Resided in Chatham County and enlisted in Wake County at age 20, July 15, 1862, for the war. Present or accounted for until transferred to the C.S. Navy on April 5, 1864.
- △ ★ AUTRY, RAYFORD, Private
Resided in Sampson County and enlisted in Wake County at age 30, July 15, 1862, for the war. Wounded at Chancellorsville, Virginia, May 3, 1863. Present or accounted for until captured at Petersburg, Virginia, April 3, 1865. Confined at Hart's Island, New York Harbor, until released after taking the Oath of Allegiance on June 21, 1865.
- △ BURKE, JAMES, Private
Resided in Chatham County and enlisted in Wake County at age 35, July 15, 1862, for the war. Present or accounted for until killed at Spotsylvania Court House, Virginia, May 12, 1864.
- △ HOLLY, B., Private
Enlisted in Wake County on July 5, 1862, for the war. Died October 31, 1862.
- △ ★ HOLLY, R., Private
Enlisted in Wake County on July 15, 1862, for the war. Died in hospital at Staunton, Virginia, November 3, 1862, of "diarrhoea chronic."
- △ HUGHES, MILTON T., Private
Enlisted in Wake County on May 18, 1864, for the war. Captured at Harpers Ferry, West Virginia, July 8, 1864, and confined at Elmira, New York. Paroled at Elmira on February 20, 1865, and sent to James River, Virginia, for exchange. Date of exchange not reported; however, he was admitted to hospital at Richmond, Virginia, March 3, 1865, and furloughed for 30 days on March 11, 1865.
- △ JEFFREYS, J. C., Private
Enlisted in Wake County on July 15, 1862, for the war. January-February, 1863, muster roll carries him with the remark: "Docked one months pay by sentence of Regimental Court Martial."
- △ KIRKMAN, JOHN C., Private
Enlisted in Wake County on May 17, 1864, for the war. Admitted to hospital at Richmond, Virginia, June 1, 1864, with "rubeola." Furloughed for 60 days on July 22, 1864. Readmitted to hospital at Richmond, Virginia, October 31, 1864, with "pneumonia." Returned to duty November 28, 1864. Federal Provost Marshal records report him as a rebel deserter received at Washington, D.C., April 12, 1865, from City Point, Virginia. Took the Oath of Allegiance and was provided transportation to Howard County, Indiana.
- △ ★ MARSHALL, THOMAS N., Private
Enlisted in Wake County on August 28, 1862, for the war. First reported on company muster roll for the period May 1-August 31, 1864. September-October, 1864, muster roll reports him as "absent wounded since July 18, 1864." Paroled at Greensboro on May 10, 1865.
- △ ★ SILLS, JOHN, Private
Enlisted in Wake County on June 6, 1863, for the war. First reported on company muster roll for the period May 1-August 31, 1864. Muster rolls indicate that he was wounded July 18, 1864. Present or accounted for until paroled at Appomattox Court House, Virginia, April 9, 1865.
- △ STEWART, DUNCAN J., Private
Enlisted in Wake County on July 15, 1862, for the war. First reported on company muster roll for January-February, 1864. Muster rolls cover through October, 1864, and report him as "absent without leave in Sampson County."
- △ USREY, SAMUEL W., Private
Born in Granville County where he resided as a farmer prior to enlisting in Wake County at age 24, July 15, 1862, for the war. Wounded and captured at Chancellorsville, Virginia, May 3, 1863. Confined in hospital at Washington, D.C., until transferred to Old Capitol Prison, Washington, May 27, 1863. Paroled on June 10, 1863, and sent to City Point, Virginia, for exchange. Declared exchanged on June 12, 1863. Reported as absent wounded until detailed in hospital at Richmond, Virginia, February 22, 1864. Company muster rolls report him as absent on detail through October, 1864.
- △ ★ WHITT, NEWTON, Private
Enlisted in Wake County on May 17, 1864, for the war. Wounded July 18, 1864, and reported as absent wounded on company muster rolls through October, 1864. Paroled at Greensboro on May 9, 1865.
- △ YARBOROUGH, A. C., Private
Resided as a farmer prior to enlisting in Wake County at age 23, August 15, 1862, for the war. Died in hospital at Richmond, Virginia, April 1, 1863, of "variola dist."

The Rev. Ella J. Yarborough of Raleigh died Thursday, April 23, in

Raleigh. Funeral was Monday, April 27, at Christian Faith Baptist Church. Burial was in Hillcrest Cemetery.

