The beautiful flowers at the altar last Sunday in memory of **Harold Wilson** and **Clyde Strother** certainly did the trick on bringing those folks to mind. One of the things so unforgettable is how families used to visit each other years ago, and I wish there was more of that today. We would visit the Wilson's on Sunday afternoon, and my little brother, **Allan Roy Lineberry** and I would have such fun with **Harold, Jr. and Margaret**; and my sister **Carolyn**, and **Evelyn Wilson**, who were about the same age, could always find something to laugh about and mischief to get into. I was proud to get the chance to give **Mrs. Frances** a big hug on Sunday! And **Clyde and George Strother** were very instrumental in the formation of my young life. I used to say, "When I grow up, I'll have a husband who will put his arm around me in church and give me a little hug, like Mr. George does Mrs. Clyde all the time."

At Christmas time, **Mr. George Strother** and his brothers, **Len** and **Percy**, along with other elders of the church, would have little bags of goodies for each child ~ each person in the church: an orange, an apple, little candies and lollipops. Every time I smell oranges, it brings that happy time to me all over again. We would go and visit **Mr. Percy and Mrs. Mynette Strother**; they had wonderful grapevines, and they invited us to share. Mr. Percy would take us children out to see his mules. My dad was so fond of Mr. Percy that he had planned to name me after him, had I been a son rather than a daughter. And we loved to visit **Miss Constance Strother** and her brother, **Len**, who was Church Clerk for as long as I could remember. Miss Constance had some special magic magnetic Scottie dogs she would let us play with; when you put a piece of paper between the magnets, you could make one Scottie follow the other (upside down) all over the paper! She was my mother's Sunday School teacher for years, and many of the ladies of the church would come to our house for Sunday School class meetings. It was up to me to serve them refreshments.

I related to Monk the story [△]Francis Helt told me about [△]Halt offering to build Aunt Maudie a nice house in exchange for her land. Monk had thought that it was [△]Harold D. Wilson, Sr who floated this deal but Monk conceded that the Francis Helt version could well be right. In any case the proposed deal caused Uncle Gertie to contact Uncle Rex in Norfolk and to persuade him to move into the home to avoid the deal. My take is that Uncle Gertie would always been angling to get the land for Frank, Jr and this is what happened in the end. Monk says he was always told that the land was somehow supposed to go to Uncle Rex's son [△]Allen (maybe as a fellow on to the return of Uncle Rex to the home. -- RW)

Monk and I once again lamented the fact that the 6 orphaned children of [△]BT4 lined out their lives in the home of their father and let it fall down around them. One could hardly blame the girls as they had not been prepared to work outside the home and opportunities were quite limited considering the Depression and all [But the opportunity was not zero!!]. The boys were the biggest disappointment. Growing up around one might guess they were raised spoiled and selected not to break out of the mold.

On June 2, 1929, Harold Wilson, was chosen to serve the church as deacon. He had been baptized in Yates' Pond on August 20, 1916. He was quite young at the time, and the evidences of his leadership did not come until close to the time that he was chosen as deacon. Unfortunately, that was the year in which the church records began to be quite abbreviated. For the most part, beginning with December 17, 1916, the records are not really minutes, but merely summaries of membership changes and statements of significant actions. Little is said about the people involved in the decisions and actions. The fact that Wilson's name does not appear in the minutes between the time of his baptism and the time of his selection to be a deacon, therefore, is no indication that he was not active. His election to that office, indeed, testifies to the exact opposite. But we simply have no clue as to what those activities were.

Throughout this entire period one of the most involved members was Harold Wilson. He had been baptized as a youth 1916, and was elected a deacon in 1929. Thereafter his name appears in the minutes of nearly every church conference. He was usually involved in matters having to do with the budget, and was particularly active in raising funds to re-build the church after the fire. He was a member of the permanent committee charged with the care of the cemetery. He served several terms as Assistant Sunday School Superintendent. And from time to time, in the absence of the pastor, he was called upon to act as moderator at church conferences.

Another staunch churchman was Harold Wilson, who had been elected deacon in 1929. He was elected assistant chairman of the deacons in 1951. When the rotating system was adopted in 1952, he was chosen for a full three-year term, and in 1954 he was chairman of the group. In 1960 he was elected to another term and promptly was chosen to be vice-chairman. In October, 1956, he was named to the "Development Committee" for long-range planning.

Harold Wilson, who had been elected deacon for the first time in 1929 and who had been a "regular" since the rotating system was adopted, completed a three-year term in 1963. He was elected to another three-year term in the fall of 1964, and yet another in 1968. For several years he was chairman of that group. He chaired the pulpit committee which in April, 1968, nominated Morris Jackson as pastor. At the deacons' meeting of October 1, 1970, "Bob Baird requested that we go on record as giving our heart felt thanks to Harold Wilson for his service as a teacher the past 46 years."
