

SEAGRAVES, WILLIAM H., Private

Resided in Wake County where he enlisted at age 22, July 15, 1862, for the war, Captured near Sharpsburg, Maryland, in September, 1862, and paroled on September 27, 1862. Exchanged at City Point, Virginia, December 4, 1862. Company muster rolls report him as absent sick after June. 1863, and July-August, 1863, muster roll carries the remark: "Dead."

SERTAIN, SIDNEY, Private

Resided in Wake County where he enlisted at age 21, July 15, 1862, for the war. Died September 10, 1862.

SMITH, RICHARD P., Private

Resided in Wake County where he enlisted at age 18, July 15, 1862, for the war. Wounded in action at Chancellorsville, Virginia, May 3, 1863. Present or accounted for until captured at Spotsylvania Court House, Virginia, May 12, 1864. Confined at Point Lookout, Maryland, until transferred to Elmira, New York, August 6, 1864. Released at Elmira after taking the Oath of Allegiance on June 12, 1865.

SNELL, SWAIN S., Private

Resided in Washington County where he enlisted at age 28, June 25, 1861, for the war. Present or accounted for until captured at Spotsylvania Court House, Virginia, May 12, 1864. Confined at Point Lookout, Maryland, until transferred to Elmira, New York, August 6, 1864. Died at Elmira on April 4, 1865, of "chronic diarrhoea."

STEPHENSON, J. D., Private

Resided in Wake County where he enlisted at age 25, July 15, 1862, for the war. Died in hospital at Mount Jackson, Virginia, November 1, 1862, of "diarrhoea chronic."

WAMBLE, PARINGTON, Private

Resided in Wake County where he enlisted at age 27, July 15, 1862, for the war. Died at home in 1863.

A WARD, JOHN, Private

Resided in Wake County where he enlisted at age 30, July 15, 1862, for the war as a substitute. Hospital records indicate that he was in and out of hospitals from November, 1862, through February, 1864, when he was furloughed for 40 days. Appears on a muster roll for Company G, 2nd Battalion N.C. Local Defense Troops for November-December, 1864, as present.

△ WELCH, MURPHY SAUNDERS, Private

Resided in Wake County where he enlisted at age 27, July 15, 1862, for the war. Present or accounted for until captured at Spotsylvania Court House, Virginia, May 12, 1864. Confined at Point Lookout, Maryland, until transferred to Elmira. New York. August 6, 1864. Died at Elmira on January 26, 1865, of "pneumonia."



WHITE, FRILEY, Sergeant

Enlisted in Tyrell County on January 28, 1862, for the war. Mustered in as Private and appointed Sergeant, November-December, 1862. Wounded in action at Chancellorsville, Virginia, May 5, 1863. Present or accounted for until captured at Spotsylvania Court House, Virginia, May 12, 1864. Confined at Point Lookout, Maryland, until transferred to Elmira, New York, August 6, 1864. Released at Elmira after taking the Oath of Allegiance on June 12, 1865.

WILLIAMS, AMOS, Private

Resided in Wake County where he enlisted at age 27. July 15, 1862, for the war. Wounded in action at Sharpsburg, Maryland, September 17, 1862. Died in hospital at Gordonsville, Virginia. May 15, 1864, of "pneumonia."

WILLIAMS, HENRY JOSEPH, 1st Sergeant

Resided in Washington County where he enlisted at age 22, June 25, 1861, for the war. Mustered in as Private and appointed Corporal on November 15, 1861. Wounded in action at Ellerson's Mill, Virginia, June 26, 1862, and at Sharpsburg, Maryland, September 17, 1862. Promoted to 1st Sergeant in November-December, 1862. Present or accounted for until captured at Spotsvivanta Court House, Virginia, May 12, 1864. Confined at Point Lookout, Maryland, until transferred to Elmira, New York, August 6, 1864. Released at Elmira after taking the Oath of Allegiance on June 12, 1865.

WILLIAMS, JOHN, Private

Resided in Wake County where he enlisted at age \$1. July 15, 1862, for the war. Discharged soon after enlistment upon providing John Mulligan as his substitute.

YATES, SIMEON Private

Resided in Wake County where he enlisted at age 40, July 15, 1862, for the war. Died at home in -Wake County in March, 1863.

YOUNG, EZEKIEL, Private

Resided in Wake County where he enlisted at age 20, July 15, 1862, for the war. Wounded in action at Payne's Farm, Virginia, November 27, 1863. Captured at Spotsylvania Court House. Virginia, May 12, 1864. Confined at Point Lookout, Maryland, until transferred to Elmira, New York, August 6, 1864. Released at Elmira after taking the Oath of Allegiance on June 12, 1865.

Mily's maiden name appears to be Harrison by the writing and all transcripts say Harrison, however, I have a strong feeling that this is a mis-reading and she was actually a Harward... time will tell. Children per WakeCo NC Census records and Jesse Yates etate records on file at the NC Archives, Raleigh, NC. Children Eliza and Elizabeth are two different people per 1850 Chatham Co NC Census page 212b. Milley is listed as a widow in the 1860 Wake Co NC census page 69b.