She was born May 17, 1912, in Greenville, daughter of the late Rev. and Mrs. Walter Hargett. She was the widow of the late Rev. A.C. Yarborough.

In 1930, she began her ministerial career, helping to organize churches in the Greenville area. In 1933, she moved to New York City where she fellowshipped with Pentecostal Faith Holiness Church until the organizing of New Covenant Temple UHC by the late Bishop H.L. Fisher. She answered the call to evangelism in 1937. She conducted street meetings, visited hospitals and conducted revivals in New York, New Jersey, Maryland, Virginia and many parts of North Carolina.

In 1955, she became pastor of Mt. Zion United Holy Church in Zebulon, where she faithfully served for 32 years. In 1958, she began to be elected to numerous denominational positions in the area of foreign missions for the United Holy Church of America. These included vice president and president of the General Missionary Department, and president of the Junior Missionary Department. During her missionary tenure, she also helped found Bennett Temple UHC in Waycross, Ga.

She was a graduate of Manhattan Bible Institute in New York City and a graduate of Civella's Beauty College in Raleigh. She completed Vocational Bible Training at Shaw University in Raleigh. In 1980, she was awarded the honorary doctor of divinity degree from United Christian College in Goldsboro. She was proprietor of Civella's Beauty Salon.

Surviving: goddaughters, Alfreda Williams of Philadelphia, Pa., Margaret Parker of Goldsboro; foster sister, Christiania Pitts of Raleigh; four great-grandchildren; two foster grandchildren; four grandchildren.

On September 2, 1778, Shadrack Medlin was a witness to the sale of land by Willis Tant to William Fish in Bute County on the north side of Crooked Creek, adjoining Fish on the Mill Branch and to head of William Pace's Spring Branch.

In 1778, in Captain Ferrell's District in Bute County, Henry Tyler Medlin, Shadrach Medlin, Bradley Medlin, and Ryal Medlin took oaths of allegiance to the State of North Carolina to defend the independent government against King George III. This oath of allegiance qualified these Medlin (Medlen) patriots from Bute County to vote in elections.

The Earl of Bute had become very unpopular in the colony and his name created dishonor. In 1779, the North Carolina Legislature abolished Bute County and the area formerly known as Bute County was divided into Franklin and Warren Counties.

On January 29, 1779, Franklin County came into existence as the southern half of previous Bute County. This new county was named in honor of Benjamin Franklin, the very popular patriot statesman of Pennsylvania.

Henry Tyler Medlin, Shadrach Medlin, and Bradley Medlin were three Patriot soldiers from Franklin (formerly Bute/Granville) County, North Carolina that served in the Revolutionary War against Great Britain. After enlisting at Granville Court House, Henry and Shadrach Medlin served together in Captain Edward Yarborough's Company in the Revolutionary War.

Henry Tyler Medlin died in July 1781 from disease after marching to Charlotte. His son, John Medlin, was issued a military land grant in Montgomery County in 1820 for his father's military service.

In the pension application for Shadrach Medlin, aged 70, in Wake County Court on October 4, 1820, his wife Cloah is listed as age 67 and his granddaughter Rebecca is listed as being age 12 or 13.

Bradley Medlin was drafted in 1780 in Franklin County, North Carolina and served two tours as an American Revolutionary War soldier from 1780 to 1782 enlisting under Captain William Ferrell. Bradley Medlin and his descendants moved to Tennessee in 1793 where he received land grants for his service. He lived in Wilson County in 1832 when he applied for a pension and he moved to Madison County, Tennessee in 1839 where he died on August 18, 1843.

Bryant Medlin (Sr.) enlisted in Kinston, in Dobbs County (later Lenoir County), as a Volunteer in the N.C. Militia for three different periods totaling 15 months between 1775 and 1781 in the American Revolutionary War. Beginning with Captain John Garland's Company, Bryant Medlin drew musician's pay as both drummer and piper. This Medlin Patriot soldier fought in the Battle of Moore's Creek Bridge, North Carolina and the Battle of Stono at Charleston, South Carolina.

John Medlin, private from Moore County, enlisted in Moore County and served under the company commanded by Captain John McRae, according to his widow's application for pension. Nancy McKenzie Medlin, living in Scotts Hill, Tennessee, last filed for a pension on August 18, 1853 in Henderson County, Tennessee. She stated that she was married prior to 1794 to John Medlin in Moore County by Thomas Medlin, justice of the peace. Her several applications were all denied for lack of existence of proof of a service record in North Carolina.

