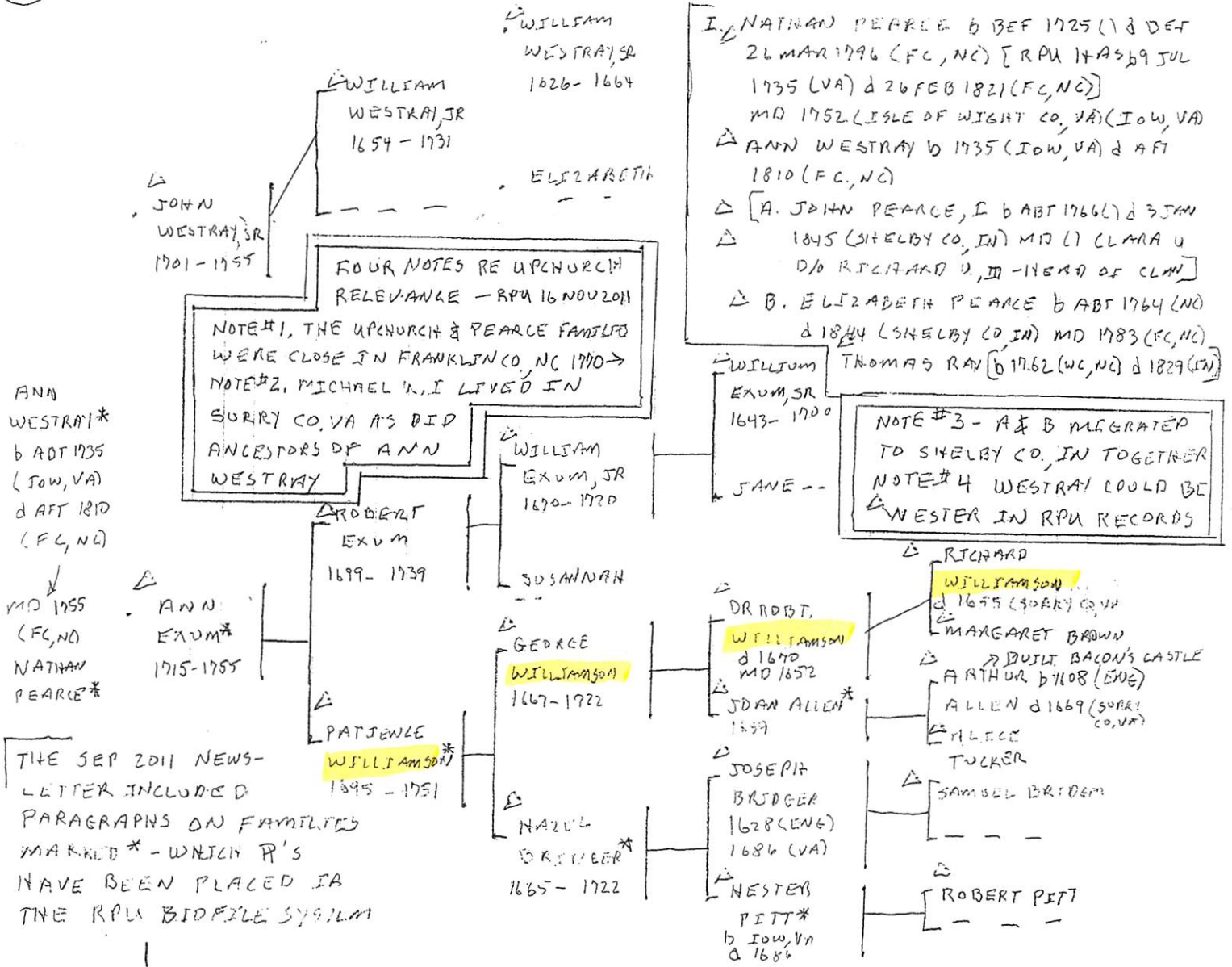

Messrs. Keuster and Smethurst secured contracts for the manufacture of gun caps, and in 1862 Capt. B. P. Williamson and the late Col. J. M. Heck manufactured belt buckles and spurs to supply the Confederate cavalry. Cartridges, too, were manufactured; the "plant" was at the Deaf and Dumb Institution, and the operatives were the pupils and other boys and girls of the city.

① Captain B. P. Williamson was certainly one of the most successful, if not the most successful, of Raleigh, NC's postbellum businessmen. A Wake Co. farmer, he purchased a \$95 license to engage in general commission business in 1865. A few years later W. G. Upchurch joined him to form Williamson & Upchurch, and in 1881 their mercantile business grossed an incredible \$465,428.77, (37, pg 63)

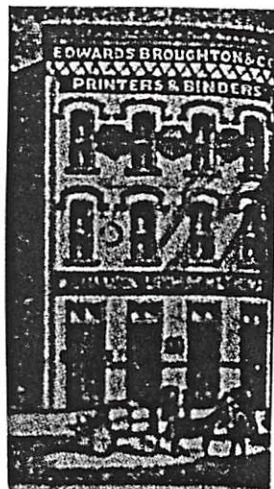

A Wake County Cattle Club, organized in 1885, began hosting an annual spring Cattle Show in the capital city where hundreds of animals—mostly Jerseys, plus a few Devons, Guernseys, Holsteins, and Ayrshires—were on display. Participants in 1886 included W. C. McMackin, William B. Grimes, W. G. Upchurch, T. B. Bridgers, B. P. Williamson, W. C. Stronach, Capt. J. B. Burwell, Dr. James McKee, Maj. R. S. Tucker, M. T. H. Murray, Dr. Richard H. Lewis, R. B. Raney, and Dr. Henry M. Tupper, all of Raleigh Township; and Maj. John M. Crenshaw of Forestville. While organizers continued calling their event the "Cattle Show," they later added horses. The 1890 show, held at McMackin's pavilion stables on Morgan Street, began with all the animals parading down Raleigh's Fayetteville Street, led by Stanley's Brass Band. The main features were a butter display and an auction of both cattle and horses.⁷³

