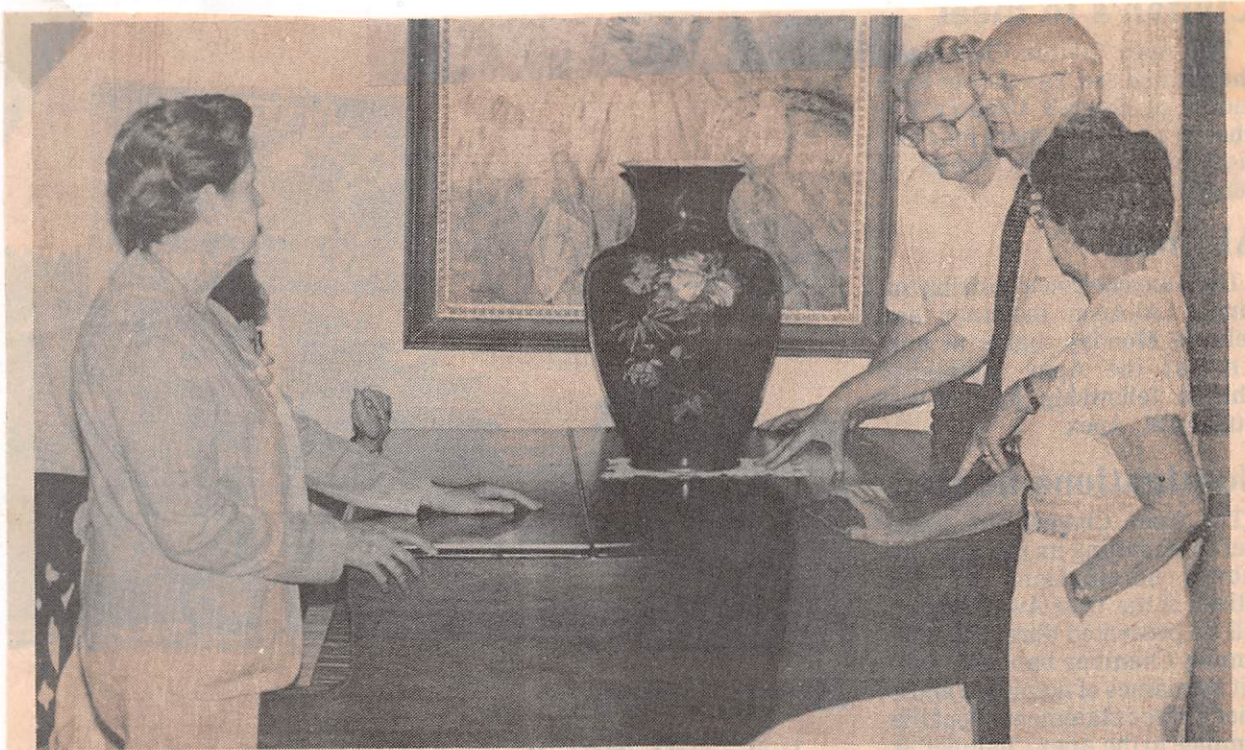
**MRS. EVELYN W. HOWARD**

## Thomas gives antique vase to The Campbell House

Mr. Wayne Thomas of Apex has given to the Campbell House in Buies Creek a large handsome handpainted German vase, circa 1890, in memory of his mother, Mrs. Omie W. Thomas.

More recently, Mr. Thomas has given other items to the house in memory of Mrs. Thomas. These more recent gifts are now in use in the house and enhance the Victorian decor of the house.

These more recent gifts consist of a Handel oil lamp, circa 1900, with a shade decorated with white roses, and a Royal Flemish "Gone With The Wind" lamp made in New Bedford, Massachusetts around 1850. This extraordinary example of American art is decorated with Narcissus.

Another lamp given was a banquet oil lamp by Bradley and Hubbard with an 11-inch ball shade decorated with roses. It is dated 1870 and is used in the great

room of the restored house. Also given was an English cherub oil lamp with a brass and bronze base and an etched cranberry shade. This lamp is from the 1860 period and is a most handsome addition to the house.

Also, Thomas has given a large Scottish oil painting, circa 1789, by the artist Beadun. This painting hangs in the formal Victorian parlor.

The Campbell House is a very appropriate home for the several fine pieces in light of the interest in antiques shared by Thomas and his mother.

Mrs. Thomas was born in Chatham County in 1898 to Jo Annie and Hamilton Windham. After her marriage to James C. Thomas, they made their home in Apex, where they raised six children. Following a long illness, Mrs. Thomas passed away September 4, 1985. She always

loved flowers and beautiful artwork. Her home and collection of artwork will be maintained in her memory.

