Not In Vain

Raleigh's Worth Bagley, the first U.S. officer killed in the Spanish-American War, became a symbol for America's reunification after the Civil War.

Among the war memorials on the capitol grounds in Raleigh stands a statue of a strikingly handsome young man named Worth Bagley. His name is unfamiliar today, but in 1898 it was known across the nation. He had the distinction of being the first U.S. officer killed in the Spanish-American War.

Bagley was from a notable North Carolina family. His mother, Adelaide, was the daughter of former Governor Jonathan Worth. His father, William H. Bagley, had been a newspaper editor in his native Perquimans County, a state senator and a major in the Confederate Army. He also had been private secretary to Governor Worth. That is when he met and married the governor's daughter. Later, he served for 18 years as clerk of the North Carolina Supreme Court.

Worth was born into this illustrious family on April 6, 1874, in the family home on the corner of Blount and South streets in Raleigh. He was the eldest of six children and attended schools in Raleigh. Though accepted at the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill, he chose to attend the U.S. Naval Academy in Annapolis, Maryland. At the academy, Bagley became a football hero. He was so successful on the field that poems were written about his athletic accomplishments. He graduated from the academy in 1895.

When the Spanish-American War began in 1898, Ensign Bagley was second-in-command of a recently constructed torpedo boat called the *Winslow*. The *Winslow* was assigned to be part of the Cuban blockade. The blockade was a key element in the U.S. war strategy and was established to prevent supplies from reaching Spanish soldiers on the island.

On the morning of May 11, 1898, the *Winslow* joined two other American ships, the *Wilmington* and the *Hudson*, near the mouth of Cardenas Bay, which is located on the northern coast of Cuba, 70 miles east of Havana. There had been reports of Spanish vessels in the area, and the three American ships steamed into the bay to look for the enemy.

During the course of the search, they spied a Spanish gunboat, tied to a dock, at a distance of about 3,500 yards. Captain Todd, commanding officer of the *Wilmington*, ordered the *Winslow* forward to investigate. When the *Winslow* got within 1,500 yards of the target, the Spanish gunboat and a shore battery opened fire. The *Winslow* responded,

and the *Wilmington* and the *Hudson* advanced to join the fight.

One of the first Spanish shots wounded the commander of the *Winslow*, Lieutenant John B. Bernadou, in the leg. As the battle continued, the *Winslow* suffered severe damage, including the loss of its steering mechanism. As a result, the *Winslow* could be maneuvered only by putting its engines alternately in forward and reverse. In addition, damage to the vessel made direct communication

between Lieutenant Bernadou and the engine room impossible. Worth Bagley was forced to deliver directions to the engine room from the deck. To do this, he had to run back and forth from the deck, down a ladder, to the engine room below. Near the end of the battle, while Bagley was on deck, a Spanish shell hit the *Winslow* and exploded. Bagley and two sailors were killed instantly. Two other enlisted men were seriously wounded and died soon after. Heavy shelling from the *Wilmington* eventually silenced the Spanish guns, and the three American ships withdrew, with the *Winslow* towed by the *Hudson*.

After the battle, Bagley's body was taken to Key West, Florida, on board the *Hudson*. The ship arrived on May 12, and on the following day, a memorial service was held for the fallen officer. The body was then sent by ship to Jacksonville, Florida, and then by train to Raleigh.

Along the train's route, people gathered to pay their respects. Large crowds assembled in Savannah, Georgia, Charlotte, Concord and Salisbury. Flowers were sent along the way to be placed on Bagley's casket, including an arrangement in the shape of the state flag given by North Carolinians living in Savannah.

The funeral train arrived in Raleigh at 1:40 a.m. on May 16. Friends and family, including Bagley's brother-in-law Josephus Daniels (the future U.S. secretary of the Navy was then publisher of Raleigh's *State Chronicle*), were waiting at the station. The group, along with an eight-member military escort, took the

casket through the dark city streets to the Bagley family home. At 1:30 that afternoon, a military escort took the body to the Capitol, where it lay in state for two hours in the rotunda.

Funeral services began at 4:30 p.m. on the southern side of the Capitol grounds. Flags were at half-mast, and businesses were closed, as 10,000 people gathered for the funeral. Some looked down from the Capitol roof, while most crowded around on the grounds and streets.

Family members and state and military officials sat in a place of honor. Behind the casket a group of cadets from the Agricultural and Mechanical College served as an honor guard. Fifteen hundred soldiers from nearby Camp Bryan Grimes stood in formation in the street facing the Capitol. Three ministers conducted the service, which included an 11-gun salute.

When the ceremony ended, the casket was taken to nearby Oakwood Cemetery. The procession numbered 3,500 and included military units, the governor, members of the state supreme court and a contingent of Raleigh school children. At the cemetery, soldiers stood on three sides of the grave, leaving the fourth for the family. A few more words were spoken by the clergymen, taps was played and three volleys were fired by the Governor's Guard.