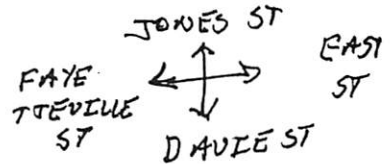

(25) Re Citations for William George U - Cetter Bradley U notified RPU via email on 6 OCT 2010 that there was a citation in the 1889 issue of The Cultivator and County Gentleman Vol 52 Pg 495 that mentioned my Great Uncle William. It was found and is reproduced below:

"We observed that a correspondent of the Jersey Bulletin traveling in North Carolina writes in highly complimentary terms of the Jersey Herds of our friends Messrs B. P. Williamson and W. G. Upchurch and Dr James M'Kee of Raleigh. During the year ending May 1, 1889 4363 (?) lbs of milk was made from the milk of eleven cows at the "Woodland" farm of Mr Upchurch, including four three-year olds, one five-year old, and six two-year olds."

RPU Commentary and Observations:

1. It seems most likely that reference is being made to three separate Jersey Herds - those of Williamson, Upchurch & M'Kee - HOWEVER, note that the 1891 Brannen's Directory for Farmers in Supt Cook TWP showed Williamson & Upchurch [BFW & WGU] owned a 696 Acre farm. [Item 6 BJA BJOFTCE]
 2. This article provides a rare citation for the Upchurch Farm called "Woodland" - presumably owned by Bartley Upchurch & WGU.
 3. Citations to "WOODLAND" are shown in the BJA BJA as follows:
Items 6, 18, 81
 4. Note that Item 6 is from my FEB 1955 interview with Uncle Cetter Henderson U in which he specifically mentioned the SCTWP Farm of BJA as "Woodland"
 5. Note that 18 is from my 24 FEB 1979 visit to Edna Lois U in which she referred to the SCTWP Farm of BJA as "Woodland"
 6. Note that 81 is from a 4 MAY 2007 conversation with Mike Robert Perry in which he refers to the SCTWP Farm of BJA as Woodland
- Notes that as of 10 OCT 2010 I have created a file for SCTWP Farm under WGNL/SCTWP/FARMS

Zebulon legal eagle Wilbur M. Jolly has soared to successful heights in his profession and in person. So much so, the owner of a Louisburg law firm was recently hailed for his longtime community leadership during a ceremony last month at Franklin County District Court.

me," Jolly said of the appreciative act unveiling a portrait which will be permanently displayed at the courthouse after renovations are completed.

Framing the career of the man rather than just the face, however, began in 1941 when the Ayden native graduated from Wake Forest University. His starting pay at his first job was \$125 a month, but he has stayed in the business for 58 years and counting. In 1961, he even formed a partnership. Then his cousin, Ben Williamson (the current dean of the Franklin County Bar Association), joined the team in 1971.

Jolly has acted as attorney for the town of Louisburg, the Department of Social Services, and the Water and Sewer Authority. But he hasn't always been stuck in his office with clients.

As a viable asset to the community, he served as a Louisburg commissioner along with three terms in the N.C. Senate, and one in the House of Representatives. He was also commander of the Louisburg American Legion post and president of the Louisburg Shrine Club. Jolly also served in the military.

A clerk of the Superior Court for 38 years, Ralph S. Knott has been a longtime personal friend of Jolly's. He said Jolly is someone that he could always count on. "Jolly is known for taking a personal interest in his friends," Knott added. "I have the utmost admiration for him. I can't count the number of times that I've called on him for his opinion."

Knott said they both attend Louisburg Baptist Church where Jolly has held every position of the church. "That impressed me," Knott said. "He's made a difference in our lives and our community."

He said Jolly is upfront about his opinion, always giving sound judgment. Jolly also sets standards for other young lawyers to follow.

Robert H. Hobgood recalled that as a law school senior in 1963, he asked Jolly to loan him a formal jacket for his senior portrait. Of course, Jolly let him borrow the jacket.

"If you look closely at the senior portraits for the 1963-64 year, you'll see that every boy was wearing Mr. Jolly's tuxedo jacket," Hobgood said.

Jolly and his wife, Justine, live in Stallings Crossings. Jolly has two grown children. His son, Michael King Jolly, said the most important lesson he has learned from his father is service to his fellow man.

"His whole life is history and a testimony of service to his community, his church and his friends," Michael Jolly said, adding he learned the importance of kindness and compassion from his father.

At age 83, Wilbur Jolly continues enthusiastically practicing law. "I'm the first one in the office every morning," he added. "And I hope I can keep doing it."

