Commentary: Penelope A. Williams was the wife of Bartley Upchurch, son of Abel Upchurch Sr., head of Upchurch Clan No. 8. Bartley was born in the Upchurch enclave on the border of Wake and Franklin Counties in North Carolina. It is likely Penelope was born in this same area. She and Bartley were married in 1823, likely in NC, and shortly thereafter moving to Alabama about 1825. More research on the Williams family is desired.

(They were <u>not</u> bur in Unity Cem) On her stone "<u>Penelope</u>, wife of B. U. 22 APR 1802 - 21 NOV 1863 - Thou art gone to rest. Thine is an earthly tomb. But Jesus summoned the away. Thy savior called the home."

"According to the Pickens Co, AL Cemetery Book, the tombstone of Penelope [<u>PAW</u>] reads '<u>Penelope Upchurch</u>, wife of J. B. Upchurch' ". All Upchurches are bur at Bethesda, not at Unity. [*Note: This entry is only evidence for Bartley U [son of Abel U, Sr - Head of Clan] to be called J. Bartley U - RPU*]

The writer says the broken stone for <u>PAW</u> includes the phrase "wife of Bartley U". This stone is broken where "of" is written and previous inspections led to the reading of "of" as "J". This was incorrectly entered in the Cemetery Book. William C. Daniel reports "I am now convinced there is no "J" [in the name of Bartley U]. This upon re-inspection of the stone.

The attached copy of minutes shows that the Liberty Primitive Baptist Church in Pickens Co, AL was formed 28 OCT 1837 with Bartley Upchurch and his wife **Penelope** as founding members. Other family members named (Strickland, etc) may have a relationship to the Upchurch Family. This article to RPU in a 22 JUL 1996 Letter from Carla Sue Jones. She got it from Mrs GUESNER PATE of Pickens Co, AL.