4 Simeon Yates born about 1818 died 3/15/1863 married Martha Upchurch born 3 Aug 1821 Chatham Co, NC [daughter of Murray Upchurch, granddaughter of Moses Upchurch – Head of Clan] married 20 Unknown Mischel or Mitchel [2nd husband of Martha]

NOTE: Proven child of Jesse and Milia Harrison Yates per their estate records at NC Archives in Raleigh, NC. Marriage Date: 28 Jan 1840 Marriage County: Chatham Bond #: 000020608. Martha Upchurch's parents were: Murray Upchurch & Nancy (Scott) Upchurch. According to "At The Gates", the biography of Matthew Tyson Yates, missionary to China, Simeon was his cousin and best friend when they were growing up. They lived on adjoining farms in western Wake County NC. Listed in the 1850 Wake Co NC census page 192a, 1860 Wake Co NC Census page 49a. Martha Mischel and Burlina are listed in the 1870 Wake Co NC census page 451a as ages 48/12 respectively. They are in White Oak township. No new husband is in the home... assuming they married about 1866 and he passed away before 1870 census. Martha and Burlina appear to be in the home of James and Rachel Penny, though Martha has land. Simeon Served in the Confederacy during the Civil War and was killed. His record indicates his Residence: Wake County, North Carolina Enlistment Date: 15 July 1882 DISTINGUISHED SERVICE Side Served: Confederacy State Served: North Carolina Unit Numbers: 100 Service Record: Enlisted as a Private on 15 July 1862 at the age of 40. Enlisted in Company G, 1st Infantry Regiment North Carolina on 15 March 1863 in Wake County, NC.

5 Julia Caroline Yates born 1842 married Joseph S Dean born about 1833 (1850 and 1860 Census)

Joseph Dean served in the Civil War. He enlisted 10/31/1861 in Harnett co NC as a Enlisted as a Private on 30 October 1861 at the age of 28. Enlisted in Company I, 31st Infantry Regiment North Carolina on 30 Oct 1861. Discharged from Company I, 31st Infantry Regiment North Carolina on 20 Nov 1862. Julia was called 'Caroline' in earlier census' and Julia C later. Julia is listed in the 1860 Wake Co NC census Southern Division page 49a in her parents home. Listed in the 1870 Harnett Co NC census pg 28a in Buckhorn township, Chalk Level with Julia and 1st 2 children in the home. Listed in the 1880 Harnett Co NC census pg 84a in Buckhorn twn with Julia's sister Burlina "Burly" Yates and Ann Steward (92) and Sarah Steward (88) (not related) in the home. Julia Yates Dean sold the land she inherited from grandfather, Jesse Yates (lot 10 of Jesse Yates estate) to her cousin Joe John Yates.

Two sons and two grandsons of Naaman Mills served as overseer of the road in Wake Co., NC from 1827 to 1867. Nine entries in the Wake County Court of Pleas and Quarter Sessions minutes concerning these four men are transcribed as follows:

- 1. Feb 1827 pg. 409 "Ordered that Matthew Mills be appointed overseer of the road in place of Rial Ferrell, and that the same hands work on said road as usual.".
- 2. May 1828 pg. 145 "THE STATE VS. MATTHEW MILLS) Indictment, overseer of the road. Charged pleads not guilty. Whereupon the same jury as to wit were empowered and sworn to try issues. Who find the defendant guilty in manner and form as charged in the bill of indictment. Judgement of the Court that defendant be fined ten dollars (\$10) to be discharged on the payment of fine costs, provided the defendant show at next Court, that his road is in good order, & costs and stand committed until fine & costs are paid."
- 3. Aug 1828 pg. 158 "Ordered that William Yates be appointed overseer of the road in place of Matthew Mills, & that the same hands work on said road as usual.".



- 4. Aug 1828 pg. 168 "It appearing to this Court that Matthew Mills had complied with the order of last term, directing him to put the road over which he is overseer, in good order. It is ordered by the Court that the conditional fine be remitted.".
- 5. Feb. 1834 pg. 224 "Ordered that William Yates be appointed overseer of the road in place of Shadrack Mills, and that the same hands work on said road under him as usual."
- 6. Feb 1845 pg. 408 "Ordered that Green Mills be appointed overseer of the road in the place of William Ferrell, and that the usual hands work under him.".
- 7. Aug 1851 pg. 351 "Ordered that Green Mills be appointed overseer of the new road from the Chatham County line to Allen Jenks', in place of Simeon Yates, and that the usual hands work under him.".
- 8. Aug 1854 pg. 615 "Ordered that Elijah Mills be appointed overseer of the road leading from Green Level to Holly Springs, in place of John Babb, and that the usual hands work under him.".
- 9. Jul 1865 pg. 639 "Ordered that Green Mills be appointed overseer of the road leading from the Chatham County line to Allen Jenks', and that the usual hands living on said road will work under him.".