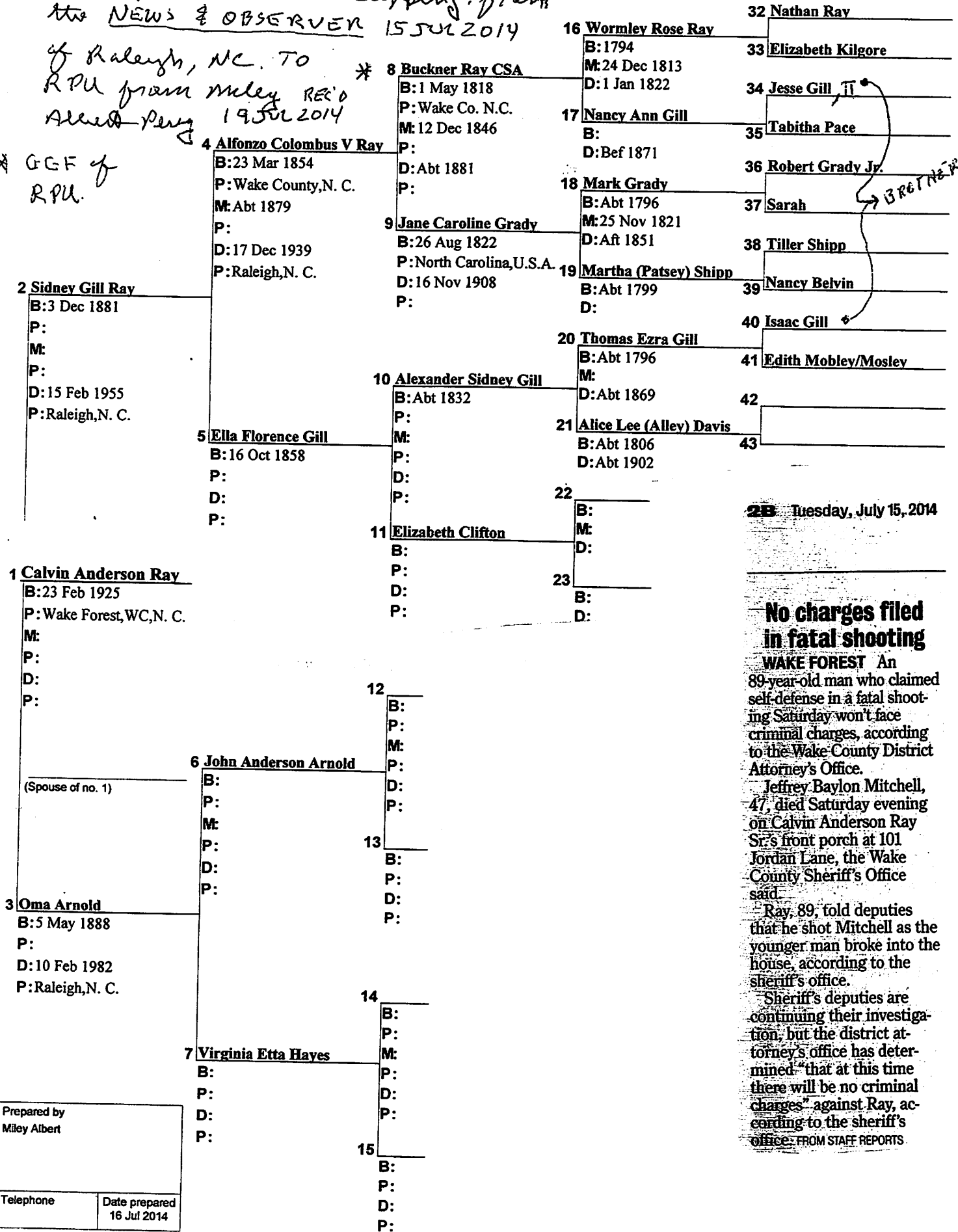

This book includes all Massey entries in the census records, tax lists, deeds, marriage records (including the record of cohabitation of former slaves), divorce records, school records, death records, wills and estates from the beginning of available records through the dates listed after each type of record. For various reasons, the Court records were not analyzed; the early records have been extracted and published. This book includes records that were Wake County records at the time they were created. However, county boundary lines changed, and a family that was in Wake County might later be found in Franklin County, because of these boundary changes, without the family's having moved.

The entries, regardless of source, are in chronological order. Deeds are by date of deed; in the county deed indices, listings are by date of recordation. Since deeds have no statute of limitation within which they must be recorded, they were often not recorded close to the time of the making of the original deed.

From this you can see that my ancestor Jesse Gill II had a brother Isaac Gill who married EDITH MOBLEY. I think one law strong evidence that the GILL/RAY and MOBLEY families lived in close proximity on the ^{Granville} ~~Wahl~~ border in the 1750-1850 era. Getting the full story will take a lot of investigation.

It so happens Jesse Gill II was a very large land owner on the Wahl/Granville border. He died in 1860 leaving his GS (my GGF) Buckney Ray to sort out the details which were very complicated and not even resolved at the death of Buckney in 1881. We have a lot of the records. Part of the problem was

That posse started giving⁴ land and other assets to some
of his children in the 1800's some of whom moved
on to other states (including Meigs Co, TN). Bushner
had trouble dealing with who had already gotten
what and who was still deserving. There were
lawsuits.

All of this deals with just some of the
families on the Wake/Granville Boards. No
doubt much more can be found & organized.

I'll be interested in your reaction to the
enclosures and will be happy to continue to

GOODEN / GOODWIN / HALL / MASSEY / TATE

My family papers include an original letter written by William HALL (b. 1794 Wake County) while in Wake Co. in 1836 to his son Jonathan Parker HALL in Pekin, Illinois regarding William building a house for William Henry TATE in Wake County. While a great part of the letter is personal to his son, it does reference certain things in Wake County and includes the formality, wording, and spelling ("ss" "fs") common to the times. The letter is written as follows:

'State of No Carolina Wake County April 25 day 1836

To Jonathan Hall and all the children.