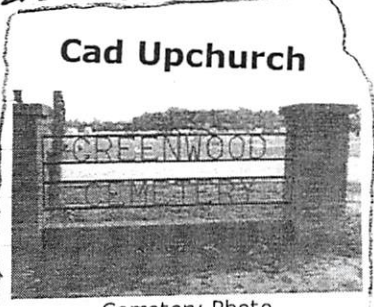

The first sheet is designed to help with analysis. The second sheet presents some facts which need to be explained or placed into the Provisional Master Outline if that is possible.

Next come sections I → IX which present the families of the Children of Melhain U b 1778 (Nc). If there are known descendants of the Greatgrandchildren of these Children they are presented in continuation of these sections as indicated by the numbers on the left hand side of the page (CS1, CS2, etc). These CS are presented after the pink sheet.

Cooperators are indicated by the symbol  $\square$ .

I show Melhain U b alt 1847 as GAR (Union) but there is clear evidence his brothers were CSA. I have more details on him I can send if desired.

Your records use the spelling GILLUM, which may be correct. This name has been extensively used in the Uplchurch family with numerous variations in spelling - even for the same person. [This is par for the course]. I have generally settled on the spelling "GILLIUM" but for certain individuals may need to use a different spelling as evidence accumulated.

I need to check on my previous cooperators who lived in Jackson Co, TN to see if they

are still alive. I still hope to depart in late OCT for a 3-week family history trip to NC with a possible stop-over in Jackson Co, TN. However, our minds are now crowded with lots of things. We leave for a 9 day trip to China on 23 SEP to celebrate our 55th wedding anniversary. Then we have to turn out an issue of the Upshur's Bulletin, install some terraces on the farm, monitor the harvest of corn & soybeans, take care of 3 grand kids while our son & his wife celebrate their wedding anniversary in Las Vegas & then help them officially open their 2nd Real Estate Brokerage Location. I guess we all stay busy, busy.

Back to family history - I am really pleased with how much your input has helped me. I do hope we can continue to exchange & help each other - still I realize you are not a direct Upshur descendant and thus may have greater priorities elsewhere. It is for this reason I am even more grateful for your help.

Thank you for your letter of August 8, 2003. I wanted to include all of the related Upchurch information I have, hence the delay in responding. If you find any pertinent additional information, I would appreciate your sending it to me. Hope this will help you. I'm sure you have most of it.

**Your Questions:**

1. James Upchurch born @1841 was actually born James Jones to Elizabeth Murray and her first husband and that this child took the Upchurch name per 1850 census? How does Manerva fit?

Δ \* James did not take the Upchurch name, this must have been an assumption by the census taker on the 1850.  
 Δ I have a letter written by R.J.C. Gailbreath from a Civil War Camp near Lewisburg, Greenbriar Co. VA.  
 Δ dated: December 3, 1861. This Gailbreath was the brother of Thomas Jefferson Gailbreath, the husband of  
 Δ + Δ Eliza Murray Upchurch's sister Margaret Murray (you will find the Murray family detailed in this letter)

From letter: "Give my love to our kind old mother, and that I was glad to hear that she was well, her son  
 Δ + Δ Thomas L. Clements (RJC married a Clements) is here somewhere in VA but I have not seen him yet, but  
 Δ + Δ + Δ hope I will. **Eliza Upchurch's son James Jones** is here and well. Bill A. is as fat and sassy as a bear and  
 Δ + Δ + Δ gets along fine. Dave and Tom Haile is well and Tom is engaged writing a letter" and so on.

Δ Δ Δ Δ I assume that Manerva is the daughter of Eliza Jones-- a child of hers before she married Gillum. On the  
 Δ + Δ 1840 census for Gillum Upchurch there is no young female. On the 1840 census for James Jones there is.  
 Δ + Δ No proof, just circumstantial. I have found no census records for James Jones. There is a record in Jackson  
 Δ + Δ County Deeds - Index to Jones Deeds. Roll#30 Sept 1872 to April 1915: Upchurch, Gillem to Jones, Jas  
 Δ + Δ book H, page 526. This may be his step- son James, but I have not seen this record. There is another  
 Δ + Δ record on this list that may be of interest to you: Jones, J.W, to Upchurch, J.M. book B page 441.

In Battle of Fishing Creek, ?Barts Creek, Murfreesboro, Boonsville, Shiloh, Farmington, Perryville KY. Was not wounded. Was captured at Murfreesboro, TN. Attended by physician Dr. Snodgrass. Was in prison at Ft. Delaware until June 1865, did not take Oath of Allegiance to the U.S.

