Thomas gives antique vase to The Campbell House

Mr. Wayne Thomas of Apex has given to the Campbell House in Buies Creek a large handsome handpainted German vase, circa 1890, in memory of his mother, Mrs. Omie W. Thomas.

More recently, Mr. Thomas has given other items to the house in memory of Mrs. thomas. These more recent gifts are now in use in the house and enhance the Victorian decor of the house.

These more recent gifts consist of a Handel oil lamp, circa 1900, with a shade decorated with white roses, and a Royal Flemish "Gone With The Wind" lamp made in New Bedford, Massachusetts around 1850. This extraordinary example of American art is decorated with Narcissus.

Another lamp given was a banquet oil lamp by Bradley and Hubbard with an 11-inch ball shade decoratd with roses. It is dated 1870 and is used in the great room of the restored house. Also given was an English cherub oil lamp with a brass and bronze base and an etched cranberry shade. This lamp is from the 1860 period and is a most handsome addition to the house.

Also, Thomas has given a large Scottish oil painting, circa 1789, by the artist Beadun. This painting hangs in the formal Victorian parlor.

The Campbell House is a very appropriate home for the several fine pieces in light of the interest in antiques shared by Thomas and his mother.

Mrs. Thomas was born in Chatham County in 1898 to Jo Annie and Hamilton Windham. After her marriage to James C. Thomas, they made their home in Apex, where they raised six children. Following a long illness, Mrs. Thomas passed away September 4, 1985. She always

loved flowers and beautiful artwork. Her home and collection of artwork will be maintained in her memory.





Thank you for your letter of August 8, 2003. I wanted to include all of the related Upchurch information I have, hence the delay in responding. If you find any pertinent additional information, I would appreciate your sending it to me. Hope this will help you. I'm sure you have most of it.

Your Questions:

1. James Upchurch born @1841 was actually born James Jones to Elizabeth Murray and her first husband and that this child took the Upchurch name per 1850 census? How does Manerva fit?

James did not take the Upchurch name, this must have been an assumption by the census taker on the 1850. I have a letter written by R.J.C. Gailbreath from a Civil War Camp near Lewisburg, Greenbriar Co. VA. dated: December 3, 1861. This Gailbreath was the brother of Thomas Jefferson Gailbreath, the husband of Eliza Murray Upchurch's sister Margaret Murray (you will find the Murray family detailed in this letter)

From letter: "Give my love to our kind old mother, and that I was glad to hear that she was well, her son Note:

Thomas L. Clements (RJC married a Clements) is here somewhere in VA but I have not seen him yet, but hope I will. Eliza Upchurch's son James Jones is here and well. Bill A. is as fat and sassy as a bear and gets along fine. Dave and Tom Haile is well and Tom is engaged writing a letter" and so on.

This R.J.C. Gailbreath was in the 8th Tennessee Regiment. James Jones was in Company H, Murray's 4th

Tennessee Calvary as a private. Ross and Thomas Upchurch were in Company E, Murray's 4th

Tennessee Calvary, as well

I assume that Manerva is the daughter of Eliza Jones-- a child of hers before she married Gillum. On the 1840 census for Gillum Upchurch there is no young female. On the 1840 census for James Jones there is. No proof, just circumstantial. I have found no census records for James Jones. There is a record in Jackson County Deeds – Index to Jones Deeds. Roll#30 Sept 1872 to April 1915: Upchurch, Gillem to Jones, Jas book H, page 526. This may be his step- son James, but I have not seen this record. There is another record on this list that may be of interest to you: Jones, J.W, to Upchurch, J.M. book B page 441.

Application 6 June 1903: Resident of Nameless, Jackson Co., TN, born Jackson Co., TN, enlisted July 18, 1861, Col. Sydney S. Stanton, Capts. L. H. McCarver then Capt. Green. In Battle of Fishing Creek, ?Barts Creek, Murfreesboro, Boonsville, Shiloh, Farmington, Perryville KY. Was not wounded. Was captured at Murfreesboro, TN. Attended by physician Dr. Snodgrass. Was in prison at Ft. Delaware until June 1865, did not take Oath of Allegiance to the U.S.

Married, age 67 wife age 77, granddaughter age 7. Engaged in no kind of business and earn nothing. Have no estate. One mule is all the property I own. I am very poor and indigent and needy. My wife owns a little place worth about \$100.00. Hyave tried to work for it [my support] as long as I was able to do so. Do not use intoxicants to any extent. Have been a resident of Tennessee all my life. Attorney is W. H. Young of Gainesboro.

Signed C. H. Upchurch

John H. Chaffin, Co. Court Clerk, took the statements of witnesses John Keith and John Cole:

△ John Keith stated applicant was his messmate and a member of his company.

△ → John Cole states he was in the same Federal Prison with applicant and when he

△ left in 1865, applicant was still in prison; that applicant is very indigent and

△ needy circumstances and is an honorable citizen.