Dear Son, I take this opportunity of writing a few lines to inform you that I am in tolerable health at present thanks be to god for his mercys hoping these few lines may find you enjoying the same blefsing [blessing], I have received one letter from you some short time after I had started the second letter and was very glad to hear from you and to hear the children was all [this part missing] with their homes though I was sorry to hear that William Paton was not going to school. I have been looking for a letter from you some time and begin to doubt whether you [?] my last letter or not. I want you to write to me as soon as pofsible [possible] as i want to hear from you very much. I can inform you that my health is very much improved since I have been here and I don't expect to return home till October or November. I expect that by that time I can settle all of my bisnefs [business] here and I expect to have the bisnefs [business] to settle for all the rest of the leggators in the western country. I am building a house for Wm Henry Tate and expect to have it completed in three or four weeks if nothing happens to prevent me from [?]. Under the first contract I was to have a hundred dollars but I shall do considerable extra work to expect I can do though at a very low price. I have nothing more of importance to write to you give my best respects to all inquiring friends.

The letter brings several questions to mind for me:

- 3) Who were the "leggators"
- 4) What area is the western country?

I found a notation that William HALL was in Tennessee in 1815 when my ancestor Jonathan was born, but I have always found his birth as Wake County, and that they moved to Springfield, Illinois in 1828. My great-great-grandfather was Jonathan Parker HALL born 1815 in Wake County. He was William's son and his oldest child. He was also the person the letter was written to.

William HALL was born in 1794 in Wake County (parents unknown). He married in 1813 Wake Co. to (1) Nancy MASSEY born 1795, daughter of Samuel MASSEY born ca 1762 and Olive (CHAMPLAIN) MASSEY born 1760. Children of HALL and MASSEY, all born in Wake County:

Hi Taylor---

Your query in the latest Updates has been noted. I am a long time student of Wake County families as all eight of my GGP lived in various parts of the County. I live in MO but visit N.C. one or more times a year. My websites are www.upchurchstory.com and www.alliedfamilies.com.

I cannot tell if we have mutual interests or not but thought a good way to start would be to focus on the name Rogers Store which surfaced in your article. Historically there have been two communities by this name in Wake County. From the time of the Revolution what we now know as Wake Crossroads was known a Rogers. The prominent Rogers family that gave the site its name soon moved on and over time the Rogers name was lost. (The family continued on to prominence elsewhere and I have a book about how one of the descendants became active in the White House.)

This community is about 5 miles due south of Wake Forest. The other Rogers location is 12 miles west and it bears the name Rogers Store on maps of today. I wonder if you have any idea as to which of the two Rogers sites William Hall had in mind in his 1836 letter?

My Upchurch connection with Wake Crossroads came when Kearney Upchurch moved to the site from Franklin County probably in the 1830's. My connection with Rogers Store came about when My GF B.J. Upchurch moved to the area after the Civil War an married Aurora Ray. The Rays had been in the area for over a hundred years at the point along with the related Gill and other families.

I don't know where all of this takes us but I thought it would be nice to see if we can get on the same page as regards the Rogers item.

I had no idea that 'Rogers Store' was a 'place name' ! I thought it was a 'store' where ggggf William Hall received his mail- like in a general store post office. duh!

(since I have no idea where he was born in Wake I have not looked at a map, because there is no point of reference yet to his parents)

I did find in rootsweb a 1860 census of a 'Rogers Store' Community House in the Barton Creek District.

*I do not know if this is the right one.

(then, rootsweb notation of a contract made 1879 with Nathaniel S. Jones of Rogers Store, NC for postal service 1882. I assume he was a postmaster there).

(is just a notation I found - it has nothing to do with my William Hall family).

**Now, as to which 'Rogers Store' William Hall referred to in 'the letter', I have no idea! so, the plot thickens yet again!

I know for sure (from family bible, papers) that he was born in Wake County in 1794 (although all current web sites note it as 1790).

I have no idea what part of Wake he was born or lived in (& there are many persons by that name in census records).or his parents names-which I am most interested in. *CONTINUED*

I know he married Nancy Massey in 1813, (tons of info on her family is available) & I believe she died in 1836, & believe in Wake, which might explain the 'business' he refers to, as his reason for being in Wake Co. in 1836...

--'the letter' refers to 'going home' in the Fall- but where was home??

And while in Wake in 1836 he met & married Rachel Gooden in Dec.. (cannot find her family in Wake. web sites note name as Goodwin, our family papers says Gooden)

The letter says he was building a house for a man he names, which should provide the clue to which Rogers Store he was closest to during that time- logic says he would not be far away from either.

Now I have to find reference to that man & hopefully, to where that house was located -township or whatever.

Family stories about William Hall always said he owned plantation & slaves, but I am wondering if that might refer to his father instead.

I find no plantation or slaves in census or plantation names that makes any sense yet.

Lots of questions remain. any more light you can shed will be most appreciated !

I will let you know if I come up with info on the man & house location.

I have done little more digging and can report that it is 99% certain that the Rogers Store Post Office William Hall referred to is in fact the site in Barton's Creek Township and that this is the exact place my Ray, Gill, etc ancestors lived from the time of the Revolution. This has always been a subsidiary study for me as my main research for 40 years has been on Upchurch. Still my periodic forays into the Ray aspect have been productive. I think we have now established that your Halls and my Rays, Gills, etc lived in the same community in the 1750-1850 era. If you are interested I'll be glad to see if this takes us anywhere based on both of us doing a little bit now and then. I can think of at least a half dozen approaches to learn if our family names in the area crossed paths. I am fully engaged in other projects but am always tempted to pursue a new lead with new cooperators. If you don't mind doing a little bit at the time we can see if our mutual interests grows.