Married, age 67 wife age 77, granddaughter age 7. Engaged in no kind of business and earn nothing. Have no estate. One mule is all the property I own. I am very poor and indigent and needy. My wife owns a little place worth about \$100.00. Hyave tried to work for it [my support] as long as I was able to do so. Do not use intoxicants to any extent. Have been a resident of Tennessee all my life. Attorney is W. H. Young of Gainesboro. Signed C. H. Upchurch

John H. Chaffin, Co. Court Clerk, took the statements of witnesses John Keith and John Cole:

John Keith stated applicant was his messmate and a member of his company.

John Cole states he was in the same Federal Prison with applicant and when he left in 1865, applicant was still in prison; that applicant is very indigent and needy circumstances and is an honorable citizen.

1 February 1905, from The Military Secretary's Office, War Department, Washington, D. C. to Tennessee Board of Pension Examiners, Nashville, Tennessee. "The records show that C.H. Upchurch was a member of Company G, 25th Tennessee Infantry, C.S.A. On the roll of the company dated April 7, 1864, last roll on which his name appears, he is reported absent, deserted May 15, 1863. No record of his release as alleged has been found.

"The records show, however, that one C.H. Upchurch, Company K, 4th Tennessee Cavanry, C.S.A., was received at Fort Delaware March 7, 1864, and that he was released on oath of allegiance May 4, 1865. I must admit that I know more about and have more records on the extended Upchurch Family than any living human being. Enclosed are details on my Upchurch Publications. You can subscribe if you so desire. However, it is not necessary for you to subscribe in order for us to collaborate and share.

I try to follow all parts of the Upchurch Family and to link all branches to our American Upchurch Family Tree. I have followed the U Family of Jackson Co, TN and enter the code JCFU on all profile sheets of this Family. Over the years I have had a number of collaborators on this family and have organized their family in notebook form. You are the only online collaborator at the moment but in due course we might reiterate some collaborators or find new ones. I tend to work hardest on the parts of the U Family where there seems to be interest and a willingness to share.

It is my belief that your Gilliam U. is about 1810 (Jackson Co, TN) is the son of William U. is about 1778 (NC) and that this William U. is in fact the Patriarch of the entire set of Upchurches we find in and from Jackson Co, TN from 1810 onwards. I have tried without success to link this



William U to the main Upchurch Family without success. About two months ago I spent several days on my hundreds of entries for individuals named William U. I do feel that a certain William U on the 1800 census of Wake Co, NC is an excellent candidate to be the William U b abt 1778 (NC). Beyond that I cannot go at present. In the meantime I feel it is important to fill out the documentation on the U descendants who trace their heritage back to Johnson Co, TN. I hope you can help in that regard. [William U b abt 1778 is most likely a member of the 6th Generation of the Upchurch Family in America.]

I had ROSS U b JUN 1840 (TN) in my files as being named and as being the s/o Gulliver U but no other key information. Your letter provides me for the first time the fact that ROSS was her middle name and that his first name starts with the letter "H". I do have two references that H. R. U served as a Confederate soldier and wonder if H. R. U was actually H. ROSS U. He would have been the right age to have served. However, his brother William U b 1847 (TN) served with the Union Army.

I have tried hard to make the facts in your letter about the family of Gilliam U fit with my records. It is all a little confusing but lets see if you and I can figure out the real situation about the 7 Children. He is a blend of information:

Your letter states that Gilliam U deposed that he had 2 Children each by different women [I assume this means 4 Children - 2 by 1 wife & 2 by another wife]. How can this fit with the 7 Children listed above? My Proposal - Assume that Gilliam U made the disposition after son William died in 1864 - so the two children by wife #2 would be Thomas & John M [E & G].

Next assume that child "D" James U b abt 1841 was actually born James James to Elizabeth Murray and her first husband and that the child took the Upchurch name from his stepfather Gelliman U per the 1850 Census. So in his deposition Gelliman U did not claim the child among the 4 he claimed to have fathered. This leaves the 2 children mentioned in the deposition from wife #1 as being Carter & Ross. This leaves unresolved the matter of how to fit Minerva/Manerva into the picture. She is extra to the 4 claimed by Gelliman. A good guess would seem to be that Minerva is also a child of Elizabeth by her 1st husband and that Minerva, like James, took her stepfather's last name. In the end we must also add an 8th child which would be the <sup>3rd</sup> child of Sarah that lived 15 days presumably in 1840. As far as I can see this would fit with all of your information and with mine. Do you have any more evidence that would affirm or refute the overall proposal? I am anxious to get this part of the story as firm as possible before moving on to other matters that should be of mutual interest to you and me. [Now that I reread P 2 on the 2nd page of your letter it seems that you and I are in good agreement]