Under Yarbrough's management the establishment quickly became the most fashionable gathering place in Raleigh. (37, pg 43).

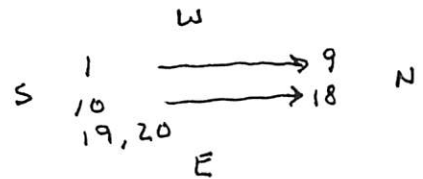

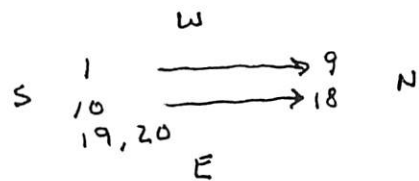

Beaver's Chapel United Church of Christ celebrates 104th year

"It Takes a Village" was the theme of the 104th anniversary celebration of Beaver's Chapel United Church of Christ.

It was in 1892 that the church was organized under the leadership of the Rev. B.F. Perry and five members: the Rev. C.W. Richardson, Sarlin Yarborough, John Yarborough, Banister Horton and John Horton. A number of the heirs of those original members are still active with the church.

The 104th celebration began Saturday night with a fellowship banquet at the CCO Center in Zebulon. Pastor William McCoy and members and friends of Beaver's Chapel enjoyed an evening of music by the Capitol City Five, then dinner and a speech by Jonathan F. Koffa.

Koffa, who first came to Zebulon as town planner, then was promoted to assistant town manager and currently serves as interim town manager, grew up in Monrovia, Liberia, in West Africa. He attended Shaw University, then earned a master's of public administration from N.C. State University. He is currently a law student at the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill.

Koffa delivered an inspiring message on the need for everyone to be active participants in the "village."

Also on the program were three older members of the church: Alma Price, Maddie Morgan and Irene Richardson. The celebration continued with the Sunday morning service. McCoy delivered a strong message relating to diligence.

There was much relevance, as members recollected and reviewed their rich and humble heritage. This included how the church derived its name — the first church having been built near Beaver Dam Creek.

The church persevered many trials and tribulations. During the Depression, it became necessary to sell the church. Miraculously, when it was put on the market to be sold, according to church history, only the man who wanted to sell the church bid on the property. It was then that the Rev. Dowd advised members to buy the church back at the auctioned price. This was done, the Depression ended, and the church debt was paid off.

Among the old-timers who played active roles in laying the foundation for today's church were R.P. "Pete" Richardson, Rush Baker, J.T. Locke, Lona Richardson, Daisy Fowler, Christine C. Locke and Irene Richardson.

Many of the children of yesterday — LaVerne and Elsie Locke; Emma Tuck; Barbara Nell Tuck; Mary Price; Catherine Champion; Ray Fowler; Dorothy High; Hattie Pretty; and Gladys, Marjorie, Dorothy and Clara Reid — became active adults in the community. Several have, however, gone to their final resting place. Their impact on the community will long be felt.

Beaver's Chapel continues to impact the community. In the old days, Jonathan Bunn, who worked for Whitley Furniture, would borrow the furniture delivery truck on Sundays and take the young men to church in the back of the truck. Buster Baker, who worked for Toney's Funeral Home, owned a black Cadillac and would transport the women to church if there was no funeral.

Then there were the two choirs, the "note" choir and the regular choir. Henry Pearce, Hubert Fowler, Pete Richardson, Daisy Adams, Ernest Adams, Clifton Champion, Georgia Mae Adams, Marjorie Reid, Gladys Reid, Jonathan Bunn, Mary Ruth Bunn, Hattie Preddy, Shirley Pretty, Mary Price and Emma Tuck were among the choir members.

Beaver's Chapel United Church of Christ continues to be a pillar in the Zebulon community. Over the years, Deacons Clifton Champion, Donnie Beckwith, Garlene Privette, Harriston Hodges, Edward June Miles and Robert Mangun, as well as ministers including T.J. Moore, J.P. Mangun, Dr. W.M. Lake, L.E. Young, M. Ray, R.L. Haith, W. Barton, D. Jones and McCoy, made lasting contributions to the longevity of the church. Dedicated members, including the late Lena Rogers, have influenced what a church, small in numbers, can do when working toward a common goal.

In regard to the church, Marjorie Reid Young, church historian, stated, "Together we develop a progressive village for our children. He (McCoy) challenges us to continue the tradition of being a resource in the village that raises the child."