Hi Taylor---

Before trying to identify families in early N. C. that might be of mutual interest let me be so bold as to tell you about place names that hopefully will be helpful. I have had to learn all of this the hard way and with any luck my description will make our sharing easier.

My guess is that your ancestors moved into N.C. likely from VA. It is likely they moved before Wake County was formed. In 1746 two very large counties were formed in central N.C.--Granville and Johnston. Subsequently, the eastern part of Granville was take to form other counties with western Granville remaining as it is today. In 1770 Johnston was divided with the eastern part remaining Johnston and the western part becoming Wake. When my Ray ancestors reached Barton's Creek Township it was probably a part of Johnston County and the same may have been true for your family.

To put an even finer point on the matter my Rays lived within five miles of Rogers Store to the north and east. I think it fair to say that your Halls probably lived within five miles of Rogers Store also but it could have been in any direction as far as we know now. However, there is a wrinkle for your family. Up until about 1912 (per my memory) the area to the north and west of Rogers store was in fact a part of Wake county known as Oak Grove Township. In 1912 this area had its name changed to Carr Township and was assigned to Durham County. So, if your Halls lived to the north and west of Rogers store they may have lived in the Oak Grove area. As you study old maps you will become familiar with this matter.

I have portrayed this large county issue in video 27 on my website www.upchurchstory.com which you may or may not find helpful. I am sue we can still do some fine-tuning on this map business as we go along. Perhaps we can now turn our attention to family names.

1. Thanks for your line. I will file under your original name but with locator sheets in my files referencing other versions. If you are interested in my background it can be found in the various Upchurch Bulletins on my website. Also, my oral history taken in 1994 is on line via the Upchurch Collection in Special Collections at N. C. State University. 4. Re Massey---My late good friend Carla Jones Tate was a descendant from a very large Massey family going back to the Revolution in Franklin County, NC. She published a very large compendium o Massey facts of which I have one of the few copies. Don't know if any of it relates to your Massey group. I had not previously thought of the Masseys as being in northern Wake but it may be that I have not had reason to learn such.

5. Re Goodwin---There was a large Goodwin family on the Wake/Chatham border going back to the Revolution. I have the definitive Goodwin Book. Again, there may or may not be a connection with your Goodwin/Gooden group.

On a personal note---We are moving to a retirement center on May 15 and at the same time establishing an office out of the home to facilitate my ongoing family history and other interests. This will involve some temporary inconvenience and as well require me to develop new work habits as I will now have to operate at two locations rather than just one. I will dig all my notes out again, & the other articles, etc. I have, & see if I can nail down where the Massey's & Brassfield's (names), properties were located as to how they place in relation to your people as well.

I also have to go back into 1790-1830 census or so again & see if it indicates location, township etc for Wm. & the other

Hall's, named below, now that your maps have placed Newlight Creek & Buckhorn Creek in context..

Identifying those places & the buyers of his land, & the Mobley's in relation to him, are the first breaks I have had in this most frustrating of searches.

I had always suspected that Joel Hall & William Oden Hall were connected to William, simply because I kept coming across their names, but had nothing to nail it down, & now that I found that the Mobley wife Elizabeth Hall is dau. in relation to them my suspicions are proving correct, so I have to dig deeper.

Joel Hall appears to have been a prominent land owner & is buried in Newlight.

Bible records of Jonathan Hall's list 'Rachel Gooden' & Wm, but a Wake marriage record spells it 'Goodwin' -again could be a like spelling or error in record, but not I think in Jonathan's. It also lists Hezekiah 'Gooden' Hall as a son of Wm. & Rachel, so that verifies it for me.

Now that you will be 'a little busy' with your move for awhile (oh goodness, I know more than I care to remember about that !) it will give me time to go back over my files for us.

IL, in 1836, but nothing concrete there so far, I did find the name in connection with bonds made by 100 citizens in establishing Springfield, and, there is a 'Mordecai Mobley' there at the same time too, who later moved to Dubuque, Iowa, but have not yet checked that out to see if he is the same one, a later one, or no one connected.

I did find a William Hall who was sued in Tazewell Co. in 1842 by Abraham Lincoln for a client of his and his partner Joshua Speed-don't know if it is my William or not, but William's son Jonathan lived in Pekin in Tazewell Co., and Lincoln stayed at their house when he was riding circuit there, so could be the same William, but I hope that Lincoln would not have sued a friend's father !

I found William's brother Jonathan -the one who sold the land with and/or by William in 36'- he lived variously in Gallatin and Saline Counties in Illinois, and is on find-a-grave with his many children listed

I'm sure you are aware of the several Newlight cemeteries with graves of the Ray's and Upchurches - my, quite a group of them I must say ! --I was hunting for Hall's there, but no luck.

I finally emailed Hope with our news, but got an email back from Roslyn Paniches who is the newsletter editor -I thought Hope was because she is the one who contacted me, but anyway, Roslyn says she will post something about the Hall's news I found. Remember I had also mentioned that the singer Reba Mcintyre had been looking for Samuel Massey, and had been to Wake searching, in the TV show I saw her on (the giant shameless plug for 'Ancestry') so Roslyn says she will try & follow up on that too.

I am certainly looking forward to your next pieces of 'our puzzles' --really exciting isn't it?