Bagley's death naturally prompted the strongest reactions in North Carolina, but the killing of the young man was also of national interest. Newspapers across the country pointed to the symbolism of a Southerner dying heroically in this first national conflict since the Civil War. Bagley became a symbol of the reunification of the nation. Units of the Grand Army of the Republic, which was the Union Army veterans' association, sent flowers to the funeral.

One of the greatest national tributes to Bagley came in June when the secretary of the Navy announced that a torpedo boat, planned for construction, was to be named for the young North Carolinian. On September 26, 1900, the Torpedo Boat Worth Bagley was launched from a shipyard in Bath, Maine.

"Bob" is a central figure in the book. The author portrays him as a handsome ladies man liked by everyone but that his early life was spent deceitfully to gain advantage. He married 3 rich women to further his cause. No 2 was Mary Lilly (Kenan) Bingham, widow of Henry Morrison Flagler. Bob & Mary had an affair in their youth & the Kenan Family went to great lengths to separate them. Mary soon took up with Flagler & in due course married him & became wealthy when he died. She was lonesome & soon fell into Bob's clutches & married him. Within a year she was dead. The author presents the case that Bob killed her. He came away from her death wealthy & became a highly minded citizen - Editor & owner of Louisville KY newspaper & Roosevelt's Ambassador to Great Britain. Not In Vain

Raleigh's Worth Bagley, the first U.S. officer killed in the Spanish-American War, became a symbol for America's reunification after the Civil War.

Among the war memorials on the capitol grounds in Raleigh stands a statue of a strikingly handsome young man named Worth Bagley. His name is unfamiliar today, but in 1898 it was known across the nation. He had the distinction of being the first U.S. officer killed in the Spanish-American War.

Bagley was from a notable North Carolina family. His mother, Adelaide, was the daughter of former Governor Jonathan Worth. His father, William H. Bagley, had been a newspaper editor in his native Perquimans County, a state senator and a major in the Confederate Army. He also had been private secretary to Governor Worth. That is when he met and married the governor's daughter. Later, he served for 18 years as clerk of the North Carolina Supreme Court.

Worth was born into this illustrious family on April 6, 1874, in the family home on the corner of Blount and South streets in Raleigh. He was the eldest of six children and attended schools in Raleigh. Though accepted at the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill, he chose to attend the U.S. Naval Academy in Annapolis, Maryland. At the academy, Bagley became a football hero. He was so successful on the field that poems were written about his athletic accomplishments. He graduated from the academy in 1895.

When the Spanish-American War began in 1898, Ensign Bagley was second-in-command of a recently constructed torpedo boat called the *Winslow*. The *Winslow* was assigned to be part of the Cuban blockade. The blockade was a key element in the U.S. war strategy and was established to prevent supplies from reaching Spanish soldiers on the island.

On the morning of May 11, 1898, the *Winslow* joined two other American ships, the *Wilmington* and the *Hudson*, near the mouth of Cardenas Bay, which is located on the northern coast of Cuba, 70 miles east of Havana. There had been reports of Spanish vessels in the area, and the three American ships steamed into the bay to look for the enemy.

During the course of the search, they spied a Spanish gunboat, tied to a dock, at a distance of about 3,500 yards. Captain Todd, commanding officer of the *Wilmington*, ordered the *Winslow* forward to investigate. When the *Winslow* got within 1,500 yards of the target, the Spanish gunboat and a shore battery opened fire. The *Winslow* responded,

and the *Wilmington* and the *Hudson* advanced to join the fight.

One of the first Spanish shots wounded the commander of the *Winslow*, Lieutenant John B. Bernadou, in the leg. As the battle continued, the *Winslow* suffered severe damage, including the loss of its steering mechanism. As a result, the *Winslow* could be maneuvered only by putting its engines alternately in forward and reverse. In addition, damage to the vessel made direct communication between Lieutenant

Bernadou and the engine room impossible. Worth Bagley was forced to deliver directions to the engine room from the deck. To do this, he had to run back and forth from the deck, down a ladder, to the engine room below. Near the end of the battle, while Bagley was on deck, a Spanish shell hit the *Winslow* and exploded. Bagley and two sailors were killed instantly. Two other enlisted men were seriously wounded and died soon after. Heavy shelling from the *Wilmington* eventually silenced the Spanish guns, and the three American ships withdrew, with the *Winslow* towed by the *Hudson*.

After the battle, Bagley's body was taken to Key West, Florida, on board the *Hudson*. The ship arrived on May 12, and on the following day, a memorial service was held for the fallen officer. The body was then sent by ship to Jacksonville, Florida, and then by train to Raleigh.

Along the train's route, people gathered to pay their respects. Large crowds assembled in Savannah, Georgia, Charlotte, Concord and Salisbury. Flowers were sent along the way to be placed on Bagley's casket, including an arrangement in the shape of the state flag given by North Carolinians living in Savannah.

The funeral train arrived in Raleigh at 1:40 a.m. on May 16. Friends and family, including Bagley's brother-in-law Josephus Daniels (the future U.S. secretary of the Navy was then publisher of Raleigh's *State Chronicle*), were waiting at the station. The group, along with an eight-member military escort, took the

casket through the dark city streets to the Bagley family home. At 1:30 that afternoon, a military escort took the body to the Capitol, where it lay in state for two hours in the rotunda.

