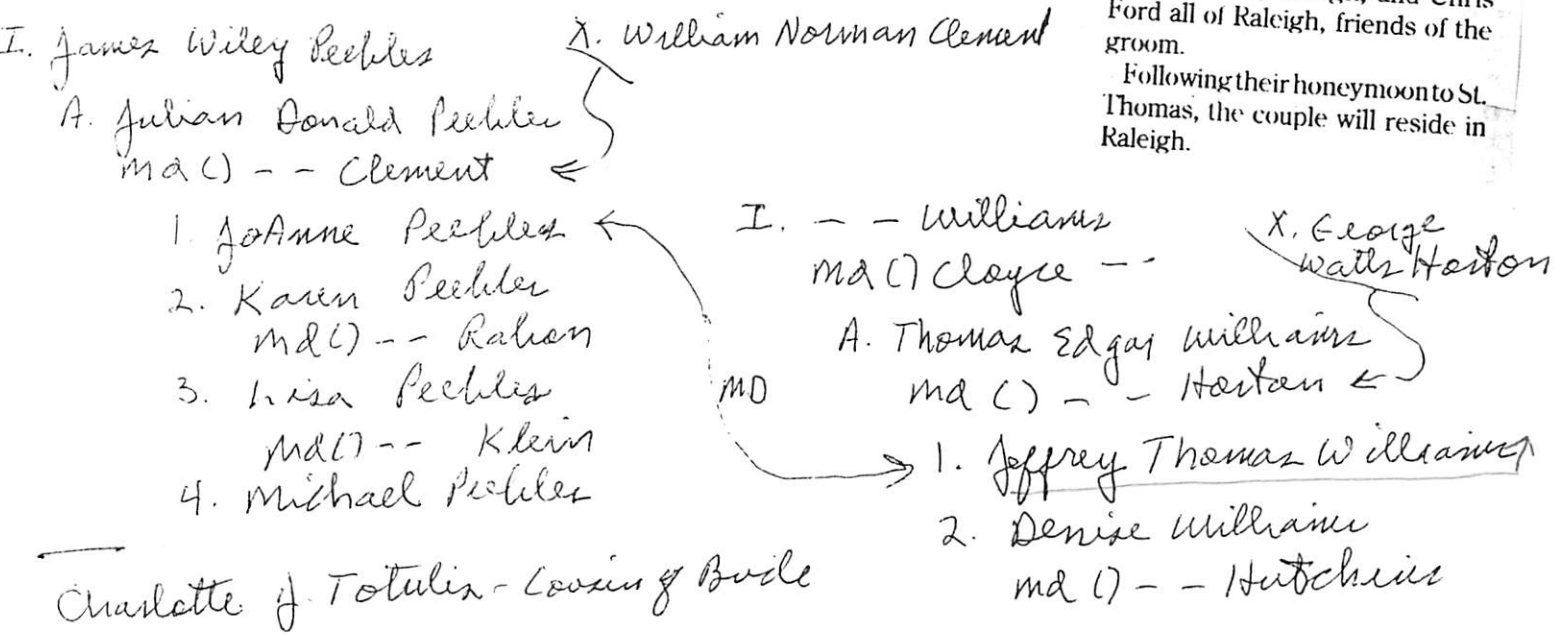

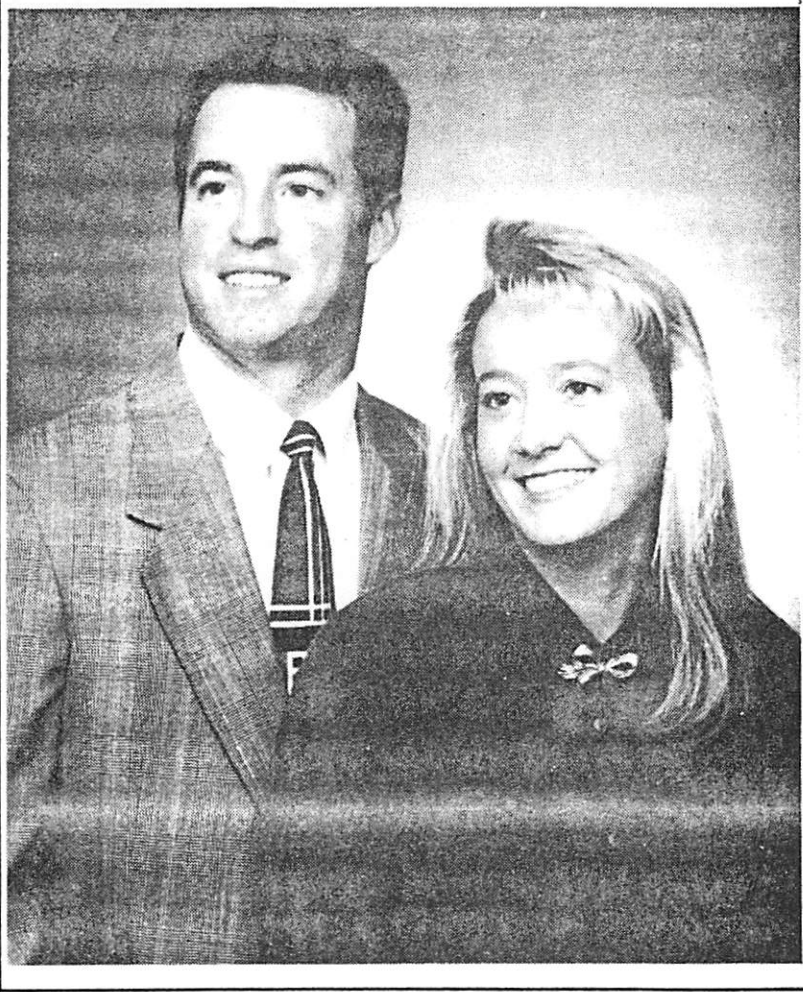

A farm family who cares

Are you tired of hearing unhappy news about the environment? Here is good news about one local farm family that cares and is doing something.

The Wake Soil and Water Conservation District is proud that the James Macon Williams family was chosen as its Conservation Farm Family for 1994. Through their hard work and stewardship of the land, they have made dramatic improvements in how their farming operation affects the environment.

The Williams' have farmed in Green Level, N.C., for almost a century since Macon Williams' grandfather, James Madison Williams, bought the farm in 1903. His father, Jeter James Williams, farmed, cruised timber, and ran a sawmill in the area.

Macon didn't originally intend to be a farmer. With a business and economics degree from Atlantic Christian College in Wilson, he worked for one year at ITT. With his father's health declining, he came home to help on the farm. Since Jeter Williams' death in 1987, Macon has had the help of his sister, Mackie Lambert, and now his children, Dawn and Jimmy. Even with a full-time job, Eliza, Macon's wife, helps on weekends and when timing is critical.

When asked how he got started in conservation, Macon replied, "My father taught me about conservation practices that didn't cost much and could be done with the resources available on the farm -- rotations, grassed waterways, dikes, etc."

Macon Williams has a concern for all the natural resources. His farming operation provides wildlife cover and food, forest management and conservation of the soil and water resources. His chemical management program uses pesticides and fertilizers only when necessary, and only at recommended rates.

His conservation practices have a strong effect on water quality by keeping soil and chemicals from leaving the fields:

- Grassed waterways use permanent vegetation in low spots in the field to filter the sediment from water runoff.

- Field borders perform the same function on the field edges.

- Terraces are used to guide the farmer's planting direction across the slope rather than up and down to slow rainfall runoff and to increase water infiltration into the soil.

- Diversions are similar to terraces but may not be parallel to the row direction.

- Sod-based rotation increases water infiltration and reduces soil erosion by increasing the organic matter in the soil.

- Soil tests guide the fertilization program.

Farmers with a history of working the land are making a difference in the battle to save their natural resources for the future. Wake Soil and Water Conservation District is proud and happy to be helping farmers like Macon Williams protect the environment in this way.