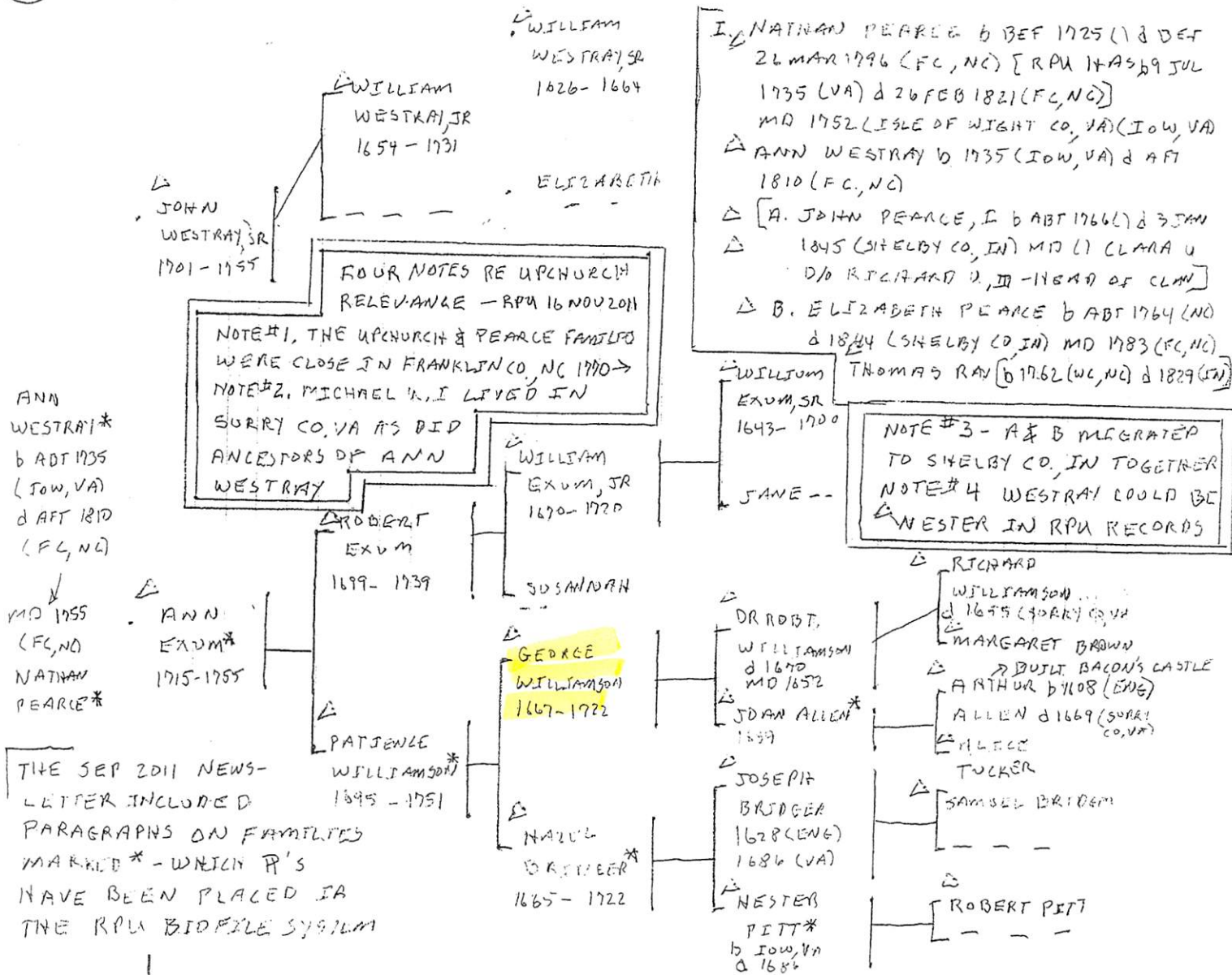

DEAN LEE "DEAM" STOCKTON, born March 13, 1895, died June 17, 1970, and is buried in Mixon Cemetery. He was married first, October 28, 1916, to Edna Viola Musick, born February 28, 1895, died December 17, 1965, and is buried in Mixon Cemetery. Edna was the daughter of Riley Ransom Musick and Altie Mae Kelly Musick.

Deam Stockton attended college at Rusk. He taught school for one year at Sycamore Grove. Deam and Edna owned a farm adjoining Ma Stockton's place at Mixon. Deam was in the garage business for a while. He was

also a painter, carpenter and paper hanger, as well as a sawmill operator. Deam and Edna lived in Jacksonville several years before building a nice home on their Mixon farm.

The lights in their new farm home were fueled by gas, which was produced from calcium carbide. The carbide tank was located in their back yard. The carbide system was viewed with great interest by the entire community, since homes in the country were rarely so well lighted, and electricity was still a luxury for only city folks.

Deam and Edna were divorced, and Deam and his second wife lived in New Mexico where he was a sawmill operator. Then during World War II he was employed in New Mexico at Los Alamos, where the atom bomb was developed.

Deam's third wife was Mrs. Jewel Williamson Henderson, and they lived in Houston, Texas, where he operated a cabinet-making business. After retirement, he and Jewel moved back to the Mixon Community where they lived several years prior to his death. All of Deam's six children were with his first wife, Edna Musick Stockton. Here are notes on the children who were all born in Cherokee County.

Trooper Allan L. Zimmerman of the N.C. Highway Patrol said neither Miss Williamson nor Cash was wearing a seat belt.

Miss Williamson was an employee in the cafeteria at Northern Telecom in the Research Triangle Park.

The couple had planned to live in Apex after the wedding.