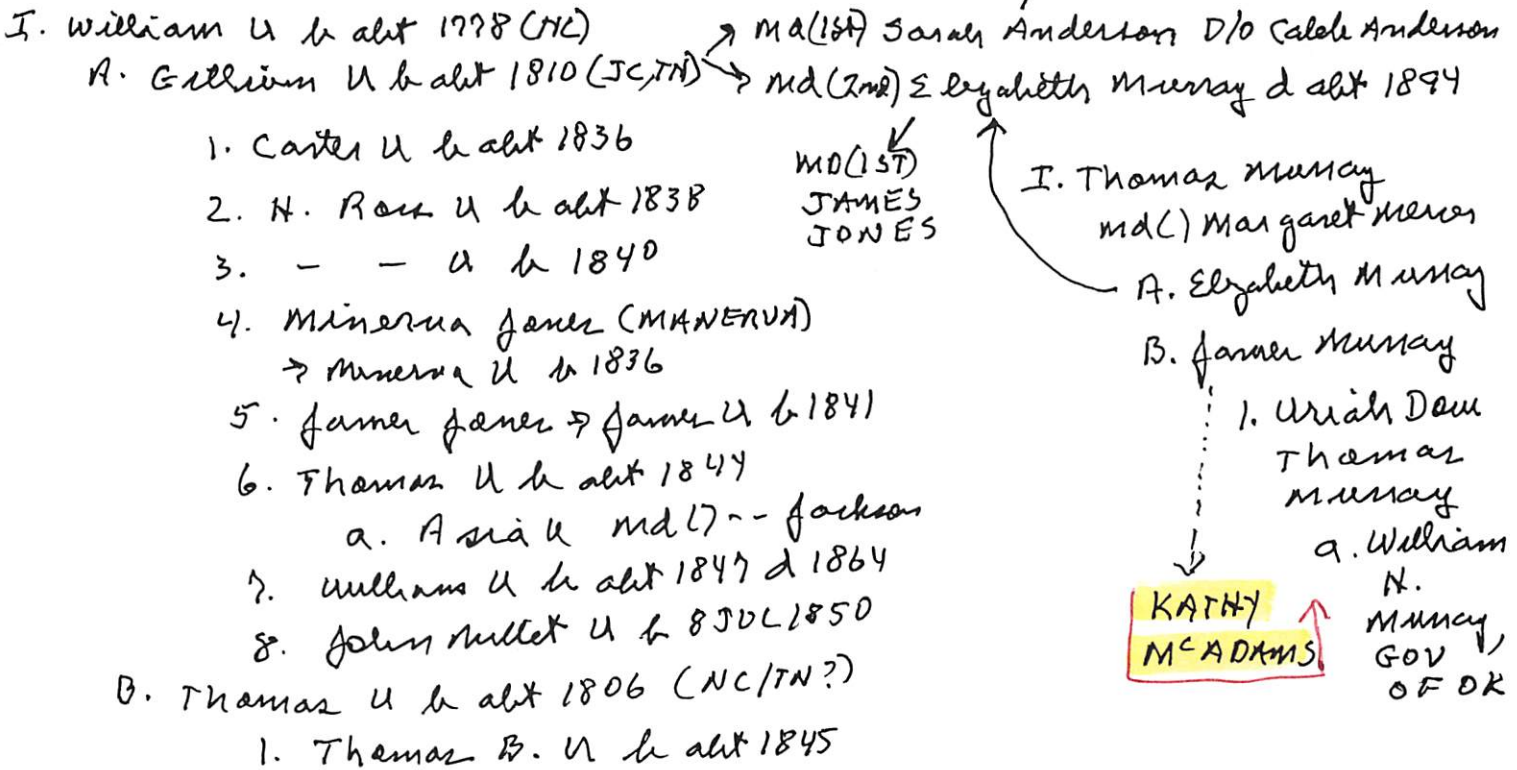

## Wayne Thomas donated several objects of fine art to the Campbell House

Mr. Wayne Thomas of the staff of the Department of Mathematics, Campbell University, and a native of Apex, has made a donation of several very fine objects d'art to the restored James A. Campbell House in Buies Creek. The Campbell House was one of the earlier listings in Harnett County on the National Register of Historic Places. The Register is maintained by the United States Department of the Interior.

These gifts by Mr. Thomas are in memory of his mother, the late Mrs. Omie Windham Thomas, who died in 1985. Mrs. Thomas was born in 1898 in Chatham County. This is the second gift of fine Victorian pieces Mr. Thomas has given in memory of his mother to the Harnett County Historical Society Foundation for use in the restored house. Each piece has added immeasurably to the authentic Victorian decor of the house.