Funeral services began at 4:30 p.m. on the southern side of the Capitol grounds. Flags were at half-mast, and businesses were closed, as 10,000 people gathered for the funeral. Some looked down from the Capitol roof, while most crowded around on the grounds and streets.

Family members and state and military officials sat in a place of honor. Behind the casket a group of cadets from the Agricultural and Mechanical College served as an honor guard. Fifteen hundred soldiers from nearby Camp Bryan Grimes stood in formation in the street facing the Capitol. Three ministers conducted the service, which included an 11-gun salute.

When the ceremony ended, the casket was taken to nearby Oakwood Cemetery. The procession numbered 3,500 and included military units, the governor, members of the state supreme court and a contingent of Raleigh school children. At the cemetery, soldiers stood on three sides of the grave, leaving the fourth for the family. A few more words were spoken by the clergymen, taps was played and three volleys were fired by the Governor's Guard.

Bagley's death naturally prompted the strongest reactions in North Carolina, but the killing of the young man was also of national interest. Newspapers across the country pointed to the symbolism of a Southerner dying heroically in this first national conflict since the Civil War. Bagley became a symbol of the reunification of the nation. Units of the Grand Army of the Republic, which was the Union Army veterans' association, sent flowers to the funeral.

One of the greatest national tributes to Bagley came in June when the secretary of the Navy announced that a torpedo boat, planned for construction, was to be named for the young North Carolinian. On September 26, 1900, the Torpedo Boat Worth Bagley was launched from a shipyard in Bath, Maine.

She died on 07 Jan 1938 in Anderson Co., TN. He married (2) LUSTER HAYES on 20 Oct 1938 in Anderson Co., TN (J. H. Wallace). She died in Jul 1958.

Notes for William Huston Owen:

Family history says that Huston came to Tennessee from North Carolina with his family by wagon train.

His grave marker says he was born May 1, 1861.

The Anderson Co. marriage records show him as W. K. Owen.

There was a W. H. Owen on the building committee for a new jail in 1930.

He had a telephone in 1916.

1870 census: living at home with his mother in Gloucester, Transylvania Co., NC. He was listed as 4 years old which would mean he was born after Rufus died. If the age is correct on the census, he was probably the son of Washington rather than Rufus Owen.

1880 census: living at home in Cocke Co., TN, age 16. His last name was listed as Capps, that of his step-father.

1891 census: There is a W. H. Owen in Anderson Co., TN.

1900 census: He was a farmer.

1910 census: He was a farmer. Living at home were Ella, Ethel, Ada, Joe, Sherman and Anna.

1920 census: He was a farmer.

1930 census: Houston W. was living in a house he owned on Big Valley Rd. next to his son Joe and family.

1940 census: He was a foreman for road construction. He was with second wife Luster.

Also in 1920 there was a Marian J. Owens living in the Briceville area working as a coal miner. He and both parents were born in NC. He was 39 years old, wife Delia (Cordelia) (age 29) Daugherty

(sister of Julia Daugherty, mother of Dorothy McQueen Owen). (She was born June 3, 1890 in Anderson Co. and died Aug. 17, 1969 in Lake City. They were married in 1918 in Anderson Co.) Her brother Dunk (Duncan) age 50 lived there too. Marian's children: daughter Louise 12, son Cleo (?) 10, and daughter Fay 3 years, 2 months. Delia and her parents were born in TN but Dunk's mother was born in NC. Could Marian be the brother of Huston?

In Clinton there is also a Richard Owen age 27, married to Mossie Hart age 21 and their daughter Juanita, less than one year old. They were living with Mossie's parents Thomas D. and Mary E. Hart. Richard and both parents were born in TN. He was a foreman for the railroad. His father-in-law was a clergyman.

There was also a Marion Owen(s) age 49 and family living near Briceville. He and both his parents were born in NC. Was he related?

Notes for Cynthia Jane Worthington:

Cynthia made beautiful quilts. Notes indicate she was a stepchild.

1860 census: living at home

1870 census: She was Sintha J., age 9.

1880 census: She is listed with her parents. She was 20 years old.

1900 census: She was shown to have had 9 children with 8 surviving, listed as Sintha J. Roscoe was the child who had died.

1910 census: It says she had 10 children of whom 8 survived. In the previous decade, Anna was born and Sherman's twin Enoch died.

1920 census: She was living with Houston, listed as Jane.

1930 census: She was living with Houston.



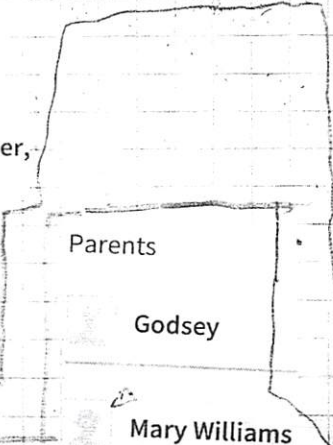