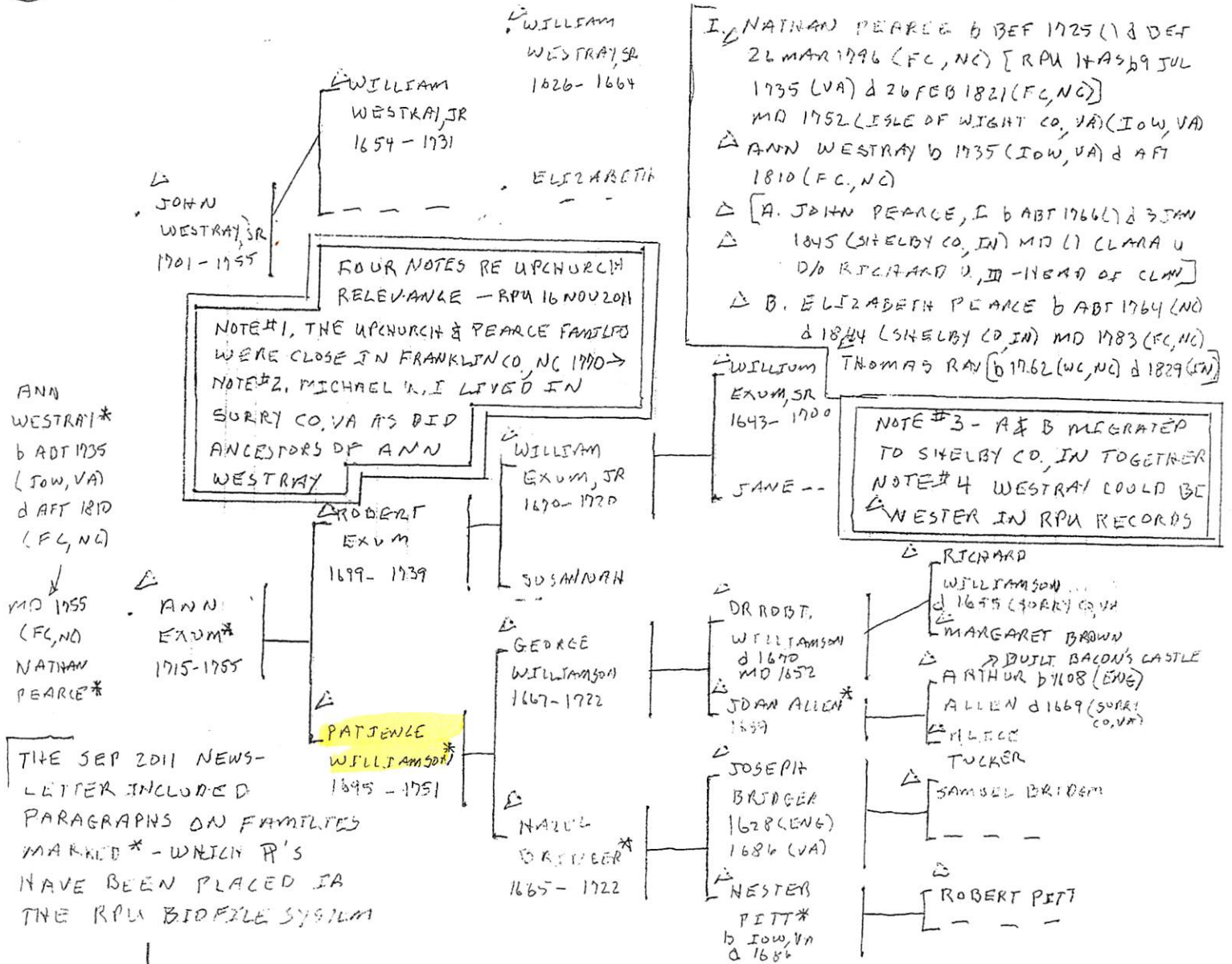

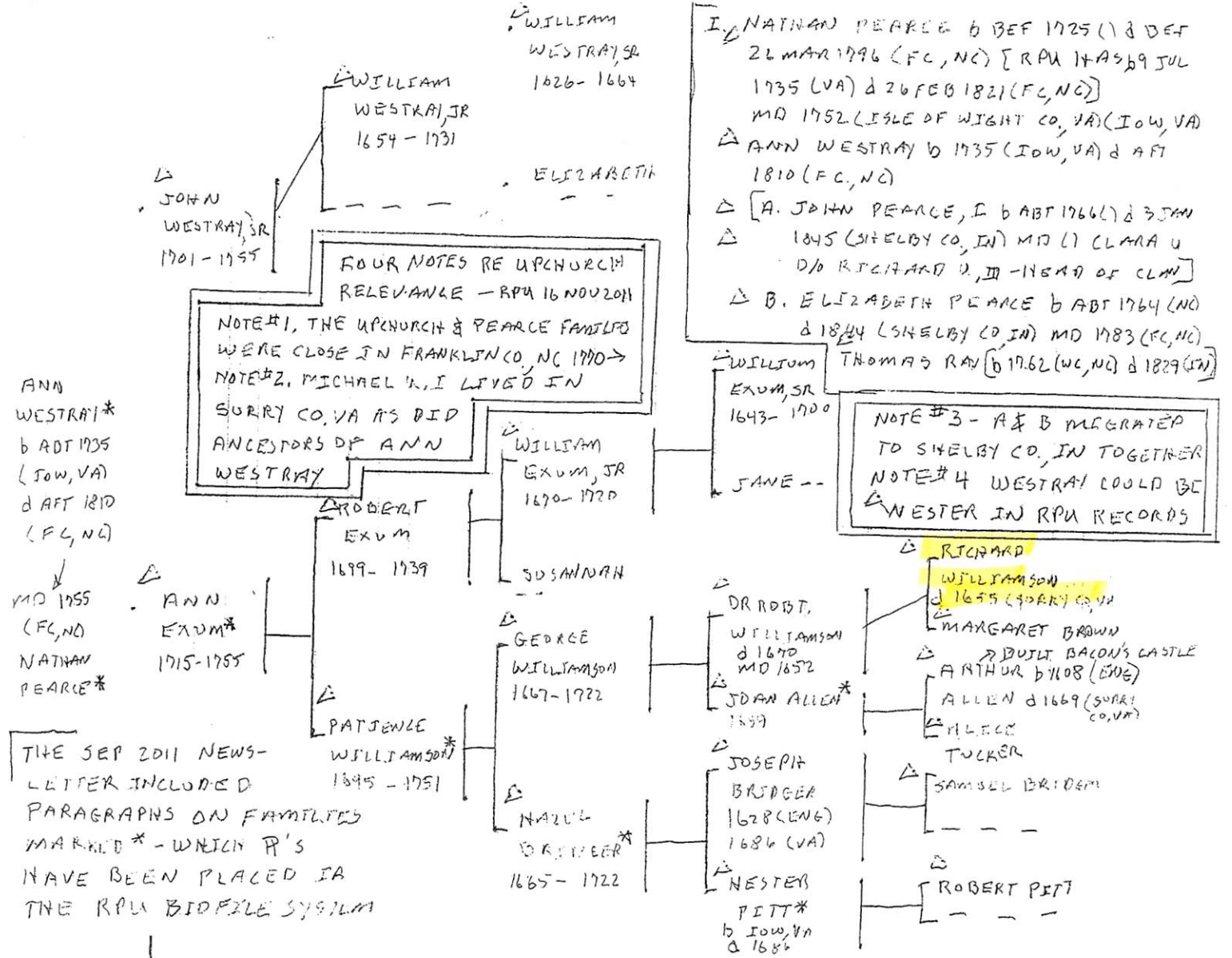

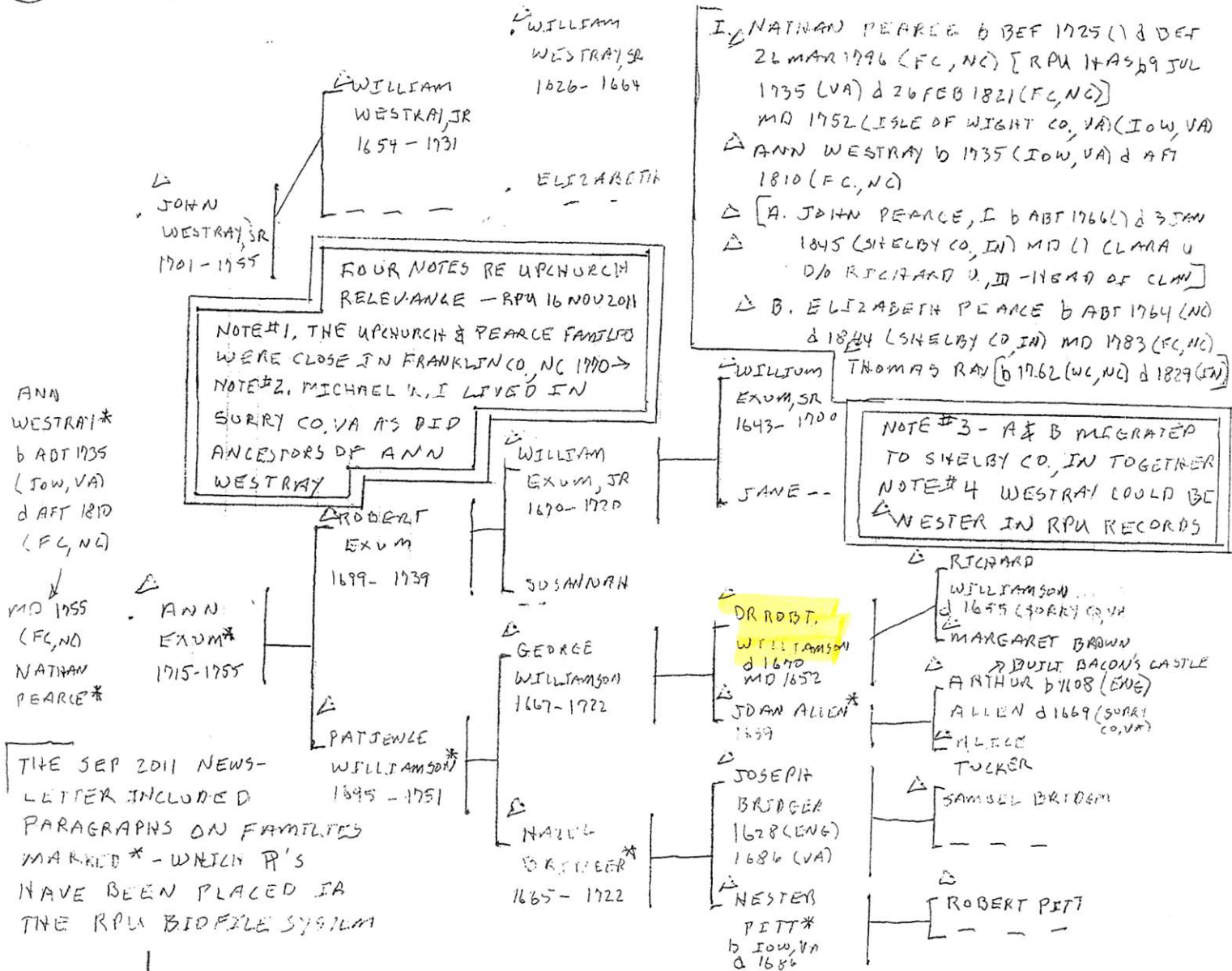
